

## ADDRESS OF MOST WORTHY GRAND MATRON

### SISTER RUTH A. JONES

The month of May brings us always to a realization that life can be merry and we are happy in this beautiful season of the year. Just sheer enjoyment of the beauties we find in the glorious outdoors. This is a lovely time of the year always for your guests to enjoy your Grand Session. I am certainly happy to come to Delaware and meet again friends I have enjoyed over many years. I am happy to greet you all.

We appreciate Brother Cleaver's readiness and willingness to accept the duty of serving on the Welfare Committee of the General Grand Chapter. It is very difficult when there are so many, to select just one. I should like to select a dozen or more but I have tried to place the honor upon someone who has given unselfish service. Sister and Brother Cleaver have been staunch workers in the Order. I am happy to greet them.

I should like to speak very briefly about our Projects:

INTERNATIONAL TEMPLE: I can tell you that you have been 100% for many years and you now stand 95%. We are going to try to finish the Temple Fund this Triennial.

Bundles for Germany: A few weeks ago I was in Arizona and there was a very interesting editorial in a magazine about the Mayor of West Berlin who has made an appeal to Americans to help his city and Western Germany bear the load which goes with accepting the refugees from Communist dominated countries. He appeals to us to send food and clothing. In the pitiful stream from East Germany there are thousands of ill-clad people and undernourished children. They cannot be turned back for it would mean death or the slave camp for the unfortunate people who have risked their lives to gain freedom. I had the pleasure of meeting the Grand Master of Germany and he assured me it meant a great deal to the people in Germany.

CANCER FUND: I hope you will continue to support the work in the prevention, cure and alleviation of cancer. Our Order has a fine record in this field which we surely will want to continue and enlarge our efforts.

Public Relations Committee of our General Grand Chapter. I was glad to have one of our committees changed from "Foreign Relations" to Public Relations. So many times we hear people say "Who are the Eastern Stars"? We need not be reticent about telling what our projects are. Right now we are very much concerned about putting before our members everywhere in the Grand Jurisdictions, the principles of our Order. Reminding them of various things that should be corrected; so we are going to put out six or more letters to try to improve our membership in the Order. We are now about three million strong. We do not strive alone for quantity but quality. Your Grand Secretary has a copy of the first letter and I am hoping that these letters will be copied and sent to each chapter. The first one is on the use and misuse of the black cube. This will be followed by one on vouchments. We also have a letter about gift-giving; also one on Gossip, Rumors and Evil-Speaking and keeping chapter business within our chapter walls.

ESTARL. Our big project is training awards for religious duties. The General Grand Chapter has now established its own project-Eastern Star Training Awards for Religious Leaderships. Pamphlets with the detail of administration will be available. We hope through this program that Delaware and all other Jurisdictions will provide financial help for many worthy young people who may be persuaded to give their lives in full time religious service. Someone has said, "If ever there was a cause worthy to be upheld by all of toil or sacrifice that the human hand or heart can endure, it is the cause of education. It has the indestructible merits and holds the welfare of mankind in its embrace as the protecting arms of a mother fold her infant to her bosom." Horace Mann who laid the foundation of the world's noblest school system in the ambition of the common people to improve themselves said, "Release the power that is in people and out of a great people will come an abundance of great and inspired leaders". How much we need to give thought to our leadership of tomorrow. I hope Delaware will give us good support in this project. Many church doors are closed because there are no ministers or rectors, no music or choir leaders. We also need to improve the quality of music in our churches. We are hoping you will assist us in giving money to give awards to young men and women who have the desire to give their services in the work of Christ. The young people will have to maintain certain standards if the awards are to be continued. I am counting on Delaware to help.

Mother's Day. The beautiful custom of Mother's Day comes in May and brings to us thoughts and memories that are a benediction. We thank our Heavenly Father for our mothers who gave us life; who cared for us in tender years; who dreamed great dreams for us. Our mothers whose eyes though heavy still watched over our cost of pain, whose hands though tired still worked for our needs and comfort, whose weary feet still took many a step to watch over us in still standing by the cross. In the high conceptions we hold of mother-hood—in its influence upon us, this quality is always present. We

see that the high goals of life, our good moral standards and the lofty moral statures of life are set by parental influence. Let us strive to build a better and saner world for tomorrow's mothers and the children of the generations to come.

The new Ritual and Secret Work will be ready and we hope that many of you will have time to study it.

I think there is a misunderstanding in some jurisdictions that does not exist here and I have been told that the changes in the Ritual would not be adopted until the Grand Chapter had accepted it. I am sure that they do not understand that when the General Grand Chapter makes changes they are obligatory.

We have asked that you immediately put into effect these changes when you have the printed copy in your hands. I have every confidence that Delaware will want to change and conform just as soon as you have the information. There are not many changes and you need not be alarmed that you will have to unlearn many things.

We have adopted a new funeral ceremony, not entirely new, but I have felt on many occasions that it is extremely difficult to call upon eighteen members to conduct a funeral ceremony; so we have adopted this new arrangement which will require only eight. When a ceremony is given from memory it is so much more impressive than reading from a book.

I want to thank you for all your courtesies, the corsages, the flowers in my room, Past Grand's Dinner, the trip to Longwood, the church service and the graciousness of your Hospitality Committee. I know you have well laid plans and that you will carry on successfully in the future as you have in the past. I have enjoyed being with you and hope to come back again and again.

The fees for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Ten (\$10.00) and for affiliation, Two (\$2.00) Dollars, which must accompany the petition.

P. 5, Art. V., Sec. 2. On lines one and two, strike our Four (\$4.00) Dollars and insert Five (\$5.00) Dollars. Section 2 would then read:

Each member must pay the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars as annual dues, payable in June and December.

P. 7, Art. VI., Sec. 4. On lines 3 and 4, add "neither of whom have signed the petitions". Section 4 would then read:

Of Whom To Consist. A Committee on Investigation on petitions must consist of three members, two sisters and one brother, neither of whom have signed the petitions.

