





As one entered the "Foyer" of the NUR TEMPLE, one was greeted by a large, old-fashioned red sleigh piled high with Christmas packages, a Christmas tree decorated with all white handmade ornaments. An "angel" and two "carolers" completed this tableau, all surrounded by a white picket fence.

- Letter written under seal from the Worthy Grand Matron not being read at first meeting after receipt.
- 2. Improper form used to request Special Dispensation.
- 3. Letter from Worthy Grand Matron written under seal not read -- just stated and spread upon the minutes.
- Subordinate Chapter Officer left the chapter room during coin march without giving raps.
- Improper raps given by Warder after Worthy Matron declares recess for retirement of Grand Officers.
- 6. Officers reading from Ritual during Initiation Ceremony.
- 7. Crossing between Altar and East while Bible is open.
- 8. Chaplain holding hands in reverent attitude while walking to and from Altar.
- 9. Work copied out of Ritual.
- 10. Star Point chairs not in proper position with the inside leg not in line with Star Rug point.
- Subordinate Chapter held meeting without one of the first four officers present thus making meeting illegal.

LEGISLATION ENACTED AT THE GRAND SESSIONS OF MAY 1990

Accepted for a first reading were the following Recommendations:

RECOMMENDATION OF THE WORTHY GRAND MATRON:

 Recommend that when the first letter of the Worthy Grand Matron is sent out (legislation enacted), a copy of the irregularities also be included for the Secretaries to read at the next stated meeting in the Subordinate Chapters.

No. 1

- A member from another chapter in this Jurisdiction wishes to demit and join our Q: Chapter. What is the proper procedure?
- I refer you to the 1983 Proceedings, page 112 where it is explained quite A: thoroughly. It states in part: "That in case of removal from one jurisdiction to another in this Grand Jurisdiction, any Sister or a Brother desiring a Demit for the purpose of joining another Chapter in this Grand Jurisdiction, shall have the right to petition such other Chapter for membership upon first giving notice to their original Chapter of such intention. This also would apply to someone from another Grand Jurisdiction petitioning for affiliation in this Grand Jurisdiction. Ref: Constitution and By-Laws - Page 49 - Section 24.

No. 2

- A member of Job's Daughters, I.O.J.D., wishes to know if she can join the Q: Order of the Eastern Star on her great grandfather's affiliation?
- No. I referred to the Constitution and By-Laws, page 4, Qualifications for A: Membership in the Order of the Easter Star - Section 1. Great granddaughters are not listed.

No. 3

- We have a member from New Jersey that attends our meetings often and is Q: a great help with any Chapter project. Can we elect her to an Honorary Membership?
- A: Yes. In the Delaware Supplement to GGC Book of Instruction, page 9, Honorary Membership it states: In order to eliminate situations, Honorary Memberships in subordinate chapters may not be proposed or voted upon when the recipient is in the room. The vote must be unanimous. Under the Rules and Regulations of GGC, page 58, Section 60, Honorary Membership states: Any Chapter shall have the right to elect to honorary membership any well-known sister or brother not a member of the Chapter by unanimous vote of the members present and voting. It shall not be necessary to ballot upon honorary membership as in the case of candidates for degrees or affiliation. Such membership shall not entitle the member to make motions, enter into discussion, unless called upon by the presiding officer, to vote or hold office in the Chapter.

THE BLACK CUBE

I am very pleased to report that there was no misuse of the Black Cube this year. We should always remember that the Black Cube is placed there for our protection and should never be used in a personal way nor for a dishonorable motive. Remember the Golden Rule.

REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Grand Officers, Members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star:

Immediately following the 1990 Grand Session, all those duties referred to as "routine" were performed-the payment of bills; the mailing of Honorary Memberships; the mailing of the Session Programs to all our Past Grands unable to attend; the mailing of the 50-Year Certificates to those members also unable to attend the Session. A recap of the Legislation enacted and a list of Irregularities were forwarded to the Worthy Grand Matron to be mailed to the Subordinate Chapters under her seal. The List of Officers and Committees (white book) needing only the names of the Grand Lecturer and Grand Sentinel to be complete was sent to the printer.

My next task was the compiling of information for the printing of the 1990 Proceedings. The printers cooperated fully with me in trying to reduce the size and cost of the book. By using a lighter grade paper, smaller print, utilizing all the space, the book was reduced from 309 pages to 254. Also, by using a technique known as "scanning," typesetting costs were kept to a minimum and speeded up the whole printing process. All proofing of the text was completed by Christmas. A great big "thank you" to Sister Effie Marvonek who spent many hours with me helping to proof. Sister Effie was also a tremendous help in helping to package the books for mailing. On March 27th, 175 books in 115 packages were mailed. A like number of books were hand-delivered to those entitled to them by some of my Sisters and Brothers. Thank you, too, for your assistance. There are approximately 40 members on a permanent mailing list wanting a copy of our Proceedings. In the past, they have been charged \$4.00. Since these books cost \$25.00 to produce, I strongly suggest that this charge be increased to at least \$10.00.

