AMMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

December 21, 1957

Approved the proposed amendments to By-Laws of Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8.

Article I-Meeting

Section 3. Change to read—The stated meeting of this Chapter shall be held on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month at 8:00 P. M., except July, August and the Fourth Thursdays of November and December, and when the meeting conflicts with the Annual

Session of the Grand Chapter. Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the Worthy Matron, due notice having been given the members and only such business transacted as may be specified in the notice.

Article IX-Powers and Duties of Officers

Section 3. Change to read—The treasurer shall receive all money from the Secretary, give her receipt therefore, and pay all orders drawn by the Chapter when signed by the Worthy Matron and countersigned by the Secretary and Treasurer. She shall give at the first meeting of each month, a report of the balance in the checking account of the Chapter.

Article XII-Delete.

Section 2.—Which will become Section 8 of Article IX, Powers and Duties of Officers. Change to read—The Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron and Associate Matron shall constitute the Finance Committee which shall examine all bills and accounts of the indebtedness rendered against the Chapter. All bills must be approved by not less than two members of the committee.

The following sentence from Section I Relief to become (d) section of Section I, Article IX, Powers and Duties of Officers.

The Worthy Matron may on report of the Relief Committee, if the case is of pressing necessity, draw an order upon the Treasurer for an amount not exceeding Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and the order so drawn shall be sufficient voucher to the Treasurer to pay same.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- Q. Is it possible for our Grand Secretary Emeritus to be presented, and if so, when?
- A. Having consulted the Jurisprudence Committee, it was decided that our Grand Secretary Emeritus be presented after the presentation of Grand Officers at Birthday Parties and Official Visits.
- Q. Is the discontinuance of all boundary lines to be effective at once or does it come up for a second reading?
- A. This is not in effect until the second reading.
- Q. Would it be necessary for the slips which are to be filled out by members and visitors before entering Chapter to be saved and filed?
- A. I see no reason why these slips should be saved, as each person signs the registers. These slips may be destroyed after each meeting.
- Q. The Guide Book states that the Chaplain makes the Salutation Sign before offering prayer, in as much as the Ritual does not state either way, which is correct?
- A. We will do just as instructed at School of Instruction (no sign made)
 The Guide Book was accepted as a whole by Grand Chapter, so
 with this exception, we will follow the Guide Book along with our
 Ritual.
- Q. Can a visitor be admitted during initiation?
- A. No, all visitors must be admitted prior to the entrance of candidates (Meaning when the Associate Conductress retires to prepare the candidate, no one is admitted).
- Q. Would you explain the term "in advance" in regard to payment of dues and suspension?

- A. Refer to Constitution and Laws— Page 48— Section 28.
 My example: If a member receives notice for non-payment of dues in December of 1956 and does not pay said dues by December 31, 1957, after having this year of grace, I would say he or she would be suspended.
- Q. When a member demits from his or her Chapter, does not affiliate with another Chapter, but wishes to rejoin his or her own Chapter, what is the procedure?
- A. In as much as a demit divorces said member from that Chapter, the member must rejoin by affiliation.
- Q. Can a member be admitted during Installation of Officers?
- A. No one can be admitted during Installation, after the roll call of officers.
- Q. If, for any reason, the Worthy Matron elect cannot be present for Installation, would it be possible to postpone the Installation?
- A. I would say no, because, the reason that keeps the Worthy Matron elect from being present may be serious enough to make it necessary for her to be absent for some length of time.
- On two occasions a Chapter asked if their meeting could be cancelled due to severe storm.
- A. A stated meeting cannot be cancelled, if there is a quorum, it must be opened and closed. Refer to Constitution and Law, Page 41, Section 1 and 2.

IRREGULARITIES

- 1. Secretaries making checks for special dispensations payable to the Worthy Grand Matron instead of the Grand Chapter of Delaware.
- 2. All sister officers not wearing white at ALL Chapter meetings.
- 3. Crossing between the East and Altar when Bible is opened.
- 4. Proposed amendments to By-Laws of Chapters sent to the Worthy Grand Matron, without the Seal of the Chapter. Sisters and Brothers, these irregularities have not been noted in the spirit of criticism or unkindness BUT in order that they may be corrected.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend we discontinue the present slips, and instead, use cards marked VOUCHED or VOUCHED FOR, which could be used repeatedly, eliminating unnecessary expense. These cards to be given each person by the Conductress or Associate Conductress, when showing Membership Cards at the door. These vouchers to be collected when proving the Chapter.

