INFORMAL OPENING

The informal opening of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star was held in the Municipal Building, Lewes, Delaware and was called to order by the sessions chairman, Sister Marie Roberts, who presented the Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Irma O. LeCompte and the Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Thomas C. Rodway.

Section 1, Strike out Five (\$5.00) Dollars and insert Ten (\$10.00) Dollars in the second line and strike out One (\$1.00) Dollar and insert Two (\$2.00) Dollars in the third line. Section would then read—"The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be \$10.00, and for affiliation Two (\$2.00) Dollars, which must accompany the petition.

March 27, 1952, Mizpah Chapter No. 2, Page 10, Article VII, Section 1, Strike out the word Five (\$5.00) Dollars and insert Ten (\$10.00) Dollars. Section would then read: "The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and for affiliation One (\$1.00) Dollar, which must accompany the petition.

Article VII, Section 2, Strike out the words Three Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$3.50) and insert Five (\$5.00) Dollars. Section would then read—"Each member must pay the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars as annual dues, payable semi-annually in June and December.

May 9, 1952 Radiant Chapter No. 6, Page 3, Article 1, Section 4 to read: Any stated meeting falling on December 24, 25, or January 1,

or during the Grand Chapter Session shall be dispensed with.

Section 5, to read: Special meetings may be called by the Worthy Matron, to be held at any time, notice of which shall be sent out ten (10) days previous to meeting. The purpose for which such special meetings are called shall be stated in the notice, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

Hour of Meeting.

To read: The hour of all stated meetings shall be 8 P. M.

Article V, Section 2. Change line 10 to read: for the amount not to exceed Ten (10) dollars.

VISITING COMMITTEE

Section 3. Omit the word quarterly at beginning of second line. End paragraph with word sick.

Article VI—To read: The office of Secretary, Treasurer and Trustees shall be covered by Blanket Bond; as prescribed by the Grand Chapter.

Article VII. Section 1, Paragraph B. Omit 'they may loan', and start paragraph with, 'Any surplus funds', and continue the following paragraph.

Article XIII. Compensation of Officers, Section 1, To read: No officer of this Chapter shall receive compensation for service except Secretary, who shall receive \$100.00, Treasurer who shall receive \$25.00, and Organist who shall receive \$35.00 per annum, payable in December.

May 12, 1952. Victory Chapter No. 15

Article 5. Section 1. To change the following: The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Five (\$5.00) dollars and for affiliation One (\$1.00) dollar which must accompany the petition.

To read: The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Ten (\$10.00) dollars and for affiliation Two (\$2.00) dollars

which must accompany the petition.

Article 5. Section 2. To change the following: Each member must pay the sum of Three (\$3.00) dollars as annual dues payable in June and December. Members initiated or affiliated between regular dates for payment of dues, shall pay on a monthly basis for each full month until the next regular meeting for payment of dues.

To read: Each member must pay the sum of Five (\$5.00) dollars as annual dues payable in June and December. Members initiated or affiliated between regular dates for payment of dues, shall pay on a monthly basis for each full month until the next regular date for

payment of dues.

One of the arduous duties of a Worthy Grand Matron is the correspondence, yet it afforded me a close personal contact with the Chapters and was a source of much pleasure. I shall always hold dear the friendships formed by these letters, for they were expressions of faith, love and appreciation of our Order. To each letter I received, I gave prompt attention and earnest consideration.

My sincere thanks to all who sent cards, flowers, dish gardens, made visits and telephone calls to my husband during his illness.

The usual Christmas Greetings were mailed by the Grand Secretary.

Copies of my Official Letters will be printed in the Proceedings.

APPOINTMENTS

January 2, 1952, appointed Sister Ruth Roberts, Past Matron of Unity Chapter No. 16, to fill the unexpired term of Sister Gladys Lynch, Deputy Grand Lecturer for Unity Chapter No. 16.

January 2, 1952, appointed Brother Clarence Rickards, Past Patron of Unity Chapter No. 16 to serve on Sessions Committee instead of Brother Elwood Lynch.

Sister and Brother Lynch moved from our Jurisdiction to Florida.

Appointed Sister Bessie Miles, P. M. of Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8 on Credential Committee to replace Sister Lillian Arters who is ill.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question: May officers leave their stations and form a hollow square outside the Labyrinth for Obligation, if someone is appointed to fill Warder's chair during Obligation Ceremony.

Answer: Yes.

Question: May a member from Pennsylvania join a chapter in Delaware by affiliation if she has a Demit from a Philadelphia Chapter without a waiver?

Answer: Yes, she does not need a waiver with a Demit.

Question: How may a man who has been suspended for non-payment of dues in one chapter, be admitted into another chapter?

