SPECIAL MEETING SEPTEMBER 21, 2019

Dover Masonic Center 1478 Wyoming Mill Road Dover, DE A Special Meeting of the Grand Chapter of Delaware was held at the Dover Masonic Hall, 1478 Wyoming Mill Road, Dover, DE on September 21, 2019, to vote on legislation tabled at the 98th Session of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, due notice having been given to the membership.

OPENING CEREMONIES

At 1:00 p.m. the Associate Grand Conductress, Worthy Grand Patron and Associate Grand Patron marched to their stations in the Grand Chapter Room. The Worthy Grand Patron then requested that the Associate Grand Conductress invite the Worthy Grand Matron and other Grand Officers into the Grand Chapter Room. When the Grand Officers were in position, the Worthy Grand Patron requested that the Grand Conductress escort the Worthy Grand Matron to the East. Once at her station the Worthy Grand Matron directed the Grand Officers to take their positions and prepare for the duties of the Grand Chapter.

The Worthy Grand Matron then proceeded with the Ritualistic Opening of the Grand Chapter.

The Worthy Grand Matron directed the Grand Warder to inform the Grand Sentinel that the Opening Ceremony of the Grand Chapter was about to begin and allow no interruptions.

The Worthy Grand Matron then directed the Associate Grand Matron to ascertain if all present were members of the Grand Chapter and entitled to seats in the Grand Chapter. The Associate Grand Matron then directed the Grand Conductress and Associate Grand Conductress to ascertain and report if all present were members of the Grand Chapter and entitled to seats.

Upon completing their duties, the Grand Conductress and Associate Grand Conductress reported to the Associate Grand Matron, who reported to the Worthy Grand Matron that all present were members of the Order and entitled to seats in the Grand Chapter.

The Worthy Grand Matron then directed the Associate Grand Matron to ascertain if all present were members of the Grand Chapter and entitled to seats in the Grand Chapter. The Associate Grand Matron reported that all members present were entitled to seats in the Grand Chapter Room.

The Worthy Grand Matron directed the Grand Conductress to attend the Altar. The Grand Chaplain led in the Opening Prayer. The Opening Ode, *In The Garden* was sung. After the Opening Ode was sung, the Worthy Grand Matron proclaimed the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star duly opened requesting the Grand Warder to inform the Grand Sentinel that the Special Meeting of the Grand Chapter of Delaware was open.

The Worthy Grand Patron led the Grand Chapter in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of our country, followed by the singing of "The National Anthem"

The Worthy Grand Matron seated the Grand Chapter and directed the Grand Warder to inform the Grand Sentinel to secure the Outer Door and sit at the Entrance to the Grand Chapter Room.

The Worthy Grand Matron then thanked the members for caring enough to show up for the meeting as the agenda is important work that must be done, and the members presence is appreciated. The legislation that is being taken care of at this Special Meeting is for the good of the Order and may affect the Grand Chapter and Subordinate Chapter for many years to come. The Worthy Grand Matron requested that the membership operate in that vein.

The Worthy Grand Matron invited Brother Robert A. Bradish, PGP, and chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee to the East for the purpose of conducting the legislation tabled till a Special Meeting of Grand Chapter.

Brother Robert then began the legislation by starting where we left off at the Grand Chapter Session in May, page 28 of the proposed legislative changes.

COMPLETION OF TABLED LEGISLATION FROM 98TH ANNUAL SESSION MAY 2019

Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter,

Article III, Committees of the Grand Chapter, Section 4; Add (D). Delete (O)

Article III Committee Duties and Composition Section 6

Add: (D) Communication Committee Delete (O) Web Page
(D) Communications Committee

- 1) It shall be the duty of the members of the Communications Committee to utilize or see that appropriate digital and print media are provided by the Grand Chapter to communicate to the membership information concerning activities of the Grand Chapter and Subordinate Chapters in Delaware.
- 2) Will consist of three (3) members, one of which shall be appointed each year for a three (3) year term.
- 3) The Chairman will be the member whose term next expires.
- 4) This committee in conjunction with the Worthy Grand Matron will select annually those tools of information dispersal that will best keep the membership informed concerning activities and actions of the Grand Chapter and Subordinate Chapter. These tools may include but are not limited to:
 - a. Website
 - b. Newsletter
 - c. Social media
 - d. Email list
 - e. Other tools as are deemed appropriate
- 5) This committee in conjunction with the Worthy Grand Matron shall select individuals to serve for one year as administrator or editor or moderator or coordinator to administer the means of communication as needed.

6) If there are costs associated with providing of these mediums of communication they shall be budgeted for in the annual budget of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star and if recoverable (such as print media) via subscription from the users, the committee shall establish a price for the service and establish a method to see that these funds are deposited to the appropriate Grand Chapter account.

Rationale: Establish the duties of the Communications Committee; establish a method for the newsletter publication to be part of the Grand Chapter; provide wording in the law of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, to provide the tools of communication to keep the membership informed concerning all aspects of Eastern Star as needed; and see that these tools are including the financial records. These tools may include but are not limited to website, newsletter, Facebook page, email, etc.

Moved by Sister Joan S. Edwards, PGM (15) and seconded by Sister Jana Bradish, PM (15) to accept Article III, Committees of the Grand Chapter, Section 4; Add (D). Delete (O) and Article III Committee Duties and Composition Section 6 Add (D) Communication Committee and Delete (O) Web Page and it be brought to the floor for discussion.

Discussion:

Henrietta R. McKelvey, PGM, (20) noted that the previous amendment had just been passed and it refers to changing the Communication Committee to (D) and in this proposal is says (C). After checking the current Constitution and Bylaws, Rules and Regulations, and Book of Instruction, she noted that the committees are listed alphabetically in the current edition, this proposal would come as (D), as voted in the previous amendment, not (C). Henrietta then moved to amend the proposal to (D) not (C). Seconded by Cheryl A. Mongillo, PM, (19).

The Worthy Grand Matron asked if there was any **discussion**. There was **none**.

The Worthy Grand Matron then called for the vote on the amendment to Article III, Committees of the Grand Chapter, Section 4; Add (D). Delete (O) and Article III Committee Duties and Composition Section 6 Add (D) Communication Committee and Delete (O) Web Page to the proposal to vote by the voting sign of the order.

