Partial report of Credentials Committee-

18 Chapters represented—129 voting delegates present.

Motion seconded by Sister Alice Abbott and adopted.

CHANGES IN SUBORDINATE CHAPTERS BY-LAWS APPROVED

November 8, 1956. Five Points Chapter No. 13.

Article I. NAME.

Section 1. First sentence to read: This Chapter shall be known as Five Points Chapter No. 13, Order of the Eastern Star of Newport, Delaware.

Section 2. Second paragraph to read: Special meetings may be held at the discretion of the Worthy Matron, written notice to the members 10 days prior to the meeting for such purpose as may be specified in the "call".

Article III. ORDER OF BUSINESS.

Section 1. Change first paragraph to read: This order of business or any part of it may be rearranged at the discretion of the Worthy Matron.

Article IV. MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1. Change to read: No person shall be admitted to membership in this Chapter by initiation or affiliation except affiliated Master Masons, their wives, daughters, mothers, widows, sisters, half-sisters and legally adopted daughters, and foster mothers of legally adopted sons, who are affiliated Master Masons in good standing. All petitioners must have attained the age of eighteen years.

Article V. FEES AND DUES.

Section 1. Change to read: The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be ten (10) dollars and for affiliation two (2) dollars, which must accompany the petition.

Article VI. PETITIONS.

Section 1. Change to read: All petitions for membership shall be in writing accompanied by the fee, filled in and signed by the petitioner in her or his own handwriting and recommended by two members of this Chapter, which petition shall be read at a stated meeting and referred to a Committee of investigation consisting of two sisters and one brother, and laid over until a subsequent stated meeting, and reported upon.

Article VII. FORFEITURE OF MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1. Add to first paragraph: The membership of a Masonic female relative in the Chapter is not affected by his suspension or expulsion.

Article VIII. POWERS AND DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

Section 4. New section to read: The Office of Secretary and Treasurer shall not be held by any one member longer than five (5) consecutive years.

CHANGE THE NUMBERING OF THE BALANCE OF THE SECTIONS.

Section 14. Which will become Section 15. Change to read: The ballot must be secret and no one shall be permitted to examine it but the first four officers.

Article XI. STANDING COMMITTEES.

Section 3. Change to read: Visiting: The Worthy Matron shall appoint a committee of three whose duty it shall be to visit all members reported sick and report same to the Chapter.

Article XII. VACANCIES.

Section 1. Change to read: If an elective officer refuses to be installed, the Worthy Grand Matron may grant a dispensation to hold an election to fill the office. An elective officer cannot resign after being installed except the Secretary and Treasurer.

November 20, 1956. Unity Chapter No. 16.

Article V. FEES AND DUES.

Section 2. Change to read: Each member must pay the sum of five (5) dollars as annual dues, payable in advance in December.

Members initiated or affiliated between regular dates for payment of dues, shall pay on a monthly basis for each full month until the next regular date for payment of dues.

December 27, 1956. Kent Chapter No. 11.

Article I. Name-No change.

Article II. ELIGIBILITY—Formerly Article IV. Membership.
No change in wording.

Article III. PETITIONS-Formerly Article VI.

- Section 1. All petitions for membership shall be in writing, accompanied by the fee, signed by the Petitioner and recommended by two members of this Chapter, which petition shall be read at a regular meeting and referred to a committee of three for investigation, and laid over until the next regular meeting. Demit must accompany petition for affiliation.
- Section 2. A Committee of Investigation on petitions must consist of three members, one of whom must be a brother, as he alone can vouch for the Masonic Standing of the applicant.
- Section 3. It shall be the duty of the investigation committee to make inquiry as to the character and standing of the petitioner if a woman, also that of the Master Mason through whom she claims to be entitled to membership and make a report. No action shall be taken on any petition until such report is made.
 - Section 4. Worded same as former Article VI. Section 4.
 - Section 5. Worded same as former Article VI. Section 5.
 - Section 6. Worded same as former Article VI. Section 6.
- Section 7. A petitioner for the degrees must not be informed of who constituted the investigating committee, and if rejected the result of the ballot must not be disclosed.
 - Section 8. Worded the same as former Article VI. Section 8.
 - Section 9. Worded same as former Article VI. Section 9.

