




Harvey J. Bunting Worthy Grand Patron 1969 - 1970

Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the Worthy Matron, due notice having been given the members and only such business transacted as may be specified in the notice.

#### Section 2A.

Seven members constitute a quorum—should circumstances ever require this procedure the following offices should be filled: One of the first four Officers to preside: Secretary to

record the minutes, Warder and Sentinel to guard the door, Conductress to attend at the Altar and Chaplain to pray.

#### ARTICLE II

#### Order of Business

Section 2. Now reads: This order of business or any part of it, may be dispensed with at the discretion of the Worthy Matron. (Delete entire paragraph).

#### ARTICLE III

#### Officers

Section 3A.

Add: No member shall be installed into office who is more than one year (1) in arrears in Chapter dues.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### Membership

Section 1. Now reads: No person shall be admitted to membership in this Chapter by initiation or affiliation except affiliated Master Masons, their wives, daughters, mothers, widows, sisters, half-sisters and legally adopted daughters. All petitioners must have attained the age of eighteen (18) years.

#### AMEND TO:

Affiliated Master Masons in good standing, the wives, daughters, legally adopted daughters, mothers, widows, half-sisters, grand-daughters, step-mothers, step-sisters of affiliated Master Masons and in good standing, or if deceased, were affiliated Master Masons and in good standing at the time of their death. All petitioners must have attained the age of eighteen (18) years.

Section 2. Life membership may be granted in this Chapter after said member has belonged to this Chapter for Forty-five (45) consecutive years. Courtesy life membership may be granted.

#### ARTICLE V

#### Fees and Dues

Section 1. Now reads: The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Five (5) Dollars and for affiliation One (1) Dollar, which must accompany petition.

#### AMEND TO:

The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Eleven (11) Dollars, One Dollar of this fee to be paid to the International Temple Fund at the close of each Chapter year. The fee for affiliation shall be Five (5) Dollars, which must accompany the petition.

Section 2. Now reads: Each member must pay the sum of Five (5)

Dollars as annual dues, payable in June and December.

Each member must pay the sum of Eight (8) Dollars as annual dues, payable in December. All dues must be paid one year in advance.

ARTICLE VI

#### Petitions

Section 2A. Applicants for initiation shall have resided six months in the State and three months in the Jurisdiction of the the State and times in office the state and times for affiliation shall have resided three Chapter. Applicants for affiliation shall have resided three chapter. Applicants to damay affiliate with any Chapter months in the State, and may affiliate with any Chapter in the State.

Section 2B. Appointments of committee on investigation must be made at a regular meeting in open Chapter, in order that all members may have due notice thereof.

Section 3. Now reads: Of Whom to Consist—A Committee of Investigation on petitions must consist of three members, one of whom must be a Brother, as he alone can vouch for the Masonic standing of the applicant.

AMEND TO:

Of Whom to Consist-A Committee on Investigation on petitions must consist of three members. Two Sisters and one Brother, neither of whom have signed the petition.

Section 5. Now reads: A petition cannot be withdrawn after an Investigating Committee has been appointed.

#### AMEND TO:

A petition cannot be withdrawn after it has been read to the Chapter.

Section 5A. A petition can only be received at a stated meeting of the Chapter and must remain in the possession of the Secretary.

Section 10. Now reads: Application for a demit must be made in writing, signed by Sister or Brother desiring it. If all dues are paid and no charges pending then, upon two-thirds vote of all members present, it shall be granted.

#### AMEND TO:

Application for a demit must be made in writing at a stated meeting by Sister or Brother desiring it. If all dues are paid and no charges pending, it shall be granted.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### Committee on Relief

Section 2A. All bills on Secretary's desk must be read in open Chapter.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### Duties of Secretary

Section 1. Add: after paid to the Treasurer. She shall forward the returns of the Chapter to the Grand Secretary on or before the Fifteenth day of February of each year. A failure to do this will forfeit the vote of such Chapter in the Grand Chapter, unless excused by a two-thirds vote.

- Members on Investigating Committee visiting the petitioners in their home, with no other contacts being made for the investigation.

#### **DECISIONS**

At the end of the year Conductress has resigned as she is not going to go on. Will you please declare this station vacant, so that we may proceed with the necessary steps to hold an election to fill this station.

