



### AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER BY-LAWS

On July 18, 1978, I approved the following amendments to the By-Laws of Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8:

### Page 4 - ARTICLE II - Section 2, now reads

This order of business or any part of it may be dispensed with at the discretion of the Worthy Matron.

### change to read

This order of business or any part of it except Items 1 and 14 may be dispensed with at the discretion of the Worthy Matron.

### Page 6 - ARTICLE V - Section 1, now reads

No person shall be admitted as a member of a Chapter by initiation except affiliated Master Masons, their wives, daughters, mothers, legally adopted daughters, widows, sisters, and half-sisters. Female petitioners shall not be less than eighteen years of age. On a petition for membership in the Order of the Eastern Star, the Masonic affiliation must hold a regular Masonic Card.

### change to read

Affiliated Master Masons in good standing; the wives, daughters, legally adopted daughters, mothers, widows, sisters, half-sisters, granddaughters, step-mothers, step-daughters, and step-sisters of affiliated Master Masons in good standing or, if deceased, were in good standing at the time of their death; each of whom shall have attained to at least the age of eighteen years, are eligible to membership in the Order of the Eastern Star.

### Page 6 - Membership - add as ARTICLE V, Section 5, the following:

Sec. 5. Dual Membership is not permitted in concurrent jurisdiction. No petition for Dual Membership shall be received unless Chapter in which the petitioner holds primary membership also permits Dual Membership.

The procedure in receiving and acting upon any petition for Dual Membership shall be the same as that of any other petition for affiliation.

Dual Members must pay dues in both Chapters and shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of membership in both, except that such Dual Members shall not hold any one of the four principal offices or that of Secretary in more than one Chapter at the same time.

Loss of membership by suspension for non-payment of dues in primary Chapter, or expulsion in either Chapter, carries with it the loss of membership in the other.

No subordinate chapter shall receive petitions for Dual Membership for a member whose primary membership is held in a Chapter under a Grand Chapter not permitting Dual Membership.

### Page 6, ARTICLE VI - Section 1 now reads

Elective officers of Chapters who have been installed cannot demit. All members have the right. . .

### change to read

Elective officers of Chapters who have been installed cannot demit. All other members have the right. . .

### Page 8, ARTICLE VII - Section 2 now reads

Each member, except life members, shall pay the sum of seven dollars annual dues, payable in December. The Chapter may, by a majority vote of the members present, remit the dues of any member.

### change to read

Each member, except life members, shall pay the sum of ten dollars annual dues, payable in December. All dues must be paid one year in advance. The Chapter may, by a majority vote of the members present, remit the dues of any member.

### Page 8, ARTICLE VII - Section 3 now reads

Any member who neglects or fails to pay dues for a period of one year shall be notified by the Secretary and if not paid within one year thereafter may be suspended by two-thirds vote of the members present. When all back dues have been paid or remitted, such member is restored to good standing without further action of the Chapter.

### change to read

Any member who neglects or fails to pay dues for a period of one year shall be notified by the Secretary and if not paid within one year thereafter may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present. Upon the payment of the dues accrued at the time of suspension and the current years' dues, a member may petition the Chapter for reinstatement by majority vote by secret written ballot.

### Page 9, ARTICLE VIII, Section 2, first sentence, now reads

The committee to which a petition is referred must be composed of three, two Sisters and one Brother.

### change to read

The committee to which a petition is referred must be composed of three, two Sisters and one Brother; the Brother's special duty shall be to ascertain the Masonic qualifications of the petitioner.

### Page 10, ARTICLE IX - Section 1c now reads

The Worthy Matron may, on the report of the Relief Committee, if the case is of pressing necessity, draw an order upon the Treasury for an amount not exceeding ten dollars and the order shall be sufficient voucher to the Treasurer to pay same.

### change to read

The Worthy Matron may, on the report of the Relief Committee, if the case is of pressing necessity, draw an order upon the Treasury for an amount not exceeding twenty-five dollars and the order shall be sufficient voucher to the Treasurer to pay same.

### Page 11, ARTICLE IX - Section 2 - delete third sentence which reads

She shall at the Annual Meeting in January report in writing all money received and paid to the Treasurer.

### Page 13, ARTICLE XI - Section 1, reads in part

The Ballot for degrees, affiliation or demits can only be ...

### since it is illegal to ballot on demits, change to read

The Ballot for degrees, affiliation or reinstatement can only. . .

On October 25, 1978, I approved the following amendments to the By-Laws of Ruth Chapter No. 19:

### ARTICLE 1 - Section 2 now reads

The stated meeting of this Chapter shall be the first and third Monday of each month at 8:00 P.M. except the meetings in July and August, as well as New Year's Day and Labor Day, shall be omitted. Any meeting of this Chapter conflicting with the Annual meeting of the Grand Chapter shall be omitted.

### change to read

The stated meeting of this Chapter shall be the first and third Monday of each month at 8:00 P.M. except the meetings in July and August, New Year's Day, Labor Day, legal holidays falling on Monday and when place of meeting is closed due to unforeseen emergency shall be omitted. Any meetings of this Chapter conflicting with the Annual meeting of the Grand Chapter shall be omitted.

### ARTICLE VIII - Section 3, now reads

The Treasurer shall receive all moneys from the Secretary, give her a receipt therefor and pay all orders drawn by the Chapter when signed by the Worthy Matron and countersigned by the Secretary and Treasurer. She shall at the Annual Meeting in January report in writing a full account of all money received and paid out by her during the past year and deliver to her successor in office all money, books, and papers belonging to the Chapter, for which service she shall receive the sum of Fifteen (15) dollars per year.

### change to read

The Treasurer shall receive all moneys from the Secretary, give her a receipt therefor and pay all orders drawn by the Chapter when signed by any two (2) of the following Officers, Worthy Matron, Secretary, Treasurer. She shall at the Annual meeting in January report in writing a full account of all money received and paid out by her during the past year and deliver to her successor in office all money, books, and papers belonging to the Chapter, for which service she shall receive the sum of Fifteen (15) dollars per year.