The stated meeting of this Chapter shall be held on the first and third Thursday in each month (no meeting in July and August) at 8:00 P.M.

Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the Worthy Matron, due notice having been given the members and only such business transacted as may be specified in the notice. When a stated meeting of this Chapter conflicts with the Grand Chapter or when the first meeting in January falls on January 1, Holy Thursday and emergencies (as declared by the state) such meetings shall be omitted.

Approved with the exception of the word emergencies—your emergencies should be explained.

SECTION 3-No change.

Article II

Section 1—Page 6 add.

5. Treasurer Report

6. Communications (other numbers thereafter to agree)

Article III and IV-No change.

Article V-No change.

Section 1—Change to read:

The fee for conferring degrees in this Chapter shall be fifteen (15) dollars and for affiliation Five (5) dollars which shall include dues for remainder of year. All petitions must be accompanied by prescribed fees.

Section 2—Delete the word June.

SECTION 3 and 4—No change.

Article VI

Section 1—Change to read:

All petitions for membership shall be in writing, accompanied by fee, filled in and signed by the Petitioner and recommended by two members of this Chapter, which petition shall be read at a regular meeting and referred to a committee of three for investigation, and laid over until the next regular meeting.

Section 2—No change.

Section 3—Omit completely and substitute:

Investigating Committee, The committee to which a petition is referred must be composed of three, two sisters and one brother. Members appointed on the Investigating Committee may visit the petitioner if they so desire. Any investigation should be made thoroughly and discreetly and more or less secretly.

SECTION 4, 5 and 6-No change.

SECTION 7—Omit completely (changing numbers to following sections to agree).

Sections 8 and 9—No change.

Section 10—Change to read:

Application for all demits must be made in writing and signed by sister or brother desiring it and must be read in open Chapter at the next regular meeting. If all dues are paid and no charges are pending it shall be granted.

SECTION 11—Add:

That in case of removal from this jurisdiction to another in this Grand Jurisdiction any sister or brother desiring a demit for the purpose of joining another Chapter, in this Grand Jurisdiction, shall have the right to petition such other Chapter for membership upon first giving written notice to this Chapter of such intention and read at the next regular meeting. Refer to 23A—page 47, Constitution and Laws.

Article VII

Section 1—No change.

SECTION 2—Add:

They shall each year before the installation purchase a Past Matron and Past Patron Jewel to be presented to said officers upon their retirement as token of this Chapter's appreciation of their services rendered. In case of a Patron having a Jewel a check for \$25.00 will be given.

SECTION 3—Added:

They be responsible for the purchase and maintain all paraphernalia including cleaning and repairing. If requested they shall advise any who wish to give gifts to the Chapter as to what is needed.

Article VIII

SECTION 1 and 2-No change.

SECTION 3—Change to read:

The Worthy Matron shall appoint a committee of three whose duty it shall be to provide and direct some musical, literary, or other entertainment for each meeting of the Chapter when the regular exercises of the Chapter do not engross the full time of such meeting. Such committee to hold office until their successors are appointed.

Section 4—Change to read:

The Worthy Matron shall appoint a committee of three or more whose duty it shall be to visit all members reported sick and if needing watchers, see that such are provided.

The Associate Matron shall be in complete charge of the Annual Barquet given for the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron. She shall appoint the committee.

Article X-No change.

Article XI

Section 1—Change to read:

The Secretary shall keep a true and faithful record of the proceedings of the Chapter and make the annual report to the Grand Chapter. She shall keep strict account of all dues and fees between the Chapter and each member respectively, shall collect all monies due the Chapter and pay the same immediately to the Treasurer; she shall deliver to her successor in office all property belonging to the Chapter and perform such other duties as may pertain to her office, for which service she shall receive the sum of Fifty (50) dollars per year.