Our By-Laws state, three members, one of whom shall be Answer: a brother, there seems to be no ruling saying that he cannot be chairman, but it is customary to put a Sister as chairman. (I prefer that a Sister be chairman)

Question: After initiation, may the officers put on a special ceremony, part of which is between the Altar and the East?

Answer: It is not permissible to pass between the Altar and the East for any ceremony.

Question: At the Annual election of officers is the Sentinel in a Subordinate Chapter allowed to vote?

The Sentinel is invited into the Chapter room, seated at Answer: the door, and is permitted to vote at the annual election of officers.

Ouestion: Can anyone leave the Chapter Room, during election of officers, to call the person elected, to see if they accept the office, if they are not present?

Answer: No one shall enter or leave the Chapter Room during election. The Secretary shall notify the person elected.

With the proceedings of Sister Jurisdictions to pilot the course, it has been the happy privilege and pleasure of the committee to travel far and wide on an imaginary journey throughout our Eastern Star world, fulfilling one of the most interesting and educational assignments of this Grand Chapter.

We have attended Grand Sessions in Masonic and Shrine Temples, Scottish Rite Cathedrals, Civic Auditoriums, Churches, Schools, Theatres and Hotel Ballrooms which have been transformed into beautiful and inspiring settings.

The Order was founded by Robert Morris. The first chapter being organized in LaGrange, Kentucky in 1850 with a few sincere, honest, conscientious people and has grown into an organization of three million members and has threaded its way into all parts of the world with subordinate chapters in Cuba, Canal Zone, Alaska, Yukon, Japan, Okinawa, Manila, Guam, Hawaiian Islands and at the General Grand Chapter held in Milwaukee last September, the Most Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Miles gave a report of his trip to Germany in the interest of instituting a chapter at Frankford. The Most Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Cramblet will go to Germany in a few weeks to constitute the chapter.

The Holy Bible, the Stars and Stripes, Christian Flag, State Flag Eastern Star Flag are always present at each Grand Session. Nearly every jurisdiction has a memorial service previous to the Grand Session. In the state of Mississippi a highway Eastern Star Marker was erected at Richland on September 1951 in front of the little Red School House where Robert Morris was teaching when he wrote the Ritual. The Marker was given by the State Historical Commission in commeration of the Order of Eastern Star movement.

Maryland has done note-worthy work for Veterans at Perry Point, Maryland.

In New Hampshire all Grand Officers, Committees and Representatives are paid milage from home town to Grand Session.

In Washington State the names of investigating committee not read in chapter, but must be in the minutes.

New Jersey affiliated and withdrew from General Grand Chapter three times. Have been independent since 1907.

Indiana does not permit members to own Rituals.

An orphanage is maintained by Eastern Stars in Michigan.

Utah must open chapter for a funeral. In 1952 constituted their first chapter in 26 years.

Connecticut has a library from which ceremonies and diagrams for marches may be borrowed.

Kansas gave \$785.05 for hair dryers and shampoo equipment for Masonic Home. The Grand Treasurer of Kansas gave her report in poetry until it was necessary to give the financial statement. An office building which had been talked about for 5 years became a reality and is located in central part of Topeka, a portrait of Sister Olga Philips to be hung in the new building.

The Grand Session of Arkansas had an unusual setting. A real cotton patch with Colonial Home in rear. The Grandson of the Worthy Grand Matron and the daughter of the Worthy Grand Patron marched through the cotton patch to open the doors of the home for the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron. At their grand session a silver loving cup was to be presented to the oldest member present who had been a member the longest. It was won by a member 86 years of age, having been a member 68 years. One had been a member 74 years, but not present.

The Golden Gavel which was presented to New York Grand Chapter in 1920 on the event of their Golden Jubilee Session has been used to open the Thursday evening session every year since that date. They gave a piano to the recreational building at the United States Military Academy, also chancel furniture, Baptismal Font and robes for the choir of thirty voices.

Minnesota has seventy chapters with wife and husband teams, Worthy Matrons and Patrons.

# REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON COMPILING OF A MANUAL OF LEGISLATION

The committee entered whole-heartedly into this work with an earnest desire to have the legislation of the Grand Chapter of Delaware in such form that the Worthy Matrons and especially the Grand Lecturer and Deputy Grand Lecturers could substantiate what they are trying to teach the officers and members of the subordinate chapters of the Order of the Eastern Star, as instructed by the Worthy Grand Matron in her School of Deputies.

After searching diligently and very carefully through all of the Proceedings since the beginning of the Grand Chapter in this Jurisdiction (1922) to the year 1945 when the printing of the legislation in the back of the Proceedings, was discontinued, we suddenly became aware of the fact that we were just duplicating time, effort and money, for the cost of printing is a considerable item in these times.

The ruling was passed last year that all legislation shall again be printed in the back of our Proceedings. Each Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, Associate Patron, Grand Lecturer, Deputy Grand Lecturers, and each Secretary for her Chapter, receives a copy of these Proceedings each year they are serving as officers. These same members or officers would be the ones to whom we would give a copy of the Manual of Legislation for their use while in office.

As all legislation, from now on will be printed in the Proceedings, including that from the beginning—1922, and inasmuch as any member who is not entitled to a free copy of the Proceedings, may buy one for the price of \$1.80, the chairman of the committee consulted with the Worthy Grand Matron and told her the Committee felt the printing of a Manual of Legislation was a waste of time, effort and money and asked permission to so state to this Grand Chapter at this Session.

This permission was granted, hence the report as just read to you.

Sister Sarah E. Riggin made motion to accept report of committee, seconded by Sister Mildred Bryan. Motion adopted and it will go into effect immediately.

Grand Marshal proclaimed Grand Chapter called from labor to recess to reconvene at 8:00 P. M.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

We, the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws, in conjunction with the Jurisprudence Committee, have reviewed the amendments to the Subordinate Chapters By-Laws, as previously temporarily approved by the Worthy Grand Matron; and offer additions and amendments as herein listed:

## DELAWARE CHAPTER NO. 1

Art. V., Sec. 1, to read:—The fees for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, and for Affiliation, Two (\$2.00) Dollars, which must accompany the petition.