The amendment was **adopted**.

The Worthy Grand Matron then proceeded to call for a vote on the amendment as amended. Before proceeding with the vote, the Worthy Grand Matron called for discussion. There was none.

Seeing no discussion the Worthy Grand Matron called for a vote on the amended Article III, Committees of the Grand Chapter, Section 4; Add (D). Delete (O) and Article III Committee Duties and Composition Section 6 Add (D) Communication Committee and Delete (O) Web Page. The amendment as amended was **adopted.**

Article III Duties of Grand Officers, Section 6, A

 - d) Distinguished Guests Breakfast, whose chairman shall be appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron.
 - e) Grand Representative Luncheon, which is the responsibility of the Grand Representatives of Delaware Association.
 - f) Reception of the incoming Grand Officers, which is the responsibility of the Associate Grand Matron and Associate Grand Patron.

5) The Chairman of the Annual Sessions Committee will provide a partial report including partial financial accounting to the Grand Chapter at the Annual Grand Chapter Session with a full report including the final reports of all sub-committees (special activities) and financial state due to the Grand Trustees one week following the Annual Grand Chapter Session.

The Sessions Committee Chairman will deliver to the new Sessions committee Chairman a copy of these reports.

Rationale: Basic housekeeping of event list. Also, the Sessions Committee needs to have all the information to help prepare for the next year. In the past, no information has been passed along to them. We are getting ready in two years to celebrate our 100th year and do not want to start from the ground floor.

Lee Anderson, PGM (8) moved to accept Article III Duties of Grand Officers, Section 6), A) and bring it to the floor for discussion. Prestina M. Crockett, PM (8, 15) seconded.

Discussion:

Cathy Yaiser, PM (20) rose to amend the **Article III Duties of Grand Officers**, **Section 6**), **A)** and Steve Tolbert, PGP (16) seconded to clarify that (O) should read Pages Luncheon not PAGO Luncheon.

The Worthy Grand Matron called for discussion on the amendment to the amendment. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for a vote on the amendment to the amendment.

The amendment to the amendment was adopted.

The Worthy Grand Matron then called for discussion on the proposed amendment as amended.

Discussion:

Sister Catherine Schultz, PGM (12) rose to address the duties of the chairman of the Annual Session. She agreed that the Sessions Chairman took care of vendors and the public address system, She felt that the Sessions Chairman had enough responsibility with overseeing the session without adding on registration,

whose members are appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron. The medical team is also appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron. Paraphernalia is the Session Committee but if you want to use your Chapter's paraphernalia that is the responsibility of the Worthy Grand Matron. The Sessions Committee sets up and the Grand Lecturer checks to see that it is in the proper position in the Chapter Room. The Public Address System is obtained by the Sessions Committee. Necrology is appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron. The Informal Opening is the responsibility of the Sessions Committee. The Grand Banquet is appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron and is chaired by the Worthy Matrons of the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron's Chapters. The PAGO Breakfast is also appointed by the Worthy Grand Matron. The Grand Representative Luncheon is the responsibility of the Grand Representatives Association. Everything else the Sessions Committee does not take care of because we have our hands full with what we have without adding to our responsibilities.

Sister Cheryl Mongillo, PM (19) felt this legislation is making sure that activities (events) of the Grand Chapter Session happen. In the past as things were handed down one to the other there was that moment when someone realized, "Oh, darn we do that." Sister Cheryl's interpretation of the legislation is that it is not more work for the Session Committee Chairman but is a checklist for whoever they are assigned too. She appreciated the comments that were made but feels that the legislation is just a checklist to make sure those items in the list are addressed.

Sister Catherine Schultz, PGM (12) noted that the Chairman does check with the chairman of all the noted events to make sure the numbers are turned in for meals and that the overall session is running smoothly.

Sister Ann Street, PGM (5) noted that she is concerned that with the amount of work listed in the proposed legislation mainly in the collecting and seeing that all the financial reports are completed and turned into the Grand Trustees. That is not the work of the Sessions Committee. That is the work of the chairman of those committees. The work of aggregating the reports and passing them on is the work the Grand Chapter not the work of the Sessions Committee.

The Worthy Grand Matron asked if there was further discussion. Seeing that there was none the Worthy Grand Matron called for the vote on .

Before the vote could be taken Euretta L. Schultheiss Rose to address the legislation indicating that the proposed legislation to not originate with her but was an attempt to bring like items altogether in one section of the law. Euretta L. indicated that she felt it was unrealistic to have one week to pull all the information together after the Grand Chapter Session as it is an impossible task to accomplish.

The Worthy Grand Matron again asked if there was any further discussion. Hearing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for the vote on **Article III Duties of Grand Officers**, **Section 6**), **A**) The proposed legislation was **defeated**.

Article III Committee of the Grand Chapter, Section 6 H Jurisprudence Committee.

Now reads:

- H. Jurisprudence Committee
 - 1) It will be the duty of the members of the Jurisprudence Committee:
 - e) Review and approve all proposed amendments to the Constitution, and Bylaws, Rules & Regulations and Book of Instruction submitted by the members by the <u>March</u> deadline.
 - f) Prepare the above legislation in proper form either printed or electronic and deliver to each Subordinate Chapter for review by the membership as well as mounting on the Grand Chapter web site.
- 3) For the 2017-2018 Grand Chapter year:
 - a) The committee will be composed of two (2) remaining members of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee and Jurisprudence Committee.
 - b) Going forward from 2018 the committee will be three (3) members as stated above.

Proposed Change: Define date & timing of responsibilities in e) & f) and delete 3 in its entirety.

Change to read:

- e) Review and Approve all proposed amendments to the....**by March 31st.**
- f) Prepare the above legislation in proper form <u>electronically</u> and deliver to the Grand Chapter website for review by the <u>membership 30 days in advance of the first morning session</u> of Grand Chapter.

Rationale: The March date is open & not defined when the deadline is in March; the new date would give the Jurisprudence committee six (6) weeks to prepare legislation.

