#### AHOY MATES!! WELCOME ABOARD!!

As one entered the "Foyer" of the NUR TEMPLE MOSQUE, one was welcomed by a sign proclaiming the "STAR of the SEA" Session. The focal point in this area was a full-size sailboat with a dolphin "swimming" alongside. Several small white tables and chairs were positioned about as if at "dockside".

In the Grand Chapter room, the Grand East (stage) featured a replica of a "lighthouse" complete with lighted beacon against a backdrop of "blue sky and fleecy white clouds". Mounted on the front of the podium was a ship's prow surmounted by a ship's wheel. "Ship's railings" edged the stage area and defined the Grand East. ### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

No. 1

Q: A member asked if a stated meeting could be postponed or cancelled when weather is so bad that there is a travel advisory that roads are treacherous.

No. (As per Ritual page 164) The stated meetings are those held on the day and at the hour prescribed by the By-Laws of a Chapter, and cannot be adjourned to another day.

Also, Book of Instruction of the General Grand Chapter (Red Book) Page 10 states, "It is not lawful to postpone a stated meeting of a Chapter if a quorum is present,"

(As per Ritual page 164) A Quorum is defined as, "Seven members of the Chapter including one of the first four officers, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, unless the By-Laws of the Chapter shall prescribe a larger number."

No. 2

- Q: Is it permissible to remove chairs from semi-circle which were placed there for installation of officers because the Worthy Matron would like to have a closing march?
- A: Yes. (As per Ritual Page 94) "Whenever possible the circle of chairs is left in the west until after the ceremony has been completed." The ceremony is completed when the Marshal proclaims that the officers of \_\_\_\_\_ Chapter No. \_\_\_\_ are regularly installed.

No. 3

- Q: \_\_\_\_Chapter had received and read 2 petitions from a Master Mason and his wife. An investigating committee was appointed. Petitioners said they wanted their money back. Can fees be returned?
- A: No. I refer to Red Book Rules and Regulations for Government of Subordinate Chapters in Delaware. Article I Section 31 and Section 34. "A petition cannot be considered unless accompanied by the initiation fee, and cannot be withdrawn after being read to the Chapter. The ballot must be spread on all legal applications and affiliation."

### AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER BY-LAWS

On October 27, 1989, I approved the following amendments to the By-Laws of Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8:

### ARTICLE III, Section 1 (Now reads)

"The elective officers of this Chapter shall consist of a Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, Associate Patron, Secretary, Treasurer, Conductress, Associate Conductress, all of whom shall be elected annually by ballot by a majority of the members present at the first stated meeting in December. There shall also be elected three Trustees; one Trustee shall be elected annually for a term of three years."

### ARTICLE III, Section 1 (Amended to read)

"The elective officers of this Chapter shall consist of a Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron, Associate Patron, Secretary, Treasurer, Conductress, Associate Conductress, all of whom shall be elected annually by ballot by a majority of the members present at the first stated meeting in March. There shall also be elected three Trustees; one Trustee shall be elected annually for a term of three years."

### ARTICLE III, Section 2 (Now reads)

"All officers shall be installed on the first stated meeting in January or as soon thereafter as possible. A dispensation must be secured to install officers at a later date."

### ARTICLE III, Section 2 (Amended to read)

"All officers shall be installed on the first stated meeting in April or as soon

thereafter as possible. A dispensation must be secured to install officers at a later date."

# ARTICLE VII, Section 2 (Now reads)

"Each member, except life members, shall pay the sum of ten (10) dollars annual dues, payable in December. By order of the Grand Chapter, all dues must be paid one year in advance. The Chapter may, by a majority vote of the members present, remit the dues of any member."

# ARTICLE VII, Section 2 (Amended to read)

"Each member, except life members, shall pay the sum of ten (10) dollars annual dues and the current Grand Chapter Per Capita Tax, payable in December. By order of the Grand Chapter, all dues must be paid one year in advance. The Chapter may, by a majority vote of the members present, remit the dues of any member."

### ARTICLE X, Section 2 (Now reads)

"No officer of the Chapter shall receive compensation for services except the Secretary, Treasurer, Organist, and Sentinel. The Secretary shall receive for services rendered the sum of One Hundred (100) Dollars per year. The Treasurer and the Organist the sum of Twenty-Five (25) Dollars per year. The Sentinel shall receive the sum equalling the regular dues."