Art. V., Sec. 2,—Each Member must pay the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars as annual dues, payable in June and December.

Art. VI, Sec. 4:—Of whom to consist. A committee on Investigation on petitions must consist of three Members, two Sisters, and one Brother, neither of whom have signed the petition.

Art. VI, Sec. 9:—A petitioner for degrees or affiliation, if elected shall be notified by the Secretary, if rejected, the petition fee shall be refunded to the applicant by the Secretary.

Art. IX, Sec. 4:—shall be worded as follows:—It shall be the duty of the Organist to pay strict attention, and whenever an Officer is requested or directed by the presiding Officer to perform any duty she should always accompany the Officer with music; at other times render appropriate music upon request of presiding Officer; for which service she shall receive the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) dollars per year.

Art. IX, Sec. 5,:—It shall be the duty of the Sentinel to have charge of all paraphernalia, and prepare the Chapter Room, and to protect the outer door of the Chapter Room at all times, for which service He or She shall receive the sum of Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars per year.

Art. IX, Sec. 6:—When the service of a Chorister is required, she or He will receive the sum of Two (\$2.00) dollars for each service rendered.

APPROVED.

#### ST. JOHN'S CHAPTER NO. 4

Art. 5, Sec. 1:—The Initiation Fee shall be Ten (\$10.00) dollars and Fee for Affiliation Two (\$2.00), which must accompany the petition.

We approve.

We disapprove of line 3 and 4 in regards to International Temple Fund, and recommend this be deleted.

Approved as recommended by the Constitution and By-Laws Committee.

Art. 9, Sec. 4: add—The salary for the Organist shall be Twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars per year, and the Sentinel Twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars per year. Salaries of all Officers shall be pro-rated at the end of each year.

Approved.

#### CAESAR RODNEY CHAPTER NO. 8

Art. VIII, Sec. 4:—Amendment to read:—The Treasurer, for which service shall receive the sum of Fifteen (\$15.00) dollars per year.

Art. IX, Sec., 3 amendment to read:—The Organist shall receive for services rendered the sum of Fifteen (\$15.00) dollars per year.

Approved.

## GEORGETOWN CHAPTER NO. 9

Art. XI, Sec. 1, Beginning with line 17 to read:—She shall receive the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) dollars per year. Approved.

#### KENT CHAPTER NO. 11

Art. 5, Sec. 1, Fees for conferring degrees in this Chapter shall be as follows:—Degrees, \$10.00.

We disapprove of compulsory \$1.00 contribution to International O. E. S. Temple Fund, and recommend this be deleted.

Approved as recommended by Constitution and By-Laws Committee.

Art. 5, Sec. 2, Affiliation, \$2.00.

Art. 5, Sec. 2, Change to read:—Each Member must pay the sum of Five (\$5.00) dollars as annual dues payable in June and December.

Approved.

#### ESTHER CHAPTER NO. 17

Art. IX, Sec. 2, Change in second sentence to read:—These jewels each year shall be the same as the redesigned ones presented to the first Past Matron and Past Patron of Esther Chapter U. D.

Approved.

#### FIVE POINTS CHAPTER NO. 13

Art. V, Sec. 1:—The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Ten (\$10.00) dollars, and for affiliation One (\$1.00) dollar, which accompany the petition.

Approved.

We disapprove of part of line 3 and part of line 4, which reads: of which a portion shall be designated for the International Temple Fund, and recommend this be deleted.

Approved as recommended by Constitution and By-Laws Committee.

We recommend that Art. 7, Sec. I, of the Constitution be changed to read:—Representatives or their proxies regularly appointed, of eleven Subordinate Chapters under the jurisdiction of this Grand Chapter, and one of the first four elected Officers shall be considered to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

We recommend that under "Rules and Regulations" for the government of the Grand Chapter of Delaware:

Art. V, Sec. 1, Be changed to read:—This Grand Chapter shall send the Worthy Grand Matron then in office to the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Chapter, if in attendance thereon, and who has been elected and installed. If she is unable to attend then a proxy in the following order; Worthy Grand Patron, Associate Grand Matron, Associate Grand Patron.

Sec. 2, That our Delegate be allowed Ten (\$10.00) dollars per day while Triennial is in session, and four cents per mile transportation charges.

We recommend that Art. IV, Sec. 7 of the Constitution be changed to read:—The first line to read:—The ten officers above named shall be elected annually.

#### REPORT ON COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND LAWS LAUREL CHAPTER NO. 18

These By-Laws were approved with the exception of the following, which were taken up seriatim:

Art. 1, Sec. 2, reading "The Warrant under which this Chapter is held is a Charter granted by the General Grand Chapter, Order of Eastern Star; Change to read:—

The Warrant under which this Chapter is held is a Charter granted on the 22d day of January, A. D. 1953 by the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star.

Art. 1, Sec. 4 reading:—"Special meetings may be called by the Worthy Grand Matron to be held at any time, but the purpose of such special meetings shall be stated in the Call, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting."

Change to read:-and conform with Constitution:-

"Special meetings may be called by the Worthy Matron, to be held at any time, notice of which shall be sent out ten (10) days previous to meeting. The purpose of such special meeting shall be stated in the Call, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting."

Art. 1, Sec. 5 reading: The hour of meeting shall be eight o'clock. Change to read:

The hour of all stated meetings shall be 8:00 P. M.

Art. 2, Sec. 1, reading: The order of business of this Chapter shall be as directed by the Worthy Matron, or in the absence of specific directions on her part as follows:

Change to read:

"This Chapter unless otherwise directed shall proceed with its business in the following order:

1. Opening ceremonies

2. Introduction of Visitors

3. Reading of Minutes4. Reception of Petitions

5. Reports of petitions

6. Ballotting

7. Unfinished Business

8. New Business

9. Work

10. Sickness or Distress

11. Good of the Order

12. Closing

- Art. 2. Sec. 2. This order of business or any part thereof, may be dispensed with at the discretion of the Worthy Matron.
- Art. 4, Sec. 2, reading: "The appointive officers of this Chapter shall be Chaplain, Marshal, Organist, Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, Electa, Warder and Sentinel and to be appointed by the Worthy Matron. Add to the end of third line—the word "Elect".
- Art. 4, Sec. 3, reading: All officers shall be installed as soon after the annual election as practicable;

Change to read: All Officers shall be installed at the first stated meeting in January, or as soon thereafter as possible. A dispensation must be secured to install Officers on any later date.