I am pleased to say that our first attempt at Pre-registration was a great success. Under the capable chairmanship of Brother William James, we were better able to welcome and properly greet our distinguished guests.

This year, there are eleven (11) Sisters eligible for 50-Year Certificates. We are most grateful to those who devote many years of service to our beautiful Order. Sister Barbara Ewing, Grand Lecturer, directed me to issue three (3) "A" Certificates and seven (7) "B" Certificates.

It is always a pleasure to have a part in the issuing of Grand Representative Commissions. Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Carol, recommended thirty-two (32) Sisters and Brothers to receive Commissions from other Grand Jurisdictions. And thirty-two (32) Commissions were issued to Sisters and Brothers to represent Delaware in their Grand Jurisdictions.

Again, I am amazed at the volume and great diversity of my incoming mail-and telephone calls. Memorials, holiday greetings, invitations to the Grand Sessions of other Grand Jurisdictions, Proceedings; and since this is a Triennium year, much correspondence, invitations, proposed legislation, forms, requests for information, etc. from General Grand Chapter. All of these were promptly acknowledged. As to telephone calls, I received a call one Sunday evening from a lady I now know to be the Grand Guardian. She advised me of the death of a lady living in the Millsboro area who was a Past Matron of a Michigan Chapter. This Sister had left very specific instructions for the Services she wished her Chapter to conduct at her demise. I was asked to contact her Michigan Chapter — after a few phone calls, I reached one of her oldest friends who knew instantly what this Sister wanted and, of course, was saddened to learn of her friend's death.

Expressions of sympathy were sent to our Sister Grand Jurisdictions on the loss of eighty-two (82) of their distinguished members: one (1) Past Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Sayda S. Petterson (1967-1970); two (2) Past Most Worthy Grand Patrons, Brothers Everett H. Newman (1979-1982) and David J. Miller (1982-1985); thirty-two (32) Past Grand Matrons, one of whom was also a Grand Secretary who had served 24 years; forty-four (44) Past Grand Patrons.

Again, every effort was made to keep postage costs down by using bulk mailings. On March 8th, approximately 900 tentative programs were bulk mailed to all General Grand Chapter Officers and Committee Members, all Worthy Grand Matrons, all Grand Secretaries, all Grand Representatives, and all voting delegates of Delaware. Regrets to attend our Grand Session have been received from Past Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Mae Mickelson; Right Worthy Associate Grand Conductress, Sister Florence Adair; Chairman Right Worthy Grand Trustees, Sister Dorothy M. Dewing; General Grand Chapter Committee Chairman and Member Our World of Youth, Sisters Nancy R. McLemore, and Frances E. Strand; General Grand Chapter Committee Members Heart Foundation, Sister Janet R. Jensen; Membership, Sister Marie Rasmussen; Knights Templar, Sister Jane B. Sadler; Charters, Sister Jeanne Beck; Grand Representatives, Nova Scotia, Brother A. W. Chapman; Wyoming, Sister Susie Grimes. Again, we used bulk mailing to mail the Worthy Grand Patron's directory brochures; however, this was at no cost to the Grand Chapter.

Iregret that I was unable to host a Secretaries Workshop in March as has been customary. But March was not a good month for me! However the Subordinate Chapter Secretaries, particularly the new ones, did a very fine job of forwarding all the proper records. Unfortunately, several Secretaries did not meet the February 15th deadline in filling their abstracts, causing a delay in compiling statistical reports for both Grand Chapter and General Grand Chapter. Also, in preparation for this Grand Session, reports of contributions to our various charities were prepared and forwarded to the Chairmen of their respective committees. Credentials lists were compiled and forwarded to the Credential Committee.

My traveling this year has been restricted because of my husband's, Brother Carl, poor health; however, I did attend all Official Visits but one; all Birthday Parties and in-state Exchange Visits; eight Banquets; the Exchange Visit to Cape Charles, VA; the District Meeting of District 16-A in Media, PA. I also traveled with Worthy Grand Matron and Patron to the Peace Garden and attended the Grand Sessions of Wyoming where I met the Grand Secretaries of Wyoming and Montana. Past Grand Matron, Sister Eliza Crossland, always a ready, willing, and able traveling companion accompanied me on most of these occasions.

