



## AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER BY-LAWS

The following were approved by me as Worthy Grand Matron and are now submitted to the Constitution and Laws Committee of Grand Chapter for final approval. Per our Rules and Regulations for the Government of Subordinate Chapters in Delaware, all changes or additions to Chapter By-Laws are forwarded to the Worthy Grand Matron, the Grand Secretary and the Chairman

of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee as they are approved by their membership. Upon approval by the Worthy Grand Matron, they become and remain effective until the next session of the Grand Chapter.

The amendments are as follows:

Mizpah Chapter No. 2 -

Article II - Meetings - Section 1, reads:

"The stated meetings of this Chapter shall be held on the second and fourth Fridays of each month, excepting July and August, Good Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, December 24th, 25th and May 30th, if it falls on stated meeting, at 8 P.M."

Amend to read:

"The stated meetings of this Chapter shall be held on the second and fourth Fridays of each month, excepting July, August, Good Friday, May 30th, if it falls on stated meeting, and only one meeting in the months of November and December, at 8:00 P.M."

Article II. Section 1a:

Add: at the discretion of the incoming Worthy Matron, the Chapter shall have Open Installation.

Changes or additions:

"Trustees recommend that Ten Dollars (\$10.00) be allowed from the Treasurer for refreshments each month except for Birthday and Official Visit."

"Treasurer's salary be raised from \$25.00 per year to \$50.00 per year."

"Secretary's salary be raised from \$75.00 per year to \$100.00 per year."

"Dues be raised to \$10.00 per year from \$8.00 per year."

Frankford Chapter No. 12 -

Article IV - Membership

Add Section 2 - Dual Membership is permitted in this Chapter as prescribed in Section 12 of Rules and Regulations for the Government of Subordinate Chapters in Delaware.

Brandywine Chapter No. 14 -

Article 1, page 5, Sec. 2 - Meetings

Change from: The stated meetings of this Chapter shall be held the first and third Thursdays of each month at 8:00 P.M., except the meetings in July and August, the first meeting in January (if this falls on New Year's Night), and Holy Thursday, shall be omitted.

To read: The stated meetings of this Chapter shall be held the first and third Thursdays of each month at 8:00 P.M. except the meetings in July and August, and the first meeting in January (if this falls on New Year's night) shall be omitted.

Article III, Powers and Duties of Officers

Change from: Duties of the Secretary, salary \$100.00 per year; Treasurer, salary \$20.00 per year; Organist shall receive the sum of \$10.00.

Change to: Secretary, salary \$150.00 per year; Treasurer, salary \$50.00 per year; Organist shall receive the sum of \$20.00 per year.

Proposed Changes to the By-Laws of Naomi Chapter No. 20 -

Page 11 - Article XI - Trustees - Section 5, changed to read:

- (a) The Trustees shall each year obtain a jewel and/or service bar to be presented to the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron upon their retirement as tokens of this Chapter's appreciation of their services rendered.
- (b) The Trustees shall follow the procedure set out in Article XII. Insert the following as new Article XII:

Article XII - Jewels

Section 1 - At the end of their term of office, jewels and/or service bars shall be presented to the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron as symbols of appreciation for their service.

Section 2 - Specification of Jewels

- (a) Worthy Matron jewel shall be 14 karat yellow gold with a bar at the top with the name of the Chapter enameled on it, from which shall be suspended a gavel and two chains which will support a wreath with an enameled star with raised emblems and one 5 point diamond centered on the star and five 3 point diamonds placed between the enameled star points as shown in the photographic sample in the Chapter safe deposit box.
- (b) Worthy Patron jewel shall be the same design except that it shall have a square and compass instead of a gavel and the enameled star shall be plain without diamonds as shown in the photographic sample in the Chapter safe deposit box.
- (c) Service bars shall be 14 karat yellow gold and rectangular in shape as shown in the photographic sample in the Chapter safe deposit box.