Debbie Good, PGM (8) moved and second by Virginia E. Crockett, PGM (8, 19) to accept *Article III Committee of the Grand Chapter, Section 6 H Jurisprudence Committee.* and bring it to the floor for discussion.

The Worthy Grand Matron then called for discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for the vote on *Article III Committee of the Grand Chapter, Section 6 H Jurisprudence Committee.* The motion adopted.

Article IV, Revenues, Expenditures and Fiscal Year, Section 1 G)

Now reads:

- G) Registration for the Annual Session
 - 1) Pre-Registration Fee for the Annual Session of the Grand Chapter \$15.00
 - 2) Onsite Registration Fee for the Annual Session of Grand Chapter \$20.00
 - 3) Fifty (50) year members are exempt from paying the registration the year they are honored.

Proposed Change: Exemption changed for 50-year members attending Monday afternoon only.

Change to read:

3) Fifty-year (50) members are exempt from paying the registration fee for the Monday afternoon session only.

Rationale: Registration has been increased. Dues have increased. Approximately 18 members will celebrate 50 years continuous membership this year. Is the Grand Chapter in the financial position to wave this fee?

Moved by Sister Joan S. Edwards, PGM (15) and seconded by Sister Linda K. Morganstern, PM (20) to accept *Article IV*, *Revenues, Expenditures and Fiscal Year*, *Section 1 G*) and bring it to the floor for discussion.

Discussion:

Brother Jeff Dennis, GGCCM Heart, PGP (15) Rose to question the phrase, "the members are exempt from paying the registration fee for the Monday afternoon session only." He noted that there was no specific amount. Jeff noted that there five (5) parts to the session. He then asked if they attended all day would they only pay for the other four (4) sessions and not the afternoon session. He asked if there shouldn't be a specific amount noted.

Sister Catherine Schultz, PGM (12) rose as a proponent of this to answer the question of Jeff Dennis. She indicated that if a member receiving 50-year recognition in the afternoon session of the first full day came for just the session where they are recognized as a 50-year member, they would not pay the registration. But if they were attending the entire session, they would be expected to pay the entire registration fee.

Henrietta McKelvey, PGM (20) rose to amend by inserting the words <u>if attending before the word "the".</u> The motion was seconded by Catherine Bradish (15).

The Worthy Grand Matron called for discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for a vote on the amendment to the proposed legislation.

The amendment to add the words **if attending** was **adopted**.

The Worthy Grand Matron then called for **discussion** on the amended amendment. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron then called for a vote on *Article IV*, *Revenues*, *Expenditures and Fiscal Year*, *Section 1 G*) as amended. The amended amendment was **adopted**.

Article VII Grand Chapter Proficiency

Rationale: The Rules and Regulations or Book of Instruction of the Grand Chapter of Delaware do not specify who must have an "A" Proficiency Certification; it is only specified that "A" holders must recertify to continue to hold an "A" Proficiency Certificate.

Now reads:

See Book of Instruction Section 30 for proficiency required for Elected Grand Chapter Officers.

Action: Add section A) – C) to clarify who must have an "A" Proficiency Certification or WGP Certification.

Change to read:

ELIGIBILITY FOR APPOINTED OR ELECTED GRAND OFFICES THAT REQUIRE PROFICIENCY

(Note Article name change)

- A) Anyone intending to serve as Grand Lecturer, Deputy Grand Lecturer, Worthy Grand Matron, Associate Grand Matron, Grand Secretary, Grand Conductress or Associate Grand Conductress must hold an "A" Proficiency Certificate.
- B) Anyone intending to serve as Associate Grand Patron or Worthy Grand Patron must hold a "Worthy Grand Patron" Proficiency Certificate.
- C) See Book of Instructions Section 30 for proficiency requirements.

Virginia E. Crockett, PGM (8) moved to accept the proposed legislation and bring it to the floor for discussion. Arthur W. Holley, PGP (5) seconded the motion.

Discussion:

Vickie J. Nicklas Rose noting that an "A" Certificate is required for the Grand Secretary. She had no problem with that but questioned what if the Grand Secretary was a Brother. Would he also have to obtain an "A" certificate. She felt that it should specify Sister or Brother. No amendment was made and there was no further discussion.

Seeing no further discussion, the Worthy Grand Matron then called for a vote on *Article VII Grand Chapter Proficiency*

Motion adopted.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF SUBORDINATE CHAPTERS

Article III Membership, Section 17: Fifty (50) Year Membership

Now reads:

Section 17: Fifty (50) Year Membership

B) To be awarded during the Anniversary Year.

Proposed Change: To be awarded during the <u>presiding Worthy</u> <u>Grand Matron's Term.</u>

Rationale: As written, it means the current Worthy Grand Matron would be signing off on 50-year members seven (7) months into the next Worthy Grand Matron's term. The Worthy Grand Matron's term ends when the next Worthy Grand Matron is installed.

Moved by Robert Hiddemen, GGCCM Membership, PGP (19), seconded by Catherine Schultz, PGM (12) to accept *Article III* **Membership, Section 17: Fifty (50) Year** and bring it to the floor for discussion.

Discussion:

Sister Catherine Yaiser, PM (20) rose to call for a clarification of why and what this change means. The Worthy Grand Matron requested that Sister Euretta L. Schultheiss, PGM (20) address the concerns.

Sister Euretta L. Schultheiss, explained that using the calendar year, January to December is the issue as the Worthy Grand Matron's term ends in May. So therefore, the Worthy Grand Matron would be signing certificates for 50-year members that happen in June, July, August, September, October, November, and December. That is seven (7) months into another Worthy Grand Matron's term. Also, the Worthy Grand Matron's signature is only valid from the night she is installed to the night her term ends.

Sister Jana Bradish, PM (15) noted that she joined Eastern Star in June of 1966. She noted that she had to wait to the following year to receive her fifty (50) year membership certificate and pin in Delaware. I waited till Barbara Lott and Robert Bradish were Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron to receive it from them even though it had only been four weeks since the previous year. If that is the way it is, that is the way it is. I don't feel that it should matter. I was able to travel to Rhode Island and receive a fifty (50) year membership and certificate from that Grand Jurisdiction in October. But not everyone has the ability.

