

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- Q. A petition for degrees received and the Committee of Investigation was appointed at previous meeting. The petitioner is stationed at the Air Base and has orders for out of country duty. Can this petition be balloted upon and if accepted initiate him the same meeting?
- A. I refer you to Page 50 of the Constitution and By-Laws first paragraph which reads: A candidate can be elected for the degrees and initiated the same night if the candidate is departing hurriedly for foreign jurisdiction. Your candidate is leaving the Country, he can be balloted upon and if favorable, receive the degrees on the same night.
- Q. Can a Trustee be elected to an Elected Office and hold Trustee at the same time?
- A. In our 1956 proceedings it was approved, since the trustee does not fill a station, is not installed, there was no reason why a trustee cannot fill an appointed office. I cannot find anything stating that an elected or appointed officer cannot hold the office of Trustee.
- Q. We have petitioners who were elected to receive the degrees, and they have been notified a couple of times in writing for initiation but have failed to show up.
- A. In our Constitution and By-Laws, Page 48, Section 29, reads: The fee for the degrees shall be returned to petitioner who does not present herself or himself for initiation within one year from date of election and such election shall thereafter be void.
- Q. We have a petition that was rejected, the fees were returned but the petitioner left his petition with the Secretary. At the end of six months can we read and ballot on the petition the same night?
- A. No, it must be handled as a new petition and an investigating committee be appointed and report at the next meeting of the chapter.
- Q. Can we at our Memorial Service in our chapter lay greens around the top of our Altar on the wood edge, not the padding?
- A. No, there should not be anything draped or placed around the edge of our Altar or have it decorated in any way.

IRREGULARITIES

Officers using wording of Old Rituals.

The Warder opening chapter door without the permission of the presiding officer.

The misuse of the Black Ball in some Chapters has caused discord. It is not the use of the Black Ball that hurts our Chapters, but the misuse.

I visited a Chapter. The Trustees report for the previous year was given three months after installation. Our Constitution and By-Laws read: "A Trustee report be submitted before the installation."

In a Chapter I visited the minutes of a Special meeting called for initation was read and other business transacted. When Special meetings are called, only the business the meeting is called for may be transacted.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that our Grand Chapter be opened according to our Ritual, or a committee be appointed by the incoming Worthy Grand Matron to revise our Opening Ceremony.

GOOD OF THE ORDER

In all our Chapters there is an excellent spirit of fellowship and cooperation and an earnest endeavor to do their work well. When an officer fails to abide by the laws required of them, they are failing to keep the Obligation taken at the Altar at the time of their installation.

In a few Chapters, however, I found discord. This I believe is due to people not trying to understand the other person. One of our greatest needs of our Order is a fuller understanding of our "Obligation" and unless we do believe in this and practice it in our daily lives, the promise made before God and man is but words.

I hate to mention it but nothing can cause so much grief and heartaches as the unjustified Black Ball. The growth, character and strength of our Order rest upon it.

"Sow good services; Sweet remembrances will grow from them."

The usual routine of work was followed after the close of our 1959 Session. Cards were taken to the bank, authorizing the signatures of our new Officers. Stationery was ordered for our Worthy Grand Matron and Grand Secretary. The Proceedings were prepared for printing. Lewels were ordered for the 1960 Company interprinting. Jewels were ordered for the 1960 Session. The usual interstate courtesies have been maintained with our sister jurisdictions, through the exchange of Proceedings, Christmas Greetings, invitations and other official notices. Booklets with names and addresses of the Grand Officers, Committee Members, Subordinate Chapter Officers, Official Visits, etc., were mailed to all who are entitled to receive them.

REPORT OF NECROLOGY COMMITTEE

The report was read by Sister May Payne, Grand Secretary, in the absence of Sister Edna Carter, P. M., Chairman.

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star:

It has been a pleasure to serve on your Necrology Committee and we wish to thank you for this honor. We submit the following report.

The Memorial Service was held on Sunday, May 8, 1960, at 7:30 P. M. in First and Central Presbyterian Church, Wilmington. Delaware.

Rev. Dr. Willard G. Purdy brought the message of the evening "What ye sow, so shall ye reap," which is the Motto of our Worthy Grand Matron.

Another year has passed and again it is time to submit our report to you, and again we say "Thank you" Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Eliza, and Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Joe, for appointing us to serve in the way we enjoy so much.

Due to circumstances over which I had no control, from May 1959 until January 1960 your chairman was not as active as in previous years, but since January I have been able to continue the Wednesday for another 300 hours of service. Sister Helen M. Welsh received a certificate for 300 hours; Sisters Loraine Putzier, Elaine Putzier, Vera Ellis and Richard Welsh, Charles Bratton, Willard Anseaume, and Lee Nichols report that all of these Sisters and Brothers are members of her own Chapter, Five Points No. 13.

Five Points Chapter No. 13 presented a gift to each nurse and aide who were on duty on Christmas Day. This is an annual project of this Chapter.

When no name is presented for a respective office, such office shall be filled by a majority written secret ballot.

The Committee recommends the adoption of the above amendments.

3. Rules and Regulations for the Government of Subordinate Chapters in Delaware. Article 1, Meetings—page 41, Section 1. Add Section (5) to read:

All chapters in this Grand Jurisdiction shall hold two meetings a month, except July and August and the Chapters whose By-Laws have been amended to take care of legal holidays, Holy Days and Grand Chapter Session.

The Committee recommends the rejection of this amendment.

WILLIAM E. HALL ELVIRA J. ZIEGLER MARY H. BEVIS, Chairman Sister Mary Bevis, P.G.M., submitted the following amendments:

1. We present for the second reading in this Grand Chapter proposed amendments to the Constitution, Article VIII, Section 2, under heading ELECTION AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS, top of page 12. Sentence now reads "All other elected offices shall be filled by secret ballot". Change to read "All other elected offices shall be filled by secret ballot, however, if only one name is presented for a respective office, the Grand Secretary shall cast an unanimous vote of this Grand Chapter".

2. Article VIII, Section 2, last paragraph. Add another paragraph to read: "When no name is presented for a respective office, such office shall be filled by a majority written secret ballot".

Sister Mary Bevis recommended the adoption of the amendment. A motion was made by Brother Ross Lanius, Associate Grand Patron, seconded by Sister Elizabeth Fisher, P.M., this amendment be adopted. Motion adopted.

3. Also, for the second reading, we present a proposed change in the Rules and Regulations for the Government of Subordinate Chapters in Delaware. Article I. Meetings. Page 41, Section 1. Add Section #5 to read "All Chapters in this Grand Jurisdiction shall hold two meetings a month, except July and August and the Chapters whose By-Laws have been amended to take care of legal holidays, Holy Days and Grand Chapter Session".

Sister Mary Bevis, recommended the rejection of this amendment as twelve out of eighteen Chapters may have to change their by-laws to meet this recommendation.