Section 2-No change.

Section 2—To become section 3—change to read

The Treasurer of this Chapter shall receive all money from the Secretary give her a receipt therefore and pay all orders approved by the Chapter when signed by the Worthy Matron and the Secretary. She shall at the annual meeting in January report in writing a full account of all monies received and paid out by her during the past year and deliver to her successor in office all monies, books and papers

(b)—Change to read

The Treasurer shall received a salary for her or his services the sum of Fifteen (15) dollars per year.

- (c)— No change
- (d)— Add

The Sentinel shall receive Five (5) dollars.

Section 4—(number should be changed to agree) Change to read:

No officer of the Chapter shall receive salaries for services except the Secretary, Treasurer, Pianist and Sentinel.

Article XII

Section 1—Changed to read:

No alterations or amendments to these By-Laws shall be made unless the same shall be proposed in writing at a regular meeting when it shall be entered on the minutes and all members notified in writing of this action before the next regular meeting, lay over until the second regular meeting, when, if two-thirds of the members present vote in the affirmative the amendment shall be adopted, except that any law, ruling or edict of the Grand Chapter altering these By-Laws has the effect of an amendment without any action on the part of the Chapter.

AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS OF NEWARK CHAPTER NO. 10 NOT APPROVED

Article VIII

SECTION 5—Added.

There shall be committee of instruction consisting of the Worthy Patron, Jr. Past Matron and Jr. Past Patron whose duties it shall be to make new members proficient in the secret work of the order and test oath. *Refer to Constitution and Laws, Page 25—Section 8, (1)—My impression is that this is the duty of the Deputy.

Article IX

Section 1—(A)—Change to read:

The decision of the Worthy Matron on any Question before the Chapter which has not been voted upon by the Chapter shall be final and conclusive and there can be no appeal from her decision except to the Worthy Grand Matron or Grand Chapter.

ALL Chapter business must be approved by the Chapter.

AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS OF GRAND CHAPTER AS PROPOSED BY VICTORY CHAPTER No. 15

MAY 1, 1958

SECTION 57-By-Laws of the Grand Chapter of Delaware.

Under the present system of balloting on the petitions of applicants for membership in the Order, the time comsumed by a large

attendance of members voting on several petitions in one meeting is such as to actually discourage attendance when a ballot is likely to be spread.

In the belief that everything possible should be done to encourage attendance at Chapter meetings, the following proposed amendment to Section 57 of the By-Laws is requested in order that it will be possible for the presiding officer to direct that a collective ballot be spread, if such is deemed desirable by the Chapter.

Amend Section 57, under the heading of "Ballot", by deleting the last sentence of the second paragraph which now reads:

"The Associate Conductress shall have charge of the ballot box under the direction of the presiding officer. She shall carry it to every member present, or may place it on the Altar as directed. No discussion of a candidate shall be allowed in open Chapter. Every candidate must be elected by a separate ballot".

Will after amendment read:

"The Associate Conductress shall have charge of the ballot box under the direction of the presiding officer. She shall carry it to every member present, or may place it on the Altar as directed. No discussion of a candidate shall be allowed in open Chapter".

Answer:

I cannot approve this amendment to permit collective balloting, as I do not have the authority to change the Constitution and Laws of the Grand Chapter.

My duties as Grand Patron have been extremely light, but at all times I have endeavored to fulfill them to the best of my ability. I trust my record of service will meet with your approval.


SCHOOL OF INSTRUCTION

POSTSCHLIESSFACH 677, KARLSRUHE, GERMANY

Re: Your Parcel(s)

Dear Sisters and Brothers:

Many times you may have wondered to what use those packages of old clothes, etc. that were sent to Hope Chapter were put. During the past year or so we have been most fortunate in receiving letters and reports from the families to whom these packages were sent. To explain to you, ourselves, the effect that those packages have, would be trite and very dull, but excerpts and little facts extracted from the letters and reports that we have received from behind the Iron Curtain will, I am sure, more than adequately repay you for the time and trouble and EXPENSE that you went to in sending these packages. Although this letter may be long, I feel sure that it will be most interesting to all of you to take the time to read its contents. A Polish friend has translated the main portion of the reports. While she was still a Polish citizen, she paid the duty tax on the Parcels that went behind the Iron Curtain. She also assisted in removing the American labels in the clothing to prevent reprisal. Today I want to share with you the happiness of people you have helped. We want you to realize that a magic power is hidden in your gifts and that the fact that you think of them and choose your gifts with such care means just as much as the material gift. You will notice that your cast-away clothes are

"new" clothes to them and that in all their misery they have kept a subtle sense of humor.