Art. 5, Sec. 1, reading: It shall be the duty of the Worthy Matron to preside at all meetings of the Chapter, to preserve order and harmony, appoint all special committees, unless named by resolution of the Chapter and perform such other duties as are required by the Constitution, Rules and Regulations of the General Grand Chapter for the government of subordinate Chapters.

Change to read: Rules and regulations of the Grand Chapter of Delaware for the government of subordinate Chapters.

Art. 5, Sec. 4. The Associate Patron shall assist the Worthy Patron and in case of his absence or disability discharge the duties of the Worthy Patron. In case of the death of the Worthy Patron, the Associate Patron shall be acting Worthy Patron for the remainder of the year.

Change: By ending paragraph on line 3 with the words "Worthy Patron".

Art. 5, Sec. 7, reading: The Trustees shall have general supervision of the finances and property of the Chapter, examine the books and vouchers of the Secretary and Treasurer and render an annual detailed report to the Chapter at the first regular meeting after the

installation of officers, and perform such other duties as may be deemed expedient or the Chapter may direct.

Change line 4 to read: "At the annual meeting before installation."

Art. 6, Sec. 3. This to be deleted, as it is covered in Art. 5, Sec. 1.

Art. 7, Sec. 3, reading: Any member in arrears for more than one year's dues shall be liable to suspension, unless financially unable to pay dues, when the Chapter may remit such dues by a vote of those present.

Change the word "One" to "Two".

Art. 8, Sec. 5, reading: Application for demit shall be made personally or in writing by the applicant at a regular meeting. If all dues are paid and no charges are pending, a demit shall be granted.

Change to read: "Elected Officers of Chapters who have been installed cannot demit. All other members have the right to demit if they are clear on the books. A demit shall be granted only on written request signed by the Sister or Brother desiring it. A demit having been granted by the Chapter, cannot be reconsidered.

Each of the above changes were voted upon in Grand Chapter. Motion made by P. G. Patron, Brother Walter Sawdon, seconded by Past Grand Matron, Sister Jane C. Zebley that the change be approved.

Motion adopted.

# ACTIVE LEGISLATION OF GRAND CHAPTER Approved Recommendations

- 1. That at every semi-annual meeting of a subordinate Chapter the Secretary shall read the Land Marks.—1922.
- 2. That the Warder or Sentinel remain at their stations during recess, otherwise the Chapter must be purged on resuming order.—1922.
- 3. That the degrees cannot be conferred on a candidate the same night that the said candidate is elected for the degrees, unless said candidate is departing hurriedly for foreign jurisdiction.—1922.
- 4. That any visitor desiring to visit a Chapter by examination must show receipt for dues paid, or a year card, before the committee will give an examination.—1922.
- 5. That no member be allowed to vouch for any one unless they have sat in Chapter, or have lawful information from a sister or brother who has sat in Chapter with them.—1922.
- 6. That the Bible shall not be closed at recess,—by doing so closes the Chapter.—1922.
- 7. That while a Chapter is in session, excepting during recess, members be required to use the guarded door.—1922.
- 8. That the Grand Chapter furnish Christmas Greetings to be sent to each Grand Jurisdiction, General Grand Chapter, Present Grand Officers and to the subordinate Chapters in Delaware.—1922.
- 9. That for every ten white balls in a ballot box, there shall be one black ball; no ballot box, however, to contain at any time less than six black balls.—1922.
- 10. That the letter "G" be omitted from the Square and Compass in all Patrons' Jewels.—1922.
- 11. That a uniform system of books be adopted by this Grand Chapter consisting of Minute Books, Roll Book, Secretary's Cash Book, Treasurer's Cash Book, Ledgers, Record Book of petitioners elected and rejected in this State.—1923.
- 12. That the proceedings of this Grand Chapter be distributed in the following manner—One copy to each Grand Officer—to each Past Grand Matron and Past Grand Patron—to each Grand Representative of Delaware—to each elective officer of the General Grand Chapter—three copies to each Grand Chapter—six copies to each Chapter in Delaware.—1923-1930.
- 13. That the Flag of our Country be required to be placed in the East at the right of the Worthy Matron in each Chapter room and that the Pledge of Allegiance be given at each meeting.—1924.

- 14. That the Grand Secretary send to each Chapter a copy of all legislation enacted at the Grand Chapter Session immediately after its close.—1924.
  - That public installations be discontinued.—1924.
- 16. That once each year there shall be set aside a night known as Obligation Night in which to have a Special Service to renew our Obligation, the matter of the time and Ceremony to be left in the hands of the Worthy Matron of each Chapter.—1925.
- 17. That all approved decisions and recommendations made by this Grand Chapter be printed in the Proceedings under the heading of "Approved Decisions and Recommendations," adding those made and approved each year.—1925.
- 18. That all Sister Officers must be dressed in white at all Chapter meetings.—1926.
- 19. That Officers shall not be permitted to take hand bags or similar articles to their stations.—1926.
- 20. That no one but members be admitted to the ante-room or preparation rooms, except candidates for the degrees, until after the Chapter is closed.—1926.
- 21. The laws of this State forbid gambling, any form of raffling, or chances; therefore no Chapter, or any committee, or individual representing a Chapter, shall be permitted to secure money for any Chapter in this manner.—1926.
- 22. That the sale of anything in the Chapter Room be prohibited.