### ARTICLE VIII - Section 4, now reads

The office of Secretary and Treasurer shall not be held by any one member longer than five (5) consecutive years.

### change to read

The office of Secretary and Treasurer shall not be held by any one member longer than five (5) consecutive years and no elected Officer shall hold two elective offices at the same time.

On December 12, 1978, I approved the following amendment to the By-Laws of Five Points Chapter No. 13.

### Add to ARTICLE IV - Membership

Section 11 - Dual Membership
Members of this Chapter shall be permitted to hold Dual
Membership

On December 27, 1978, I approved the following amendment to the By-Laws of Mizpah Chapter No. 2.

### ARTICLE II, Section 1, now reads

The stated meetings of this Chapter shall be held on the second and fourth Thursday of each month, excepting July, August, Holy Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, December 24, 25 and 26 and May 30 if it falls on stated meeting at 8 P.M.

### change to read

The stated meetings of this Chapter shall be held on the second and fourth Fridays of each month, excepting July, August, Good Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, December 24, 25 and 26 and May 30 if it falls on stated meeting at 8 P.M.

On February 5, 1979, I approved the following amendments to the By-Laws of Victory Chapter No. 15.

### ARTICLE V, Section 1, now reads

The fee for conferring the Degrees in this Chapter shall be fifteen (15) dollars and for Affiliation five (5) dollars, which must accompany the petition.

### change to read

The fee for conferring the Degrees in this Chapter shall be twenty-five (25) dollars and for affiliation, ten (10) dollars, which must accompany the petition.

### ARTICLE V, Section 3 - now reads

Any member in arrears for one year's dues shall be notified by the Secretary, and if dues are not paid within one year thereafter may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the Chapter. When all back dues have been paid or remitted, such member is restored to good standing without further action of the Chapter. No member shall be installed into office who is more than one year in arrears for dues.

### change to read

Any member in arrears for one year's dues shall be notified by the Secretary, and if dues are not paid within one year thereafter may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the Chapter. Upon the payment of dues accrued at the time of suspension and the current year's dues, a member may petition the Chapter for reinstatement by a secret written ballot. No member shall be installed into office who is more than one year in arrears for dues.

### ARTICLE VI, Section 1, now reads

There shall be a separate account known as the Savings Account, which may be added to upon motion of the Chapter whenever Chapter finances shall warrant. Should the Chapter treasury become depleted, this account may also be borrowed from to whatever extent the needs of the Chapter may be during the year.

(Because of the recent IRS investigation, it was voted to change the name of the Savings Account to the "Renovation Account")

### ARTICLE VI, Section 1, should now read

There shall be a separate account known as the "Renovation Account" which may be added to upon the motion of the Chapter whenever Chapter finances shall warrant. Should the Chapter treasury become depleted, this account may also be borrowed from to whatever the needs of the Chapter may be during the year.

On March 21, 1979, I approved the following amendment to the By-Laws of Kent Chapter No. 11:

### ARTICLE 2, Section 1, shall read:

"Dual Membership is permitted in this Chapter."

The \$1.00 requested for each Special Dispensation, was forwarded to the Grand Secretary.

### IRREGULARITIES

- 1) Members walking through Labyrinth at Recess.
- 2) Drapes being left open-it was warm-during meeting.
- Conductress giving Salutation Sign improperly when opening and closing the Bible.
- Conductress giving the Salutation Sign before the Bible was opened, and after it was closed.
- 5) Undraping the Charter at the beginning of the meeting, right after meeting was opened.
- 6) Worthy Matron not ordering Warder to secure doors, and directing her to inform the Sentinel that they were about to open their meeting.
- Chaplain using "Praying Hands" position of hands, instead of the Reverent Attitude while praying at the Altar.
- 8) Star Points failing to hold their signs until the Pass is given.
- 9) Officers picking up badge with the left hand instead of the right hand.
- 10) Only two trustees signed the Trustees' Report. The Trustees' Report was not as complete as it should be.
- 11) Chapter Room not set up and ready for meeting to begin at the time stated in their By-Laws 8:00 o'clock.

### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- The Grand Lecturer of —— Chapter asked: "If a husband were just made a Master Mason on Monday, could his wife apply for membership in our Chapter on Thursday?"
  - ANSWER Yes. I find nothing in the Constitution that says how long a husband must be a Master Mason—only that he must be one and in good standing. The Brother on the Investigating Committee would check this.
- 2) The Deputy Grand Lectuter of ——— Chapter asked: "Is it permissible to ballot on a candidate and confer the degrees the same night if the person concerned is leaving the area in the near future? There will be one additional meeting of the Chapter prior to the candidate's departure."
  - ANSWER No. Our Grand Chapter Constitution states that this may be done only "when the candidate is departing hurriedly for a foreign jurisdiction." Since you have another meeting before her departure, you should do the initiation at that meeting, even though as you stated, you may have to have several substitutes. It could also be embarrassing to the candidate if she were waiting in the anteroom and the vote were not affirmative.
- 3) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of —— Chapter asked, for a member, if it were possible to confer Degrees on Sight on a person who had always wanted to be an Eastern Star. Her husband is a Master Mason.
  - ANSWER There is no provision in our Constitution and By-Laws for conferring degrees on sight.
- 4) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of ——— Chapter asked: "The Ritual lists step-daughters of Master Masons as being eligible for membership in

the Order, Is this true in Delaware? I do not find it in my copy of the Constituton."

