



"Should the Associate Grand Patron, through illness, resignation or some emergency, not be able to be advanced, the Grand Secretary will cast an unanimous vote for the Grand Sentinel to be Worthy Grand Patron. A nomination must be placed in the nomination box for Associate Grand Patron and Grand Sentinel".

This is a first reading.

Seconded by Sister Mildred Wootten, P. M. Motion carried.

IRREGULARITIES

- 1—Secretaries sending check to the Grand Secretary when requesting a special dispensation from the Worthy Grand Matron.
- 2—Secretaries sending cash instead of a check under Chapter seal when requesting special dispensation.

- 3—Chapters not using special form for special dispensations.
- 4—Secretaries not notifying the Worthy Grand Matron and Grand Secretary when a special meeting is called.
- 5—Chapters requesting approval of changes in By-Laws from the Worthy Grand Matron, not submitting how By-Laws previously read.
- 6—Ballot box not being properly prepared.
- 7—Members not using proper sign before balloting.
- 8—Members prompting. This is the duty of the Deputy Grand Lecturer according to the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter.
- 9-Members turning their backs to the Altar.

DECISIONS

- 1—An Associate Matron-elect failed to take the proficiency examination. She was not installed at regular installation. I instructed the Chapter to grant her an additional thirty (30) days from installation, in which time she should take the examination and be installed. At the expiration of the given time, she did not present herself for either. At the end of forty-five (45) days, upon request from the Chapter, I declared the office vacant.
- 2—A Chapter elected a Conductress from the floor. I granted permission for this Officer to be installed at regular installation and be given ninety (90) days from installation to pass the proficiency examination.

I have had no correspondence directed to me personally, under Chapter seal, therefore I felt I did not have the right to go into this Chapter without a request, for my presence, from the Chapter, under seal.

From the copies I have received of their transactions it seems this Chapter is trying to settle their difficulty within the Chapter.

OUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question: At our last meeting a motion was made to give one of our members a Life Membership. Under the question, I requested the Chapter to wait until I could find some information pertaining to the procedure involved. I cannot find anything. Can you help me?

Answer: Life Membership was approved at the 1963 Grand Session, I refer you to the Proceedings of 1963, page 127, which reads: That our Constitution be amended to permit the Subordinate Chapters, should they so desire, to make a member a life member after said member has belonged to a Chapter for forty (40) years. (end of quote) Even though this will exempt the member from paying dues to the Chapter, it is my feeling this does not exempt the Chapter from paying the per capita tax tax to Grand Chapter on said member.

QUESTION: Chapter received a petition which was read and a Committee of Investigation appointed. Since that time the petitioner has notified us she cannot find any time to be initiated if she was elected and wants her fee returned. Can we do this as the Committee has not made their report?

Answer: Once a petition has been read at a stated meeting, with no objection and received, it must be balloted upon. If the ballot is clear, the petitioner is notified and if she or he does not present themselves within one year for initiation then the ballot is declared void and the fee must be returned. If the ballot is not clear (petitioner rejected) the fee must be returned immediately. Refer to: Rules and Regulations For The Government of Subordinate Chapters in Delaware, Article I. Sections 29-30-31-32-33.

QUESTION: Article I, Section 3 of Rules and Regulations says: The appointive Officers are Chaplain, Marshal, Organist, Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, Electa, Warder, and Sentinel, who shall be appointed by the Worthy Matron-elect. How can a Subordinate Chapter have in their By-Laws to elect the Sentinel?

Answer: In 1958 there was an amendment to Section 3 with the following added—A Subordinate Chapter may elect a Sentinel if they so desire.

QUESTION: Chapter has two Trustees who are very ill.
What steps should be taken in order for our books to be audited?

Answer: You have a Past Grand Patron and Past Matrons and

Patrons who are very capable. Have your Worthy Matron appoint two, to act for the Trustees.

- QUESTION: If a Grand Officer is holding an office in her Chapter, should she fill that station at Official Visit?
- Answer: Being a Grand Officer is an honor which has come to this sister or brother. It is my feeling that their station in their Chapter should be filled by a substitute on that evening.
- QUESTION: Our Martha is expecting to undergo surgery and does not feel able to fill her station, may she sit on the side line until she is well again?
- Answer: Since she is unable to fill her station yet shows that much interest in her Chapter, she is allowed to sit on the side line until she can fill her station.
- QUESTION: There is a Sister who wants to affiliate with our Chapter.

 Must she fill out a petition and be balloted upon? Then
 what do we do?
- Answer: Yes, there is a regular Petition for Affiliation. If elected, give her a welcome, Obligation and have her sign the By-Laws. No initiation.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1—That no member of lower rank than Past Matron or Past Patron be allowed to hold an "A" Certificate of Proficiency.
- 2—Immediately after installation in the Subordinate Chapters that the name and address of a new Secretary be sent to the Worthy Grand Matron and Grand Secretary.
- 3—That the Sessions Chairman be reimbursed for the cost of a single room for three nights during Grand Chapter Session.
- 4—That the presentation of the American Flag be a requirement in the Subordinate Chapters.
- 5—To conform with General Grand Chapter, that the placement in introductions in Grand Chapter and the Subordinate Chapters be changed, placing the Grand Representatives after the Grand Officers and the Worthy Matrons and Worthy Patrons before the Past Matrons and Past Patrons.
- 6—That this Grand Chapter adopt the Book of Instructions as set forth by the General Grand Chapter and discontinue the use of our present Book of Instructions.

Let us keep our Chapters active, for by so doing our meetings will be more interesting.

As the ballot is the most sacred privilege to members of our Order, we should exercise much thought to permit to membership only those who possess a good moral character. Yet we should not allow a personal grievance to come before our Obligation. We should remember to do unto others as we would have them do unto us.

A nomination must be placed in the nomination box for Associate Grand Patron and Grand Sentinel".

Second reading of proposed change to the Rules and Regulations for the Government of Subordinate Chapters in Delaware:

Art: 1, Sec. 11 MEMBERSHIP Who may be admitted.

That the last sentence of the above mentioned section which reads, "No person shall be a member of more than one Chapter at the same time, except in case of honorary membership", be changed to read "No person shall be a member of more than one Chapter at the same time in this Grand Jurisdiction, except in the case of honorary membership. Dual membership from and to Chapters of other Grand Jurisdictions, and with Chapters under the jurisdiction of the General Grand Chapter, shall be allowed those members who move into other Grand Jurisdictions and be valid during their stay therein. Dual members shall pay dues in both Chapters and suspension for non-payment of dues in their primary Chapter, or expulsion from either Chapter shall carry with it loss of membership in the other. Fees and acceptance of dual membership shall be as prescribed by the petitioned Chapter. Dual members shall be identified as such in both Chapters".