### ARTICLE X, Section 2 (Amended to read)

"No officer of this Chapter shall receive compensation for services except the Secretary, Treasurer, Organist and Sentinel. The Secretary shall receive for services rendered the sum of Two Hundred (200) Dollars per year. The Treasurer shall receive the sum of Fifty (50) Dollars and the Organist shall receive the sum of One Hundred (100) Dollars per year. The Sentinel shall receive the sum equalling the regular dues."

On January 10, 1990, I approved the following amendment to the By-Laws of Victory Chapter No. 15:

## ARTICLE V, Section II (Now reads)

"Each member must pay the sum of (10) dollars as annual dues payable in December or before. Members initiated or affiliated between regular dates for payment of dues, shall pay on a monthly basis for each full month until the next regular date for payment of dues."

# ARTICLE V, Section II (Amended to read)

"Each member must pay the sum of (10) dollars as annual dues payable in December or before. Members initiated or affiliated between regular dates for payment of dues, shall pay on a monthly basis for each full month until the next regular date for payment of dues. In addition, each member must pay the annual Grand Chapter Per Capita assessment with their dues."

### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Irecommend that the possibility of the Grand Chapter purchasing a computer and the appropriate software be investigated by the Trustees and the Grand Secretary. The computer would be located in the Grand Chapter Office and used primarily by the Grand Secretary and therefore needs her concurrance and willingness to devote some time to learning how to use the computer to the benefit of the Grand Chapter and its operation. I believe the Grand Jurisdiction of Delaware is well thought of in our sister jurisdictions and I believe the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron of Delaware should be "clearly" identified as such.

## REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Grand Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, O.E.S.:

As the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron will agree, it is most difficult, if not impossible, to condense into a few short paragraphs a year of activities and transactions.

First, I want to express my appreciation to this Grand Body for approving the purchase of the Canon Copier last year. This has been a very important time-saver as much of the correspondence that crosses my desk is to be shared with the Worthy Grand Matron and Patron.

Following the close of the 1989 Grand Sessions, the Sessions Programs were mailed to all Past Grands unable to attend; 50-year Certificates and Honorary Memberships were also mailed to all those who did not receive them at Grand Chapter. All bills were paid. A copy of all Legislation passed was sent to all the Subordinate Chapters under the seal of the Worthy Grand Matron.

During the year, my "IN" basket was many times stacked higher than my "OUT" basket with Proceedings from the other Grand Jurisdictions, tentative programs, Holiday Greetings, and Memorials. The proper acknowledgements were sent for each of these; and the Proceedings delivered to Sister Euretta L. Schultheiss for her Fraternal Correspondent Report and to the Grand Representative.

Expressions of sympathy were sent to other Grand Jurisdictions on the loss of PMWGM Mildred Haney Harris; forty-nine (49) Past Grand Matrons, forty (40) Past Grand Patrons; the Associate Grand Matron and Grand Secretary of New Brunswick; the Grand Secretary of Nevada, the Grand Chaplain of Pennsylvania, and the Grand Sentinel of Quebec.

Worthy Grand Matron appointed twenty-three (23) Grand Representatives to other Grand Jurisdictions and thirty (30) Commissions were issued. It was very pleasant to receive notes expressing delight, enthusiasm and excitement in planning to attend our Grand Sessions.

Sister Clara James, Grand Lecturer, directed me to issue two "A" and thirteen (13) "B" Certificates of Proficiency. Six (6) Sisters were eligible for 50-year Certificates. Regrets were received from PMWGM Sister Mae E. Mickelson, who had recent hip surgery; Sisters Florence Adair, Right Worthy Associate Grand Conductress; and Dorothy Dewing, Chairman

Right Worthy Grand Trustees; Frances Strand, Our World of Youth Committee; Marie Rasmussen, Membership Committee; Jeanne Beck, Member Charters Committee; Jane B. Sadler, Member Knights Templar Eye Foundation Committee; and several newly appointed Grand Representatives.

On March 31st (postponed from March 24), it was my pleasure to host a Luncheon/Workshop for the Secretaries of the Subordinate Chapters. Attending were seven (7) Secretaries, two (2) Secretaries-elect and our Associate Grand Matron. I want to thank Sister Carol and Brother Griff and their two helpers, Sister Dot and Brother Evert Pringle for serving a delicious luncheon and Kent Chapter No. 11 for allowing us the use of their Chapter room. There was much lively discussion and an interesting exchange of ideas.