1. A Polish maiden, named Fella, was 12 when the war broke out and she never had a good time. She has already lost hope that she will ever get married because hunger and worry have made her look much older than she is, and she is always dressed in dark clothes. The lady for whom she works wrote us, "You have really missed something. What a pity you could not see Fella's face when the parcel arrived. She was overwhelmed by its contents and so excited about the red pullover. She was so happy that everything fitted her as though it had been made for her with the exception of the suit which was too small for her. But that was just as well because her conscience told her that she should share her treasures with her sister, still poorer than she is, and if it had fitted her, I am afraid she could never have parted with it!" And among other things, Fella, herself writes, "but most of all I like the red pullover. It seems to be my color, but I never knew that because I have never owned anything red in all my life. I would never have discovered it because I could never have bought a red pullover. There are always so many expenses. I have to send money to my father and to my sister and for myself I can rarely buy anything. So I thank you once more very cordially, and I thank your friends, too, that they think of me and send me all these clothes, although they do not know me."

Letter No. 3 was from an artist and his wife. He is a painter of frescoes in churches. The wife wrote, "Your parcel arrived in the afternoon. We planned to attend church that night. My husband quickly tried on the suit, and it fitted him beautifully. I pressed it quickly so that he could wear it, and on the way to church, I kept looking at him . . . at this elegant gentleman walking by my side, wondering whether that really was my own husband! Friends and acquaintances keep on asking where he has these wonderful clothes from as the quality is so utterly different from anything we see here. And these people are not people who are concentrated on materialistic things, but these clothes make my husband look so different. As for myself, I am impatiently waiting for the fall. I love the woolen dress you sent, and do write me, please, if I can have the green coat, too. You did not write whether it was for me or for my sister. It has such a beautiful lining, and I shall probably have to sell my fur coat, which I still have from the good old times, as we need money for other things now. Many, many thanks to all your kind friends.

The fourth letter is about the 16 year old son of a former book-keeper who has not worked several years because of T.B., and his which serves as a kitchen as well. Father and son are extremely tall. They were so badly dressed that they were literally in rags and what the Grandmother wrote, "People in the street stare at my grandson and ask him what piece of luck he has had that he can afford to

dress so well. My grandson looks like an English Lord when he walks in town!" This grandmother is 79, a doctor's widow. Her old age pension amounts to about \$6.00 a month. She cannot afford even a room of her own and spends a few weeks here and a few weeks there, helping with housework and mending, as she says, she must earn her right to die somewhere in peace. She enthusiastically tells everybody how unknown in Germany and America have completely clothed her family!

The fifth letter from a Polish teacher, 50 years old, tells how she has lived for years in a small cubicle that could not be heated, and now she has a room of her own. She wrote, "I can hardly express in words what these clothes mean to me. You know that I love beautiful things, and my old worn out clothes made me so depressed. The lovely things you sent me made me feel like a different human being—more like the woman I was before the war. It makes me feel good that people in the street look at my clothes with admiration. These clothes and my new room have completely raised the level of my life.

No. 6 a college teacher of music, 44 years old, who, like so many others, got T. B. from undernourishment and overwork, received her parcel a few hours before leaving for a sanatorium. In the parcel happened to be a white woolen jacket and some bright dresses, which not only will keep her warm in the mountains, but has helped her to get over her depressed state of mind.

Letter No. 7 comes from a lady in Eastern Germany to whom we sent a red woolen dress because she is an organist in an unheated church. She sent a special note saying, "Every morning I slip into my red woolen dress, and I say, "Thank you, kind giver!" Since her husband is connected with the church, also, their position is rather precarious.