Section 3 - After approval by the Chapter of the cost of any jewels, service bars, revisions, engraving and attachment, the Trustees shall purchase said jewels and/or service bars, and upon receipt thereof they shall be placed in the Chapter safe deposit box.

Section 4 - At various times Naomi Chapter has in it's possession certain jewels and/or service bars which have been donated or bequeathed to the Chapter. During the month of January it shall be the duty of the Trustees to check with the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron and determine if any of the jewels and/or service bars which are on hand will be acceptable or if they desire to have a jewel and/or service bar as described in Section 2, Article XII, After a decision has been made by the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron, it shall be the duty of the Trustees to obtain whatever is required and have it ready for presentation.

Section 5 - In the event that a Worthy Matron and/or Worthy Patron shall serve Naomi Chapter more than one term, they will not receive a new jewel. A service bar for attachment to the existing jewel or service bar shall be obtained by the Trustees. The Trustees shall attend to have the bar engraved and attached to the existing jewel or service bar. (See letter on Page 29.)

Section 6 - The jewels and/or the attached service bars shall be presented to the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron at the final meeting of their term of office or at any other regular Chapter meeting at the pleasure and convenience of those officers.

Section 7 - The price of such jewels and/or service bars will vary according to the price of gold and the cost of labor to fabricate, engrave and attach such items.

## GEORGETOWN CHAPTER No. 9 CHANGE IN BY-LAWS

#### ARTICLE I

Section 3 - Fiscal Year - Now Reads:

The fiscal year of this Chapter shall commence on January 1st and end on December 31st.

Change to Read:

The fiscal year of this Chapter shall be governed by the Grand Chapter for all Subordinate Chapters.

## ARTICLE III - Officers

Section 1 - Now Reads:

The elective officers of this Chapter shall consist of Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, Associate Patron, Secretary, Treasurer, Conductress, Associate Conductress, who shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the members present at the first regular meeting in December.

Change to Read:

The elective officers of this Chapter shall consist of Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, Associate Patron, Secretary, Treasurer, Conductress, Associate Conductress, who shall be elected annually by a majority vote of members present at the first regular meeting of the last month of the Chapter year.

## Section 3 - Now Reads:

All officers must be installed except Trustees on first regular meeting in January or as soon thereafter as practicable.

Change to Read:

All officers must be installed except Trustees on first regular meeting of the Chapter year or as soon thereafter as practicable.

## ARTICLE V - Fees and Dues

#### Section 3 - Now Reads:

Any member in arrears for one year's dues shall be notified by the Secretary, and if not paid within one year thereafter may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the Chapter. When all back dues have been paid or remitted, such member is restored to good standing without further action of the Chapter.

## Change to Read:

Any member in arrears for one year's dues shall be notified by the Secretary, and if not paid within one year thereafter may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the Chapter. Upon payment of two (2) years back dues plus current year's dues, a member may petition a Chapter for reinstatement by majority vote by secret written ballot.

If the case is one of pressing necessity, the Worthy Matron may on the report of the Committee draw an order upon the Treasurer for an amount not exceeding ten dollars and the order so drawn shall be sufficient voucher to the Treasurer to pay the same.

Last sentence Change to Read:

If the case is one of pressing necessity, the Worthy Matron may on the report of the committee draw an order upon the Treasurer for an amount not exceeding twenty-five (25) dollars and the order so drawn shall be sufficient youcher to the Treasurer to pay the same.

#### Section 2 - Delete Section 2 as written

Section 2a - In the by-laws book will become Section 2.

#### Add Section 2a -

Each Worthy Matron will appoint a gift committee consisting of three (3) members to take care of all Chapter gifts presented during her term of office. The committee will select gifts and purchase same after Chapter approval of monetary amount.

OMIT Section 3 and 4 completely as written

#### ARTICLE IX

#### ADD Section 3

Any Past Matron serving another term in this Chapter as Worthy Matron will be compensated the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) in lieu of a Jewel for services rendered.