One of my saddest duties of this past year was to sign, along with the Worthy Grand Matron, the charter of Delaware Chapter No. 1, when it was surrendered to Ruth Chapter No. 19 when the two Chapters consolidated on December 4, 1989. All report of contributions were prepared following the April 15th deadline and forwarded to the Chairmen of the various committees. ## REPORT OF THE FRATERNAL CORRESPONDENT

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Distinguished Guests, my Sisters and Brothers:

The Voyage of Friendship left port a year ago. We set sail with Kate Hoey as our radio communication officer. She was most efficient in keeping us informed of

the ships about to dock at our port and to the rest of their tales of travel and we thank her for this. We had some that had been lost at sea that finally reached our port as a proceedings of 1986 from California. The hurricane winds spun around and the Minnesota proceedings of May reached us in September. Congratulations to Minnesota for such a speedy report to their people. We had sickness on our Voyage but Joyce weathered the storm and was there as we prepared to dock busily typing this ship's report.

The Fraternal Correspondence Committee was founded in 1876 by the Worthy Grand Matron of Connecticut who had the foresight to see the value of exchanging ideas and creating fellowship between jurisdictions.

Our ritual is printed in English, French, German, Spanish, Italian, and Chinese as well as in braille.

The Headquarters of General Grand Chapter is located in the International Temple in Washington, D.C.. Built in 1909 as a private home, it was sold in 1934 by Mr. Belmont, a Master Mason. The Temple flies no flag but displays a lighted Star within a Pentagon within a Circle. The Star represents subordinate chapters, the Pentagon represents the Grand Chapter, and the Circle represents the General Grand Chapter. The Temple is open for tours through the General Grand Secretary.

The International Peace Garden is located between North Dakota and Manitoba. It consists of 888 acres donated by the State of North Dakota and 1451 acres donated by the province of Manitoba. The Eastern Star Chapel of Peace, in the shape of an octagon, was dedicated in 1970. This is the only building that was ever allowed to be built right on the border and probably will be the only one forever. The Chapel bears a plaque with these words, "Don't walk ahead of me, I may not follow- Don't walk behind me, I may not lead. Just walk beside me and be my friend." A Masonic auditorium was dedicated in 1981 and the roof and building are in the shape of a square and compass.

We give approximately one million dollars to charity. One of these charities is ESTARL which was founded in 1952 as a scholarship program for religious training and leadership. ESTARL with star in the middle and C and L represent "Deity of God" in ancient language.

I mention these two committees since we are honored with appointments to each of them-General Grand Chapter Committee members, Sister Joan and Brother George.

Michigan is the oldest Grand Jurisdiction. Ohio is the largest. Puerto Rico is the smallest. In Scotland and Australia no one receives Grand Honors, the prayer responses are sung, and the female candidates are veiled for their initiation. Grand Officers serve a two year term. In Kansas the Subordinate Chapters must exemplify Oregon no Grand line officers are permitted to ride in the same car, boat, or plane. In In Tennessee no Chapter meeting can last longer than two hours. In Indiana they Missouri they give a Gold Star Certificate to Chapters who had eighteen officers

present and a Silver Star Certificate if they had ten or more sideliners present. The decline in membership is of major concern throughout the Eastern Star World. The challenge to change this trend is ours. Let us live in such a way that those who are inactive can be rekindled and made active again and those that are not members will want to join us. Robert Morris said, "If we continue to serve humanity and share a purpose in the world, Eastern Star will live."

It is an honor for me as Potentate of NUR TEMPLE to welcome you to the Temple. You have certainly decorated it beautifully. I know someone has been doing a lot of work. As your Worthy Grand Patron stated earlier, we, too, help the crippled children. I would like to give you a few facts - in the sixty-seven years from the opening of the first Shriners Hospital through December 31, 1989, there have been approximately 4,842,674 X-rays taken; 3,617,571 out-patient and out-reach clinic visits; 431,535 operations performed; 468,308 braces and prostheses applied; 8,145,636 physical therapy treatments given. During 1989, 23,130 new applications were approved by Shriners Hospitals. Currently, there are approximately 115,331 active patients at the 22 units. Since I have been associated with the Shrine, in the years from 1984 through 1989, the Order of the Eastern Star, has donated \$32,000.00.