We gave two jackets to a University student from the Eastern Zone. When he put one on, he looked so different that we gasped and asked him what was the matter with his old jacket. He said, "I don't wonder that you asked. I wore that at my confirmation when I was 14." Now he is 24!

We send parcels to a doctor in the Eastern Zone. She is a widow with 5 children of her own. What she cannot use, she gives to her patients. Summer and winter she drives an open car, from the year 1938, and she is a country doctor. After sending her some sheets, she wrote, "The sheets were most welcome. My own got very hard wear when I had a small maternity hospital in my own house after the end of the war. Our sheets have so many patches that they look like the map of Germany before World War I!"

I think this gives you some idea of the good the Eastern Star Relief packages are doing in Europe. Keep them coming, and we'll pass them on.

REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

I am thankful for the strength and care that my Heavenly Father has given me to finish this year as Grand Secretary, when at times with the illness in my family I felt the load was too heavy to bear.

When it comes time to give a report of the year's work, every little detail has an importance of it's own, but small details must be eliminated for lack of time and space, but I assure you from the smallest to the greatest they have received my careful attention.

One of the first duties was a letter sent to the bank with cards enclosed bearing the signatures of the Officers whose names should be honored on our checks.

Official Lists of Grand Officers, Committees, Subordinate Chapter Officers, Official Visits, etc. were printed in booklet form and mailed to all members entitled to receive them.

Stationery was ordered and printed for the Worthy Grand Matron and Grand Secretary.

Jewels were ordered for the out going Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron.

Due cards in sufficient number for membership in each of our 18 chapters were ordered sent to all of our Secretaries.

All bills of Grand Chapter were paid as soon as presented.

Flowers were sent to Shut-ins and fruit taken to Sister M. Etta Keys as directed by Grand Chapter, and Sympathy plants to those bereaved. Letters of thanks were written as requested by Sessions and Necrology Committees.

Supplies have been kept on hand and re-ordered when stocks became low.

Proceedings were compiled and mailed to all those entitled to receive them.

Proceedings from Sister Grand Jurisdictions have been acknowledged and mailed to Grand Representatives and a copy of each given to our Fraternal Correspondent.

Invitations to Grand Sessions of other Jurisdictions have been acknowledged with fraternal greetings and good wishes.

Immediately after the receipt of the Annual Abstract from each Chapter, the membership was totaled and a check covering 10c for each member was sent to General Grand Chapter to be credited on their books to the Estarl Fund and then returned to be deposited in

our local Estarl Fund. The check this year was in the amount of \$327.00

As our Order grows, few realize the vast amount of correspondence, orders, reports, supplies and many tasks performed over and above the call of duty, which are handled through the office, yet never recorded.

The work of the Order though written differently is basically the same. We all give the same Obligation and learn the same lessons. In every jurisdiction we read of unsurpassed good being done. Each has one or more wonderful projects being sponsored; Cancer Dressings, Shrine Hospital, Home for the Aged, Crippled Children, Welfare at Home and Abroad, to name a few and millions of dollars are spent each year to relieve sickness and distress.

We realize that special guidance must be given our youth of today, for they are the Builders of tomorrow. Therefore, it is most gratifying to learn that all Grand jurisdictions sponsor either Rainbow for Girls or Job's Daughters and many sponsor both. DeMolay for boys is sponsored in many states also. REPORT OF THE SUMMER BENEFIT JUNE 15, 1957

In the New Testament we are taught that willingness and voluntary service to others is the highest duty and glory in life, and it is with this thought in mind that I bring you this report of the Committee for the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron's project for this Grand Chapter year, the Summer Benefit for Handicapped Children, which was held June 15, 1957 in the Richardson Park School.

Our thanks to Noble Benjamin Cohen of the Story Printing Company, for the donation of our tickets for this benefit, and to the Board frustees of the Richardson Park School for the use of the building

Our net profit was \$2,614.16, of this amount \$145.00 was contributed through the Worthy Grand Matron's Bouquet for Handicapped Children. This was given by the Subordinate Chapters to our Worthy Grand Matron on her official visits in the form of money tied

to plants, candles, corsages, nosegays, fans and even held by a doll. Sister Sarah you are to be congratulated in sacrificing your flowers that some child might take his or her place in this world through this contribution.