Worthy Grand Matron, I have enjoyed working with you this year and I regret very much that I was unable to participate in all your activities and travel. I know that this has been my loss because you are a fun person to be with. Worthy Grand Patron, congratulations to you on the success of your picture directory project. Sister Doris, Grand Treasurer, you are a delight to work with. And to our Grand Trustees, you, too, are great to work with, always most cooperative -- now just get me that computer!! And lastly, Sister Janet Day, my very competent and able assistant, thank you for all the help you are always so willing to give.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Grand Officers and Members of Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star.

The Board of Grand Trustees this year accepted Past Grand Patron Thomas Sweeney's Jewel and it is assigned for a future specific presentation. When a new Jewel has to be made and engraving done, it has to be in the Jeweler's hands by January prior to Grand Chapter Sessions.

A list of the furniture and paraphernalia of the Grand Chapter will be spread in the Proceedings.

On May 2, 1991, we traveled to the home of the Grand Secretary and audited the books of the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer and found them correct. Both sets of books were kept in an orderly and business-like manner for which we congratulate them.

A recommendation was made last year that a more suitable Traveling Badge for the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron be investigated. We have had the Jeweler remove the soiled ribbon and attach the bars. It has been refurbished at a nominal cost. If this does not prove suitable, we will have to have new ones made at a cost of approximately \$500.

Perhaps a special fundraiser to help in the project would aid in the purchase.

We wish to thank the Ways and Means Committee for their report of \$7,017.92. A special appreciation to Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Jim, for a profit of \$5,440 on the book. Every year Grand Chapter is spending more that it receives, a trend we wish could be reversed and cause us to have a BALANCED budget. The Ways and Means Committee is our only source of income.

I walked through a county courthouse square,
On a park bench an old man was sitting there.

He said, "Hah, it'll do for our little town."
I said, "The old flagpole is leanin' a little bit,
That's a ragged old flag you got hanging on it."
He said, "Have a seat." And I sat down.
"Is this the first time you been to our little town?"
I said, "I think it is." He said, "I don't like to brag,
But we're kinda proud of that little ragged old flag.
You see, we got a little hole in that flag there
When Washington took it across the Delaware.
And it got powder burns the night that Francis Scott Key
Sat watchin' it, writing 'O, say can you see!'
And it got a rip in New Orleans

When Packingham and Jackson was tuggin' at its seams And it almost fell at the Alamo Beside the Texas flag -- but she waved on though! She got cut with a sword at Chancellarsville, And she got cut again at Shiloh Hill. There was Robert E. Lee. Beauregard, Braggs. And a south wind blew hard on that ragged old flag On Flanders Field in World War One She got a big hole from a Bertha Gun She turned blood red in World War Two She hung limp and low a time or two. She was in Korea, Vietnam She went where she was sent by her Uncle Sam. She was covered with blood and stomped under a boot When our brave Marines were bombed in Lebanon, at Beirut. She waved from our ship upon the briny foam And now they've about quit waving it back here at home In her own good land here she's been abused. She's been burned, dishonored, denied, refused. And the government for which she stands Is scandalized throughout the land. And she's getting threadbare, and she's wearing thin: But she's in good shape for the shape she's in. 'Cause she's been through the fire before And I believe she can take a whole lot more. So we raise her up every morning, we take her down every night. We don't let her touch the ground, and we fold her up right. On second thought, I do like to brag 'Cause I'm mighty proud of that ragged old flag."

I was born July 4, 1776. The Declaration of Independence is my birth certificate. The bloodlines of the world run through my veins because I offered freedom to the oppressed. I am many things and many peoples, I am the patient, I am over 200 million living souls and the ghost of millions who have since died for me. I am Washington, Jefferson, and Patrick Henry. I am John Paul Jones and the Green Mountain boys. I am Davey Crockett. I am Lee, Grant and vaguely I remember the Alamo, the Maine and Pearl Harbor. When freedom called I answered and stayed until it was over. I left my heroic dead in Flanders Field, the rocks of Corregidor, the peaks of Korea, the jungles of Viet Nam and the deserts of Saudi Arabia. I am the Brooklyn Bridge, the great wheat fields of Kansas and the granite hills of Vermont. I am the coal fields of West Virginia and Pennsylvania. I am the great purple lands of the West, the Golden Gate and the Grand Canyon. I am Independence Hall, the Monitor and the Merrimac. I am big; I sprawl from the Atlantic to the Pacific and reach my arms to embrace Alaska and Hawaii. Three million square miles throb with industry. I am forests, fields, mountains and deserts. I am quiet, serene villages and cities that never sleep. You can see the lights of Christmas and hear the strains of