I am very glad to be here. I have not had the opportunity to attend an Eastern Star function before. My wife just informed me at the Banquet Saturday night that I will be joining Five Points Chapter. I know the tremendous work the Eastern Star has done over the years and I know that most of you have contributed thousands of dollars to Muscular Dystrophy. Well, this year, at the Jerry Lewis Telethon, the world is in for a big surprise. They have made a tremendous breakthrough in the fight against Muscular Dystrophy. There is not a light at the end of the tunnel shining a big light on the middle of the tunnel but it is a light that is beginning to shine. They have just come up with a drug that can be administered to children six years and under. They do have Muscular Dystrophy at that early age. We still have a long way to go in the fight to cure Muscular Dystrophy. Our children don't live long, very few of them live to be teen-agers. In 1959, the Tall Cedars of Lebanon became the first fraternal organization to support Muscular Dystrophy and since that time, we have raised over six and a half million dollars. All the money raised in Wilmington has gone into research, therapy and counseling in the Philadelphia area. I would like to thank you on behalf of all the members of Brandywine Forest No. 20 for your efforts.

### TRIBUTE TO THE FLAGS

### The American Flag

The story of the origin of our National flag — the story of the Stars and Stripes — parallels the story of the origin of our country. As our country received its birthright from the peoples of many lands who were gathered on these shores to found a new nation, so did the pattern of the Stars and Stripes rise from several origins back in the mists of antiquity to become emblazoned on the standards of our infant Republic

The star is a symbol of the heavens and the divine goal to which man has aspired from time immemorial; the stripe is symbolic of the rays of light emanating from the sun. Both themes have long been represented on the standards of nations.

General George Washington, when the Star Spangled Banner was first flown by the Continental Army, in 1777, is reputed to have described its symbolism as follows: "We take the stars from heaven, the red from our mother country, separating it by white stripes, thus showing that we have separated from her, and the white stripes shall go down to posterity representing liberty."

In a 1917 Flag Day message, President Woodrow Wilson said: "This flag, which we honor and under which we serve, is the emblem of our unity, our power, our thought and purpose as a nation. It has no other character than that which we give it from generation to generation. The choices are ours."

This beautiful flag that thrills our hearts as we see it hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously, is an inspiration and gives hope without measure to people in all walks of life. Where else could we boldly and fearlessly say, "...ask not what America will do for you, but what together we can do for the freedom of man." Or, "... I have a dream...." Or, "We have every right to dream heroic dreams."

### The Canadian Flag

The Canadian Maple Leaf flutters above an independent confederation of provinces. Though its titular head remains the Queen of England, Canada charts its own course as a parliamentary democracy.

The flag of Canada features a red eleven-pointed maple leaf, a national symbol of the country, on a white field; at each end is a broad, vertical red stripe. It became Canada's official flag on February 15, 1965...the realization of a goal set by Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson...and omitted any symbol of Canada's ties with Great Britain. The Motto: Appropriately, "From Sea to Sea."

We thank God that we have such peaceful neighbors to our North.

The Delaware State Flag

On July 24, 1913, the present State Flag of Delaware became official. The Flag was readopted on June 13, 1955, after it was discovered that the law describing it had been left out of the 1953 Delaware Code.

The date appearing below the diamond indicates when the State ratified the Constitution, Delaware being the first State to do so. The principal colors of the flag are "colonial blue and buff," recalling the colors of Revolutionary War uniforms. These colors were given precise definition in the law of 1955. This law also specified that the cords and tassels of the flag should be blue and gold. Blue and gold were the colors of the flag which flew over the colony of New Sweden located in what is today the State of Delaware.

The Arms of the State were adopted in 1777, which accounts for the presence of a colonial soldier as one of the supporters. The other supporter is a farmer, the agricultural theme further being carried out in the shield which includes an ox, a sheaf of wheat, and an ear of Indian corn. Our Motto: Liberty and Independence.

President Thomas Jefferson referred to Delaware as being like a diamond, because it had great worth even though it was small, and this led to the additional nickname of "The Diamond State."

### The Missouri State Flag

The Missouri Flag embodies the national colors, with the Coat of Arms in the center which denotes the independence of the State while still part of the Union. The blue stripe represents vigilance, permanency, and justice. The red indicates valor, and white purity. The State Motto: "The welfare of the people shall be the supreme law," is emblazoned on the seal in the center.