- ANSWER I could not find it either, but learned upon questioning that our Constitution was changed in 1975 to bring it in line with this provision in the Ritual. Notice was sent to the Chapters, but our Constitution has not been reprinted since then.
- 5) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of ——— Chapter asked: "If a member was suspended for non-payment of dues, then later paid the dues required and was reinstated, could she be given a Life Membership, or a Fifty Year Member honor and certificate?"
  - ANSWER No. Our Grand Chapter honors those as Fifty Year Members who have "had continuous membership in the Order," According to your Chapter By-Laws, you award Life Membership. However, Chapters only award it for continuous membership in the Order.
- 6) The Secretary of ——— Chapter asked: "Can any item in the Minutes be changed after the minutes have been approved by the Chapter?" (She stated that there was some discussion during Recess, then a motion made to alter some item.)
  - ANSWER No. Nothing can be added to, or changed, after the Minutes have been read and approved. (We never make "Additions"—only corrections, even at the time of the orginal reading.)
- 7) The Secretary of ——— Chapter asked: "Can a person who has been elected but has not paid their dues for the coming year be installed?"
  - ANSWER Yes. Our Constitution states, on Page 44, "No member shall be installed who is more than one year in arrears in their dues."
- 8) The elected Associate Patron says he cannot assume his duties because of changed conditions of employment; therefore, he does not want to be installed. Can we elect another man to take his place?
  - ANSWER Yes. You can request a Special Dispensation and have the election.
- The Worthy Matron of ——— Chapter asked: "May a person of the Catholic Faith apply for membership in our Order?"
  - ANSWER Yes. Our Constitution states that the requirements for membership are that a woman have the proper affiliation with a Master Mason in good standing.
- 10) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of —— Chapter asked: "In the case of members of our Demised Chapter, Julia M. Story No. 3, should the Demit have been given by the Grand Chapter—our Constitution refers to this?"
  - ANSWER Constitution states "former members of Demised Chapters".

    These members were granted demits at their request before the Chapter surrendered their Charter.
    - Comment: Since there were no detailed guidelines in our Constitution for procedures in this case, it was decided that this was the best way to proceed until more specific directions are added to our Constitution.

- 11) The Secretary of —— Chapter asked: "Is it necessary to have an Investigating Committee appointed when members of Julia M. Story Chapter present a petition for affiliation?"
  - ANSWER Yes. We should proceed with these Affiliations just as we would with any others, as directed in the Constitution. Perhaps after the Constitution and By-Laws Committee considers this, they may want to make changes in this procedure.

### DECISIONS

- The Deputy Grand Lecturer of ——— Chapter asked: "We have someone acting as Associate Patron. Should we ask for a dispensation and have him elected, or just wait and elect him in December?"
  - ANSWER I think this is up to the Chapter and the person concerned; however, if he is elected now, he would have to complete his work for "B" Certificate within 90 days. If he did this, he would be ready earlier to do the work of the Worthy Patron, or help with Initiation in his position of Associate Patron.
- 2) The Secretary of —— Chapter wrote: "Our Chapter voted, after meeting all the requirements of informing our membership, etc., to make several changes in our By-Laws. We did not send it to the Worthy Grand Matron of last year for her approval because there was some confusion about who was to do it. Can the Secretary now submit these changes to the current Worthy Grand Matron for her approval, or must we re-vote upon the changes?"
  - **ANSWER** Since you have already voted upon them, you may send them to me for approval.
- 3) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of —— Chapter asked: "If the Chapter is sending out notices of an election, must they send two if the husband and wife are both members; must they each have a separate letter?"
  - ANSWER In my opinion, no. If the letter is addressed to both of them, then both are informed, and one letter should be sufficient, and much more economical for the Chapter.
- 4) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of ———— Chapter asked: "If a Charter Member has been reinstated after having been suspended for non-payment of dues, is she still a Charter Member?"
  - ANSWER In my opinion she would be a Charter Member still.
- 5) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of ——— Chapter asked: "If we do an Eastern Star Funeral Service with the casket closed, do we use the flowers?"
  - **ANSWER** Yes, they may be used; I have seen this done. The flowers are placed on top of the casket in the same relative position as they would be if the casket were open.
- 6) Two Chapters asked: "Is it acceptable to remove the chairs which have been placed in the circle for Installation, if the Worthy Matron wants to have a Closing March?"
- ANSWER Yes. Our Ritual says (Page 94) "... whenever possible, the circle of chairs is left in the West until after the ceremony is concluded." This indicated to me that they can be removed. We would consider the Ceremony of Installation closed when the Marshal declares the Officers regularly installed. It might often be in the interest of safety also to remove them, especially in smaller Chapter rooms.

- - ANSWER No. Our Instruction Book (green one) states that all Sister officers will wear white dresses, hose, and shoes. I think our Officers look lovely all in white and I hope we will never change this custom. Of course, if you must sometimes fill a station from the floor, and the member does not have on a white dress, that is an exception.
- 8) Two Chapters asked: "If you have a few officers to install after the regular Installation, how much of the service do you do?"
  - ANSWER In my opinion, we should begin at the beginning and do all through the "Obligation"—then skip to the part involved with the installation of those particular Officers—then skip to the end, where the Marshal declares these Officers regularly installed.
- 9) This happened in two cases—the Conductresses were installed, and were not able to complete their work within the thirty days. One was held over from last year. I agreed with that Worthy Grand Matron, and extended the time, setting a definite limit. However, this one Conductress decided not to go on to Associate Matron and did not finish her work.

In the second case, we extended the time a few weeks—that was during the bad winter weather, when she could not get out to take her examination. She has now finished.

I have just been recently informed that there is another one, not ready, who is considering not going on either. This one has not been resolved.

Since our Chapters do need Officers so badly, we have to be more lenient than we would wish sometimes. I feel that, even so, it may be better for all concerned if we were to hold our usual procedure as stated in our Constitution—"10 days before her installation", if an officer is moving up—and thirty days to prepare, if she is elected "from the floor".