Sister Hazel Smith, PM (5) the same thing happened to her. She joined in June of 1966, and I had to wait an entire year to receive the certificate and pin. She stated that she would like to see this change.

Sister Catherine Bradish rose to ask if the year (term) that is noted in this proposed legislation would be May of one year to May of the next. Or is the proposed legislation saying that it will be January to December and everyone in that year will receive at the next annual session or is it saying May to May. The Worthy Grand Matron clarified that the proposed legislation would put the awarding of the 50-year certificate and pin in line with the sitting Worthy Grand Matron's term of office, May to May. Sister Catherine then asked if a member's 50-year membership milestone happened the third week in May, they would have to

wait till the next May (next annual session) to receive their 50-year pin and certificate.

Brother Robert Hiddemen, GGGCM Heart, PGP (20) Rose to clarify that we are not talking about the calendar year but the Grand Chapter year.

The Worthy Grand Matron reminded the Grand Sentinel, Brother Robert Hiddemen, GGCCM Heart that as Grand Sentinel he is outside the door and should not be participating in discussions or making motions. She reminded him that he had ears but no voice.

Brother Robert Bradish, PGP (15) stated that someone who was initiated in another jurisdiction, continues their membership in the jurisdiction of Delaware, and has been a 50-year member in the jurisdiction of Delaware and their anniversary is in June will have to wait almost 51 years to be awarded their 50-year certificate and pin.

Sister Euretta L. Schultheiss, PGM (20) state that is not true but continued by addressing another issue. She indicated that the signature on the 50-year Member Certificate is the Worthy Grand Matron's signature which is only good till the end of the session. Signing certificates for June, July, August, etc., is not legal as the Worthy Grand Matron's signature would not be legal as she is only Worthy Grand Matron from May to May.

Sister Henrietta McKelvey rose to give the history of this issue. She stated that the Grand Chapter of Delaware honored 50-year membership during the Worthy Grand Matron's term of office. She understood that this amendment was changed several years ago, and this proposed amendment is to revert back to honoring 50-year members during the Worthy Grand Matron's term.

The Worthy Grand Matron asked if there was further discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron then called for a vote accept Membership, Section 17: Fifty (50) Year was adopted.

Before proceeding the Worthy Grand Matron requested of the Jurisprudence Committee a ruling the legality of an earlier motion made by the Grand Sentinel and if there needed to bring that *Article III* Membership, Section 17: Fifty (50) Year Membership back to the floor. The Jurisprudence Committee felt that the proposed legislation should be brought back to the

floor and properly moved and seconded. The Worthy Grand Matron requested that the motion be made again and seconded. Sister Cheryl Mongillo, PM (19) moved and Sister Catherine Schultz, PGM (12) seconded that 50-year membership be awarded during the presiding Worthy Grand Matron's year (term).

The Worthy Grand Matron called for discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for a vote. *Article III* Membership, Section 17: Fifty (50) Year Membership was adopted.

Article VIII, Election

- Section 1: The first eight (8) officers of a Subordinate Chapter will be elected annually at the **first** stated meeting in **March.** A majority written secret ballot, 1 more than half of ballots cast is needed for election.
- Section 2: A written separate ballot must be taken for each elective office.
- Section 3: One trustee will be elected for one (1) year, one for two (2) years, and one for three (3) years after which each trustee will be elected for a term of three years.
- Proposed Change: Restate and clarify Section 3 and delete Section 2 as it is explained in the book of instruction.

Will then read:

- Section 1: The first eight (8) officers of a Subordinate Chapter will be elected annually at the **first** stated meeting in **March.** (See Book of Instruction Section 11: Election Procedure)
- Section 2: Three trustees will be elected, one for one (1) year, one for two (2) years and one for three (3) years after which one trustee will be elected annually for a term of three (3) years. (See Book of Instruction Section 11: Election Procedure)
- Section 4: To be renumbered to Section 3.
- Section 5: To be renumbered to Section 4.

Rationale: To coincide with the Book of Instruction Section 11: Election Procedure.

The motion adopted.

Article XVII Ritualistic Work, Etc., Section 4 Rituals

Now reads:

- A) Any member of the Order can procure a Ritual from the Secretary of the Subordinate Chapter. Only members of this Order should be in possession of the rituals, and they must never be placed in the hands of others.
- B) Only one (1) Ritual should be open during the meeting of a Subordinate Chapter and that is for the use of the Worthy Patron, Deputy Grand Lecturer, or a prompter designated by the Deputy.

Proposed change: Delete the phrase "Worthy Patron,"

- A) Any member of the Order can procure a Ritual from the Secretary of the Subordinate Chapter. Only members of this Order should be in possession of the rituals, and they must never be placed in the hands of others.
- B) Only one (1) Ritual should be open during the meeting of a Subordinate Chapter and that is for the use of Deputy Grand Lecturer, or a prompter designated by the Deputy.

Rationale: The Worthy Grand Patron usually does not have an "A" Proficiency

The Worthy Grand Matron called for discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for a vote. Motion **adopted.**

Article XIX, Amendments, Section 1

Now reads:

Section 1: **Amendments:** No amendments to these Rules and Regulations, either by alteration or addition will be made unless in the following manner:

- A) Proposed amendment(s) must be presented, electronically or in writing to the Jurisprudence Committee a minimum of ninety (90) days before the Annual Grand Chapter Session or Special Meeting call for that purpose.
- B) The amendment will then be presented by the Jurisprudence Committee to the Grand Secretary who will present it in writing at an Annual Grand Chapter Session or Special Meeting called for that purpose and after being heard discussed, and if so ordered amended.
- C) The amendment may then be adopted by two thirds (2/3) vote of all members present and voting.
- D) When printed after amendments are adopted, the date of adoption will be printed with the change.

Proposed Change: Change to electronic submission of changes only and add E) and F) to read as in Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter of Delaware.

Change to read:

Section 1. **Amendments:** No amendment(s) to these Rules and Regulations, either by alteration or addition will be made unless in the following manner:

A) Proposed amendment(s) must be presented <u>electronically</u> to the Jurisprudence Committee a minimum of ninety (90) days before the Annual Grand Chapter Session or Special Meeting called for that purpose.