Answer: Go to the secretary of his former chapter and conform to their by-laws for re-instatement, ask for a Demit and petition the chapter of his choice for affiliation.

Question: May a chapter sell chances on a cake after meeting is closed?

Answer: No, I refer you to paragraph 23 in "Active Legislation" of Grand Chapter, also "Approved Recommendations" in Proceedings of the year 1926.

Question: We sponsor Job's Daughters in the State of Delaware, why do we permit them to sell chances and then when they are old enough to join the Order of the Eastern Star, tell them it is against the Law of the Order?

Answer: We sponsor this organization, but they are governed by the rules and regulations of the International Order of Job's Daughters, which permits this and we have no jurisdiction over their laws.

Question: To "Sponsor" means to be more or less responsible for.
Why do we sponsor Job's Daughters, if we have no jurisdiction over them, even when it comes to breaking the law of out state?

Answer: This will have to be answered by Grand Chapter in Session.

Question: Since the law says the officers (Conductress and Associate Matron-Elect) must take examinations at least three days before installation, should they be installed if the required examinations have not been given?

Answer: I would say "NO," in order to uphold our law.

Question: Our Altar has a slide shelf on the side, may we use it for our Ballot Box instead of placing Ballot Box in front of the Bible?

Answer: Since the shelf is a part of the Altar, "Yes". It looks better and more reverent to use shelf than to push Bible with Ballot Box.

Question: The question has been asked in our chapter, In proving a chapter should the Conductress and Associate Conductress use "Lawful Information" as the "Book of Instruction" tells us or must they have sat in Chapter with them?

Answer: Our instruction is use "Lawful Information". This does not mean that the Conductress or Associate Conductress shall have sat in chapter with them, but, "Lawful Information" means, they must be vouched for by someone who has sat in chapter with them.

Question: Does the Conductress assist the Associate Conductress when there are two members to be affiliated?

Answer: No, Associate Conductress does the work alone

Question: Is it necessary for members to be affiliated to wait in the anteroom?

Answer: No, they may be present for the opening ceremony and then asked by the Worthy Matron, to retire.

IRREGULARITIES

Secretaries requesting Dispensations by letter instead of using the regular form (which can be secured from the Grand Secretary) and also failure to affix the seal of chapter.

Secretary sending amendments without signature of the committee and without seal of the chapter.

Installing officers who have not yet earned Certificate of Proficiency.

Worthy Matrons having their work written in small folder. Soloist's name listed in Chapter Program, with the officers, thus making nineteen.

Members leaving Chapter room while balloting is in progress. Worthy Matron, instructing members they must not give a glad

hand of welcome to Grand Officers or any visitors in chapter.

One of the rulings of the Grand Jurisdiction of Delaware is, that after presentation, they shall be given a glad hand of welcome. This means hand clap.

Clapping for closing march is prohibited.

Repeating "So may it ever be" after an "Amen" when blessing is asked at banquet, birthday parties, etc. This is out of order.

It is a satisfaction to me to report that I found very few causes for complaint in the work of the chapters.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend that all examinations for Grade "B" certificates and "Star" cards be taken immediately after election of officers instead of three days before installation.

The reason for making this recommendation is, these examinations must be recorded in the Grand Chapter Books, signed and sealed by the Grand Secretary and forwarded to the Grand Lecturer for her signature before they can be given to the member who has passed the examination.

I recommend that all legislation passed at each Grand Session be listed item by item in the last pages of the Proceedings.

I recommend that the report of the Fraternal Correspondent which is read in Grand Chapter, be printed in the Proceedings, but that the alphabetical listing of each state be eliminated. That the Grand Conductress and Associate Grand Conductress continue to read the Proceedings, as they do at present, send the reports to the Associate Grand Matron and if there happens to be an item of unusual interest in the reports handed to her, that she incorporate it in her report which will be read during Grand Session. This will permit the inclusion of more information pertinent to our own Grand Jurisdiction with perhaps very little increase in the cost of printing the Proceedings, which you can see from the Financial Report of Grand Secretary. is a considerable sum.

All Road numbers except U. S. No. 13, are Sussex County numbers, and are found on the Maintenance Map of Sussex County, Delaware.

RECOMMENDATIONS

No. 1: Sister Mary L. G. Burris, Past Matron of Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8 who is the Sister of the late Sister Carrie Gemmill, Past Grand Matron of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star has given Sister Gemmill's Past Grand Matron's jewel to the Grand Chapter. It has been a truly enjoyable and educational experience to serve as your Fraternal Correspondent this year. It is surely a most interesting way to learn of the many fine things our great Order is

accomplishing.