Auld Lang Syne when the calendar changes. You can look at me and see Ben Franklin walking down a street in Philadelphia and see Betsy Ross with her needle. I am over 130,000 schools and colleges and over 230,000 churches where my people can worship God as they see fit. I am a ballot box. I am the roar of a crowd at a game or the voices of a choir in a cathedral. I am an editorial in a newspaper and a letter you write to your congressman. I am Eli Whitney, Thomas Edison, Albert Einstein and Billy Graham. Yes, I am the nation and these are the things that I am. I was conceived in freedom and, God willing, I will spend the rest of my days in freedom. May I ever have the courage, deportment and integrity to keep myself unshackled to remain a citadel of freedom and a beacon of hope to a troubled and chaotic world. This is my wish, my hope, my prayer in this year of 1991, two hundred fifteen years after I was born. I am your Flag, "OLD GLORY."

THE CANADIAN FLAG

This Flag is a symbol of friendship. We pay tribute to our neighbors of the North. It's flag carries a red maple leaf on a white background, bordered on each side by two red bars. The eleven points of the Maple Leaf represent the ten Provinces and other Territory which comprise the Canadian Nation. We are two great nations side by side, with over three thousand miles of border, yet no soldier patrols an inch of that border. As we pay tribute to the flag and Canada, may our prayers be that we will continue in faith and love for each other and our friendship continue forever.

THE DELAWARE FLAG

It is with great pride that we pay tribute to the Delaware State Flag. The many events of the past history and the hopes of the future are symbolized in our shining beacon of light. The buff colored diamond bearing the State seal stands in the center of a blue background. The sheaf of wheat, ear of corn, and ox on the shield symbolize the farming activities in early Delaware. The rifleman and farmer standing at the side of the shield represent the duties of Delawareans both as producing workers and as defenders of their rights. A ship sails above the shield and a banner bearing the State motto waves beneath it, "Liberty and Independence." Below the diamond is the date December 7, 1787, when Delaware became the first State to ratify the Constitution of the United States. We, in Delaware, are proud of our flag as it stands in place with other respected emblems in this Temple.

THE CHRISTIAN FLAG

The Christian Flag which symbolizes purity and Christian perfection, should be a constant reminder of the supreme sacrifice of Christ. We are indebted to our Heavenly Father for all that we are and for all that we have. The white background symbolizes the purity He portrayed in His earthly life. The field of blue symbolizes the fidelity and sincerity of our Saviour. The red cross is a reminder of the self sacrifice shown by Christ, who sacrificed His life that we might live. The Christian Flag is a symbol of our faith and love.

THE EASTERN STAR FLAG

The Eastern Star Flag is a symbol of our beautiful Order and is the embodiment of the dreams of our founder, Robert Morris. The colors of that Star symbolize some of life's greatest lessons and truth. The Star, on it's field of purist white, should remind us of the teachings found in that great Light, which rests upon the Altar in our Chapter room and radiates it's teachings through the Blue of Fidelity, the Yellow of Constancy, the White of Loyalty, the Green of Faith and the Red of Love. These lessons, as told by the heroines of our Order should be emulated in the lives and actions of all members of the Eastern Star. Remember always, Sisters and Brothers, the principles of Charity, Truth and Loving Kindness, as you pay tribute to this, our Flag.

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE ON THE REPORT OF THE WORTHY GRAND MATRON

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Officers and members of this Grand Chapter.

We, the Jurisprudence Committee, met with the Constitution and Laws Committee. We commend the Worthy Matron on the splendid manner she performed her duties.

Amendments to the By-Laws of Naomi Chapter No. 20 were referred to the Constitution and Laws Committee.

We approve all Waivers of Territorial Jurisdiction requested.

We approve all Questions and Answers.

We approve Waiver of Territorial Jurisdictions granted.

We approve all Dispensations granted except March 6, 1991, Kent Chapter No. 11, to be used March 20, 1991, and on March 25, 1991, Victory Chapter No. 15, to be used April 6, 1991, for the purpose of moving paraphernalia from one floor to another is not necessary for a Dispensation as they are not moving their paraphernalia from the building. We suggest that the Dispensation fees be returned to the Chapters.

We approve all Irregularities except No. 2 -- The Warder let members out of the Chapter Room without instructing them to give the sign of permission to leave the Chapter Room. The Grand Lecturer is to give all instructions in the Chapter Room.

We disapprove the Recommendation which reads:

Because of inclement weather, a Chapter who meets only 10 times a year may not be able to hold their 10 stated meetings required. Therefore, I recommend that Chapters having only one stated meeting a month and who are dark in July and August amend their By-Laws adding a second stated meeting to either one or two months. Then when a meeting must go by default, they will have their required number of two stated meetings.