  —1926.
- 23. That the Address of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron be in the hands of the Jurisprudence Committee not less than one week previous to the date of the Opening Session of the Grand Chapter.—1926.
- 24. That in the future when a call is sent to the members of any Chapter for a Special Meeting a duplicate shall be sent at the same time to the Grand Matron and Grand Secretary.—1926.
- 25. I have noticed some of the articles appearing in the newspapers concerning the activities of the Order in this State. One recent article gave the names of the candidates initiated in one of the Chapters, while another article stated that only one office held by the officer named would be contested at the election. I would recommend that the members be more careful in giving information outside the Chapter Rooms.—1928.
- 26. That a copy of the Book of Instructions be given to the Worthy Grand Matron and each one of the members of the Board of Grand Instructors, to be returned to the Grand Secretary on their

retirement from office. Also that a copy be furnished to the Worthy Matron of each Subordinate Chapter to be turned over to her successor at the close of her term of office.—1928.

- 27. That a revised copy of the By-Laws of each Subordinate Chapter be kept on file in the Grand Secretary's office.—1928
- 28. That a special dispensation be required to install officers who are not installed at the regular installations.—1928.
- 29. That in case of removal from one jurisdiction to another in this Grand Jurisdiction, any sister or brother desiring a demit for the purpose of joining another Chapter in this Grand Jurisdiction, shall have the right to petition such other Chapter for membership upon first giving notice to their original Chapter of such intention.

Should the Chapter so receiving the petition elect the petitioner to membership and notify their former Chapter, under seal, accordingly, upon receipt of said notice by their former Chapter, it shall grant a demit, which shall be sent direct to the Secretary of the Chapter to which petitioner has been elected. In case of their rejection by the Chapter to which petitioner has applied, their membership shall remain in their former Chapter.—1929.

- 30. That no request be made or granted to confer degrees by courtesy for a Grand Chapter working under a Ritual other than the one promulgated by the General Grand Chapter, and that a petitioner for membership by affiliation on demit granted by a Chapter working under such Ritual, if elected shall be required to take the obligation. —1930.
- 31. That the election of a petitioner, against whom objection has been made, shall be considered void, if the objection is not raised and the petitioner initiated within one year of the date of the election. That the status of such person be that of a rejected petitioner over whom the Chapter shall have jurisdiction for one year thereafter.—1930.
- 32. That each Chapter be held responsible to this Grand Chapter for the number of Rituals furnished them at the time of Institution, as a part of their required Chapter property and that the Chapter shall pay to the Grand Secretary the list price for each Ritual lost, upon receipt of which the necessary Rituals will be sent to the Chapter. That a money value be placed upon the Secret Work and Labyrinth Chart, to be paid to the Grand Secretary by the Chapter in case of loss.—1930.
- 33. That no new edition of By-Laws shall be issued by any Chapter without first submitting a copy to the Worthy Grand Matron or the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws, for approval.—1930.

- 34. That the Visiting Card as issued heretofore, be abolished and that the "identification and receipt for dues in card form," as required by our Constitution, be the only card furnished the Chapters to be issued to members, and that the cards furnished by the General Grand Chapter be adopted for this purpose.—1930.
- 35. That in the future all officers appointed to serve Under Dispensation shall be installed at the time of Instituting the Chapter and that no Chapter shall be Constituted until they have worked Under Dispensation at least six months (not including July and August unless stated meetings are held during these months).—1930.
- 36. That all persons signing a petition for a dispensation for a new Chapter be required to also fill out, in ink, individual petition blanks, answering all questions thereon in their own handwriting. Said petition to become the property of the Subordinate Chapter.—1930.
- 37. That a price of \$5.00 (five dollars) be placed on Secret Work and \$2.00 (two dollars) on the Diagram of the Labyrinth.—1930.
- 38. That no member of a Chapter shall furnish a list of the membership to anyone for the purpose of circularizing its members, or soliciting for any purpose other than the Eastern Star.—1931.
- 39. That a space be provided for the signature of the installing officer on the list of officers installed.—1931.
- 40. That a copy of the Book of Instructions be furnished the Associate Grand Matron, and that officers of Subordinate Chapters and any member interested in the work in this Jurisdiction be allowed to purchase them, if they so desire.—1931.
- 41. That a form, for requesting a Special Dispensation from the Worthy Grand Matron, be printed, to be furnished to Chapters, as other supplies, from the office of the Grand Secretary.—1931.
- 42. That Article 5, Section 1, be amended so that this Grand Chapter may meet in any town in Delaware where there is a subordinate Chapter, at the discretion of the Worthy Grand Matron. —1931.
- 43. That the Grand Secretary be authorized to dispose of all foreign proceedings after a period of 3 years, and that due care be taken in disposing of them.—1931.
- 44. That a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws of this Grand Chapter (marked "Property of Grand Chapter" and with Seal affixed) be given to each member of the Jurisprudence, Constitution and By-Law Committee and to each elective officer and returned to Grand Secretary on their retirement from office. That copies be sold to interested members of the Order for twenty cents each.—1932.
- 45. That the list of names of the members of subordinate Chapters be omitted and that in place thereof a Chapter directory be printed

to contain the name of the Chapter, place, and time of meeting, the names of the Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, Associate Patron, with the name and address of the Secretary.