- 10) The Deputy Grand Lecturer of Chapter asked: "I cannot find in writing a law which states that any By-Laws changes made in our Chapter should be sent to the membership ten days prior to voting on said changes; do we have to send notice to our membership?"
  - ANSWER I agree with you about the Constitution, but it is stated in our green book of instruction (Page 9) "Chapter members must be notified in writing ten days in advance when contemplating a change in By-Laws."

I feel that this is a good practice, is democratic, and assures that a few people could not change By-Laws that would affect the whole Chapter. Comment - It would, I think, be better if it were definitely stated in the Constitution and also added, if not already included, to individual Chapter By-Laws. Then it would be clear to everyone.

Deputy Grand Lecturer of ——— Chapter asked: Could, or should, the Deputy Grand Lecturer of Julia M. Story Chapter take her honors as Deputy Grand Lecturer during 1978 and 1979?

ANSWER Yes, if she is interested in doing so. She served her Chapter for over 7 months of the Grand Chapter year. She is a Grand Appointment, and I would like for her to take these honors for the balance of this year, including Grand Chapter Session.

### JULIA M. STORY CHAPTER

A RESUME OF THE NOTES I MADE IN MY NOTEBOOK, SOME AT THE MEETINGS, SOME JUST AFTER I RETURNED HOME, OR AFTER I HAD A TELEPHONE, OR OTHER, CONVERSATION CONCERNING THE SURRENDERING OF JULIA M. STORY'S CHARTER:

November 25, 1978 - Howard T. Hall, Past Grand Patron, and Worthy Patron of Julia M. Story Chapter No. 3, and Iva C. Hall, Trustee, came to my home to talk with me about the idea they were considering of surrendering their Charter. (Evidently, they had done a lot of soul-searching, and researching on how it was done in other states, and a lot of pondering before coming.) They felt they could not continue to serve in the East—Pete Hall having served 9 times and Iva 3—their daughter, Carol, had served 2 years and had had a very difficult time getting members to fill offices and to substitute. An Associate Matron had been elected, but had not attended many meetings; the Conductress and Associate Conductress felt they were not able to go on, for personal and health reasons. The Secretary and Treasurer may not be able to serve. They have called a meeting of the Trustees and Line Officers at the home of Past Grand Patron Ross Lanius for tomorrow evening, November 26.

November 26, 1978 - The Trustees and Line Officers, except the Associate Matron, and Secretary were present. They discussed all the possibilities, including Consolidation, but felt that was not feasible since no one knew of anyone thinking about Consolidation, and procedures were not spelled out in our Constitution or By-Laws. They drew up a Resolution to be presented at the next meeting, to surrender their Charter. They had already sent a letter asking members to try to be there as they wanted to discuss some important business. Also at this meeting, they discussed the idea of giving some of their money to OES Accepted Charities before they would surrender their Charter. They had information from other States that this was a procedure followed. All the Charities suggested were Eastern Star related.

November 28, 1978 - I called the Right Worthy Grand Secretary, Virginia Jones, in Washington D.C., to ask her about procedures, and about the idea of giving money to Charities. Virginia said she could give no directives if it were not spelled out in our Constitution and By-Laws, and that I would have to advise, when asked, as best I could. She also said that it is the practice in some other States, in a case like this, that the Chapter does give some of its money to Charities, and if they are Eastern Star related there can be no question.

I also talked at length with a member of the Jurisprudence Committee, and later talked with the other two members but, since there were no directives, everyone said about the same thing—they felt that the Chapter was doing this in good faith, and that we would have to decide as we went along.

Our Grand Secretary - I called Sister Margaret and we talked of the situation. She suggested that I remind the Chapter that if their proceedings went over into 1979 they would have to pay the Per Capita Tax for this current year now ending, and for 1979, since they would also be functioning in 1979. Later, when this was discussed, they agreed.

The Chapter had planned to grant Demits to all members in good standing and wanting them before they would surrender their Charter; their Resolution was to surrender it on January 31, 1979, thus giving them time to get the books audited and all financial arrangements made, if and when the Chapter voted to accept this Resolution. I felt, as did Sister Margaret, that they could grant Demits; by our Constitutional provision, they will still be a Chapter until January 31, 1979. If, however, there are those who do not get a Demit before that time, or some who may have been suspended for non-payment of dues and wish later to be reinstated, the Grand Secretary would issue those Demits.

These members, after January 31, 1979, would fall under "FORMER MEMBERS OF DEMISED CHAPTERS" as our Constitution states. This was later questioned by one Chapter, and I gave that same answer.

November 27, 1978 - I talked with the Chairman of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, who felt that we would have to proceed on faith, answering the questions as best we could, and with trust in the right intentions of all concerned.

The meeting of November 27, 1978, could not be held due to a lack of quorum being able to get there. Roads were treacherous, parking lot impossible. My own feeling is that it would have been unfair to vote on such a resolution anyway, had there been only a quorum present.

December 9, 1978 - At their Banquet - a lovely affair - I talked with Brother Harvey Bunting, Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee about their intentions. I had a call from a Trustee asking if they could vote on giving the money to Charities and also vote to surrender the Charter at the same meeting. I said NO—according to their By-Laws, and Grand Chapter practice, the Resolution must be presented at one meeting and, if accepted, the membership informed of this and of the intention of taking a vote at their next stated meeting two weeks hence. He said they planned to hold the Election of Officers at the next meeting also, to comply with our Constitution. I strongly approved, both because it was constitutional and because it may help the membership to realize fully the situation the Chapter was facing.

