

A most pleasing sight to each one who entered the foyer before going into the Gold Ballroom was the beautiful rose garden. White wrought iron furniture surrounded a bird-bath, pink roses and numerous bluebirds completed the setting. Ornate screens stood in the background.

If two-thirds of the members present vote in the affirmative, the amendment shall be adopted".

Article IX—Section 1, now reads: "The Secretary shall keep a true and faithful record of the proceedings of the Chapter and make the annual report to the Grand Chapter. She shall keep strict account of all dues and fees between the Chapter and each member respectively, shall collect all money due the Chapter and pay the same immediately to the Treasurer, taking her receipt therefor. She shall notify the Secretaries of Chapters with concurrent Jurisdiction of all applications for degrees and all rejections. She shall at the annual meeting in January report in writing all money received and paid to the Treasurer; she shall make out and sign all orders drawn on the Treasurer, and

shall deliver to her successor in office all property belonging to the Chapter and perform such other duties as may pertain to her office, for which service she shall receive the sum of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per year."

AMEND TO:

Reading the same as above, changing only the last two lines to read: "For which service she shall receive the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per year."

I feel I too have kept the postman very busy with notes, letters, invitations and cards. Well over 1500 pieces of mail have been issued by me during this year, in addition to 65 sympathy cards, 74 Get well, 54 Birthday, 12 Anniversary cards and cards for special occasions.

All circular letters and letters about Summer Benefit were approved.

IRREGULARITIES

- 1. Rituals in the East—at no time should they be taken to the East regular stated meetings, initiation or installations.
- 2. Not reading dispensations in open Chapter.
- 3. Elected Grand Officers, other than the Grand Lecturer, giving instructions, particularly over the telephone.
- Dispensing with a stated meeting by simply voting to do so— This must be stated in the by-laws.
- 5. Omitting recess when it is specified in the by-laws.
- 6. Wearing colored hose. Our rules specifically say "All White"—this means hose as well. *Never* under any circumstances should *no* hose be worn at all.
- 7. Wearing short white dresses—except for Organist, as she does not participate in the floor work. We should be uniform—dresses should be floor length.
- 8. Secretaries not sending invitations to Chapter Secretaries for Official Visits, Birthday Parties.
- 9. Also failing to comply with Grand Secretary's request to have abstracts correctly filled out and mailed by specified time. Installing Officer signing abstract not properly filled out.
- 10. Not singing "Blest Be The Tie That Binds" as the Ode after the prayer in prayer circle in initiation. Our Ritual states "Blest Be The Tie That Binds" or any appropriate Ode, but this is so appropriate and so significant.
- 11. Secretaries not notifying Worthy Grand Matron and Grand Secretary when special meetings are held.
- 12. Deputy Grand Lecturers appointing someone to fill their place in their absence. This is to be the decision of the Worthy Grand Matron or the Grand Lecturer.
- 13. Secretaries not using special form for dispensation and then sending them to the Grand Secretary instead of the Worthy Grand Matron.
- 14. An Associate Patron substituting for Worthy Patron in his absence, when the initiatory work is to be done and not having

- passed his proficiency examination, reads the initiatory work. A Past Patron should be invited to confer the degrees.
- 15. Ritual being copied. Never copy any part of it. If needed for the prayer take the Ritual to the Altar.
- 16. Dispensing with closing ceremony. This is ritual. Closing march may be dispensed with, if so desired.
- 17. New Officers being installed without all old business of previous year being completed.
- 18. Members being suspended without their names being read in open Chapter and a vote being taken to suspend them.
- 19. Members not being notified 10 days in advance of special meeting.
- 20. The Secret Work being in the possession of anyone other than those specified in our Constitution and By-laws. No one is allowed to purchase the Secret Work for their personal use.
- 21. Worthy Patron destroying the ballot. Ballot box is handled only by the Worthy Matron and the Associate Conductress.
- 22. Investigating committee making a verbal report. A report must be made in writing, in regular form. (Book of decision—General Grand Chapter—Page 24, under heading "Investigating Committee", Section 2.)
- 23. Presiding Officers, both in Grand Chapter and Subordinate Chapters having relinquished their authority, still giving instructions and decisions. This is the prerogative of the present Presiding Officer. If advice is needed and asked for—give it willingly—but only when asked.