Section 10. Application for a demit must be made in writing signed by sister or brother desiring it. If all dues are paid and no charges pending, it shall be granted. Elected officers who have been installed cannot be granted a demit.

Article IV. OFFICERS-Formerly Article III.

Section 1. The elective officers of this Chapter shall consist of Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, Associate Patron, Secretary, Treasurer, Conductress, Associate Conductress, who shall

be elected annually by a majority vote of the members present at the first regular meeting in December.

Section 2. There shall also be three Trustees elected for a term of three years, one to be elected each year at the first regular meeting in December.

Section 3. The appointed officers are Chaplain, Marshal, Organist, Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, Electa, Warder and Sentinel, who shall be appointed by the Worthy Matron-elect.

Section 4. All Officers except Trustees must be installed at the first regular meeting in January or as soon thereafter as practicable.

Article V. DUTIES OF OFFICERS—Formerly Article IX, X, and XI. Now combined under one heading for clearness and easy reference, and changed to read:

Section 1. Worthy Matron: It shall be the duty of the Worthy Matron to preside at all meetings of the Chapter, preserve order and harmony, appoint all regular and special committees, unless named by resolution of the Chapter, and perform such other duties as are required by the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations of the Grand Chapter for the Government of Subordinate Chapters.

The decision of the Worthy Matron on any question before the Chapter shall be final and conclusive and there can be no appeal from her decision except to the Worthy Grand Matron or Grand Chapter.

In case of a tie vote on any question, the Worthy Matron shall give the deciding vote, provided she has not voted as a member.

SECTION 2. SECRETARY: The Secretary shall keep a true and faithful record of the proceedings of the Chapter and make the annual report to the Grand Chapter. She shall keep a strict account of all dues and fees between the Chapter and each member respectively, shall collect all moneys due the Chapter and pay over the same immediately to the Treasurer taking her receipt therefor. She shall at the annual meeting in January report in writing all money received and paid to the Treasurer; she shall make out and sign all orders drawn on the Treasurer, and shall deliver to her successor in office all property belonging to the Chapter and perform such other duties as may pertain to her office.

Section 3. TREASURER: Worded the same as former Article XI. Section 3.

Section 4. In recognition of their services to the Chapter, the following officers shall receive as compensation the amount of the annual dues of the Chapter: Secretary, Treasurer, Marshal, Organist, and Sentinel. The Secretary shall also receive \$10.00 a year for her services.

Section 5. Worded the same as former Article X. Section 1.

Section 6. Worded the same as former Article X. Section 2, except to add the following sentence: "The Associate Patron fills the office of Worthy Patron".

Article VI. MEETINGS:

Section 1. The stated meetings of this Chapter shall be held on the first and third Wednesday in each month, September to June inclusive except January 1st, at 8:00 P. M.

Section 2. The presence of either the Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, or Associate Patron, and six other members of the Chapter, are necessary to open a Chapter for the transaction of business. They shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the Worthy Matron, due notice having been given the members and only such business transacted as may be specified in the notice.

Section 4. Worded the same as former Article 1. Section 3.

Article VII. ORDER OF BUSINESS:

SECTION 1. Same as former Article II. Section 1. Adding Correspondence as No. 5, and Bills as No. 6, and re-numbering the remaining numbers.

Section 2. Same as former Article II. Section 2.

Article VIII. FEES AND DUES:

Section 1. The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be ten dollars and affiliation two dollars which must accompany the petition.

Section 2. Each member must pay the sum of Five Dollars as annual dues payable in advance. No membership card for the current year can be issued until the annual dues for that year are paid.

Section 3. Same as former Article V. Section 3.

Section 4. Same as former Article V. Section 4.

Article IX. COMMITTEES:

Section 1. Emergency Welfare Committee: There shall be an Emergency Welfare Committee composed of five members of the Chapter who shall serve a term of five years, one to be appointed each year by the Worthy Matron-elect. The duty of this committee shall be to investigate all cases among the Chapter membership where dire need is known to exist and report the circumstances to the Worthy

Matron. This Committee with the consent of the Worthy Matron shall be authorized to draw upon the Emergency Welfare Fund to meet such pressing needs of any member.