#### MEETING OF DECEMBER 11, 1978

Under "New Business" the Worthy Matron reviewed the recent history of the Chapter and the problem of finding members who were willing to take offices—especially the Line Offices—there were some who would take the appointive offices. She tried to get each member to express their feelings about it after she presented the Resolution that had been drawn up on the 26th of November. Nearly everyone spoke, but no other solution was suggested except maybe to consolidate, but there was not much interest in this. I mentioned that there are guidelines for consolidation in the General Grand Chapter Book but not in our By-Laws, and mentioned what they were. The vote on accepting the Resolution was almost unanimous. Brother Ross Lanius, Trustee, outlined the idea of the Trustees and Line Officers regarding the dispensing of the money. This, of course, would depend on the final vote to surrender.

The Worthy Matron instructed the Secretary to send out a notice to all members that a vote would be taken at their next stated meeting which would be on the 8th of January, 1979 (they do not meet on the fourth Monday of December). By now it was getting late, the room was cold, and they were supposed to be out of the building soon. The question of holding the Election arose. It did not seem feasible, under the circumstances, so I agreed that they could hold the Election in January. Action on the final disposition of the money would have to await the outcome of the voting on the surrender of the Charter.

Meeting of January 8, 1979: There were 25 voting members present, 3 Honorary Members, and the Worthy Grand Matron.

This meeting was opened in short form - there were no introductions and, after the Secretary read the minutes of the last stated meeting (which I felt had not included as much of the discussion as might have been included), the Worthy Matron announced that they would now hold the Election. They proceeded as prescribed, using regular ballots. There was no majority on the first or second ballot for either Worthy Matron or Worthy Patron—and no one offered to stand for election. I agreed that under the circumstances it was useless to continue the Election (this made more clear to all that there was a real problem of leadership in the Chapter).

The Worthy Matron discussed the Resolution and asked everyone to express their opinions, even the Honorary Members. When the vote was taken—a standing vote was taken—all but three voted affirmatively. The comments were that they were sad to see it happen, but they saw no other solution.

Again, the Trustees reported in detail the proposal to give the bulk of their money to Eastern Star related charities. They asked my opinion and I repeated what the Right Worthy Grand Secretary had told me—that it is the accepted procedure in cases like this in some states—the vote on this motion was affirmative also - almost unanimous.

There was discussion as to what they would do with some of their furnishings. I said that since it was the property the Chapter had purchased, such as chairs, rug, etc., they could sell it or donate it to other Chapters. I had known of this being done in other cases.

Dispensing with items given by members was discussed, and it was felt that they should be returned to the persons donating them. I agreed. They would return items specified to Grand Trustees. Action taken previously was reported but I felt this was Chapter business and I had no comment, or right to comment.

Later - the Chairman of Trustees was not home, so I called the majority member to discuss this surrender, and talk about the Trustees having a meeting to receive the Charter, etc. It was decided we would await the return of the Chairman to think of such a meeting.

I also talked with a member of the Jurisprudence Committee to inform her of their action. She agreed with me that it was Chapter business what they did with furniture, etc.

The Chapter Secretary sent out a letter to each Subordinate Chapter announcing that Julia M. Story Chapter No. 3 has voted to surrender their Charter.

Information was beginning to get about that certain ones were planning to affiliate with certain Chapters. If I had been requested to do so, it may have been a good idea to have announced it, but there was no large meeting until Five Points Birthday in February, other than Installations—these were a little previous, I felt.

When the Chairman of Grand Trustees came home, we discussed the possibility of being ready to hold a meeting as soon as Julia M. Story Chapter No. 3 had their affairs ready. They were not ready for the 25th, a date we had talked of. It was decided we would await their request.

If it had been possible to have the final meeting on the 25th of January, we had planned to include the Constitution and Laws Committee. However, as this did not occur, I wrote the Chairman of Constitution and Laws on February 15 to bring her up-to-date on the action the Chapter had taken. Saying I hoped the Constitution and Laws Committee might be able to begin working on assembling information on procedures to be followed in cases of Surrender and Consolidation, I did not ask for a meeting of the Committee. A copy of the letter went to the two other members of the Constitution and Laws Committee—Sister Euretta Schultheiss, P.G.M. (recently appointed to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Sister Ellen Gregg, P.G.M.), and to Brother William E. Hall, P.G.P.

We had been assured by the Trustees of Julia M. Story Chapter No. 3 that the books would be audited and all reports prepared and requirements complied with.

#### MARCH 30, 1979

At the request of the Trustees and Worthy Patron of Julia M. Story Chapter, the Grand Trustees, Julia M. Story's Trustees, Worthy Patron, Grand Secretary, Sister Margaret Wicks, and I met at the home of Brother Pete and Sister Iva Hall, and they turned over to the Grand Trustees and Grand Secretary all items specified. The Grand Secretary and Grand Trustees have a detailed report of this transaction.

It was a sad experience for everyone, but each one involved tried to do what they felt was best in the present circumstances, and hope that we will have complete directions to follow should this happen again.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- I recommend that the Constitution and Laws and Jurisprudence Committees
  prepare a list of detailed, suggested procedures to be followed if and when
  a Chapter decides to surrender their Charter, or to Consolidate with
  another Chapter—that they include in these recommendations the following (in detail):
  - a) responsibilities and prerogatives of the Chapter involved.
  - b) responsibilities and prerogatives of the Worthy Grand Matron
  - c) responsibilities and prerogatives of other Grand Officers in all of the suggested procedures.
- I recommend that the Constitution and Laws and Jurisprudence Committees also consider the possibilities of a third alternative, such as a "merger", in which neither Chapter involved would lose their name or their Charter.
- 3. I recommend that these suggestions be presented at the next Grand Chapter Session to be voted upon (a first vote, of course).
- 4. I recommend that a Committee be appointed to consider ways of honoring our Grand Representatives, who are Grand Appointments, in a different manner than we honor them now. Their suggestions to be presented for consideration at the next Grand Chapter Session.

#### BETTY P. LAPORTE, Grand Marshal:

It is with a deep sense of pride that we pay tribute to the symbols of our nation, our faith, our home state, and our fraternal order.