I have taken a trip to beautiful churches, auditoriums, and temples where Grand Chapter sessions were held. The interiors have varied greatly, ranging from lovely colonial flower gardens to majestic palace settings. Many of the settings featured our Star in some special manner, and upon every altar rests the Holy Bible, our source of strength and wisdom. The Hour of Remembrance is observed in solemn impressive ceremonies to honor the memory of those members who have departed from us. The Sessions are generally preceded by divine services, receptions, banquets and concerts. In nearly all the states, welcomes are extended by mayors, governors, and other officials.

Homage is paid to the National flag, the Christian flag, the State flag, and the Eastern Star flag. Our Order is the largest fraternal order, to which both men and women belong. It is composed of four Sovereign bodies, The General Grand Chapter, The Supreme Grand Chapter of Scotland, and the Independent Grand Chapters of New

York and New Jersey.

General Grand Chapter has jurisdiction over the Grand Chapters in the United States, Canada, and the Subordinate Chapters in China, Guam, Mexico, Yukon, Philippine Islands, and New Chapters in Japan and Bermuda. The outstanding work of our Order is benevolent. In 1951, there were fifty-one Joint Masonic and Eastern Star Homes, and 18 Eastern Star Homes. Funds are being raised for several more. Many Grand Jurisdictions sponsor Job's Daughters, Order of Rainbow for Girls. The Beatitudes in Florida, and New York has a new organization, "The Daughters of the Eastern Star." There are

nearly 15,000 Chapters with a membership of over two million. Michigan is the oldest Grand Chapter, Nova Scotia is the youngest, Puerto Rico, the smallest, and Ohio has the largest Grand Chapter membership, Illinois the most Chapters. All Grand Chapters meet annually, except the District of Columbia, which holds two meetings a year, one in December and one in May. Our Ritual is translated into Spanish, Chinese, and Italian. All Jurisdictions are interested in perfecting the ritualistic work of our Order. Some have Deputy Grand Matrons, District Instructors, and Grand Lecturers; many have Grand Librarians. Harry Truman is the only President of the United States who has ever been a member of the O. E. S. The Order of the Eastern Star was founded by Robert Morris, in La Grange, Kentucky, in 1850. One Chapter in Missouri has for its entire membership husbands and wives. The Bible used at the Maryland Grand Chapter Session was the famous "Pauper Bible" engraved in 1560, and loaned by the Maryland Bible Society. The gavel used by the Grand Matrons of Florida, was made of olive wood from Jerusalem. Connecticut has a well managed Eastern Star Library which contributes programs for the use of Worthy Matrons.

We move that the report be accepted and changes complied with. Recommendation No. 1. Art. 3, Sec. 1, Paragraph 1, Page 37 of Constitution will require an amendment to our Constitution.

CHANGES SUGGESTED IN CONSTITUTING CEREMONY:

First: The Worthy Grand Matron shall call a special meeting of the Grand Chapter, to grant a charter, at least three weeks before the first monthly meeting of the U. D. Chapter in the month in which they are to be constituted.

The date of Constituting the U. D. Chapter shall be the date of the second monthly meeting of the U. D. Chapter (after the special

meeting of Grand Chapter).

As soon as the Special meeting of the Grand Chapter is closed, the Grand Secretary shall notify the chapter under dispensation of the date set for constituting ceremony and inform them that the Worthy Grand Matron wishes them to hold an election of officers on the first meeting of the month, in order that the new officers may be istalled at the close of the Constituting Ceremony.

Having the election previous to Constituting would eliminate from the ceremony as it is now written, two sentences contained in the

5th paragraph of the 2d page of the ceremony which reads:

"Before proceeding further, it is necessary that your officers be elected and appointed: Worthy Grand Patron I invite you to preside".

It would also eliminate the 6th paragraph which reads:

The election will be conducted in the customary manner in this jurisdiction. At its conclusion the Worthy Matron elect will present the constituting officer with a list of her appointed officers, who will then make the announcement of the appointments."

Instead the list of officers elected and appointed may be given to the Grand Marshal who will assist in the installation.

The Ceremony will then continue from the third paragraph on the second page as follows:

WORTHY GRAND MATRON: The Grand Officers will assume their stations.

WORTHY GRAND MATRON: Grand Secretary you will read the Charter.

AFTER THE PROCLAMATION OF Constitution is made, a short recess should be declared so that the Grand Marshal may place the badges upon the Altar and also that chairs may be placed in the West for the officers who are to be installed.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE SHRINERS' HOSPITAL FOR CRIPPLED CHILDREN AND DELAWARE HANDICAPPED CHILDREN

We. The Committee, wish to report:

The third annual benefit was held at the Shrine Club on Saturday, March 1st., 1952.