A gift of \$5.00 was sent to our Grand Secretary from a Rug Manufacturer in California, so you see Sisters and Brothers your deeds will follow after you.

On Friday evening October 4, 1957 it was my happy privilege to be a guest at the Potentate's Ball given by Nur Temple at the Du-Pont Country Club, and on behalf of the Grand Chapter of Delaware O.E.S. presented to the Illustrious Potentate C. B. Harris a check for \$1000.00 for the Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

This amount has been set up as an endowment fund in the name of the Grand Chapter of Delaware O.E.S. in the Chase National Bank of Philadelphia.

On October 6, 1957 accompanied by several members of the Grand Chapter we paid a visit to the Delaware Day School for Handicapped Children and presented a check for \$1,000.00 to the President of the Board of Trustees, Mr. Thomas Brand, and through the Grand Secretary's office a check for \$100.00 was sent to the Pusan Hospital in Korea.

On April 20, 1958 a caravan of about 85 Sisters and Brothers and friends of our Order paid a visit to the Shriners Hospital in Philadelphia and presented to the Hospital 102 toys for the younger patients and 8 mismated shoes which had been given to me by Frankford Chapter No. 12 and on May 20, 1958 Mr. C. B. Harris delivered to the Hospital 45 toys, games and model boats and airplanes to be given to the older patients, making a total of 147 toys.

Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, your committee wishes to thank you for the appointment to serve on this wonderful committee, and if we have pleased you we are happy in our service to this grand body, and to the Sisters and Brothers who made all this possible, as we could not have done it alone.

The Summer Benefit for 1958 will be held Saturday June 21, 1958 in the Richardson Park School and your committee hopes you will do your very best to make this year bigger and better, and when your Worthy Matron asks you for a contribution, give it willingly.

And now let us continue our journey down Memory Lane to the year

1922 - 1923

Sister Amy E. Meyer, Worthy Grand Matron

Sister Meyer is our senior Past Grand Matron in years of service and the second Grand Matron of this Grand Chapter. Our sister is still active in the work and interested in the welfare of this Grand Body.

1924 - 1925

Sister Corrine Timmons, Worthy Grand Matron, had as her guiding motto Peace, Harmony and Service, and from reading her proceedings we are sure that all three were in evidence during her leadership.

1925 - 1926

Sister Louise Green, Worthy Grand Matron

Grand Chapter has now reached the five year mark, and under the capable leadership of Sister Green much good was accomplished for the betterment of Eastern Star in Delaware.

1927 - 1928

Bro. Thomas B. Pepper, W.G.P.

Bro. Pepper served this Grand Chapter with Sister Rose Newlin and they both used the Golden Rule as their guide throughout their year of stewardship.

1929 - 1930

Sister Mattie Pyle Horn Worthy Grand Matron

During this Grand Session much was accomplished in forming of the laws of this Grand Body, and it was at this Session the Opening Ceremony was adopted.

1930 - 1931

Sister Irma Baker Barr, W. G. M. Bro. Walter E. Sawdon, W. G. P.

This was the ending of the first decade in the forming of this Grand Chapter, and Sister Barr and Bro. Sawdon were both well pleased with the strides made in the first ten years. Our Grand Chapter has now grown from the original eight Chapters in 1921 with a membership of 1,488 to thirteen Chapters with a membership of 1,987.

1931 - 1932

Sister Clower asked for the support and cooperation of the Grand Chapter, and after reading the reports of her year of stewardship we are sure she received all this.

1932 - 1933

Sister Anna Belle Sauter, W. G. M.

Sister Sauter and Bro. Grover MacNamee presided over the twelfth annual session. This session was honored by The First Lady of The Land, Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt who presented a gavel to Sister Sauter. It was at this session that Job's Daughters was first sponsored.

1933 - 1934

Bro. C. Herbert Neutze, W. G. P.

Bro. Neutze served this Grand Chapter during its thirteenth year, and has served on its Jurisprudence Committee from time to time.