At Flag Day many years ago, Woodrow Wilson expressed his sentiments for "Old Glory". His message was:

"The things that the flag stands for were created by the experience of a great people. Everything that it stands for was written by their lives. The flag is the embodiment, not the sentiment . . . of history. It represents the experiences made by men and women, the experiences of those who do and live under the flag."

This is true, not only of our American Flag, but also the Christian, Delaware State, and Eastern Star Banners.

Gazing upon the red, white, and blue, Hubbard Parker wrote:

"What shall I say to you, Old Flag? You are so grand in every fold, So linked with mighty deeds of old, So steeped in blood where heroes fell, So torn and pierced by shot and shell, So calm, so still, so firm, so true, My thought swells at the sight of you. Old Flag!"

Perhaps George Duffield was similarly inspired by the passing of the blue, red, and white symbol of the Christian faith when he wrote:

"Stand up, stand up for Jesus Ye soldiers of the cross; Lift high his royal banner, It must not suffer loss."

Centered within a field of blue is a colonial buff diamond which contains the seal of the State of Delaware. To many of us, this symbol represents the state we fondly refer to as home. By chance this banner may have influenced Ezedkel Humm to write:

"Oh! Delaware is little but Her soul is very great. All priceless gems are small, and so She's called the 'Diamond State'."

Memories of pleasant experiences and fond friendship are perhaps recollected when the flag of the Eastern Star is visible.

Oh Beautlful Banner All Splendid with star That in the breeze is flying Proud emblem of the few My heart and hand salute you Flag of fraternity.

Red, green, white, blue, yellow Colors of our Star Stand for love, faith, purity, Fidelity, constancy My heart and hand salute you Flag of fraternity.

be made in the Chapter By-Laws.

Chapter writes: "Our By-Laws state A member of Chapter writes: "Our By-Laws state what is to be given to an out-going Worthy Matron or Worthy Question:

Patron who have served in the East before, perhaps 2 or 3 times. Do the Trustees or the Secretary have the right to deviate

from the By-Laws, without even bringing it on the Chapter floor?"

No. The By-Laws of your Chapter, since they have been voted by your members, and have been approved by the Grand Chapter, Answer:

should be followed exactly as stated, until and unless the member-

ship decides to amend them through the usual process.

Chapter asked: "Can a Member be Ouestion: suspended for non-payment of dues, when the member had not

been notified? No notice of possible suspension was sent."

No. Under Rules and Regulations governing Subordinate Chapters, Answer: under "Fees and Dues" Section 30, page 51\* states: . . . any member who neglects to or fails to pay dues for a period of one year, shall be notified by the Secretary, and if not paid within one year threafter, may be suspended by a two-thirds

vote of the Chapters."

\*(Refers to Delaware Grand Chapter Const. and By-Laws.)

Question: A Secretary of a Chapter asked: "Can the Trustees give a mem-

ber her dues without first coming before the Chapter? Our By-Laws

do not give them this authority.'

Answer: No. In Section 30, page 51, under "Dues and Fees" in our Grand

Chapter Rules and Regulations governing Subordinate Chapters, states: ". . .a Chapter may, by a majority vote of those present, remit dues to the Member." Usually the Chapter By-Laws have

the same provision.

We have been travelling for about a year and have had a marvelous time visiting the many Jurisdictions of the General Grand Chapter, the Independent Grand Chapters of New York and New Jersey and we even travelled to the Supreme Grand Chapter of Scotland. Our tour was made possible by the very prompt attention of our Travel Agent, Sister Margaret Wicks, Grand Secretary, who provided the many Proceedings necessary for our Eastern Star World Tour, Please accept our thanks, Sister Margaret.

In our travels we learned so many interesting things about the Jurisdictions we visited; however, when we entered a Chapter room, no matter where, we saw the same beautiful work and teachings which we know. The open Holy Bible rests upon the Altar of every Chapter and gives strength, courage and comfort to all members.

The Order of the Eastern Star circles the Globe. International in scope, the Order is the largest fraternal organization in the world to which almost three million men and women belong to nearly 14,000 Chapters. It is divided into four Sovereign Bodies, the oldest of which is the Independent Grand Chapter of New York, founded in 1869, and they are the only Jurisdiction which has Esther's point up on the Star.

The second oldest body is the Independent Grand Chapter of New Jersey which was organized in 1870, and they do not have an Associate Patron in their Grand Chapter or Subordinate Chapters. Both of these Grand Chapters permit Master Masons in good standing, though not members of the Order, to attend Chapter meetings by taking an oath of secrecy.

Our own General Grand Chapter is the third oldest body, founded in 1876, and the largest. It convenes every three years and will meet in Toronto, Ontario, Canada this year, October 21-25, 1979, with Mrs. Mabel Mackereth, Most Worthy Grand Matron, of Toronto, and Mr. William E. George, Most Worthy Grand Patron, of Arkansas, presiding.

We, in Delaware, are proud of our Sister Eliza Crossland, who is a member of the Charters Committee of the General Grand Chapter, and in our travels we met our "Rambling Rose" in many other Grand Jurisdictions.

The fourth body is the Supreme Grand Chapter of Scotland which was organized in 1904 and has jurisdiction over 600 Subordinate Chapters in Scotland, England, Wales, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and India. They meet semi-annually for one day in April and in October.

It was also interesting to note that in all jurisdictions, whether large or small, the Worthy Grand Matrons had projects to earn money for such worthwhile causes as Estarl, Cancer Research, Heart Foundation, Arthritis, Handicapped Children, Veteran's Hospitals and Masonic and Eastern Star Homes, Millions of dollars were raised for these worthy causes.

We do agree that it is the duty of the Brother on the Investigating Committee to ascertain the Masonic qualifications of the petitioner.

We approve all answers given to the remaining Questions 2 through 11.

### **DECISIONS:**

We approve Decisions 1 and 2.