As the Conductress had notified the Chapter that she was not going to advance, this office was declared vacant.

January 19, 1970 Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8 requested permission to remove their Charter from Chapter room to have photostatic copy made, it to be deposited in their Safety Deposit box.

This request was granted with the request that I be notified the dates it was taken from the Chapter and returned. This was done.

February, 1970 —Georgetown Chapter No. 9 requested permission to remove Charter from Chapter room to have photostatic copy made. This request was also granted.

After the member is accepted and voted upon, the Secretary of . . . . . . Chapter No. . . . will notify . . . . . . . . Chapter No. . . . under seal. Upon receipt of said notice by her former

Chapter, it shall grant a demit, which shall be sent direct to the Secretary of the Chapter to which petitioner has been elected. She will then be affiliated and sign the By-Laws, becoming a member of Chapter No. .... I base these facts upon Constitution and Laws, page 47, section

23A, both paragraphs.

An Officer of ..... Chapter No. .... was installed on ..... without a special dispensation to be used on that night. This I declared

The Chapter requested and was granted a special dispensation to be used on ..... which was a later date. This Officer has since been installed on night specified in dispensation.

# QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

QUESTION: A question has come up in the Grand Council International Order of Job's Daughters about 50-50 Club. I have been appointed by our Grand Guardian to get a ruling from the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star, concerning such a Club.

Since our Order does not have jurisdiction over the Job's Daughters, we cannot give a ruling on this from the Grand ANSWER: Chapter. However, I quote the following from our 1926 Proceedings, page 23, Section 4: No form of gambling to be permitted. The personal feeling of our Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Harvey J. Bunting and myself is that the 50-50 Club is a form of gambling, and our young girls should be protected against this way of raising money. We therefore do not approve the 50-50 Club for the Job's Daughters.

QUESTION: A Sister would like very much to be Sentinel if we could have the doors between the Chapter room and the anteroom opened during the business meeting.

Our Ritual, page 28, states that the station of the Sentinel is outside the closed door. Whenever there is a large group ANSWER: of members present and the room is uncomfortably warm, only then may the door be opened during the business meeting of the Chapter.

QUESTION: When a petition is rejected, do the months when the Chapter is not in session (July and August) count as part of the six months' waiting period?

1966 Proceedings, page 33, second line in last paragraph states: "so I would say they are not counted". My answer is, if we do not count these two months, we are asking a petitioner to wait eight months. Our new Book of Instruction, page 21, last paragraph, line 5, reads: "If after six months the rejected petitioner desires to again petition the Chapter, etc." My answer is "Yes", these two months count.

QUESTION: When an Associate Matron is not able to be present at several meetings must a Past Matron fill this office or may we use one of our regular substitutes?

Answer: This is an elective office and a Past Matron should fill this office. You have several Past Matrons whom you could ask to substitute, using a different one each time. Your Deputy Grand Lecturer could also be used in an emergency.

QUESTION: At the time of election our Associate Matron will not be present. Is a verbal acceptance permitted by someone speaking on their behalf, or is the acceptance made preferably in writing?

Answer: New Instruction Book, page 36, paragraph 2, states: "All elected Officers must affirm the acceptance of their Office in Chapter before being installed, if not present at the time of their election".

QUESTION: Two drawings are enclosed for positions of Officers during an O. E. S. funeral service. Is there any rule that we must use No. 1, or is it simply habit?

Answer: Our Ritual, page 153, small print, last paragraph: "at the time of the funeral the Officers assume their positions in any convenient manner best suited to the arrangement of the room. According to protocol the Officers positions would be Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Chaplain, Adah Ruth, Esther, Martha and Electa." So my answer to this question would be to use diagram No. 1.

QUESTION: Our Associate Patron does not know the long form for initiation, another Past Patron knows the long form for initiation. During the initiation can this Past Patron substitute for the Associate Patron even though the Associate Patron is present for the opening and closing?

Answer: Our Constitution and Laws, page 51, section 38, Associate Patron, reads: "The Associate Patron shall perform the duties appertaining to his office." Our Ritual, page 85, small print, reads: "that the portion inside the bracket is optional." Book of Instruction, page 7, 2nd paragraph reads: "The Worthy Matron has the right to ask an Officer to fill another office pro-tem." It does not say she has the right to ask the Associate Patron to step aside and have another take his office during a ceremony, so my answer to your question will have to be "No".