#### ADD Section 4

Any Past Patron serving another term in this Chapter as Worthy Patron will be compensated the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50) in lieu of a Jewel for services rendered.

## ADD Section 5

Any alterations of Jewels will be at discretion of Trustees.

## ARTICLE XI - Duties of Secretary

Section 1 - sentences that read: "She shall at the annual meeting in January report in writing all money received and paid to the Treasurer. She shall forward the returns of the Chapter to the Grand Secretary on or before the fifteenth day of February of each year.

## CHANGE TO READ: (sentences)

She shall at the annual meeting of the ensuing Chapter term report in writing all money received and paid to the Treasurer. She shall forward the returns of the Chapter to the Grand Secretary on or before the fifteenth day of the following month.

## Section 1 - Duties of Secretary

Reads: . . . for which service she shall receive the sum of One Hundred (100) dollars per year.

CHANGE TO READ: . . . . for which service she shall receive the sum of One Hundred Fifty (150) dollars per year, plus relinquishment of paying Chapter dues plus Grand Chapter Per Capitation.

#### ARTICLE XI - Duties of Treasurer

Section 3 - last sentence reads: . . . . for which service she she shall receive the sum of twenty-five (25) dollars,

CHANGE TO READ: . . . . for which service she shall receive the sum of fifty (50) dollars per year plus relinquishment of paying Chapter dues and Grand Chapter Per Capitation.

# CONSOLIDATION OF RADIANT CHAPTER No. 6 WITH BRANDYWINE CHAPTER No. 14

Procedure for Consolidation of Chapters adopted by our Grand Chapter was carefully followed in the consolidation of Radiant Chapter with Brandywine Chapter.

- 1. A letter dated September 27 was sent to each member of Radiant Chapter by the Secretary regarding the probability of consolidation. The date of the meeting to decide to be November 1, 1983.
- 2. At a stated meeting on November 1, a motion was made to Consolidate with Brandywine Chapter No. 14, a vote by secret written ballot was taken. It was unanimous, and a letter was written to Brandywine Chapter No. 14 asking to be accepted by them.

3. Brandywine Chapter No. 14 received the letter and voted on accepting Radiant Chapter No. 6 by consolidation. The vote was unanimous to accept the members of Radiant Chapter and a letter was sent to Radiant Chapter stating the results of that motion.

Two questions arose in regard to the dues and dues cards. The members of Radiant had paid \$10.00 for 1984 and Brandywine Chapter dues are \$15.00. It was agreed that Radiant members would not have to pay the additional amount this year. Second, should the members of Radiant, who had paid dues prior to consolidation, be issued Brandywine Chapter dues cards? After discussing this with the Right Worthy Grand Secretary to find how other Grand Jurisdictions handle this matter, it was determined that dues cards of the continuing Chapter should be issued. At some time during the month of February, the Grand Secretary asked me to change my decision on this would cause additional work and expense to send out new dues cards. Since I had made my decision, I placed the matter in the hands of the Committee on Chapters Under Charter, Dispensation and Consolidation for them to decide. There are three members on that committee: one felt that new dues cards should be issued and two felt that it was an unnecessary expense to re-issue the dues cards. I notified the Secretary of Brandywine Chapter and the Grand Secretary of this decision. The committee will make a report at the proper time.

We do not like to lose a Chapter under any circumstance. However, if circumstances warrant a decision to consolidate, we do have a proper procedure to follow and consolidation does protect our members who can not affiliate with another Chapter.

## To: WORTHY MATRONS AND DEPUTY GRAND LECTURERS:

From: Joan L. Moore, Worthy Grand Matron, Grand Chapter of Delaware, O.E.S.

This is a letter to clarify some details in regard to Open Installations and a few other items:

I do plan to attend as many Installations as possible but will not be accepting honors as the night of Installation is at times quite lengthy.