A fund of \$200.00 known as the "Emergency Welfare Fund" shall be set aside for the use of the committee to be taken from the Treasury and replenished from same. The expenditure of any money from this fund shall be made only after a written statement of the case signed by the chairman and two other members of the committee and by the Worthy Matron.

Section 2. Such other committees, or chairmen of committees shall be appointed by the Worthy Matron as she deems necessary, or as the Chapter may authorize, or as the Grand Chapter may require.

Article X. AMENDMENTS:

SECTION 1. Worded the same as former Article XII. Section 1.

RULES OF ORDER

Second. When a sister or brother arises to speak she shall respectfully address the chair and if she transgresses the rules of the Chapter in speaking or otherwise, the chair shall call her to order when she shall immediately sit down unless permitted to explain.

All other numbers under Rules of Order to remain the same.

Add: Thirteenth. In all cases and upon all questions unless otherwise provided, a majority vote of all members present shall govern.

Fourteenth. The Worthy Matron, or in her absence the person presiding at the time of the approval of the minutes of the Chapter, shall sign them, whether she be the regularly installed officer or acting pro-tem.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- Q. May we solicit Ads for Calendars to be sold as a benefit for our Chapter. The Ads would be solicited in the name of the Chapter, and the revenue over a stated amount, plus a profit on each Calendar sold would come to the Chapter?
- A. According to a ruling of our Grand Chapter, Advertising may be solicited if value received is given; however I question whether the merchant would receive the true value of the advertising. We should always keep in mind the Good of the Order and try to uphold its dignity in our respective communities. Answer—No.
- Q. Can our Charter be draped for more than one deceased member, or must the drape remain on for the full 30 days for each deceased member?
- A. The Charter can be draped for more than one member; the Worthy Matron reads the name or names of each departed member.
- Q. Our Charter is now draped, the 30 day period has not expired, two more members have passed away, should the drape remain on for a total of 90 days?
- A. No. The Worthy Matron announces the passing of the two members, and that the Charter will remain draped another 30 concurrent days.

- Q. Would the above ruling apply to draping the Altar?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Can we sell Eastern Star Stamps as a Ways & Means Project?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Can a subordinate Chapter have a dance as a benefit?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Does the Worthy Matron have to pick her colors from the colors we have in our Chapter, or can any color be used?
- A. Our law says that all sister Officers must be dressed in white at all Chapter Meetings. I would say that any color may be selected so long as it is used only for programs or decorations for social affairs, and not as part of any regular Chapter meeting, or Ritualistic Ceremony.
- Q. I am under the impression that we can not sell chances on anything, but can we do as the Firemen, and have the word donation on the tickets?
- A. I refer you to approved recommendations No. 23, and 24. I do not believe we would be upholding the dignity of our Order by merely substituting the word donation for chance.
- Q. Our Chapter has been asked to sell tickets for the benefit of our local Library. Is this permissible?
- A. I would say that this decision should be made by the majority of your members. Approved recommendation states: "That the sale of anything in the Chapter Room be prohibited".
- Q. A member of a Chapter in this jurisdiction has expressed a desire to affiliate with our Chapter. She has paid current dues and holds a 1957 membership card in her present Chapter. How does she go about transferring her membership?
- A. The member notifies her present Chapter in writing that she is making application for membership in your Chapter. When elected your Secretary under the Seal of the Chapter notifies the Secretary of her former Chapter, who will send a Demit to your Chapter. When Demit is received the applicant signs your Chapters' Byretary sends to the Secretary of her former Chapter. Your Chapter issues a 1957 card. The former Chapter upon receipt of the 1957 for the balance of 1957.



Our receipts for the day were \$3,864.26, including \$30.00 from 1955.

Our expenditures \$695.46

Leaving a balance clear \$3,168.80

On September 13, 1956 we paid a visit to the Delaware Day School for Handicapped Children and presented them with a gift of \$2,000.00, to be divided between the 3 schools, one in each county.

On October 21, 1956 a Caravan of the members made a visit to the Shriners' Hospital for Crippled Children in Philadelphia, Pa. and presented them with a check for \$1,000.00.