DECISIONS

- In Chapter, Conductress elect felt she could not fulfill the station and was not installed. Instructed Chapter to procure a special dispensation to elect a Conductress. This was done and Conductress has been installed.
- An appointed Officer, having had mouth surgery, wanted to attend the Birthday Party of her Chapter but felt she could not fill her station.
 Permission given for her station to be filled and she could attend.
- In several of our Chapters, candidates to be initiated were relatives or close personal friends of some of our Past Matrons and Past Patrons.

Permission was given for them to confer the degrees only by filling either the Conductress' or Worthy Patron's station and permitting the Officer to remain in the room.

4. A member of a Subordinate Chapter wanted to send a circular letter to all Chapters about a cruise.

When asked for what charity or benefit—it was discovered it was for her own personal benefit. She was denied the privilege of sending the letter.

A Chapter has in its possession a white Marshal's baton. Since the Marshal was to be a man a dark baton was purchased as a personal gift.

Permission was granted for him to carry his personal baton.

6. A petition was received by Chapter. After having been accepted it was brought to the attention of some of the members that it had not been completely filled in. Said petitioner had been rejected on two different petitions but only put in the date of one rejection.

Advised the Chapter to return the petition and have the petitioner add the second rejection date, then return it to Chapter and then it would take it's usual course.

Informed them that it was the duty of the Conductress and Associate Conductress to fulfill their duties.

8. Received a communication regarding the presentation of a Canadian Flag to the Grand Chapter of Delaware.

Upon conferring with the Grand Trustees it was decided that we would prefer not to have Flags of other Countries, since we would have no space or place to display them and also we would not want to show partiality.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

QUESTION: When are Worthy Grand Matrons from other Jurisdictions

introduced?

Answer: After General Grand Chapter Committee Members, before Past Grands. (Book of decision—General Grand Chapter—Page 23—under heading "Introductions"—Section 3).

QUESTION: Can a person of Egyptian blood be a member of the Order of the Eastern Star?

Answer: Yes—I find no reference made to this. In General Grand Chapter Book of decisions—Page 14, it states only persons

with any percentage of Ethopian blood cannot be elected or initiated into membership. Also page 16—a foreign citizen who fills all requirements for membership is entitled to petition a Chapter.

QUESTION: How many candidates may be initiated at a stated

meeting?

Not more than 6 candidates can be initiated at any stated meeting. (Constitution and by-laws Page 54—Section 48). ANSWER:

QUESTION: Can a person with a "B" Certificate substitute as a Conductress, never having been a Worthy Matron? Yes. With a "B" Certificate I see no reason why she cannot

ANSWER: substitute as Conductress.

QUESTION: A Charter Member, having demitted and then again becoming affiliated with her original Chapter, is she still considered a Charter member?

No. She forfeited this privilege when she demitted. ANSWER:

QUESTION: We will not have an Associate Patron at our next stated meeting. What do we do with the Flag?

The Flag will be placed in the East to the right of the ANSWER: Worthy Matron.

..... Chapter have a float in the DeMolay QUESTION: Can ... parade?

I see no reason why not, providing you do not use any of ANSWER: our emblems or secret work in any way. There are many interesting ways in which to decorate a float and show the beauty of our beautiful Order.

Question: Can Chapter change their Birthday Party, either by having it a month earlier or a month later, as it will conflict with the Worthy Grand Matron's reception?

This is up to your Worthy Matron and your Chapter. ANSWER:

QUESTION: A man has been suspended from his Blue Lodge. What effect does this have on his membership in the Order of of the Eastern Star?

ANSWER: He automatically is suspended from the Order. This does not affect the women members of his family, they remain members.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Recommend that the Grand Representatives in Delaware approach the West, introduce themselves, then be escorted to the East, given a hand of welcome. They are an appointment of the Worthy Grand Matron, the same as our Deputy Grand Lecturer.
- 2. Recommend that anyone taking an "A" Certificate and not com-

- pleting it, should not be allowed to be held over for another Grand Lecturer to complete. The "A" proficiency Certificate should be taken in its entirety with only one Grand Lecturer.
- 3. Recommend that a pin in the shape of the State of Delaware be procured for Grand Representatives to Delaware. The present badge is simply a piece of ribbon stamped with the word "Delaware" and looks so inadequate. After being privileged to present so many pins and badges this year I feel more than ever that ours are so inadequate. After all we are the First State, so let is have something to give our Representatives that we can be proud of.
- 4. Recommend that a page be set aside in our proceedings for a picture of the Most Worthy Grand Matron.