- E) All proposed amendments presented for consideration by the membership of the Grand Chapter of Delaware be signed by a minimum of at least two (2) members of this Grand Chapter.
- F) Any proposed amendment presented for "Emergency Legislation" during the Grand Chapter Annual Sessions, must require a minimum of at least ten (10) signatures, representing at least three (3) different Subordinate Chapters in this jurisdiction.

Rationale: Each section of the Constitution and Bylaws and Rules & Regulations should have the same process for amending the content.

Sister Debbie Good, PGM (8) moved and seconded by Sister Linda Morganstern, PM, WM (20) that the *Article XIX*, *Amendments*, *Section 1* be adopted and placed on the floor for discussion.

Discussion:

Brother Steve Tolbert, PGP (16) rose to request that the phrase "emergency legislation" be defined.

Sister Henrietta McKelvey, PGM (20) stated that it was her understanding that "emergency legislation" was something that was not given to the Jurisprudence Committee before the Annual Session but was going to be brought up on the floor during the session.

Brother Steve Tolbert, PGP (16) again requested that the phrase "emergency legislation" be defined as what is emergency legislation to him may not be emergency for the rest of the Grand Chapter. He stated that he is not in favor of the legislation as written.

Sister Ann Street, GGCCM Service Dogs, PGM (5) stated that, that is part of the discussion. Is the item truly "emergency legislation" or is this something that can wait and what is the process for that? That is something that would be evaluated at

that time. But if somebody or some group or the Grand Chapter receives something from General Grand Chapter that requires action sooner rather than later, then action can be taken. Recently there were several items that came up and the thought that they had to wait a year before being presented. So, to put something in to address situations like this provides a process for such situation. She felt that this would not become standard practice. This will be the exception to the rule. By acting on this legislation there is a process in the law and all sections dealing with amendments in the Constitution and Bylaws, Rules and Regulations and Book of Instructions are consistent.

Sister Kathy Trombly, AGM, (15) Rose to ask, "who determines emergency? Jurisprudence or the Worthy Grand Matron?" The Worthy Grand Matron asked if the question had been asked as a rhetorical question or a real question. Sister Kathy answered that is a real question. Sister Kathy felt that we should know who is going to make the decision on what is "emergency legislation" and not leave it out there nebulously.

Brother Bob Bradish, PGM (15) stated that if ten (10) people from three (3) different Subordinate Chapters sign legislation that says the legislation is an emergency. To get ten (10) people from three (3) different Subordinate Chapters to all agree that something needs to be done sooner than later, then that is what determines it is emergency legislation. He felt the term "emergency" is probably the wrong word and the word should possibly be "immediate" rather than "emergency" and it is an item that has not gone through the Jurisprudence Committee ninety (90) days before the sessions and is something that has come up sometime between the ninety (90) days and the Grand Session. If something comes up in that timeframe that should be addressed, we don't have to wait a whole year to bring it up. He felt the word "emergency" is the issue and not who makes the decision on if the item is "emergency."

Sister Cathy Yaiser, PM (20) moved and Brother Robert Bradish, PGP (15) seconded to divide the question by voting on A) and E) first. Then vote on F) separately.

The Worthy Grand Matron called for discussion on the motion to divide the question. There was none.

The Worthy Grand Matron then called for a vote.

The motion to divide the question was adopted.

The Worthy Grand Matron then asked if there was any discussion on section A) and E). As there seemed to be some confusion the Worthy Grand Matron restated that only sections A) and E) were being voted upon at this time. There was no discussion.

Seeing no discussion, the Worthy Grand Matron called for a vote on *Article XIX*, *Amendments*, *Section 1*. Motion adopted.

The Worthy Grand Matron then indicated that F) will now be brought up.

Sister Henrietta McKelvey Rose to question that if the question is divided then there needs to be someone to make a motion on each part. After discussion among several speakers, it was determined that there only needed to be a motion to bring F) to the floor.

The Worthy Grand Matron asked for a motion for acceptance of *Article XIX*, *Amendments*, *Section 1* Section F) and to bring it to the floor for discussion.

Sister Virginia E. Crockett, PGM (8, 19) moved and seconded by Brother Robert Bradish, PGP (15) to accept *Article XIX*, *Amendments*, *Section 1* Section F) of the original proposed change and bring it to the floor for discussion.

Discussion:

Brother Robert Bradish Rose to state that the entire section was approved in 2018 for Rules and Regulations, Article XII.

The Worthy Grand Matron clarified that this section was not in the top section of this proposed amendment as it was approved in 2018 and was not part of any change.

Sister Debbie Good, PGM (8) Rose to explain that what the Jurisprudence Committee was trying to do was every section concerning amendments the same in each section - the Constitution and Bylaws, Rules and Regulations Grand Chapter, Rules and Regulations Subordinate Chapters, Book of Instructions. The Committee wanted to see that all terminology in the sections dealing with Amendments was the same. The

Worthy Grand Matron further explained that it was not in the top section as it didn't exist. The Committee proposed to add F) so that it would be consistent with all other sections dealing with amendments.

Sister Ann Street, GGCCM Service Dogs, PGM (5) Rose to request further explanation so that the membership is not mislead after voting on this issue. She felt that the Rules & Regulations of Grand Chapter section dealing with Amendments had not been placed on the table to be acted upon. At the time it was felt that the section needed more discussion amongst the members of the Jurisprudence Committee before going forward with it. She asked if this was the same as the Rules & Regulations of Grand Chapter, the Rules & Regulations of Subordinate Chapters, and the Book of Instruction. The answer was in the affirmative.

Sister Henrietta McKelvey Rose to question Section 5 that is presently being considered is also in the Grand Chapter section regarding legislation to be presented at Grand Chapter. This is being done because? Robert Bradish answered that the goal is to have the section on Amendments to be presented be consistent among all the section. It was noted that there was legislation to be presented which is identical to this for the Book of Instruction.

The Worthy Grand Matron called for further discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for the vote. Motion adopted.

Grand Chapter Book of Instruction Section 8 Balloting E)

Now reads:

E) The Secretary is directed by the Worthy Matron to IMMEDIATELY inform the candidate of election to receive the degrees, giving time and date of initiation; if a female, to wear white floor length gown, and white shoes, no hat, or gloves; if male, to wear formal business attire.