QUESTION: In reference to the New Instruction Book for the use of the

Subordinate Chapters of Delaware, page 22 on the Report of the Investigating Committee. In these instructions the Committee is not discharged. Does this Committee serve all year until she discharged all Committees? How can she appoint another three to serve when she has not discharged the first, even though it will be another petition? Her first investigating committee has not been discharged.

ANSWER:

I refer you to our Constitution and By-Laws, page 49, Section 31, Investigation Committee. Book of Instruction, page 22, Report of Investigating Committee we read: "The Secretary shall read the report of the Committee and the Worthy Matron shall say 'Sisters and Brothers, you have heard the report of the Investigating Committee. The ballot will now be spread'". Book of Instruction General Grand Chapter, page 30, Report of the Investigating Committee, we read the same as above. This New Book of Instruction prepared by six members of the Jurisprudence and Constitution and By-Laws Committee of 1968 and 1969 was accepted by the vote of the Grand Chapter and as they were not specific in this particular instance, this I feel is a matter for the Committee who compiled this Book of Instruction to clarify for us at our Grand Chapter Session next month.

QUESTION: If a member is 2 years in arrears in dues and cannot be contacted, what do you do?

Answer: I

If after a registered or certified letter has been sent to the member and it has been returned, marked unknown or no forwarding address, you may suspend a member by a two-thirds vote of the Chapter, but you should so state to the Chapter and enter it in the records. I base this decision from our Constitution and By-Laws, page 48 under the heading "Dues" and we read: "Any member who neglects or fails to pay dues for a period of one year shall be notified by the Secretary, and if not paid within one year thereafter may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the Chapter.

QUESTION: ..... of ..... No. requests

Chapter to lift the suspension.

Answer: Constitution and By-Laws, page 45, section 14 reads:
"Under Forfeiture of Membership. One who has been initiated in this Order can only be deprived of membership by suspension or expulsion by a Chapter after trial.

QUESTION: On .......... I requested by letter and sent my ......... dues and demit back to my Chapter, received an answer saying the Chapter could not comply with my wishes.

Answer: Demits, Constitution and By-Laws, page 46, section 20 reads: "A demit having been granted by the Chapter,

Constitution and By-Laws, page 49, section 32 reads: "The ballot must be spread on all legal applications for degrees and affiliation".

Ritual, page 163, Landmark No. 7 and Landmark No. 11.

QUESTION: When a member demits from his or her Chapter, and does not affiliate with another Chapter, but wishes to rejoin his or her own Chapter, what is the procedure?

Answer: 1958 Proceedings, page 25, reads: "In as much as a demit divorces said member from that Chapter, the member must rejoin by affiliation".

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- No. 1—Each year there are a number of New Secretaries in the Subordinate Chapters. I recommend that the Grand Secretary be authorized to hold a meeting to instruct the Secretaries, time and place at her convenience.
- No. 2—In this time of bombing of buildings and setting fires our Chapters' paraphernalia may be destroyed at any time. I therefore recommend that each Chapter be permitted to have a photostatic copy made of their Charter. As we know that a Chapter meeting cannot be legally held without the Charter being present.

#### GOOD OF THE ORDER

Having visited all the Subordinate Chapters, some when the initiatory work was being exemplified, others when the Deputy Grand Lecturer notified me that there was going to be balloting, I was so very happy and pleased, especially with the work of the Star Points each reaching her station at the same time. It was a picture to behold. Thank you Officers and especially the Star Points, for a job well done.

Sorry that I could not have visited every Chapter when there was going to be balloting.

At the beginning of our year I asked that our Officers be hospitable in greeting and speaking to the members. This our Worthy Grand Patron and I feel has made a better relationship with our members. The covered dish suppers before meetings have made more friends and a wonderful relationship between our Chapters. Our Motto: Kindness, Thoughtfulness and Happiness in Service to Others has prevailed throughout our Jurisdiction this year.

The misuse of the black cube frequently comes up. Let us remember our Obligation, forgetting spite and vote for the Good of the Order.