We disapprove Number 3. We agree that two (2) notices could be sent in one envelope and addressed to both members; then each receives a letter as the law requires.

We approve 4 through 6.

We approve the answer to #7 should be "NO", but our law states: ALL sisters wear white. The remaining portion to the answer should be omitted.

We approve 8 through 11.

Note: #11 — This is an appointment by the Worthy Grand Matron, and her decision should be final.

# JULIA M. STORY CHAPTER:

Concerning the report on Julia M. Story Chapter and any questions and decisions made by the Worthy Grand Matron throughout her entire report; we disapprove the procedure used in the demise of Julia M. Story Chapter. Most of the procedure is spelled out in Constitution and By-Laws of Grand Chapter of Delaware, Page 44 under "Authority" - Section 2 and Pages 48-49 under "Demits", Section 21, 22, 23. Also under "Decisions of General Grand Chapter", page 12, number 8.

We Recommend: In the future, any chapter in this jurisdiction considering a demise or consolidation to contact the Worthy Grand Matron and

Worthy Grand Patron who will call a joint meeting consisting of both themselves, the Jurisprudence Committee, the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron of the chapter involved. This committee will resolve any questions and decisions that have to be made to properly dispose of the matter.

# RECOMMENDATIONS:

We disapprove #1, #2, and #3. They all are one recommendation. We recommend the Constitution and By-Laws and Jurisprudence Committees get together and formulate proper rules, regulations and guidelines to follow if a Chapter in this Jurisdiction has to surrender its Charter. All procedures auch as consolidation and mergers be considered. The findings of these committees to be presented at our next Annual Session of this Grand Chapter.

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star:

The Constitution and By-Laws Committee has acted in conjunction with the Jurisprudence Committee and have reviewed the amendments to the By-Laws of various chapters, as temporarily approved by the Worthy Grand Matron,

We approve the By-Laws of -

Ruth Chapter No. 19 Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8 Mizpah Chapter No. 2 Victory Chapter No. 15 St. John's Chapter No. 4 Kent Chapter No. 11 Five Points Chapter No. 13

However, we advise Kent Chapter No. 11 and Five Points No. 13 to add to Dual Membership the procedure as found on Pages 46 and 47 under MEMBERSHIP, Section 12 of the Constitution and By-Laws of Grand Chapter of Delaware.

### SECOND READINGS -

- Recommendation that the 90 questions required for the "A" Proficiency Examination be revised. Many are obsolete.
- 2. All presiding officers should have knowledge of Parliamentary Law of how to conduct a meeting. Recommendation that some questions be incorporated in the "B" Certificate.
- 3. It has been extremely difficult for our Deputy Grand Lecturers to find some answers in our General Grand Chapter Book of Instructions. # RECOMMENDATIONS TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION

Article VIII - Election and Installation of Officers

Section 2

Add:

Should a Grand Trustee or Trustees through illness, resignation or some emergency not be able to advance, notice shall be given the Grand Chapter in writing, Monday morning of the meeting week. A nomination must be placed in the nomination box for the Grand Trustee or Trustees.

The Board of Grand Trustees recommends an increase of 50% in the salari's of the Grand Secretary, the Assistant Grand Secretary and the Grand Treasurer; and for this purpose present the following changes in the Constitution—

Parentheses indicate portion to be omitted and underscored indicates portion to be added.

Article IX - Section 5 (12)

The Grand Secretary shall receive for services a salary of (\$400.00) \$600.00 and a contingent fund of \$250.00. Such compensation is to include the entire amount expended for services in the Grand Secretary's office during the year. She shall also be reimbursed for the cost of a single room for three nights during Grand Chapter Session. She shall select a competent Assistant to act as Stenographer at the Grand Chapter Session who is a member in good standing, answer all mail and distribute supplies to the subordinate chapters and receive for this service the sum of (\$75.00) \$112.50 to be paid by the Grand Chapter.

Article IX - Section 6 - (4)

The Grand Treasurer shall receive as full compensation for her services (\$50.00) \$75.00.

Duties of Committees and Grand Representatives.

Article II - Section I

Only those first four Officers who have not previously served be given Credential cards. There is no reason for a Past Matron, Past Patron, Past Grand Matron or Past Grand Patron to be required to show Credentials but should vote as all other Past Matrons and Past Patrons.

Article II - Section 12

ADD:

As the present appointments expire, the length of Commission of Grand Representatives appointed by the State of Delaware be for a two year period.

### FIRST READINGS

The Grand Trustees presented to the Constitution and By-Laws Committee for consideration the following recommendations:

1. On page 17 of the Constitution and Laws, Sec. 1, Paragraph 23 now reads—

"That our Delegate to the Triennial Assembly be allowed \$10.00 per day while the Triennial is in session and 4¢ per mile traveling charges." We recommend this be changed to read—"That our Delegate to the Triennial be allowed Four (4) nights lodging and 10¢ per mile traveling charges."

2. It has been brought to our attention that in last year's Grand Session all Contingent Funds with the exception of the Contingent Fund for the Grand Secretary were increased 50%. We recommend that the Contingent Fund for the Grand Secretary be raised from \$250.00 (page 22) to \$375.00.

We disapprove Recommendation No. 1 as worded. However, we recommend the following:

That our Worthy Grand Matron or her legally appointed proxy to the Triennial Assembly be allowed \$25.00 per day for 4 days while the Triennial is in session and 10¢ per mile traveling charges.

We approve Recommendation No. 2.

We the Constitution and By-Laws Committee recommend:

That the report of the Jurisprudence Committee and the Constitution and By-Laws be given immediately after the opening of the Tuesday Morning Session.

# INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN REPORT

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Distinguished Grand East, Sisters and Brothers:

The International Peace Garden lies on the borderline of two great Countries, the United States and Canada. It was developed as a contribution to the peaceful co-existence between Canada and the United States.