- 46. That a Grand Lecturer be required to pass the examination to secure a Grade A Certificate not less than two months after being elected.—1933.
- 47. That the Grand Matron have the power to appoint a member who holds a Grade A Certificate, that the appointment of the Grand Matron shall be effective until the elected officer qualifies or until the next annual session of the Grand Chapter, when the office shall be filled by election.—1933.
  - 48. That no practice meetings be held on Sunday.—1933.
- 49. That the approved recommendation, No. 34, 1930, be rescinded and that the Sentinel see that all members and visitors register in the Register Book.—1933.
- 50. That the Book of Instruction on Page 8—Reception of Grand Officers on Official Visits be changed from "they should be introduced and escorted to the East immediately after the Conductress and Associate Conductress have finished proving the Chapter" to "they should be introduced and escorted to the East immediately after the Chapter has been declared open". My reason for this recommendation is that Grand Honors should not be given when the Bible is closed and the Chapter not opened.—1934.
- 51. That the names of all Past Matrons and Past Patrons be printed in the Proceedings after the names of the Officers.—1934.
- 52. That the Worthy Grand Matron appoint a committee composed of four sisters and one brother to be known as an "Educational Fund Committee". One member to be appointed for five years, one for four years, one for three years, one for two years and one for one year. Thereafter one to be appointed each year to serve for five years. Said committee to have the custody of all money properly belonging to the fund. All disbursements to be signed by the President, Secretary and Treasurer of the committee.—1934.
- 53. That a copy of the Book of Instructions be given members of the Jurisprudence Committee. These books to remain the property of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, and to be returned to the Grand Chapter at the completion of each member's term.—1934.
- 54. That the members be permitted to remain seated during the Opening March in Subordinate Chapters and called up when the position referred to in the Ritual is assumed.—1935.
- 55. That no Life Memberships shall be granted by Chapters in this Grand Jurisdiction. (This not to affect those now holding such memberships.)—1935.

- 56. That some ruling be adopted by this Grand Chapter whereby the Associate Patron shall have the same restrictions as the Worthy Patron regarding the Pink Slip.—1935.
- 57. That all petitions for Affiliation from New Jersey shall state thereon the Masonic relationship upon which their Eastern Star Membership is based, and if it does not conform to the requirements of the General Grand Chapter, such petitions shall not be considered.—1935.
- 58. That the Ceremony used in receiving Distinguished Visitors at this Grand Session be adopted as official in this Grand Jurisdiction. —1935. See pages 37-38.
- 59. That the ceremony of affiliation as used at the Schools of Instruction in 1935 be adopted and incorporated in the Book of Instruction. This is in accordance with the General Grand Chapter.—1935.
- 60. That a sponsorship committee, composed of three members of this Grand Chapter, be appointed by the incoming Worthy Grand Matron to cooperate more fully with the Job's Daughters, which organization has been sponsored by this Grand Chapter.—1935.
- 61. That those portions of the Worthy Grand Matron's report and the Worthy Grand Patron's report which require action by this Grand Chapter be duplicated and distributed to the delegates at the opening of the Grand Chapter Session.—1935.
- 62. That in order to facilitate the making of proper records, secretaries of Subordinate Chapters be instructed to list on their annual reports both the new and old names of members whose names have been changed since the issuance of the latest annual report.—1935
- 63. That the Associate Matron fall in line with other officers and march to her station, when directed by the Worthy Matron.—1936.
- 64. That all Grand Representative Commissions expire the same Month, December 31st.—1936.
- 65. That our proceedings be bound in book form with stiff backs, four or five in one volume.—1936.
  - 66. That Job's Daughters be added to our mailing list.—1936.
- 67. That Chapters urge their committees on applications to be more particular in their investigation. This is the most important committee in your Chapter.
- 68. That the Associate Matron march to her station when the Worthy Matron says: "The Officers will take their respective stations".—1937.
- 69. That a Membership Committee shall be appointed each year by the Worthy Matrons.—1937.

- 70. That the Worthy Grand Patron make written Report to his successor in office of all outstanding petitions for dispensations and any preliminary work that has been done to create interest in localities where no Chapters exist.—1937.
- 71. That as the Conductress is the only one (except the Worthy Patron) to use the pink slip in her work, that the Associate Conductress be required to pass a Grade B examination—1938. See Recommendation 100
- 72. That the Associate Matron be required to pass an examination in the opening and closing ceremony before she is installed as Worthy Matron.—1938.
- 73. That a complete set of our proceedings be bound for the use of the Worthy Grand Matron. That she be held responsible for same and deliver them to the Installed Grand Matron at the same time she delivers the seal, etc.—1938.
- 74. That the fourth paragraph on page 28 in the proceedings of 1930 be eliminated and the following substituted: The Associate Conductress must be positive, when preparing the ballot box, that there are as many white balls as there are voting members in the Chapter Room, and the proper number of black balls or cubes. If there be a Chapter that has not in its possession as many white balls as it has members they should be purchased.—1938.
- 75. That this Grand Body give its approval and recognize the sounding of the gavel in the subordinate Chapters as the opening of the Chapter.—1938.
- 76. I recommend that all Chapters requesting Dispensations shall accompany their request by check drawn on Treasury of Chapter requesting same.—1941.
- 77. That the compensation to the Fraternal Correspondent be eliminated for the time being.—1941.
- 78. I recommend that in order to eliminate embarrassing situations, Honorary Memberships in Subordinate Chapters not be proposed or voted upon when the recipient is in the room.—1943.
- 79. That the Grand Lecturer's contingent fund be increased to \$50.00.—1943.
- 80. That the Associate Conductress hand the ballot box to the Worthy Matron from the floor of the Chapter room and not go up on the platform.—1944.
- 81. That we discontinue the use of stoles. The Jurisdiction of Delaware has adopted the use of shoulder ribbons and no officer should wear both.—1944.
- 82. That the outline for Proficiency examinations in Constitution and By-Laws, Rules and Regulations for Class "A" certificates

as found on pages 29, 30 and 31 in 1930 Proceedings be mimeographed for the use of those desiring to take the examination.—1944.