A request from our Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Florence A. Plummer for a gift to the Korean Hospital was received, and our Worthy Grand Matron instructed the Grand Secretary to send a check for \$50.00 for this project.

A check for \$10.00 was also sent to the Organization for Crippled Children and Adults for a Bond which they sent to us as an interest in this organization.

This leaves a balance of \$108.80.

Our Worthy Grand Patron will purchase lumber and make a collapsible outside stand to be the property of the Grand Chapter, and can be used each year. This will eliminate having to borrow lumber each year for a stand.

We thank our Asso. Grand Patron Brother John Conley (who was called away on business) for his telegram of good wishes for a successful day.

We are greatly indebted to our past Grand Patron, Brother I. Kendall Gibbs for his efforts in securing 10-100 lb. bags of potatoes which were given to us by Mason Brothers, Hallwood, Va. and to Mr. Benjamin Cohen for our tickets and posters which were donated by Story Printing Company. To the Melody Makers who furnished entertainment and music for dancing, and to Victory Chapter for their part in helping to get the school started in Dover, Delaware.

Our Summer Benefit this year will be held on Saturday, June 15, 1957, in the Richardson Park School.

Your Worthy Matron has tickets and will notify your chapter the table she has selected, and I hope you will all do your part to make this affair outstanding. Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, I thank you sincerely for appointing me Chairman for this Grand Chapter Project, and hope the efforts of your committee and the success of the Summer Benefit has pleased you. I am sure we did our best, and we have a great feeling of satisfaction to know we have brought some sunshine to these children who are less fortunate than our own, and to lighten the burden of their parents.

During the past year, I have taken a very pleasant journey throughout the Eastern Star World, the mode of travel being by the proceedings of other Grand Jurisdictions.

As I traveled from Maine to California, from Puerto Rico to British Columbia, with a little time out for a side trip to Scotland, I have been permitted to stand in magnificent churches, beautiful temples and auditoriums, decorated with nature's loveliest flowers, each setting bringing to light and life, the watchword, the motto, or favorite Scripture of a Worthy Grand Matron.

The Holy Bible rests on the Altar of all Grand Chapters and Prayer is a vital part of each Session.

Impressive memorials are given in loving tribute to those who have answered the "Good Shepherd's Call".

Our National Emblem is our most honored guest at each meeting. In the Chapters of our States along the Canadian border the Union Jack and the Stars and Stripes stand side by side, symbolic of the friendship between the two great nations.

The magnitude of our Order has gone far and beyond any dream of Doctor Robert Morris who in 1850 wove the divine threads of "Charity, Truth and Loving Kindness" into a beautiful pattern and called it the Order of the Eastern Star.

We are today the largest fraternal organization in the world to which both men and women belong, having a membership of over 3,000,000. It is international in scope, comprising four sovereign bodies:

The General Grand Chapter
Supreme Grand Chapter of Scotland
and the independent Grand Chapters of New York and New
Jersey.

The General Grand Chapter has been organized since 1876—with jurisdiction over 58 Grand Chapters including 46 States, the District of Columbia and the Provinces of Canada and Puerto Rico. It also has direct supervision over subordinate Chapters in Alaska, Bermuda, Cuba, Mexico, Philippine Islands, Guam, Hawaiian Islands, China, Japan, Canal Zone, Yukon area and Germany.

Our International Eastern Star Temple, located in Washington, D. C., is the headquarters of General Grand Chapter. The Temple's magnificent interior houses fifty-four rooms, priceless and rare furniture, rugs and treasures as well as valuable O. E. S. records and documents. This Temple is maintained by dividends from a trust fund established from receipts of "One dollar per member in a life time".

The International Peace Garden is a tract of land situated between North Dakota and Canada which was established in 1932 as a memorial to the friendship between the two countries. Plots in this garden have been allotted to the Order of the Eastern Star and it is the hope that in the near future something of beauty will be placed there which is symbolic of our Order.

Since it would be impossible to include in this report all the interesting details of each Grand Jurisdiction, I have selected some of the highlights to share with you.