#### SICKNESS AND DISTRESS

Whenever possible I tried to have personal contact with the

members during an illness or when in distress or bereavement. This was not always possible to do. Either I was not notified or I was out of the Jurisdiction. Many cards were sent. The following is a list of visits I have made.

Our inspiration for this tribute to your Session came from the following message given at the Worthy Grand Matron's Official Visit to her home chapter, Julia M. Story #3 by our own Past Grand Matron, Sister Adelaide L. Martin, a member of the Necrology Committee of the General Grand Chapter.

"To God in His Glory, we two nations dedicate this Garden and pledge that as long as men shall live, we will not take up arms against one another".

This is the pledge that was made at the dedication of the International Peace Garden in 1932. The Peace Garden founders started with nothing but faith, hope and an idea conceived by a horticulturist in Eastern Canada. Its purpose was the creation and maintenance of a Garden as a memorial to peace which had existed for over 150 years between our United States of America and the Dominion of Canada. The Turtle Mountain was chosen for the fact that it was midway between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans and only 35 miles from the spot considered to be the Geographic Center of the North American Continent. It is on the border of North Dakota and Manitoba, the area consists of 888 acres donated by the State of North Dakota and 1,452 acres donated by the Province of Manitoba.

At the 1955 Triennial of the General Grand Chapter the sponsoring of a project in the Garden was undertaken. At the 30th Triennial in Miami in 1961 a motion was made and carried to build a chapel, contributions have been made ever since.

It has been the desire, and now we know it will be the realization, of our present Most Worthy Grand Matron that the chapel be completed during her term of office. If present plans go as expected, the chapel will be completed and dedicated with an Eastern Star pilgrimage and appropriate ceremony sometime during the Summer of 1970. This chapel stands on a knoll at the west end of the formal area and is clearly visible from the entrance and will be accessible for all those desiring a place of serene quiet for moments of prayer and meditation, something we all need in these days of stress and tension.

This Garden symbolizes the fact that two great nations can and do live in peace and harmony along the longest unfortified boundry in the world. Canada, the native home of our own Worthy Grand Matron and the United States, her chosen home. May this Garden, known as the International Peace Garden, be a symbol of the Brother-hood of Man and Peace in the World."

we would like to make a "Garden of Peace" here on the Gold Ballroom floor for all to enjoy.

As the song says "Let There Be Peace On Earth and Let it

Begin with Me".

# REPORT OF THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star.

We, your Committee on Constitution and By-Laws, in conjunction with the Jurisprudence Committee, have approved the amendments to the By-Laws of the Subordinate Chapters which have been temporarily approved by the Worthy Grand Matron with the exception of the following:

St. John's Chapter No. 4-adding Section 6 to Article V to read:

Anyone who has completed forty (40) years as a dues paying member shall be deemed to be a Life Member of this Chapter; and,

thereafter shall be relieved of the responsibility of paying dues. The action shall become effective at the first stated meeting held during the month in which the fortieth year of membership occurs.

We disapprove the last sentence—it should either be deleted or the wording changed so that the action on this membership will not be effective until the completion of the anniversary date.

Georgetown Chapter No. 9-Article V Fees and Dues to read:

The fee for conferring the degrees in this chapter shall be eleven (11) dollars, one dollar of this fee to be paid to the International Temple Fund at the close of each Chapter year.

We disapprove of the last portion of this sentence. It is the privilege of each subordinate chapter to set their fees for initiation, affiliation and dues as they wish, but they must not be designated, in the bylaws, for anything other than initiation, affiliation and dues. What you do with this money after it is collected is your own chapter business.

Georgetown Chapter No. 9-Article XII, Section 1-amend to read:

The amendment proposed must be presented in writing at a stated meeting and after being heard, discussed, and if so ordered amended, it may then be finally adopted by a two-thirds vote of all members present.

All members must be notified in writing ten (10) days in advance.

We do not approve of a change in By-Laws being made at one stated meeting. There should be two readings for adoption and these should not be at the same stated meeting.

Your Constitution and By-Laws Committee submitted the approved changes made by this Grand Chapter during the 1969 Sessions to our Grand Secretary who had gummed labels printed for correction in your Constitution and By-Laws Books, they are still available from our Grand Secretary.