We feel this is taken care of in the By-Laws of the Chapters meeting once a month.

REPORT OF THE FRATERNAL CORRESPONDENT

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Distinguished Guests, My Sisters and Brothers:

Our theme this year was Christmas. Christmas has many customs and beliefs. It is the most popular time of the year for sharing and celebrating. It is the birthday of our Saviour. With the birthday of Jesus, the Bible tells us the "Star in the East" led the three wise men to the little babe lying in the manger.

We, too, have a "Star" that guides us and leads us to other jurisdictions. Our Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron were led to the Grand Jurisdictions of Texas, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Washington, D.C., Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and New Jersey. And that same "Star" brought Sisters and Brothers of some of our Sister Jurisdictions to Delaware. As many Fraternal Correspondent Reports state, there are five General Grand Jurisdictions. Our own General Grand Chapter is the largest and the third oldest Jurisdiction on this planet. We were organized in 1876 and meet triennially. We use the ritual written by Dr. Morris and it is printed in five languages.

The Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star of New York is the oldest. They were organized in 1869 and use the McCoy ritual and display the Emblematic Star with the white point up. The General Grand Chapter of New Jersey is the second oldest. It was organized in 1870. They meet annually and use a modified ritual-combination of Morris-McCoy. The Supreme Grand Chapter of Scotland is the fourth oldest and was organized in 1904. They have their own ritual and meet twice a year. Our youngest Grand Jurisdiction is Australia. They were organized in 1985.

We all have an open Bible on our Altar. We also share a common desire to work for charities such as ESTARL, Masonic and Eastern Star homes, Cancer Research, Heart, Knights Templar Eye Foundation, and many others. We really should publicize the total amount of money contributed by Eastern Star members as it truly is awesome.

Reading the Proceedings also was sad. Sad because of misuse of the Black Cube, bickering, refusing to memorize the ritualistic work and the decrease in membership. Maybe we can all pray for a turn around and do our best to increase membership in our great order.

Christmas also reminds me of a big guy in a red suit with a magic sleigh. Well, my magic sleigh was delivered by Sister Kate and I found many interesting facts about other Grand Jurisdictions like:

Arizona allocated \$9,000.00 from their general fund to obtain a computer.

Arkansas allows videos of open installations.

British Columbia and Yukon had a non-member work the PA system. He was escorted out for the formal opening and during the exemplification of the secret work. They also have a Grand Doctor.

California called Sickness and Distress by Circle of Concern. There are no special seats for Grand Officers at Officials and they list resumes for those running for elected Grand Officers.

Colorado has the incoming Grand Officers escorted into the sessions room by their spouse/escort prior to installation.

Connecticut presented Virginia Painter, RWAGM, with a Hitchcock Chair with a stencil of Mystic Seaport on it. One was also presented to Ray Osborne, RWAGP.

Washington, D.C. called a special Grand Chapter Session on June 29, 1988, to install the Associate Grand Matron and Associate Grand Patron due to an illness of the Associate Grand Matron.

Florida had cuddly critters for in-patient and out-patient children. One of their irregularities was an officer wearing white hose.

Illinois gives the Worthy Grand Matron an allowance of \$350.00 per month and the Worthy Grand Patron an allowance of \$225.00 per month. They present all Grand Jurisdiction flags at their Informal Opening. They gave \$223,000.00 to charities. They gave 130 regular school scholarships.

Indiana has seven chapters with membership over 650.

Kansas presented fourteen 75-year pins.

Louisiana gave twelve first-year ESTARL Awards, ten second-year awards and four third-year awards.

Manitoba presented one 75-year certificate.

Massachusetts presented 80 scholarships and held seven Schools of Instruction.

Michigan is the oldest Grand Chapter. They have six chapters with over 500 members. The largest chapter has 712 members and the smallest chapter has 41 members. The Worthy Grand Patron gave each Worthy Patron \$1.00 and told them to make it grow. They raised \$32,926.82 which was presented to the School For The Blind. Both the Worthy Grand Matron and the Worthy Grand Patron had Bibles presented to them. The Worthy Grand Matron's project, "Angels" earned \$32,000.00 and was used for scholarships and charities and \$12,000.00 was put towards a computer.

Mississippi constituted two chapters, four chapters surrendered their charters, and two chapers consolidated.

Missouri is the birthplace of Eastern Star but it is the first time they've been honored with an elected General Grand Chapter Officer, the Most Worthy Grand Patron. The time element was 129 years.

Montana has the Grand Representative read the Proceeding Report for the Jurisdiction they represent for the Fraternal Correspondence.

Nebraska does an initiation at their Grand Sessions.