IN APPRECIATION

Beside the God given strength and guidance the membership of Delaware has given me much to be thankful for. The vote of confidence you extended to me assured me of your cooperation and support and you have indeed opened the door that has brought a greater understanding of human relationship, a deeper concern for others and a more understanding heart. The Old Slogan "One dollar once in a Life-Time", still holds today for our beautiful Temple in Washington, D. C. This majestic, beautiful Temple is also utilitarian. It is a Beacon Light to the World. In most Jurisdictions, this dollar is added to the initiatory fee and in that way the Chapters will always remain 100% once being thus. It is the desire of your Most Worthy Grand Matron to terminate this Project in this Triennium and have, according to the decision at the Triennial Assembly in 1961 in Miami Beach, a Chapel constructed in the Peace Garden. Everything points in the direction to have it come to fruition. Many organizations have made splendid concrete contributions to a Project in the Peace Garden and our Order will likewise be most proud and happy to be represented there. May we each have one another's indulgence when we err and their support when we are right. May we always walk in the Light when the Shadows of Life will fall behind us.

No flag flies over the Temple because of it's International character, but there is on top, an Emblematic Star within a Pentagon, within a Circle, which is illuminated and never dimmed.

Our Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Sayda S. Pettersen has honored many Grand Chapters as well as subordinate Chapters by her presence. We are both happy and justly honored Sister Sayda, as your presence here with us is adding much joy and dignity to this our "Bluebird of Happiness" Session. We are looking forward to your message as a highlight of this year, and we hope the time spent with us will be most enjoyable. We of Delaware appreciate the honor you have extended to us by your appointing Sister Adelaide L. Martin a member of your Necrology Committee and we are very proud to have her represent us in the General Grand Chapter.

The Chapters of the Order of the Eastern Star now encircle the earth and it is the largest Organization in the world, to which both men and women belong. Our Ritual is printed in English, Spanish, Italian, German and Chinese. While the wording in our Ritual has had some changes, the Cabalistic word, emblems, flowers and colors have remained the same. A most interesting History of the founding of our Order is found on the front pages. It is sold only by the General Grand Chapter.

No matter where our travels took us, we found that the focal point of each Chapter room is the center, where the Sacred Altar stands, on which rests our Holy Bible. Each Chapter opens and closes with prayer.

Our flags are honored at each Chapter meeting in every Jurisdiction, and along the border between the United States and Canada, both the United States flag and the Canadian flag are so honored.

Our Most Worthy Grand Matron is planning a pilgrimage during her Triennium to the International Peace Garden which is situated on the International boundary between Manitoba and North Dakota, and during her tour of the Holy Land she was privileged to plant a tree in the Memorial and Peace Forest in Jerusalem in behalf of the General Grand Chapter and in honor of all members over the world of Stardom.

Ours is a beautiful Order dedicated to Charity, Truth and Loving Kindness. Millions of dollars are spent annually for Charitable pur-

poses such as, Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Arthritis and Rheumatism, Veterans Hospitals, Cancer Research, Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children, ESTARL which means Eastern Star Training Awards for Religious Leadership is supported by all Grand Jurisdictions and has helped thousands of young people in Christian Leadership.

The very old and the youth are always in our thoughts. Almost every Grand Chapter helps in maintaining Homes for the aged or for children, as well as supporting the International Order of Jobs Daughters, The International Order of Rainbow and the DeMolay.

Michigan is the oldest Jurisdiction having celebrated its One Hundredth Anniversary in 1967, Nova Scotia the youngest, Ohio the largest and Puerto Rico the smallest. South Carolina donations to Estarl were in the amount of \$2,457.64. Connecticut, The Worthy Grand Matron's Project the O.E.S. Endowment fund made \$36,795.24. Arizona, a picnic was held to replenish the needs of the O. E. S. Home. Pennsylvania, the members living in the O. E. S. Home are exempt from paying dues. These are just a few of the many facts we will include in our already lengthy report.

On behalf of the Grand Chapter of Delaware we extend Fraternal Greetings to our Sister Grand Jurisdictions and thank them for the courtesy of receiving their Proceedings. Our sincere thanks to the Fraternal Correspondents for the fine reviews given our Proceedings. Now that our imaginary tour around the world is finished, we trust that our report will give you some idea of the work that is being accomplished through our Eastern Star World.

The pathway has been pleasant, as we travelled it for you, to each Grand Jurisdiction, the whole world through; as we read, we learned, and to we three, this journey will long live within our memory.

Thank you Worthy Grand Matron for the privilege of preparing and presenting our Report to this Grand Chapter.