### The Mississippi State Flag

In the early days, Mississippi flew the Bonnie Blue Flag and the Magnolia Flag, but on February 7, 1894, the Legislature approved the report of a committee which had been appointed to select an appropriate State flag for Mississippi. The design chosen by them is believed to be the idea of Senator E. N. Scudder. The flag is red, white and blue — it combines the Stars and Bars of the Confederacy and its Battle Flag. The gilt staff and combined battle-axe and spear at the top were made part of the correct flag which became official when the committee report was accepted.

Mississippi has used as a seal a modified version of the arms of the United States ever since 1798 when it was a territory. Its motto means "By Virtue and Arms." The shield is wreathed with cotton, an important Mississippi crop, and the eagle holds a palm branch instead of the usual olive branch.

### The Christian Flag

The Christian flag is the banner of the Prince of Peace. It stands for no creed or denomination. It contains no symbol of warfare. The ground is white, representing peace and purity. In the upper corner is a blue field, the color of the unclouded sky, the symbol of fidelity and truth. Its chief device, the cross of red, is the emblem of Christian sacrifice. It symbolizes the blood our precious Saviour shed upon the Cross for the remission of our sins.

The Christian flag is a result of the inspiration of Charles C. Overton, Sunday School Superintendent, Coney Island, New York. When the speaker did not show up at Rally Day and Mr. Overton had to fill the time, the thought like a vision came to him. He expressed a wish for a flag to be made and the first Christian Flag unfurled for public service the following Sunday. It remains unchanged to this day...although nearly 84 years old it is one of the oldest unchanged flags in the world today.

The Christian flag is unique. It is unlike any other religious flag. All others are denominational...only the Christian Flag is universal for ALL Christian people of all persuasions. It has no parochial bearing. It has no temporal allegiance. No church sponsors it or rules it. This Flag stands on its own, shines by its own light, true, free, uncompromised. It belongs only to Christ.

### The Order of the Eastern Star Flag

Dr. Rob Morris founded our beautiful order based on the Holy Bible in 1850. When we see our Flag and the colors that emanate from the Central Star of our Order represented here, we cannot help but remember the teachings of each of those heroines, that is, that Adah teaches Fidelity to ourselves, our country and our God; Ruth teaches us to be Constant, steadfast and true; Esther, Noble Queen, teaches us to be Loyal to our friends, our country and our God; Martha teaches that a trustful Faith is greater than knowledge; and Electa's lesson is the second great law laid down by Christ, "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself."

There are no higher ideals than those which the Eastern Star Flag represents: As the Bible is the light which guides our faith, this banner is the symbol of our love and loyalty to our beautiful order.

Finally, my tribute to them all shall be that we always remain "One Nation under God," for liberty, love, faith, fidelity, constancy and loyalty. Let us always be proud to wave these flags!

But it is great to be with you here in Delaware. I've had a number of people ask me when I go home. Well, I don't go home for another few days. We'll be leaving bright and early in the morning. Thanks to Sister Jackie, she's going to get up and we'll leave at 4:30 in the morning in order to get a plane at six or so out of the Philadelphia airport. Now, if that's not dedication on her part! We'll spend about twenty-four hours in Maine. We'll go to the airport the next morning and spend about twenty-four hours in Wisconsin. Get up the next morning, go to the airport and come back to Massachusetts, and then go on to Virginia. Then on to home for about four days before going to British Columbia. So as the choir was singing, "Fifty States in Rhyme" I said I believed that they got the words from my itinerary. But Eastern Star Members are the finest people in the world and the finest God placed on the face of the earth.

Sisters and Brothers, at the end of this month, we will have completed approximately half of our journey. As you know, the Triennium will be held in St. Louis, Missouri, the first week of November 1991, and I'd like to invite you all to be there. During the past eighteen months, it has been our pleasure to travel in the Far East and visit Chapters in Guam, Okinawa, Taiwan, and Japan. I didn't realize until we attended a meeting of the Chapter in Guam that they do not have much opportunity of visiting with other Chapters. We are so used to visiting, if you want to visit a Chapter, you visit a Chapter. You have to understand in Guam they have to travel over 1500 miles away in order to see the work done. So it makes it difficult for them to see the work performed.