New Mexico -- The Worthy Grand Matron's grandson had to use the Presbyterian Airlift shortly after his birth. This was also her special project and they earned \$12,768.98 selling Lifesavers.

New York -- The Grand Secretary calls roll of the seven highest ranking chapters for the Quorum.

Oklahoma had one chapter that initiated 18, affiliated 10 with 7 more petitions turned in.

Quebec was saddened by the death of their Worthy Grand Patron.

Rhode Island really does it all in one day, their Grand Sessions. Like Delaware, they are small but mighty.

Scotland prints the railway schedule in the front of their meeting booklet and the MWGM and MWGP serve a two-year term.

South Carolina has the WGM and WGP spouses write a biography for their Proceedings. \$33,993.83 was given to OES members and Eastern Star homes to help with costs of repairs from damage from Hurricane Hugo.

South Dakota gave ten ESTARL scholarships.

Tennessee has elections before the Worthy Grand Matron's Report. The Fraternal Correspondent is appointed.

Texas gave the Worthy Grand Matron a van to travel in for the year. She also received seven gavels and five Bibles.

Utah -- The Worthy Grand Matron's recommendation was for everyone to renew their obligation and remind ourselves of the promises we made.

Vermont collected \$8,000.00 for handicapped and disabled children.

Virginia escorts the Worthy Grand Matron-elect to the East to participate in the elections of the remaining Grand Officers.

My magic ride is over. I learned much on my trip and I pray that our good deeds for our youth and elderly continue and we can grow, grow, and grow!

The Star identifies our Order and has been used this year to remind us of the basics we strive to live by.

To the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star:

The Constitution and Laws Committee has met, acted on and approved the amendment to the by-laws of Naomi Chapter No. 20 as approved by the Worthy Grand Matron.

The Constitution and Laws Committee met with the Jurisprudence Committee to review the reports of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron. We join with the Jurisprudence Committee in commending them on their excellent year and concur with all Jurisprudence findings.

We have reviewed Supplementary Report of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron and concur with the Jurisprudence Committee.

Copies of legislation up for their second reading have been printed and are on the registration desk for distribution, as follows:

LEGISLATION TO BE BROUGHT BEFORE GRAND CHAPTER FOR SECOND READING

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 2 (a) (1) now reads: "The Chairman of the Summer Benefit shall have a contingent fund of \$1,000.00 for Summer Benefit, to be returned within the same calendar vear."

Recommendation: Change amount from \$1,000.00 to \$1,500.00. (Grand Trustees)

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 5. (13) Grand Secretary

Afterwords "copies of all legislation," add "(including irregularities)." Recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron.

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 5. Grand Secretary

Add new (15) to read: "The term of office for the Grand Secretary be limited to ten (10) years, (or to no more than two successive five-year terms); and the offices of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer not to be vacated simultaneously."

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 6. Grand Treasurer

Add new (6) to read: "The term of office for the Grand Treasurer be limited to ten (10) vears, (or to no more than two successive five-year terms); and the offices of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer not to be vacated simultaneously "

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers Section 7. Closing Books of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer Add sentence at end of present paragraph: "All reports must be in the hands of the Grand Secretary no later than April 15 to be included in present year's business transactions."

CONSTITUTION AND LAWS

Article IX -- Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers -- Worthy Grand Matron

Section (13) now reads:

"She may appoint Grand Representatives for Delaware near other Grand Jurisdictions and approve the appointment of Grand Representatives from other Grand Jurisdictions near the Grand Jurisdiction of Delaware, at the expiration of their commissions. Only voting members of this Grand Chapter are eligible to appointment as Grand Representative. All Grand Representative Commissions shall expire the same month; viz., Dec. 31st."

ADD.

Section (13-A)

"No Past Grand Matron or Past Grand Patron is eligible for a Grand Representative Commission in this Jurisdiction. When a Grand Officer is elected to office in this Grand Jurisdiction he/she must resign Grand Representative Commission if they hold one at the time of election."

The young Boy Scouts pushed the wheel chairs and when we were not busy we let them have a chance to shoot too. But didn't give them any prizes.

The Annual Recognition Dinner for Volunteers at V.A. was held April 24, at Cranston Heights Fire Hall. Doris Brown has 25 years with 1,177 hours; Edith Hopkins, out of state Sister, 500 hours and I received a pin for 1,000 hours. We had pictures taken. This Grand Year our Hobby-Cart contacted 5,170 veterans and served 1,991. We distributed from O.E.S. and donations 4,554 items and 733 items from the "Help Hospitalized Veterans' Program" in California. There were 78 lap robes distributed made by our own Sisters. What joy they have brought to our wheel chair vets. Knitted slippers 63; and many warm hats knitted by ladies of Peninsula-McCabe United Methodist Church. Thank you to all that knit or sew lap robes, slippers, etc. for Vets.