Arkansas—Worthy Grand Martha attended the Session. Since the Star Point, Martha, was honored, Sister Helen West extended the welcome to the Marthas of Subordinate Chapters.

Colorado—A Mother and her six daughters and a sister-in-law were initiated on the Official Visit of the Worthy Grand Matron. At one Chapter meeting, the Worthy Grand Matron was presented a real live burro.

Michigan is the oldest Grand Chapter.

Ohio has the largest membership.

Illinois has the largest number of Chapters.

Montana—Each member pays one dollar towards Estarl, and over \$12,000 was contributed, enabling a Chair of Religion

to be established at Rocky Mountain College. This jurisdiction has placed a gold piano in the International Temple, in honor of Sister Anna Smalley, Past Most Worthy Grand Matron.

Pennsylvania—To Pennsylvania goes the distinction of being the home of our Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Florence Plummer. This Grand Jurisdiction supports three homes.

Utah—One Chapter in Utah, the ladies wove their own labyrinth rug.

I would like to thank Sisters Mildred and Eliza, for their able assistance in reviewing with me the proceedings from other Grand Jurisdictions, and we unite in thanking our Grand Secretary, Sister Elizabeth Fisher, for her promptness in forwarding the proceedings.

Worthy Grand Matron, we thank you for the privilege of serving as Fraternal Correspondents.

May I report to you on the meeting of the Delaware Order of the Eastern Star Building Corporation which was held on November 30, 1956 at its office 912, West Street.

At the present time there are only three bodies retaining stock in this corporation. They are Grand Chapter of Delaware with two (2)

shares; Julia M. Story Chapter No. 3 with eighty-five shares and Radiant Chapter No. 6 with sixty (60) shares.

The present members appointed to represent the above bodies are Mrs. Pauline Davis, Mr. Chas. V. Cleaver and Mrs. Jane Zebley respectively.

We three voted for the new officers of the corporation with the following result. President, Mrs. Jane Zebley; Secretary, Mr. Charles V. Cleaver and Treasurer, Mrs. Pauline Davis.

Mrs. Davis read the treasurer's report which showed income from interest amounted to \$78.90 and expenses of corporation file fee and safe deposit box rent for \$11.60 leaving net gain of \$67.30.

The corporation had two (2) U. S. Bonds that matured and it was decided to cash these bonds and place the \$2000.00 in the Wilmington Savings Fund account at 3% interest.

The total worth of the 147 shares as of November 30th, 1956 amounts to \$4,845.85 or a book value of a little over \$33.00 per share.

We are most anxious that this corporation shall fulfill its mission and be able to secure a building for the five Wilmington chapters. Your suggestions will be greatly appreciated.

SPEECH OF MOST WORTHY GRAND MATRON

Sister FLORENCE PLUMMER

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, my co-workers in General Grand Chapter, Distinguished East, Officers and members of our Order:

Truly, looking at my watch, I would have begged off if I had been going to be here to speak tomorrow because I don't want to spoil your Session by making of it an endurance test. Now up here on this platform they have a clock—it isn't set but it is used for the limitation of speeches. So you folks don't know what you're in for.

First, I'd like to say a very glad thank you for the free atmosphere which I have again found in this Grand Chapter. I have been coming to Delaware for many years and the Past Grands have heard me say that I rate Delaware and Maryland close to my heart because in General Grand Chapter they stood with my own Jurisdiction, when I was elected, and that is my outstanding picture of this triangle of three states. So there is really a big place in my heart for the members of this and the Maryland Jurisdictions.

I have many thanks to offer. I would like to say thank you first to the Worthy Grand Matron for her corsage, for her using my gavel, for having her reports read when I was awake enough to enjoy them and digest them and then I would like to say that I am grateful to this Jurisdiction because they have given to me the privilege of having to me to have Sister Helen. It has meant a great deal very sure that Delaware is pleased to be represented by her in that

I noticed when a report was read—I think it was Sister Elvira that read it—she said the project of the Most Worthy Grand Matron. I would like to tell you that I have no new projects. They are being brought up to have a belief in a Supreme Being, to know that there is an all loving father and so I think that we are very fortunate that in our funds we have a bit of money that we can use for charitable purposes and that has not been used for other purposes and so this was used for that, after the Masons started that project. The officer who started this hospital is now stationed in Fort Meade, many of you know how they rotate them. Perhaps some of the men who are not nearly so interested now will be so later and we are glad as members of the Eastern Star to be able to tide them over.