1934 - 1935

Bro. Jay W. Miller, W. G. P.

Bro. Miller and his Worthy Grand Matron Sister M. Etta Keys selected as their motto "Service" and we know that this has been their motto not only for their year as Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron of this Grand Body, but for all time. We were all saddened recently by the passing of Sister Keys.

1935 - 1936

Sister Bessie Warrington, W. G. M. Bro. Victor J. Carmine, W. G. P.

Sister Bessie, was the first Worthy Grand Matron to preside over the Grand Chapter in her home town, Georgetown, and is still a great advocate for "Brotherly Love" as she so ably put it in her welcoming address.

1936 - 1937

Bro. James Duncan, W. G. P.

The motto "Love One Another" was taken from the first grand appointment received by Bro. Duncan's Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Bertha Smith.

1937 - 1938

Sister Martha and Bro. John presided with great dignity over the eighteenth annual session and up until a few years ago Sister Martha was the first and only secretary of her home Chapter and is now Secretary Emeritus of Newark Chapter No. 10.

Sister Zebley and Bro. Derrickson selected as their motto "Loyalty and Service". They presided over the twentieth session which was known as the Loyalty Session.

1941 - 1942

Sister Bertha and Bro. Bob were sincere and unassuming and tried during their year of service to this Grand Chapter to live the "Obligation". It was at their grand session the Grand Lecturer was first appointed.

1946 - 1947

Since the Estarl Scholarship Fund, started by our Past Most Worthy Grand Matron, was based on the equivalent of ten cents per member, and as we have slightly more than 3,000 members, the annual income to this fund is approximately \$300.00 per year.

It was felt that in keeping with the income, the scholarship should be \$300.00 per student per year.

Since there is considerable money in the Fund at present which is being transferred from the old Educational Fund, more than one student can be helped each year until this money has been used. After this money has been depleted, it will then be necessary to drop back to one scholarship per year.

We, therefore, make a motion that the Grand Chapter authorize \$300.00 a year per student from the Estarl Fund be given as a scholar-ship to a worthy boy or girl who is studying for religious training, such student to be selected by the Estarl Committee.

Seconded by Brother John Conley. Motion carried.

A letter was sent to Dr. Trelease thanking him for his letter of recommendation and informing him that after our Grand Chapter Session we would be able to inform him as to the help the Estarl Committee could give to Mr. Merrill.

COMMITTEE REPORT ON V A HOSPITAL

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, and Members of the Order of the Eastern Star in Delaware:

Dear Sisters and Brothers:

Another year and another report from your Veterans' Hospital Rehabilitation Chairman, and each year seems to bring added pleasure to your committee. It has been so enjoyable having Past Grand Patron William Nutter as co-worker this past year and we both thank you, Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, for our appointments. We trust we have met with your expectations.

In May of 1957 your chairman received a certificate for an added 100 hours of service at the V. A. Hospital and, also, one for consistent service over a period of years. Your Eastern Star chairman was the spokesman for all volunteers which was a great honor inasmuch as there are 32 volunteer organizations on the V. A. V. S. (Veterans Administration Volunteer Service) Committee. This year on April 21st your chairman received a certificate for another 300 hours, which makes nearly 3000 hours of service, and was so happy to have among the guests our Worthy Grand Matron with her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. John Orzech, our Worthy Grand Patron, and Past Grand Patron, Brother Nutter. This year the entire program was presented by the staff of the V. A. Hospital in honor of the volunteers.

The Third Annual V.A.V.S. Banquet was held June 6, 1957, in the International Banquet Room at the New Castle Airport and your chairman and Worthy Grand Patron, Brother John Conley, were in charge of tickets. Mr. A. S. Mason of the Central V. A. Office in Washington, D. C. was a guest, and Mr. James H. Sears, Chairman of the Governor's Committee on Employment of the Physically Handicapped in Delaware was the speaker. Over 150 persons attended. Your chairman is in charge of tickets again this year.

The Carnival which was held on June 25th was quite successful. The presiding officer may direct that a collective ballot be spread if such is deemed desirable by the Chapter.