Please note as follows: 1. When the Worthy Grand Matron or first person in line for introductions, declines honors proceed to greet each person or persons (if a group such as Grand Officers or Deputy Grand Lecturers, Worthy Matrons and Patrons). However, do not direct the Conductress and/or Associate Conductress to introduce or escort them, then wait for them to decline. I feel this is redundant. Continue through the complete order of introductions as per Book of Instructions. (2) Some Worthy Matrons are saying assemble in the West, it is APPROACH. (3) Grand Representatives are introduced by the Conductress saying, "I have the pleasure to introduce the Grand Representatives who will state their name and jurisdiction they represent." (4) The Conductress and Chaplain proceed to and from Altar in like manner, line of march two steps beyond Esther's station, turn, walk direct to Altar, back out to position between Esther and Ruth or Martha, turn around, walk directly to point on line of march which is two steps beyond Esther's station (the same as when going to Altar).

OPEN INSTALLATION procedures are set out on Page 96. Please read the second sentence of the first paragraph (I have numbered the paragraphs 1 through 9) and continue through the third paragraph. The fourth paragraph must be used selectively as some phrases do not pertain to our "Open Installation" as the Installing Officer is in full charge at that point. Therefore, disregard the first sentence of the fourth paragraph. The second sentence states the "Worthy Matron" directs the Conductress to open the Bible. Disregard Worthy Matron as this will be upon the direction of the Installing Officer. The Bible will be opened by the OUTGOING CONDUCTRESS. The Conductress will be outside of the room during recess for preparation of Installation; when the Installing Marshal has everything in readiness she will tell the Conductress, the Conductress will assume the Conductress' station in the Chapter room. When the Installing Officer is ready she will then instruct the Conductress to open the Bible (with no signs) stating, "after which we will repeat the Lord's Prayer." The Conductress will remain West of Altar until after the Lord's Prayer, then return to marching line and join the other officers outside of the Chapter room. Omit Paragraphs 5 and 6. Please note Grand Honors are given. Paragraph 7 is additional information. Paragraphs 8 and 9 are self-explanatory.

I know that this is a lot on one page but hope that this does cover all the questions that have been asked. Many points have been discussed and are clear to those persons. If you have questions, please call me, but not at work as I do not have my books with me.

## **OUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**

- Q: A member had been suspended from the Order of the Eastern Star for non-payment of dues, also from the Blue Lodge. He expressed his desire to become a member once again verbally through another member.
  - A: Until the former member requests the petition himself there is nothing we can do other than instruct the friend the exact procedure to follow for reinstatement.
- 2. Q: A petition was received and read in a Subordinate Chapter. The petitioner used the Masonic relationship of a "stepfather". She is, as the Chapter is now aware, no longer a "stepdaughter". What action is now taken by the Chapter? Is the petition valid on the grounds that she was a "stepdaughter"?
  - A: I referred to page 27 of the Rules and Regulations, Decisions, Book of Instruction (Red Book) which states that if the petitioner does not have the proper eligibility according to the section on Membership, Ritual, Page 161, the petition and fee shall be returned and no ballot shall be taken.
- 3. Q: A fomer member returned her demit to her former Chapter stating she would like to remain a member of that Chapter. She intended to affiliate in another Jurisdiction at the time she requested the demit and now is ill and unable to affiliate.
  - A: I referred to the Constitution and By-law, Page 48, Sec. 21, which states, "A demit having been granted by the Chapter cannot be reconsidered."
- 4. Q: A member asked if a stated meeting could be cancelled.
  - A: A stated meeting can not be cancelled, Page 10, Book of Instruction of the General Grand Chapter (Red Book) which states, "It is not lawful to postpone a stated meeting of a Chapter if a quorum is present". A Quorum is defined on Page 164 of the Ritual. Also the Delaware Supplement states one of the first four elected officers must be present.
- 5. Q: What is the proper procedure for reinstatement after suspension for non-payment of dues?
  - A: The answer in part is found on Page 51, Constitution and By-laws, Section 30, the last sentence. However, the words "by majority vote" should be added after by — and before secret written ballot. This answer will be in its entirety when the book is reprinted.