I have a jumble of notes here and I hope you will bear with me as I speak of them. I was astonished when I heard of Sister Elizabeth's plan to retire. I know the Grand Chapter of Delaware has had a very good friend in Sister Fisher and wherever she is and whatever she does, she has my best wishes that whatever she does will bring her happiness and contentment. And may you never lose a friend, Sister Elizabeth.

I think most of you know how proud I was tonight when my own Worthy Grand Matron and Patron were presented and then Sister Care's corps of Grand Officers. There has been a close tie between the two of us. In 1955 when I served in Pennsylvania, Sister Edith Care was my Grand Marshal and now she is Grand Matron and never was a mother hen more proud than I am. I saw two girls from Korea given an award—one is going back as a medical missionary and one as a teacher in the school where she first saw the light. Such teachings as these, going on in far off places must of necessity bring some results. At most they will help bring about some understanding and with understanding comes peace, and isn't that what we're all laboring for?

I have just returned from a trip around the world. I have seen the evidence of bombing. I have seen the evidence in the cemeteries of the dear ones who died and in every National Cemetery I placed a wreath in memory of those sons whose mothers or sisters could not be there to place them.

On that which is still above water of the Arizona, I floated a lei, thinking and saying, "Dear God, let not their sacrifice be in vain."

Sisters and Brothers, through Estarl you are doing your best to bring about understanding and to bring about peace in this world. So I congratulate you in having made it a part of your program.

Sister Plummer spoke of the bandages being made in British Columbia which are never marked British Columbia, but always marked O. E. S. They are for the sufferers of cancer from the smallest to the largest.

Sisters and Brothers, it is a privilege to belong to an organization such as this. It is a privilege to do your bit, to bring joy into the lives of others. We couldn't begin to do what we are doing "but inasmuch as ye have done it for the least of these my children ye have done it unto me," is the word of our Master.

May I, and what I have said to you plant a seed in your heart that will bring forth fruits and may you feel richly rewarded for the part in which you have taken in furthering His work.

Again, my deepest appreciation for the courtesies extended to me and my time hasn't yet run out on the clock. Good-night.

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Members of the Order of Eastern Star in Delaware,

Dear Sisters and Brothers:

Each year seems to go by more swiftly as we grow older, and once again it is time to make our report to you.

Due to illness and an operation, your V. A. Hospital Chairman has been less active at the Veterans Hospital on a weekly work basis, but our Chapters have not "fallen down" on their part.

We have taken parties to the 6-E, 7-E and W, and to the 8th floor patients on a one-night-a-month schedule, and the patients and staff at the hospital have enjoyed and appreciated them. Letters were received from Dr. W. Major Gasper, Manager of the V. A. Hospital, and copies were sent to each Chapter chairman. Delaware Chapter No. 1 took one of the parties on July 9th, a hot dog roast with all the trimmings. This was to have been an outdoor affair but due to weather conditions it was held indoors. On October 8th, a few members of Delaware Chapter took a similar party to the same floor, the 7th. The patients enjoy the friendliness of our members at these parties as well as the prizes and refreshments which are always in good taste. We are permitted to play bingo as there is no money involved and it is just a game for those attending.

Your chairman, and Sister Helen M. Welsh who is a member of Five Points Chapter No. 13, and an oriented volunteer at the V. A. Hospital served again as pages for the doctors at the New Castle County Medical Society meeting which is held once a year at the Veterans Hospital. This is the eighth year your chairman has served in this capacity, which she considers an honor.

"Hospital Day" was observed on Friday, May 10th, and your chairman was again treasurer for the booklet, and again made more than 200 "dogwood" boutonnieres for the women guests. The cost for these is assumed by the Veterans Administration Volunteer Service committee.

At the request of our Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, contributions were made at the time of the Grand Visitation to each chapter and the proceeds of Electa's Cup were given to your chairman who, in turn, purchased hobby materials which were used by bed patients to help wile away long tedious hours.