And then, we went on to the Philippines where I had the honor of constituting Marapara Chapter, and instituted Kinampay, U.D. We now have 26 Chapters in the Philippines and I have received requests to institute three more Chapters there. The work is going splendidly.

The Most Worthy Grand Patron spoke of visiting Australia, and southeast Alaska. He found wonderful people willing to do everything to make their visit pleasant. Then they went on to Hawaii and then to Mexico where the work is done two years ago. They then visited the fifteen Chapters in Germany where half of the Italy where the work in German and the other half in English. In March, he visited saying, he answered that if vou knew the work well enough you could follow it with Sessions last less than one day. They start at 11:00 in the morning and are finished places and yet he has found that the spirit of fraternalism is the same throughout the Eastern Star World.

# PROCEEDINGS REPORT

In attempting to comply with the recently passed Legislation directing me to obtain competitive bids for the printing of the Proceedings, I encountered major problems. Sister Helen Oliver and I spent several days last spring traveling from one print shop to another, even as far as Aston, PA; and Sister Carol Jordan even print shop to another, even as far as Aston, PA; and Sister Carol Jordan even delivered a sample to a shop in Milford for me. Most shops are not equipped to handle a job as large as this; or they are just not interested in a long-term project.

Ifinally wound up with three bids: one (oral) from M & H Printers (who are doing the Summer Benefit Ad Book); one (oral) from Diamond Printing, and one nicely detailed written bid from Minuteman Press in North Wilmington. I forwarded all this information to the Board of Trustees and received written approval from Brother Bob Sherwood, Chairman, to award the contract to Minuteman Press.

Their contract read as follows:

Again, I received permission from the Grand Trustees to transfer \$3,000.00 from our Savings Account to the Checking Account to forward the required 50% deposit. On August 9, 1989, I delivered to the printers a check for \$3,300.00 and all the material for the Proceedings. Our Constitution under ARTICLE IX, SEC. 5, states that "The Grand Secretary shall record all the transactions of the Grand Chapter proper to be published, and shall superintend such publication, which shall be made within one hundred twenty days after adjournment of the Grand Chapter....." I submit to you that it is impossible to complete this book within this time frame.

During the Christmas Holidays, I started receiving proofs and Past Grand Matron, Sister Gloria Piergalline and I spent many Saturday mornings proofing. Finally, everything was in order and I gave them the OK to print.

The finished books (400) were delivered to me on March 30th—then came the big job of getting them distributed!! On March 31st, at the Secretaries' Workshop, I delivered the prescribed number of books to all the Secretaries in attendance. I want to especially thank Sisters Henrietta McKelvey for delivering to Naomi Chapter; Isabel Turley to Unity Chapter; and Hilda Livingstone who came to my home and

helped package and for delivering to Frankford, Esther and Georgetown Chapters. I, myself, delivered to Ruth, Victory, Newark Chapters and made a special trip to the Masonic Home to deliver to the residents there, assisted by Sister Janet Day. On April 6th, 187 books in 130 packages were delivered to the Claymont Post Office in my son's pickup truck. The cost of this mailing was \$228.10.

As Sister Hilda and I were packing, we became aware of the poor binding on some of the books and tried to sort out the worst ones. I immediately notified the printer. I do apologize to anyone who may have received a poorly bound copy. And then it came time to pay the bill!! I thought, and the Grand Trustees also thought, that the final bill would be as quoted, a balance of \$3,310.00. Not so!! We misunderstood the quote and so did not add in the cost of typesetting — another \$6,000.00. You can imagine my panic and utter dismay!! However, these people were fantastic to work with! Because it had not been fully explained to me about the typesetting costs, a compromise was offered; we would split this cost, and because of the trouble with the binding, there would be no charge for that at all.

The final cost was as follows:

I know that there has been some criticism of the size of the Proceedings and I have spoken with them about better utilizing the space and perhaps use smaller print. As all work is now on the computer, future costs should be significantly less and take less time to complete.