## **DECISIONS**

- A former member who had demitted from her Chapter, petitioned another Chapter and was rejected, wrote to me requesting me to attend a Chapter on the night her petition would be balloted upon. I informed her that the presence of the Worthy Grand Matron should have no effect upon the results of the ballot and that I would not be attending the meeting. We have a provision in our Constitution and By-laws to protect a member in the interim change of Chapters.
- Open Installations are permitted in our Grand Chapter at the discretion of the Worthy Grand Matron. There is nothing in some Chapters' By-laws

regarding Open Installation in the Subordinate Chapter. Therefore, we must govern Open Installations in the Subordinate Chapter by the statement in the Ritual which is as follows: "By action of the Chapter, an open meeting for the Installation of officers may be held". The decision involves the word "action". By action of the Chapter means that a vote must be taken to permit Open Installation if there is no provision in the Chapter By-laws.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

 It has been a requirement for several years that the Grand Secretary shall send a copy of all legislation transpired at the annual session to the Subordinate Chapters. I recommend that the approved changes or legislation adopted by the members of this Grand Chapter be sent by the Grand Secretary under a cover letter from the Worthy Grand Matron, bearing the seal of this Grand Chapter, directing that they shall be read and spread upon the minutes so that there is a permanent record in each Chapter of these changes and additions to our laws.

2. I recommend that each Chapter when submitting changes or additions to their Chapter By-laws, have the portion of the By-law to be changed, the addition or correction, be typed double spaced on a page separate from the body of the letter to the Worthy Grand Matron which requests her approval. The reason being that they have to be re-typed in order to include them in the Worthy Grand Matron's report. At times they have been submitted as a photocopy of the page to be changed or corrected with the changes

crossed out and the change interlined.

## RATIONALE FOR CHANGE OF LOCATION FOR THE "JOY OF LIVING" SESSION

The change of location was strictly a matter of economics. I believe in living within a budget and, when costs escalate, then an alternate plan must be found. There is no way to measure the cost to our members per person who attend the annual session. We do know that a few years ago many persons could room together to reduce the cost per person. However, in the last year, the Hotel duPont would not allow this doubling up. Therefore, the cost per person for housing increased considerably. If the cost increases too much, we will not have as many of our members attend and they will not have any interest in our Grand Chapter Session. Research revealed that the cost for the Gold Ball Room and rooms for the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron and Grand Secretary have increased considerably; from \$150.00 in 1936, \$756.00 in 1956, \$1.268.50 in 1976, \$2,086.43 in 1982 and \$2,750.68 in 1983. The cost for Nur Temple facilities for this year is less than \$200.00 per day. This is important but the most important savings is to our members individually.

Another factor considered very carefully before making this change, was the parking situation. Our members should not be walking to the parking authority late at night to get their cars and, in the morning when they arrive, there has been a problem finding a place to park. There is no limit to the parking at the Shrine Temple and there is no charge for parking.

I do realize that it is inconvenient to those who stay at the Ramada Inn as we have to travel the distance between the Inn and the Temple. I felt that the savings to us can offset this inconvenience.

If I have erred in this decision, please forgive as I made it with the Good of the Order foremost in my mind.

I also mailed them to all Grand Representatives who had been appointed during my term. Also included in this recommendation is that the Grand Officers of New Jersey be sent these tentative programs.

That a standing committee of three be formed to obtain a photographer for all Sessions photography. The name of this committee should be "Photography Committee". When the Banquet and Necrology Committees need a photographer they could have a source committee for information. We have no guidelines now as to cost, who bears this expense, etc. The death of the photographer on Saturday prior to the banquet put an extra burden on the Worthy Grand Matron which would not be necessary if there was a committee.

# RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WORTHY GRAND PATRON

1. Owing to the fact that a Past Grand Patron may upon short notice be called upon to preside during the ceremony of initiation, I hereby recommend that a Past Grand Patron or current Worthy Grand Patron, and in proper standing upon his request, be loaned a copy of the secret work and/or diagram of the Labyrinth.

And also the Brother making a request be allowed to retain such items until he voluntarily returns them to the Grand Chapter. It is, of course, expected that in return for such privilege, he will follow the then currrent rules established by the General Grand Chapter for proper preservation of these articles. 2. I, too, as my predecessor, have, upon visiting other Grand Jurisdictions, found all elected and appointed Grand Officers wearing jewels to indicate their currently held office.

I also felt badly for our Grand Officers and, therefore, I recommend that jewels of office (be-ribboned style) alike or similar to the existing traveling jewels of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron.

I, furthermore, with the concurrence of the incoming Worthy Grand Matron, would be willing to volunteer my services to undertake the raising of funds to finance such a project if this recommendation is so approved.

It is expected that the said jewels would be handled in the same manner as those of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, being that they would be presented at their installation and returned at the end of their elected or appointed year.

3. It appears that as years go by, it will become increasingly difficult to attract high caliber men to the elected Grand line. It behooves us to assist our Brothers to the best of our ability to enable as much as possible those who desire to join these ranks to do so.

Some may be on fixed incomes and others for various reasons cannot undertake further financial burdens.

I realize that the office of Worthy Grand Patron is a high honor, but many of our worthy and dedicated Brothers cannot afford to succeed to such a high office.

I would therefore recommend that an increase in the allowance of the current \$75.00 of the Worthy Grand Patron be increased.

We would not expect our Grand Secretary or Grand Treasurer to perform their duties without proper remuneration, yet the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron presently are expected to perform their duties on an exceedingly small amount.

We should not preclude any of our Sisters and Brothers from serving our beloved Order only because some are more fortunate to be blessed with more suitable financial abilities than others.

Sister Carol C. Strizek, our Most Worthy Grand Matron states: "Nothing is of more value to the world, than our support of the Youth Organizations." She says: "May we always give to our young pepole all the help we are able to muster to aid them."

Sister and Brothers, the future of our Order depends on how successful we can be in getting Rainbow Girls, with proper Masonic affiliation, Job's Daughters, and young Masons, who were former DeMolay boys, into your Order. We must meet with them, talk with them, tell them what good people we are, and what we have to offer.

A Bethel consists of 19 officers and a choir. Five of the officers are elected and 14 appointed for a six month term. Delaware has 11 Bethels from Claymont to Dagsboro.

The purpose of the Order is to band together girls ages 11 to 20 for character building, developing self-confidence, and learning leadership qualities.

The Bethel atmosphere gives each member a little taste of life by exposing her to the experience of planning, organizing, and supervising projects and programs. Each Bethel is provided with a Council of volunteer, adult workers dedicated to the purpose of caring for, guiding, and directing the members toward the higher ideals of life.

Membership in Job's Daughters, as in other organizations, is down. I encourage anyone here tonight, if they know of a girl who is related to a Master Mason, to please see me later on in the evening to pick up a petition or at least some brochures about the Order that may help to influence a girl to join. Or if you prefer, you can give me a name and phone number of a girl and I would be very happy to make contact with her.

I also welcome all Masons and members of the Eastern Star who have never attended a Bethel meeting in the past to come to one. Each Bethel has Eastern Star and Masonic nights every term during which the members of these two Orders are honored. You are always welcome and may I personally encourage each of you to attend and help support the organization.