- 84. That the Conductress drape the Charter immediately after the Flag Ceremony in all Chapters. This to be incorporated in the Book of Instructions.—1944.
- 85. That when a Chapter amends its By-Laws, copies of said amendments be sent in threes to the Grand Secretary, one for the book in the Grand Secretary's office, one for the book held by the Constitution and By-Laws Committee and one for the Worthy Grand Matron's book. These books will then be kept up-to-date.—1944.
- 86. That the incoming Deputy Grand Lecturers receive a copy of the Proceedings.—1944.
- 87. That the Worthy Grand Patron read Article 8, Sec. 1, of the Constitution, on ballotting, before the election of officers each year.—1944.
- 88. That the words "Without further ceremony" be deleted from Article 11, Sec. 6 of the Rules and Regulations. This will give the Worthy Grand Matron the privilege of having a ceremony if she so chooses.—1944.
- 89. That the Associate Grand Matron, who according to our Constitution and By-Laws, automatically becomes Fraternal Correspondent, be granted permission to divide proceedings received, with Grand Conductress, and Associate Conductress, each to review and report same to Associate Grand Matron to be included in her report to this Grand Chapter.—1944.
- 90. That the Diamond used in future for Past Grand Matron's jewel be a fine point 18 (.10) white stone.
- 91. When it is impossible for the Worthy Grand Matron or Worthy Grand Patron to attend a Grand Visitation, the Conductress and Associate Conductress proceed as though both officers were present and conduct either Worthy Grand Matron or Worthy Grand Patron, as the case may be, to the East.—1945.
- 92. Since the Ritual requires the Associate Matron to assume the duties of the Worthy Matron, the Conductress must take an examination in the Opening and Closing ceremonies.—1945. (See Recommendation No. 109.)
- 93. Deputy Grand Lecturer is authorized to give examinations in Grade "B" but the certificates be issued by the Grand Lecturer.

- 94. Candidates may be seated during lecture to the Worthy Patron, in initiatory work.—1947.
- 95. Members of a chapter must be notified ten (10) days in advance when voting to change the By-Laws of a chapter. —1948. (See Recommendation No. 111.)
- 96. Members appointed on an investigating committee should not visit the petitioner. An investigation should be made thoroughly but discreetly and more or less secretly.—1948.
- 97. Members should not sign a petition unless they are acquainted with the petitioner.—1948.
  - 98. Price of Proceedings shall be \$1.80 each.—1948.
- 99. That we recognize and welcome in subordinate Chapters, the Grand Guardian, Associate Grand Guardian, Bethel Guardian and Associate Bethel Guardian of the Job's Daughters, at the close of regular introductions, by a request to rise. Welcome them at their seats. Our Grand Chapter sponsors the Job's Daughters and we do recognize them in Grand Chapter Session.—1949.
- + 100. That all examinations for Grade "B" Certificates and Star cards, be taken immediately after election of officers.
  - 101. That a committee of five (3 sisters and 2 brothers) be appointed on a Home Fund Committee. One member to be appointed for five years, one for four years, one for three years, one for two years and one for one year. Thereafter one to be appointed for each year to serve five years. This fund to be kept as a separate fund by the Grand Secretary and known as Eastern Star Home Fund. No money to be withdrawn from this fund without the consent and approval of the committee.—1950.
  - 102. That the Grand Lecturer and Deputy Grand Lecturer impress upon the officers and members of subordinate chapters that when a change is contemplated in the By-Laws of a Chapter all members must be notified at least 10 days in advance.—1950.
  - 103. Secretaries must put Seal of Chapter on all requests to Worthy Grand Matron.
    - 104. No notices shall be sent out on Post Cards.
  - 105. Grand Representatives shall be recognized and welcomed at all meetings.
  - 106. Worthy Patron must give secretary a receipt for Secret Work and Diagram. Associate Patron must give secretary a receipt for Secret Work.
  - 107. Associate Grand Patron must pass an examination of 20 questions six months before Installation as Worthy Grand Patron. This examination to be given by Grand Lecturer.
  - 108. Time of meeting of Grand Chapter has been changed from 1:00 o'clock to 10:00 o'clock A. M.

# Changes to be made in Constitution and Laws:

109. Art. V, Sec. 1 Changed to read:

This Grand Chapter shall send the Worthy Grand Matron, then in office, to Triennial Assembly of General Grand Chapter. If she is unable to attend, then a Proxy in the following order—Worthy Grand Patron, Associate Grand Matron, Associate Grand Patron.

- 110. Art. V, Sec. 2. That our Delegate be allowed \$10.00 per day while Triennial is in session and 4c per mile traveling charges.
- 111. Art. IV. Sec. 7, Change to read: The ten (10) officers above named shall be elected annually.

This changes the office of Grand Lecturer and Grand Sentinel from Appointive offices to elective offices.

#### Approved Decisions

- 1. The election of a petitioner to receive the degrees in a Chapter, when another Chapter holds jurisdiction over the person as a rejected petitioner, is null and void,—1922.
- 2. It is permissible to do crocheting or fancy work in the Chapter during the session? No.—1922.
- 3. The time referred to in the Constitution shall be the time prevailing in Wilmington on the dates the Grand Chapter is in Session. —1925.
  - 4. Can we hold rehearsal at member's homes? No.-1926.
- 5. A special election is necessary to fill vacancies in the office of Trustee. This will require a dispensation for that purpose, the members being notified ten days before the election.—1926.
- 6. A petition has been received from a person holding a demit from Pennsylvania, but who now resides in Maryland. Is it necessary to ask for a waiver of Territorial Jurisdiction from Maryland? Yes.—1926.
- 7. What should we do with a visitor who attends our Chapter, and has done so for years and has never shown a receipt for dues? Every visitor must show a receipt for dues or a demit once every current year. If demit is more than one year old, she is refused admission.—1928.
- 8. Can the members of the Chapter stand within the Labyinth and repeat the Obligation at the same time a candidate is taking the Obligation? No. Members can arise and repeat Obligation when presiding officer calls for it.—1928.
- 9. After a petitioner has been balloted upon and has been declared either elected or rejected and ballot broken, members may be admitted, after which the name of the next petitioner may come up for ballot.—1929.