Proposed Change: Change dress code for women.

Change to read:

E) The Secretary is directed by the Worthy Matron to IMMEDIATELY inform the candidate of election to receive the degrees, giving time and date of initiation; if a female, to wear

<u>Sunday dress or suit</u>, no hat, or gloves; if male, to wear formal <u>or</u> business attire (suit).

Rationale: To help take off some of the stress a new candidate has to join and try to find the white outfit, not knowing what others are wearing. The women basically would not take a station for a year. To bring it to equal to what we ask the men to wear. In lodge, they do not need to get a tuxedo until their third degree. Modified men's attire for clarity.

The Worthy Grand Matron then called for discussion on **Grand Chapter Book of Instruction Section 8**) **Balloting E**) as amended. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron then called for the vote on **Grand Chapter Book of Instruction Section 8**) **Balloting E**). The amendment as amended was **adopted**.

Grand Chapter Book of Instruction Section 11: Procedure of Election of Subordinate Chapter Officers

Proposed change: Delete the present Section 11 and insert the following in its place.

Section 11: Election Procedure

A) Grand Chapter: See Constitution Article V Elections

- 1) Election Procedure:
 - a) The Worthy Grand Patron will say:
 - i. All elective offices shall be filled by secret ballot. However, if only one name is presented for a respective office, the Grand Secretary or Grand Treasurer shall cast a unanimous vote of this Grand Chapter. In the case of the Grand Secretary, the Grand Treasurer will cast a unanimous vote.
 - ii. All nominees must be a Past Matron or Past Patron of Delaware and hold the appropriate proficiency for the office for which they are nominated as defined by the Constitution Article 5 Section 3 and Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter A
 - b) Election Procedure for election of all Grand Officers
 - c) All persons running in an elective office will stand; state their name along with the name of their primary as well as secondary Subordinate Chapters in Delaware.

- 7) If an office has no submissions, the presiding officer may issue a call for nominations from the floor.
- 8) Those seeking elected office must have the appropriate proficiency for the office they are seeking as specified in the Rules and Regulations of the Subordinate Chapters of Delaware Article VIII.
- 9) The first eight officers and one Trustee will be elected by a majority vote (one vote more than half of the ballots cast) no blank ballots shall be counted.
- 10) The remaining officers will be appointed by the Worthy Matron-elect.
- 11) The election shall be by a majority vote on a separate, written ballot, and if there are more than three candidates for the same office, the name of the one receiving the lowest number of votes cast shall be dropped after the third ballot is announced.

12) Election Procedure

- a) At the first meeting in March, Under New Business, the Worthy _____ will announce those to be appointed tellers and distributors preferably sideline members, according to the needs of the Chapter.
- **b)** Ballots provided by the Grand Chapter MUST be used.
- c) The Distributors will pass the ballots and pencils (which must be provided and waiting on the Secretary's desk).
- d) For uncontested offices, the Worthy ___ will say, "there being only one name presented or nominated, and if there are no

objections, the Secretary will cast a unanimous vote of this Chapter except for the Secretary which will be done by the Treasurer. [Vote is cast]

- e) For contested offices, the Worthy _____ will say, "you will prepare ballot number [number] for the office [name of contested office]. [Pause long enough for all to complete their ballots]. Have all voted? If so, I declare the ballot closed. Sisters Conductress and Associate Conductress], you will collect the ballots and take them to the tellers.
- f) When the result is given, Sister/Brother [name] you have been elected by this Chapter to serve as [name of office] for the ensuing year. Do you accept? [After acceptance] Sister/Brother [name], I declare you elected to serve as [name of office]
- g) If there are no nominations for an office the Worthy Patron after asking three times, will declare the office vacant.
- h) If vacancies occur the Worthy ____ will declare the election is complete and any unfilled office will be appointed by the Worthy Matron-elect provided that these appointees are eligible for the position which she/he may be appointed.
- i) Blank ballots must not be counted.
- j) All elected officers must affirm the acceptance of their office in Chapter before being installed, if not present at time of their election.
- **k)** A special election to fill a vacancy requires a dispensation and a notification to members, ten days before the election.

I) If a Chapter desires to elect a Sentinel, this must be incorporated in the Bylaws of the Chapter.

Rationale This modification is a merging of two (2) separate submissions that were very similar, and the Jurisprudence Committee edited to form one coordinated submission along with eliminating sections of each submission that were already part of other sections of the Constitution and Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of Grand Chapter, Rules and Regulations of Subordinate Chapters and Grand Chapter Book of Instruction. The Worthy Grand Matron noted that what was in place for changes was only to change Rules and Regulations. Brother Robert Bradish noted that the *Book of Instruction* was also included.

The Worthy Grand Matron handed the gavel to the Worthy Grand Patron to preside as she wished to ask a question.

The Worthy Grand Matron then noted that she thought that the Grand Chapter had in place anything that was changed in General Grand was automatically changed in Grand Chapter, so why are we voting on this?

- A) Proposed amendment(s) must be presented <u>electronically</u> to the Jurisprudence Committee a minimum of ninety (90) days before the Annual Grand Chapter Session or Special Meeting called for that purpose.
- B) The amendment will then be presented by the Jurisprudence Committee to the Grand Secretary who will present it in writing at an Annual Grand Chapter Session or Special Meeting called for that purpose and after being heard, discussed, and if so, ordered amended.
- C) The amendment may then be adopted by two thirds (2/3) vote of all members present and voting.
- D) When printed after amendments are adopted, the date of adoption will be printed with the change. (AM 2009)
- E) All proposed amendments presented for consideration by the membership of the Grand Chapter of Delaware be signed by a minimum of at least two (2) members of this Grand Chapter. (AM 2018)
- F) Any proposed amendment presented for "Emergency Legislation" during out Grand Chapter Annual Sessions, must require a minimum of at least ten (10) signatures,

representing at least three (3) different Subordinate Chapters in this jurisdiction. (AM 2018)

Rationale: To make consistent throughout each section of the Constitution and Bylaws and Rules and Regulations.

Sister Debbie Good, PGM (8) moved and seconded by Brother David Holley, PGP (5) to accept this proposed amendment and bring it to the floor for discussion.