## REPORT OF VETERAN'S HOSPITAL HOBBY-CART

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Distinguished Guests, my Sisters and Brothers:

It has been an honor and pleasure to serve as chairman of the Veteran's Hospital Committee for the past six busy years. My co-chairman is Henry Boys and our two deputies are Norman Doelze and Jim Fine. Jim is from Brandywine Chapter No. 14 and Henry, Norm and I are from Five Points Chapter No. 13. This past winter Doris Brown from Five Points Chapter No. 13 joined us. She is an avid golfer and connot be with us from Spring until Fall but she has been an asset to the Hobby-Cart. She not only works on the cart but has knitted many hats, lap robes and wheel chair

holders. Victor Burkhard, Five Points Chapter No. 13, is our only substitute. It is a shame that more of our sisters and brothers cannot find time to give us a few hours once a month during vacations in the Summer. They will never know the joy of seeing a veteran so downhearted, perk up to have us give him a little time, a smile plus our goodies on our Hobby-Cart. We start filling our cart around 8:15 a.m. and go to four floors of the hospital and to the Nursing Home.

Last October we had a request from a head nurse for an electric razor for them to shave two veteran wards who were unable to care for themselves. I was camping that weekend and Garrett Robinson, P.P. of Five Points Chapter No. 13, had me purchase it and he paid for it. Many times since then as I have been on the cart, she has told me that it is still busy every day. Ruth Chapter No. 19 has been so faithful with Sister Kathleen Hall bringing clothing, magazines, lap robes, etc. several times every month. Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8 donated \$25 in place of giving Christmas presents and I purchaed razors, toothbrushes, and magnifing glasses. They also sent a box of personal items. Sister Pat Miller brings boxes several times a year to my home for our veterans. Many thanks to Ruth Chapter No. 19 and to Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8.

In December, Mrs. Estella Day, P.G.P. Watson Day's mother, sent me a check for \$15 to purchase a special gift for a patient. There is a veteran that is dying and the nurse in charge asked for a specific item. I did not have it on the cart but purchased the gift. When I took it to him, he was unable to speak but tears rolled down his cheeks and when I left, two nurses were with him and all were smiling. Mrs. Day also knits slippers all year round for them plus lap robes. I wish she could see their happy faces as they put on their slippers.

Hertha Bowers is unable to work on the cart but she assembles the stationery and envelopes with paper clips for us. She does this several times a year -- hundreds of these take many hours. I am still contacting many businesses to receive donations and to receive discounts on our crafts and other items. Norman and I spend many hours getting all of these articles from the businesses and filling our two lockers for the cart.

Last September, we again had our Annual Summer Carnival outside in the parking lot. Henry Boys, Norm Doelze and I took charge of our booth. The veterans, most in wheel chairs, shot our stuffed animals with dart guns. They really enjoyed this sunny afternoon. We gave prizes to all 93 veterans.

Five Points Chapter No. 13 had a Bingo Party in the Nursing Home. Thirty-eight patients and seven sisters and brothers had a lot of fun. We gave lots of prizes and enjoyed home baked cakes and sodas.

Sister Edna Thorp and I have started our fifth year at the Nursing Home. Our sing-a-long is considered therapy as some of the veterans are unable to speak but they can really beat time to Edna's beautiful music. Victor Thorp has been coming this year to assist us. We never know how many will be there -- some in hospital beds, tied in chairs, wheelchairs, canes, etc., but we all enjoy the hour and a half together on the fourth Wednesday afternoon every month.

The Annual VA Voluntary Service Dinner was May 2, 1990, and The Order of the Eastern Star Awards: Henry Boys, 300 hours; Doris Brown, 1,000 hours; Norman Doelze, 750 hours; Jim Fine, 100 hours; Edna Thorp, 100 hours. I am between hours this year. We had a lovely dinner and had pictures taken as a group.

This year our Hobby-Cart contacted 5,507 veterans and served 2,035 veterans. We distributed 4,530 items from O.E.S., items purchased and donations, and 834 items from the "Help Hospitalized Veterans" program in California. Many of the 105 lap robes were knit from the yarn that sisters all over the state gave me. Two Senior lap robes were knit from the yarn that sisters all over the state gave me. # RECOMMENDATION OF THE WORTHY GRAND MATRON:

 Recommend that when the first letter of the Worthy Grand Matron is sent out (legislation enacted), a copy of the irregularities also be included for the Secretaries to read at the next stated meeting in the Subordinate Chapters.

## RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES:

- We recommend that the contingent fund for the Chairman of the Summer Benefit be increased from \$1,000.00 to \$1.500.00
- We recommend all reports be in the hands of the Grand Secretary no later than April 15. If not, they will be entered into the following year.