- 10. A person with a deformity of the hand may be initiated into the Order of the Eastern Star if such deformity does not interfere with their ability to make themselves known as a sister or brother. —1929.
- 11. The ballot shall not be spread on the application of a person who is not eligible to petition for the degrees.—1930.
- 12. A legally adopted daughter may petition for the degrees on the Masonic affiliation of the son of her foster parents.—1930.
- 13. A petitioner for affiliation becomes a member of the Chapter immediately upon being elected. Having signed the By-Laws of a Chapter upon being initiated, the signing of the By-Laws upon affiliation is merely a matter of Chapter record.—1930.
- 14. A petition for affiliation on demit granted by Chapter not using Ritual of General Grand Chapter shall be handled in the usual way, except that in addition to signing the By-Laws, such petitioner shall be required to take the Obligation of the Order as required by our Ritual.—1930.
- 15. Members cannot be admitted to the Chapter room during balloting. The ballot is started when the Report of the Investigating Committee is read to the Chapter. According to our procedure, action on the report is not finished until the petition is balloted upon.—1930.
- 16. By-Laws of a subordinate Chapter are required by the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter and should be classified as a supply, as interpreted in my official letter number one.—1930.
- 17. A duplicate Certificate of Proficiency can be secured upon payment of a fee to cover the cost of affixing the Grand Chapter Seal (See Rules and Regulations for government of Grand Chapter, Art. III, Sec. 1, (4), plus the list price of the Certificate.) (See recommendation of Jurisprudence Committee.)—1930.
- 18. The Worthy Matron or Worthy Patron serving from the time of the Instituting of a Chapter, though not elected at the time of Constituting, is entitled to the privileges and prerogatives of a Past Worthy Matron or a Past Worthy Patron, since she or he filled the office for which she or he was appointed by the Worthy Grand Patron.—1930.
- 19. That in accordance with Constitution and By-Laws, Section 44, when a person applies to a Chapter for the degrees, and is rejected, said Chapter retains absolute jurisdiction over said party for one year.—1931.
- 20. That no member can be elected or appointed to fill two offices at the same time in a subordinate Chapter.—1931.
- 21. That Secretaries do not read the names of rejected candidates in other Chapters with concurrent jurisdiction and that secretaries keep proper record of all said applicants.—1933.

- 22. Page 61, 1929 Proceedings, "do not give honorary membership to anyone, this law rescinded".—1933.
- 23. That this Grand Chapter sponsor the Order of Job's Daughters.—1933.
- 24. That a member who is in arrears two and one-half years for dues and has received suspension notice may visit this Grand Chapter by another Sister of the same Chapter vouching for her.—1935.
- 25. That a demitted or suspended Past Matron has the right to wear her Jewel, because it is her personal property; however, it does not seem to be good taste.—1935.
- 26. That the time referred to in constitution shall be the time prevailing in the Town or City on the date that the Grand Chapter is in Session.—1936.
- 27. That a Grand Instructor be required to pass the examination to secure a Grade A. Certificate not less than two months after being elected.—1933.
- 28. Only a brother may occupy the station of Worthy Patron or Associate Patron. (This decision made by Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Easton). If there is no brother present, the Worthy Matron may invite a Past Matron to call the Chapter to order and invite the Worthy Matron and other officers to enter the Chapter room.—1944.
- 29. A dispensation is required to hold a special election, the Chapter members being notified ten days prior thereto. (Constitution and By-Laws, Article 1, Sec. 10, under Rules and Regulations governing subordinate Chapters.)—1944.
- 30. Collection plates shall not be passed in the Chapter room. The By-Laws specify the amount of dues each member shall pay. Voluntary contributions may be put into a receptacle placed in a convenient place, such as Electa's cup or on the Associate Matron's pedestal.—1944.
- 31. There shall be no music while the prayer is being said. (Ritual, Page 34—fine print.)—1944.

# **OUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

Question Our Charter is now draped for one of our deceased members.

The 30 day period has expired. Another one of our members just passed away. Do we undrape the charter (even though the 30 day period hasn't expired) and then drape it again for the other member?

Answer No we do not undrape the charter. Have the presiding officer mention the passing away of this other member,

thus the drape remaining on the charter for 60 days for the two deceased members.

Question Can a suspended member of . . . . . . Chapter affiliate with another Chapter in the City?

**Answer** No. The member must be reinstated in his or her chapter before she can affiliate with another chapter.

Question Can a person join our chapter who is unable to kneel at the Altar due to Arthritis in her knees?

Answer Yes. I see no reason why a person should be deprived of the privilege of our Order due to her inability to kneel at the Altar. She could stand with bowed head while taking the Obligation.

Question We would like a special dispensation granted for the purpose of holding our regular meeting on December 26th, as our regular meeting night occurs on December 25th. You will find inclosed \$1.00 for this Special Dispensation.

Answer It is impossible for me to grant this Dispensation, because regular meetings cannot be changed. Meetings are either regular or special. I suggest amending your By-Laws.

**Question** Has the Sentinel the right to present a resolution or take any part in the business of the chapter?

Answer When the Sentinel is invited into the chapter by the Worthy Matron (he or she) has the same right and privilege as any other member.

**Question** A few days after being elected, our associate conductress elect, found she could not accept this office. When holding a special election to elect another, may we install the same night?

Answer Yes.

Question May we ballot at a special meeting?

Answer No.

Question May officers leave their stations and form a hollow square outside the labyrinth for Obligation, if someone is appointed to fill Warder's chair during Obligation Ceremony?

Answer Yes.

Question May a member from Pennsylvania join a chapter in Delaware by affiliation, if she has a Demit from a Philadelphia Chapter, without a waiver?

Answer Yes. She does not need a waiver with a Demit.

Question May a chapter sell chances on a cake, after meeting is closed?

Answer No. I refer you to paragraph 23 (now paragraph 21) in Active Legislation.

Question Since the law says the officers (Conductress and Associate Conductress) must take examinations before installation, should they be installed if the required examinations have not been given?

Answer I would say "NO" in order to uphold our law.

Question The question has been asked in our chapter "In proving a chapter should the Conductress and Associate Conductress use "Lawful Information" as the Book of Instructions tells us, or must they have sat in chapter with them?

Answer Our instruction is "use Lawful Information". This does not mean that the Conductress or Associate Conductress shall have sat in chapter with them, but "Lawful Information" means they must be vouched for by someone who has sat in Chapter with them.

**Question** Does the Conductress assist the Associate Conductress when there are two members to be affiliated?

Answer Associate Conductress does the work alone.

Question Is it necessary for members to be affiliated to wait in the anteroom?

Answer No, they may be present for the opening ceremony and then asked by the Worthy Matron to retire.