Everyone, we are sure, can recall what a dreadful day it was with one of the worst snow storms of the winter. The roads were just about impassable. As our food was already bought and prepared, it was impossible to have postponed the affair as we would have taken a big loss. Some of the committee arrived at the club by 11 A. M. and by 4 o'clock in the afternoon most of the Chapters in the upper part of the state got through. Food had been prepared for 650 people and we served 257 and the balance of the food was sold at quite a loss. Most every down state Chapter made brave attempts to get through, but it was impossible. This, however, did not deter them from carrying on in the very best possible manner at their disposal; for they returned to their homes and disposed of their material among their neighbors. All of their tickets that were sold were paid for and with their proceeds from the sale of their material, made a very fine showing and saved the day for the cause.

We had coin cans out throughout the state in various business

places and they were collected and the money sent in.

Total monies received—\$1,089.52 of which—\$489.32 were expenses. A hearing aid was purchased for a little 8 year old girl at the cost of \$75.00 and she is now using it with very satisfactory results. Three hundred dollars has been given to the Shriners' Hospital in Philadelphia, and two hundred and twenty five dollars and twenty cens has been sent to the Delaware Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

Total profit from the affair is \$600.20.

The Committee wishes to express their appreciation to every Chapter in the State and every individual member who helped in anyway at all and as there are so many, space will not permit names. Our Chairman, Sister Sarah Riggin could not be with us as she was living in Virginia for the winter, but supported the affair very generously and it is the wish of the committee that our Chairman read this report.

Once again it is our privilege to report to you the activities of your 'Hospital Rehabilitation' Committee.

First, we want to thank you, Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Irma, and Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Tom for giving us the pleasure of serving you and our veterans in the work we love to do.

It takes a lot of time and work but the heart-warming cooperation of our Chapters and the appreciation of the boys and personnel of the V. A. Hospital more than compensates.

A copy of the minutes of the V. A. V. S. business meeting was sent to the Worthy Grand Matron each month.

'Hospital Day' Booklets (1951) were sent to the Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Abbie Hanson, Most Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Franklin W. L. Miles, Past Grand Matron, Sister Edna, Past Grand Patron, Brother Fred, Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Irma, Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Tom, the Grand Secretary, Sister Elizabeth and Grand Treasurer, Sister Virda. I was delighted to receive a letter of thanks for the Booklet, and commendation on our work from our Most Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Miles.

On June 1st., 1951, Brother William C. Edmonds, Field Agent, Masonic Service Association of the United States, who is stationed at our V. A. Hospital in Elsmere, entertained Sister Maxine Musselman of Denver, Indiana and your Hospital Chairman at lunch at the hospital; after which, he and Mr. J. J. Crowe, Chief of Special Services, took us on a tour of the hospital and surrounding buildings. Sister Maxine was much impressed with the hospital, our Grand Session, and with Delaware's hospitality.

Sister Anna Brice of Pennsgrove Chapter No. 86, Pennsgrove, N. J., was a patient in the V. A. Hospital for several weeks last September and many of our Delaware Sisters and Brothers visited her and took her flowers which she enjoyed very much. I sent two letters to the Secretary of Pennsgrove Chapter advising them of same. I have received several nice cards and notes from Sister Anna since she returned home.

I received from Frankford Chapter No. 12, 100 stamped Christmas cards which I delivered to the hospital in the middle of December. A letter of thanks was sent to Sister Edna Johnson, Chapter chairman, for same.

A request from the hospital for 'National Geographic' Magazines was received and several hundred were taken to Mr. Edmonds. Many pairs of old spectacles were also given to Mr. Edmonds who repairs the patients' eye glasses at no cost to the patient.

Letters requesting gifts to be used as prizes for games for our boys were sent to each Chapter chairman and the response was wonderful. Altho there were not as many gifts as last year, they were much nicer and Sister Mary Cornelius surely puts them to good use, and can use as many as we can give her. Dr. Gasper's letters of thanks were sent to the Chapters for the gifts. Sister Mary is the 'Recreation Director' at our V. A. Hospital, and is a member of 'Manessa Chapter, Manessa, Pa. We, who serve each week as volunteers in the hospital, divide our time between Central Supply and Recreation and thoroughly enjoy it.

On March 5th., 1952, I had the pleasure of being interviewed on a 15 minute hospital radio program in regards to the Eastern Star program in the V. A. Hospital.

On April 3rd., members of the Staff and Personnel put on a "Planning for Patient Care" program and did it as well as professionals could have done it. Letters, and verbal invitations were extended for this program, also.

Sunday, May 11th., a 'Mothers' Day' and 'Hospital Day' program was carried out and the public invited. Written invitations were mailed to the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron. The Order of the Eastern Star had a large part in this program as usual, five volunteers acting as guides from 12 noon till 4 P. M.