Every day when leaving the V.A. Hospital I thank our Heavenly Father that He spared the lives of our service people in Desert Storm. May God bless our veterans. Thank you, Sisters and Brothers, for your support.

Sisters and Brothers of this Grand Jurisdiction. Sessions Transportation -- I don't know if you all know what this entails. It is the shuttle bus from the Ramada Inn to the Nur Temple, Nur Temple back to the Ramada Inn. And I am the Chairman, Co-Chairman and Member, all lined up in one. On Sunday at 6:00 P.M., the bus left the Ramada Inn with eight passengers -- four of them were out-of-state passengers, the other four were our own members. Section 2 (a) (1) now reads: "The Chairman of the Summer Benefit shall have a contingent fund of \$1,000.00 for Summer Benefit, to be returned within the same calendar year."

Recommendation: Change amount from \$1,000.00 to \$1,500.00. (Grand Trustees)

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 5. (13) Grand Secretary

After words "copies of all legislation," add "(including irregularities)." Recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron.

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 5. Grand Secretary

Add new (15) to read. "The term of office for the Grand Secretary be limited to ten (10) years, (or to no more than two successive five-year terms); and the offices of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer not to be vacated simultaneously."

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 6. Grand Treasurer

Add new (6) to read: "The term of office for the Grand Treasurer be limited to ten (10) years, (or to no more than two successive five-year terms); and the offices of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer not to be vacated simultaneously."

Article IX Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers

Section 7. Closing Books of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer

Add sentence at end of present paragraph: "All reports must be in the hands of the Grand Secretary no later than April 15 to be included in present year's business transactions."

A motion was made by Grand Secretary, Sister Kate Hoey, that this Legislation be accepted for a second reading and be complied with. **Seconded** by Sister Hilda D. Livingstone, Grand Trustee. Motion adopted.

CONSTITUTION AND LAWS

Article IX -- Duties and Prerogatives of Grand Officers -- Worthy Grand Matron --

Section (13) now reads

"She may appoint Grand Representatives for Delaware near other Grand Jurisdictions and approve the appointment of Grand Representatives from other Grand Jurisdictions near the Grand Jurisdiction of Delaware, at the expiration of their commissions. Only voting members of this Grand Chapter are eligible to appointment as Grand Representative. All Grand Representative Commissions shall expire the same month; viz., Dec. 31st."

ADD:

Section (13-A)

No past Grand Matron or Past Grand Patron is eligible for a Grand Representative Commission in this Jurisdiction. When a Grand Officer is elected to office in this Grand Jurisdiction he/she must resign Grand Representative Commission if they hold one at the time of election.

WORTHY GRAND MATRON:

Associate Patrons, I have a special project for you. In honor of my Father, who, when he died was the Associate Patron of Newark Chapter. Let me read this little verse first.

Father always carried a silver dollar in his pocket besides collecting them -- so what better symbol to use than the silver dollar. I'd like to present each of you with a silver dollar and ask you to see how you can make it multiply this coming year, and, at the "Garden of Joy" Session, report back on how much you were able to make from just one silver dollar. Brother Frank, would you keep in touch with our Associate Patrons this year and prepare the final report so we can see how the silver dollar multiplied for this special report.

You heard in Sister Joyce's report this morning how Michigan was able to multiply into \$32,926.82. That's a lot more than I hope for, I guess I made it too small!!

The Associate Grand Patron, Associate Patrons, Worthy Patrons were escorted to the East, presented with their silver dollars, and given a hand of applause as they returned to seats of their choice.

Installing Grand Officer, Brother Carl E. Olliver, addressed the assembly as follows:

Congratulations Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, the new Grand Officers, Distinguished East and Distinguished Audience:

Sister Janet Day, would you rise? This was my first Worthy Matron and she is a Past Grand Matron. Thank you for being my friend. Sister Edith Shinn, are you around here somewhere? Well, I've known Sister Edith a long time. We won't go into that one, but her father said to me when I was elected Grand Sentinel how happy he was that I was elected to Grand Sentinel because he figured that I would go along to become her Worthy Grand Patron, which I did! And I've always remembered this -- she was the Worthy Grand Matron, I was her Assistant and Advisor. Thank you for being my friend.

Sometimes, some of us in the Masonic Order and the Order of Eastern Star, we think, because the other person has a title they are more important. Not so! These two people behind me are Grand Matron and Grand Patron. They have a very important title but let me tell you something, no better than any one of you. Not at all! Just stay out of sight! They're glad to help you, or to the non-members, you saw that beautiful row of our girls and the one gentleman, that are our Deputy Grand Lecturers that teach us what we have forgotten. There was a little while there tonight that I needed one but she wasn't right there handy!