If anyone has any questions about the Order or about anything I have said this evening, I encourage any questions. I am sold on the Order, its beliefs, and its purpose; let me and others help sell you on it also.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS, SUBORDINATE CHAPTERS

In our pattern is always found the violet, the yellow jessamine, the white lily, the green fern, and the red rose. Some others quite appropriately used are the lily of the valley, columbine, trullieum, desert flowers, apple blossoms, eidelweiss and the pine cone. Appearing in the picture, you will also find the Eastern Star International Peace Garden (located between North Dakota and Manitoba, Canada) as a symbol of peace and harmony. Also, as an emblem of International unity is the International Temple in Washington, D.C.

As we view each jurisdiction so different and yet so alike, we always find the blue of Adah's fidelity, the yellow of Ruth's constancy, the white of Esther's light, purity and joy, the green of Martha's hope of immortality, and the red of Electa's fervency, all appearing in different hues as each Worthy Grand Matron emphasizes a different virtue.

The names of each session were so varied, yet all interwoven with fraternal love, formed an intricate pattern. "Sessions of Love", Michigan - "Red Rose of Love", Nebraska - "Golden "Sessions of Friendship", North Dakota - "Precious Memories", Oregon - "Miracle Chain of Tricks Wellington Trectous Memories , Oregon - "Miracle of Love", South Dakota - "Unity", Tennessee - "Chimes of Love", Utah - "The of Love, Binds", Washington - "Words of Love", Delaware - "Harvest of Friendship", and Indiana - "Treasures of Love". In Vermont they combined the names of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron for "Gar-Mel". As we visualize the picture significant to each session it is difficult to believe there could be such variety.

The tapestry was consistently strengthened by the charity of its truly beautiful members in supporting the many, many projects of each Grand Chapter, spreading love, happiness and support wherever they are needed.

# LEGISLATION ENACTED AT GRAND CHAPTER - MAY 1984 SECOND READINGS CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Article IX, Section 6, paragraph 4. Salary

Now reads: "The Grand Treasurer shall receive as full compensation for her services \$75.00 and a contingency fund of \$50.00."

Article IX, Section 9, paragraph 5.

Now reads: "That the diamond used in future Past Grand Matron's jewel be a fine point .18 stone. In the event a Past Grand's jewel is acquired by Grand Chapter, it will be preserved as it was originally crafted except for refurbishing and engraving."

# RULES AND REGULATIONS, SUBORDINATE CHAPTERS

Article I, Section 12, paragraph 4. (Membership)

Now reads: "The procedure in receiving and acting upon any petition for Dual Membership shall be the same as that of any other petition for affiliation. Proper notification shall be made to the primary Chapter that Dual Membership has been completed."

Article I, Section 3. Officers. Line 6 was defeated. This pertained to the change of Grand Chapter year for election of officers and installation.

The following were adopted for a first reading:

Article IX, Section 1, paragraph 11 (Worthy Grand Matron)

Would read if adopted next year: "During the recess of the Grand Chapter she shall exercise its executive powers, and her authority shall be supreme in all matters as set forth in our laws; she may call upon the Worthy Grand Patron for assistance and advice at any time. In the event of the disability or demise of the Grand Secretary or Grand Treasurer, she shall call a meeting with the Worthy Grand Patron, Jurisprudence and Constitution and By-Laws Committees to appoint an acting Grand Secretary or Grand Treasurer who shall serve until the next annual Session. Interested persons may make their desires known in writing to the Worthy Grand Matron within ten (10) days after said disability or demise, said meeting and appointment shall be made within the next ten (10) days."

Article IX, Section 5, paragraph 14. Grand Secretary.

Add: "She shall maintain a chronological log of the duties of her office to facilitate any changeover which may occur."

Article IX, Section 6, paragraph 5. Grand Treasurer.

Add: "She shall maintain a chronological log of the duties of her office to facilitate any changeover which may occur."

Article X, Section 2, paragraph 2. Secret Work.