The Worthy Grand Matron called for discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for a vote on **Section 31: Amendments to the Book of Instruction.** Motion **adopted.**

Much clapping was heard at the conclusion of the vote on the last amendment.

The Worthy Grand Matron thanked The Sisters and Brothers present for the expedient way that they handled the legislation.

Before closing the Worthy Grand Matron entertained a motion refer to a Special Committee to evaluate the changes by Grand Chapter and its Subordinate Chapters to facilitate a change in the Grand Chapter year. The Worthy Grand Matron continued that this is to appoint a committee to investigate the pros and cons and report back to the members of Grand Chapter at the 2020 Grand Session.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Special Committee to Investigate change of Grand Chapter Year: The Worthy Grand Matron noted that the Committee on Unfinished Business had brought forward one item of unfinished business and that was the special committee appointed to investigate the possibility of moving the Grand Chapter year, the pros and cons, and location.

The Worthy Grand Matron stated that she was unable to find someone to chair the committee. Several members had offered to participate but none wanted to chair. Sister Cathy Yaiser, PM, Grand Trustee (20) Rose to question in looking through the *Constitution and Bylaws Article VII Section* 2 A} on page 6 the only place found that says "...at least fifteen (15) days prior to". So how do you have ninety (90) days' notice for this section.

The Worthy Grand Matron requested that the Jurisprudence Committee answer the question posed by Sister Cathy.

At this point the Worthy Grand Matron indicated that Brother Robert Bradish, PGM (15) and chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee was not present because his wife, Sister Jana Bradish, is having surgery.

Sister Debbie Good, PGM (8) and member of the Jurisprudence Committee answered on behalf of the committee stating that all the other sections in the *Rules and Regulation Grand Chapter*, *Rules and Regulations, Subordinate Chapters and Book of Instructions* dealing with amendments state that submission should be done electronically and have been previously passed. This is the only section that was not consistent with the other sections and the reason for this proposed change. This has nothing to do with notice for a special meeting.

Sister Cathy then stated that on page 6 of the 2019 revision it states that "Special Meetings may be called by the Worthy Grand Matron, with the concurrence of the Worthy Grand Patron, at such time and place as in their judgement the interest of the Order may require, and every Chapter in this Grand Jurisdiction will be notified at least fifteen (15) days prior thereto. Sister Cathy asked how we can send a notice ninety (90) days ahead of a session?

The Worthy Grand Matron recognized Brother Steve Tolbert, PGP, Grand Treasurer who stated that the various pieces of legislation should not wait ninety (90) days before the season to

be submitted to the Jurisprudence Committee. They should be presented throughout the year. If the Worthy Grand Matron has a special communication of the Grand Chapter those pieces of legislation that have already been submitted could be dealt with at that special communication. So, he felt the ninety (90) days was an issue for a special communication.

The Worthy Grand Matron recognized Sister Euretta L. Schultheiss, PGM who was opposed to this as written because this has eliminated all our members who are electronically challenged. She felt there should be a proposal that indicates that written proposals would be accepted so many days before a session to the Jurisprudence Committee so that they could still participate in the legislative process. Otherwise, we are eliminating so many of our members from submitting legislation.

Sister Debbie Good, PGM (8) pointed out that on page 98 of the 2019 revision of the *General Grand Chapter Red Book* in the 3rd through 5th lines of Section 24 that the phrase" (and it understood that the current year's dues card, now in general use, shall be construed as the equivalent of a Certificate of Good Standing).

The Worthy Grand Matron called for further discussion. Seeing none, the Worthy Grand Matron called for the vote. Motion adopted.

Article IV Fee, Section 1

Now reads:

Initiation Fee (Including Plural Membership fee): The minimum fee for initiation in this Grand Jurisdiction will be not less than \$25.00 but each Subordinate Chapter may provide in its bylaws for any larger amount that it may wish.

TRIBUTE TO THE FLAGS Sister Susan E. Peronti, PM (19) Grand Marshal

Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna, and Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Tom, when we began this journey, you asked us to think outside of the box. I started compiling some information when things were quite normal! But that soon changed, and I found myself, stuck in a box called "home". So, I found some interesting facts and I hope you enjoy this tribute.

THE AMERICAN FLAG

During a National History project in 1958, a 17-year-old high school student in Lancaster, Ohio submitted his version of the American Flag. Robert G. Heft presented a flag with 50 stars and 13 stripes. His teacher gave him a B- with the comment that there were only 48 states. And, if he wasn't satisfied with the grade, to get the flag accepted in Washington and come back to class for a grade adjustment.

By the time, all 1,500 entries were judged, Alaska and Hawaii had become states. Heft received a phone call from President Dwight D. Eisenhower with the news that his flag was selected! He was excited with the news but more importantly, his teacher was true to his word and adjusted his grade as promised.

Our flag carries a message of hope for all. It represents many things to many people, but most of all it stands for the freedom we enjoy in our daily lives.

THE CANADIAN FLAG

The Canadian Flag symbolizes one thing above all, especially to the citizens of the United States, and that is Friendship. A boundary line between Canada and the United States runs for thousands of miles. On this line is the International Peace Garden where our two flags fly side by side. Each pledging never to take up arms against each other. May these flags always remain symbols of peace, freedom, and brotherly love.

THE ISRAEL (Hebrew) FLAG

It is my pleasure to present this flag for the first time at Delaware's Grand Sessions. The flag of Israel was adopted on October 28, 1948, five months after the establishment of the State of Israel.

The blue Star of David on a white background, between two horizontal blue stripes symbolize the Jewish prayer shawl and the Star of David. Both emblems represent the widely acknowledged symbols of the Jewish people.

THE DELAWARE FLAG

Delaware was ratified on December 7, 1787, thus becoming "The First State". According to the members of the commission established to design the state flag, the colonial blue field and the buff-colored diamond were said to represent the colors of a uniform worn by General George Washington. The diamond alludes to the nickname, "The Diamond State" given because of Delaware's small size, great value, its geographic position on the Atlantic Ocean and its leadership contributions.