Now in the state of Florida, where I attend a lot of Chapters, we do not have Deputy Grand Lecturers, I'm sorry, we do not! One specific person will go around to about six chapters and these ladies get paid well in love. This is why they do it. They love to do it and if you are having a problem in your chapter -- well, you just go to one of those and they'll be so happy to help you.

I want to point out one lady -- she's not going to like this but I'm going to do it anyway. Sister Betty Loeffel, will your rise? I was sitting in her Chapter one time when Mizpah Chapter was still in operation and she was having trouble. You know we all have a bad night. And she was having a bad night -- she just couldn't remember names! Well, one Sister said to another, that girl will never make Worthy Matron! Now, let me tell you something, folks, she was our Grand Treasurer for twenty-four years. Thank you for being my friend.

It's a pleasure indeed to be here. I came up a little early from Florida because Gene asked me to do a "little favor" for him and it is an honor and pleasure for me. I'm certainly pleased to be with you and I wish you all the luck in the world!

I want to tell you a little story. If the Grand Master of Masons or even the Potentate hear they may throw me out! I've told this story once -- when there is a bunch of ladies around, they say, "What do you Masons do down at that Lodge building?" "My goodness! They talk about 'raising!' What is it, what does it mean?" And you hear lots of stories, but at Lafayette Lodge No. 14, where I belong, we raise them a little different. Sister Janet's husband belongs there. We do things just a little different. We have a straight chair, no arms, and we grease it with hog lard. Now, if you are from Sussex like me you know what hog lard is. Then we have two long poles and we put these poles under the chair and we seat the candidate on the chair and if he stays on there, he's ready. If he falls off, we bury him and we all go home! God bless you all!!!







LEGISLATION ACTED ON AT GRAND SESSIONS MAY 1991

LEGISLATION ENACTED AT THE GRAND SESSIONS OF MAY 1991

Accepted for a second reading and ADOPTED:

All of the following amendments are changes to the CONSTITUTION, ARTICLE IX DUTIES AND PREROGATIVES OF GRAND OFFICERS:

Worthy Grand Matron Section 1. (2) (a) (1) now reads: "The Chairman of the Summer Benefit shall have a contingent fund of \$1,000.00 for the Summer Benefit, to be returned within the same calendar year."

Changed to read: "The Chairman of the Summer Benefit shall have a contingent fund of \$1,500.00 for the Summer Benefit, to be returned within the same calendar year."

This was a recommendation of the Grand Trustees.

Grand Secretary Section 5. (13) After the words "copies of all legislation," add "including irregularities."

This was a recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron.

Grand Secretary Section 5. Add new (15) to read: "The term of office for the Grand Secretary be limited to ten (10) years, (or to no more than two successive five-year terms); and the offices of the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer not to be vacated simultaneously."

Grand Treasurer Section 6. Add new (6) to read: "The term of office for the Grand Treasurer be limited to ten (10) years, (or to no more than two successive five-year terms); and the offices of the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer not to be vacated simultaneously."

Closing Books of Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer Section 7. Add sentence at end of present paragraph: "All reports must be in the hands of the Grand Secretary no later than April 15 to be included in present year's business transactions."

Grand Secretary Section 5. (1) Proceedings now reads: "-- three copies to each Grand Chapter --."

Changed to read: "-- two complimentary copies to each Grand Chapter (One for the Grand Secretary and one for the Grand Representative)."

Grand Secretary Section 5. (1) Proceedings: Add new paragraph: "That new bids be secured for our printing needs, not only for the Proceedings but for other printing needs of the Grand Secretary. Bids should be entered for specific quantities."

Recommendation of the Worthy Grand Matron of 1987-1988.

Presented for a first reading and ACCEPTED:

ARTICLE IX DUTIES AND PREROGATIVES OF GRAND OFFICERS

Worthy Grand Matron Section (13) now reads: "She may appoint Grand Representatives for Delaware near other Grand Jurisdictions and approve the appointment of Grand Representatives from other Grand Jurisdictions near the Grand Jurisdiction of Delaware, at the expiration of their commissions. Only voting members of this Grand Chapter are eligible to appointment as Grand Representative. All Grand Representative Commissions shall expire the same month; viz., Dec. 31st."

Add new Section (13) (a) to read: "No Past Grand Matron or Past Grand Patron is eligible for a Grand Representative Commission in this Jurisdiction. When a Grand Officer is elected to office in this Grand Jurisdiction, he/she must resign any Grand Representative Commission he/she may hold at time of election."