Would read if adopted next year: "There shall be three copies of the Secret Work for each Subordinate Chapter, one for the use of the Worthy Patron, one for the use of the Associate Patron and one for the use of the Conductress. A copy of the Secret Work and Diagram of the Labyrinth should be given to the Worthy Grand Matron and the Worthy Grand Patron."

The following was adopted and needed only 1st reading as it is a Rules and Regulations.

Recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron which reads as follows: "It has been a requirement for several years that the Grand Secretary shall send a copy of all legislation transpired at the annual session to the Subordinate Chapters. I recommend that the approved changes on legislation adopted by the members of this Grand Chapter be sent by the Grand Secretary under a cover letter from the Worthy Grand Matron, bearing the seal of this Grand Chapter, directing that they shall be read and spread upon the minutes so that there is a permanent record in each Chapter of these changes and additions to our laws.

Article III, Section 1 (8) (Page 41)

Will now read: "Registration fee for Grand Chapter Session . . \$3.00."

Recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron which read as follows was approved by the Committee on Jurisprudence: "I recommend that each Chapter when submitting changes or additions to their Chapter By-laws have the portion of the By-law to be changed, the addition or correction, be typed double-spaced on a page separate from the body of the letter to the Worthy Grand Matron which requests her approval. The reason being that they have to be re-typed in order to include them in the Worthy Grand Matron's report. At times they have been submitted as a photocopy of the page to be changed or corrected with the changes crossed out and the change interlined.

Recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron which read as follows was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee: "Tentative programs be sent by the Grand Secretary to all General Grand Chapter Officers, both elected and appointed, and General Grand Chapter Committee members. I found this was not the normal procedure and used my own funds to photocopy and mail them to all Grand Representatives who had been appointed during my term. Also included in this recommendation is that the Grand Officers of New Jersey be sent these Tentative Programs.

Recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron which read as follows was approved by the Jurisprudence Committee: "That a standing committee of three be formed to obtain a photographer for all Sessions photography, the name of this committee should be "Photography Committee". When the Banquet and Necrology Committee need a photographer they could have a source committee for information. We have no guidelines now as to cost, who bears this expense,

etc. The death of the photographer on Saturday prior to the banquet put an extra burden on the Worthy Grand Matron which would not be necessary if

## Irregularities approved -

- Letter from Worthy Grand Matron under seal not being read the first meeting after receipt of letter.
- A note sent to a Deputy Grand Lecturer not under seal being read in a Subordinate Chapter and spread upon the minutes.

- Demits being voted on by membership. A demit is granted by the Worthy Matron if the member requesting demit is clear on the books.
- Signs are not always as they should be but we must allow for our many substitutes. We are grateful to them as most are called upon at the last minute to substitute.
- Incorrect raps by Warder and Sentinel. Also raps should be done quietly as many times our meetings are held in public places where sound carries.
- Lighted candles being used in the Chapter room. Refer to page 4 of the Red Book of Instructions.
- 10. A Deputy Grand Lecturer asking advice from someone other than the Worthy Grand Matron or Grand Lecturer in regard to procedure for reinstatement after non-payment of dues. This Deputy Grand Lecturer had already been instructed by the Worthy Grand Matron the exact, correct procedure to follow. The procedure used by this Deputy Grand Lecturer upon the advice of another member was not correct and is an irregularity. The member upon reinstatement DOES NOT sign the By-laws.

## Questions and answers approved -

- A member had been suspended from the Order of the Eastern Star for nonpayment of dues, also from the Blue Lodge. He expressed his desire to become a member once again verbally through another member. A: Until the former member requests the petition himself there is nothing we can do other than instruct the friend the exact procedure to follow for reinstatement.
- 2. A petition was received and read in a Subordinate Chapter. The petitioner used the Masonic relationship of a "stepfather". She is, as the Chapter is now aware, no longer a "stepdaughter". What action is now to be taken by the Chapter? Is the petition valid on the grounds that she was a "step-