Our beautiful Order of the Eastern Star has long been interested in this lovely garden to the extent of desiring to be identified with a tangible evidence in this International Peace Garden. At the 30th Triennial Assembly held in Miami in 1961 a resolution was adopted to build a chapel in this International Peace Garden. At the 1967 Triennial the incoming Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sayda S. Petterson, was given full authority to complete this Peace Garden Project by building the Peace Garden Chapel when the necessary funds had been raised. With this authority and assisted by the willing work of the Peace Garden Committee this was accomplished. The non-denominational Chapel is situated about one mile west of the entrance to this Garden.

The dedication of the Chapel took place on July 18, 1970 by the Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Sayda S. Petterson, in behalf of the General Grand Chapter, O.E.S. The following articles were placed in the Cornerstone Box, the Souvenir Program of the Dedication, the O.E.S Bible, the O.E.S. Ritual, The Signet, the General Grand Chapter Constitution and By-Laws, the Book of Instruction and the Book of Decisions. A leading newspaper of the United States of America, a leading newspaper of the Province of Manitoba, Canada, all denominations of 1970 coins of the U.S.A., all denominations of 1970 coins of Canada, pictures of the Chapel, a small U.S. flag, a small Canadian flag and a Cross.

The Cornerstone Box was placed into the cornerstone, then the Cornerstone was placed into the foundation and sealed with mortar. Members from 24 States and 6 Provinces of Canada were in attendance to participate in the dedication in song and responsive reading of Scriptures.

In 1971 over 40,000 visitors signed the Great Book in the Chapel with the number increasing each year. Weddings and Baptisms are also on the increase.

Many inspiring Services have been held in the Peace Garden Chapel during July and August. These Services were so well attended that a Public address system was installed. Money was raised for folding chairs to be placed around the grounds. The most inspiring moment at this Peace Chapel is at the conclusion of the Services when visitors from as many as twelve different denominations from the United States and Canada join hands in the Prayer Circle and sing "Blest Be the Tie That Binds", a never-to-beforgotten experience.

Slides of the Garden and Chapel have been shown in some Jurisdictions. and have been well received by the members. Information on these slides may he received from the General Grand Chapter Peace Garden Committee.





#### FIRST READINGS

The Grand Trustees presented to the Constitution and By-Laws Committee for consideration the following recommendations:

1. On Page 17 of the Constitution and Laws, Sec. 1, Paragraph 23 now reads-

"That our Delegate to the Triennial Assembly be allowed \$10.00 per day while the Triennial is in session and 4c per mile traveling charges."

We recommend this be changed to read-"That our Delegate to the Triennial be allowed Four (4) nights lodging and 10¢ per mile traveling charges."

2. It has been brought to our attention that in last year's Grand Session all Contingent Funds with the exception of the Contingent Fund for the Grand Secretary were increased 50%. We recommend that the Contingent Fund for the Grand Secretary be raised from \$250.00 (page 22) to \$375.00.

We the Constitution and By-Laws Committee recommend:

That the report of the Jurisprudence Committee and the Constitution and By-Laws Committee be given immediately after the opening of the Tuesday Morning Session.

Article IX Section 6 (4)

The Grand Treasurer shall receive as full compensation for her Services (\$50.00) \$75.00.

Duties of Committees and Grand Representatives

Article II Section I

Only those first four Officers who have not previously served be given Credential cards. There is no reason for a Past Matron, Past Patron, Past Grand Matron or Past Grand Patron to be required to show Credentials but should vote as all values of the Past Matrons and Past Patrons.

Article II Section 12

ADD-

As the present appointments expire. The length of Commission of Grand Representatives appointed by the State of Delaware be for a two year period.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION

SECOND READINGS-

Article VIII Election and Installation of Officers

Section 2

Add:

Should a Grand Trustee or Trustees through illness, resignation or some emergency not be able to advance, notice shall be given to the Grand Chapter in writing, Monday morning of the meeting week. A nomination must be placed in the nomination box for the Grand Trustee or Trustees.

The Board of Grand Trustees recommend an increase of 50% in the salaries of the Grand Secretary, the Assistant Grand Secretary and the Grand Treasurer; and for this purpose present the following changes in the Constitution—Parentheses indicate portion to be omitted and bold indicates portion to be added.

Article IX Section 5 (12)

The Grand Secretary shall receive for services a salary of (\$400.00) \$600.00 and a contingent fund of \$250.00. Such compensation is to include the entire amount expended for services in the Grand Secretary's office during the year. She shall also be reimbursed for the cost of a single room for three nights during Grand Chapter Session. She shall select a competent Assistant to act as Stenographer at the Grand Chapter Session who is a member in good standing, assist in compiling the proceedings and in the absence of the Grand Secretary answer all mail and distribute supplies to the subordinate chapters and receive for this service the sum of (\$75.00) \$112.50 to be paid by the Grand Chapter.

- Recommendation that the 90 questions required for the "A" Proficiency Examination be revised. Many are obsolete.
- 2. All presiding officers should have knowledge of Parliamentary Law of how to conduct a meeting. Recommendation that some questions be incorporated in the "B" Certificate.
- 3. It has been extremely difficult for our Deputy Grand Lecturers to find some answers in our General Grand Chapter Book of Instructions. We have complied with not using our old "Green Book of Instructions" but find many procedures pertaining to our own Jurisdiction not included in this Book. It is recommended that some consideration be given to loose leaf pages which could be added (and revised without too much expense) to our General Grand Chapter Book of Instructions and would supply the missing instructions needed by our Deputy Grand Lecturers. This would eliminate the Worthy Grand Matron compiling her "Book of Instructions" each year.

Should this be approved as a second reading, the Worthy Grand Matron is instructed to appoint a committee of three to work in conjunction with the Jurisprudence and the Constitution and By-Laws Committees to compile the necessary instructions.