The flag was presented to the tune of "Our Delaware". The official state song written by George B. Hynson. Originally the song contained three verses in honor of each county in the State. A fourth verse was written by Don Devine to praise the State and pledges the loyalties of its citizens.

THE CHRISTIAN FLAG

The Christian Flag is one of the oldest unchanged flags in the world. It represents a belief in a living God and symbolic of all the faith, love, kindness and understanding that we have for our fellow man.

In 1908, the first pledge to the Christian Flag was written by Lynn Harold Hough, a Methodist pastor. Which states: "I pledge allegiance to the Christian Flag and to the Savior for whose Kingdom it stands. One brotherhood, uniting all mankind, in service and in love."

THE EASTERN STAR FLAG

The Eastern Star Flag is a symbol of our Order and as such merits our love and respect. Its unique design and bright colors allude to those lessons taught by the heroine of our Order and remind us that we should always endeavor to exemplify the sublime virtues of those celebrated characters.

May our Star ever lead us, and our flag constantly remind us of the beautiful principals given to us in our Eastern Star teachings:

Blue means Fidelity and Obedience from Adah

Yellow means Constancy from Ruth.

White means Loyalty and Purity from Esther.

Green means Faith and Belief from Martha.

Red represents Charity and Love for One Another from Electa.

Therefore, let us always strive to practice those virtues learned and work to spread the message our Order represents.

THE MASONIC FLAG

Freemasonry is believed to have been started in the 1500's by stone masons in England and Europe. They grouped themselves into lodges to pass on their methods of building churches and cathedrals.

At that time very few people could read or write, so symbols were used to hang outside the premises associated with their trade or the merchandise they sold. The stone mason lodges often had a flag or banner hanging outside to distinguish each other. They would collect money to give to those stone masons who were sick or unable to work.

In the 17th century scientists, chemists, engineers, and philosophers took their education and work ethics of the stone masons to establish meetings of the Freemasons. To be part of this group, a man had to be free- which meant no prison convictions.

THE MILITARY FLAGS

As our country was evolving and trying to establish a way to identify each of the military service branches, there became a need to adopt unique American military flags. Then each branch of service established its own motto.

The United States Army

This flag is displayed first in honor of its creation by the United States Government. The Motto: "Be all you Can Be".

The United States Marines

The motto: "Semper Fidelis" meaning "Always Faithful". *The United States Navy*

The often-cited motto: "Not self but Country".

The United States Coast Guard

The motto: "Semper Paratus" which means "Always Ready" or "Ever Ready".

The United States Air Force

The motto: "Integrity first, Service before self, Excellence in all we do".

Thank you for your service and keeping us all safe.

Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the Worthy Matron, due notice having been given the members and only such business

transacted as may be specified in the notice.

ARTICLE V – Membership, Section 5, page 7.

Now Reads:

Section 5. Dual Membership is not permitted in concurrent jurisdiction. No petition for Dual Membership shall be received unless Chapter in which the petitioner holds primary membership also permits Dual Membership.

The procedure in receiving and acting upon any petition for Dual Membership shall be the same as that of any other petition for affiliation.

Dual Members must pay dues in both Chapters and shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of membership in both, except that such Dual member shall not hold any one of the four principle offices or that of Secretary in more than one Chapter at the same time.

Loss of membership by suspension for non-payment of dues in primary Chapter, or expulsion in either Chapter, carries with it the loss of membership in the other.

No Subordinate Chapter shall receive petitions for Dual Membership for a member whose primary membership is held in a Chapter under a Grand Chapter not permitting Dual Membership.

Proposed Change: Delete in its entirety since dual membership no longer exists in Delaware and Replace with Comment on Plural Membership

Change to Read:

ARTICLE VII - Fees and Dues, Section 1, page 9.

Now Reads:

Section 1. The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15), and for affiliation Five Dollars (\$5), which must accompany the petition.

Proposed Change: Increase conferring degrees and affiliation fee to \$25. Add plural and reinstatement.

Change to Read:

Section 1. The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter, <u>affiliation</u>, <u>plural or reinstatement</u> shall be <u>Twenty-five Dollars</u> (\$25) which must accompany the petition.

ARTICLE VII - Fees and Dues, Section 2, page 9. Now Reads:

Section 2. Each member, except Life Members, shall pay the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10) annual dues, plus the annual per capita tax (assessments) of the General Grand Chapter and Grand Chapter of Delaware, payable in December. By order of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, all dues must be paid one year in advance. The Chapter may, by a majority vote of the members present, remit the dues of any member.

Proposed Change: Increase in dues from \$10 to \$15. *Change to Read:*

Section 2. Each member, except Life Members, shall pay the sum of <u>Fifteen Dollars (\$15)</u> annual dues, plus the annual per capita tax (assessments) of the General Grand Chapter and Grand Chapter of Delaware, payable in December. By order of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, all dues must be paid one year in advance. The Chapter may, by a majority vote of the members present, remit the dues of any member.

Section 1. No alterations or amendments to these By-Laws shall be made unless the same shall be proposed in writing at a stated meeting, when it shall be entered on the minutes, lay over until the next stated meeting, when, if by two-third of the members present vote in the affirmative, the amendment shall be adopted. Except that any law, ruling or edict of the Grand Chapter of Delaware altering these By-Laws had the effect of any amendment without any action on the part of the Chapter.

All amendments must be approved by the Worthy Grand Matron or Grand Chapter.

Proposed change: Add approved by the Grand Chapter Jurisdiction Committee and remove Grand Chapter. This is in the guidelines of the Grand Chapter.

Section 1. No alterations or amendments to these By-Laws shall be made unless the same shall be proposed in writing at a stated meeting, when it shall be entered on the minutes, lay over until the next stated meeting, when, if by two-third of the members present vote in the affirmative, the amendment shall be adopted. Except that any law, ruling or edict of the Grand Chapter of Delaware altering these By-Laws had the effect of any amendment without any action on the part of the Chapter.

All amendments must be approved by the Grand Chapter Jurisprudence Committee and the Worthy Grand Matron of Grand Chapter.

Now, therefore, I, Most Worshipful Donald Elwood Rosenberry pursuant to the power and authority vested in me as Grand Master of Masons in Delaware, do hereby direct and order as follows:

- Mr. Michael L. Brittingham, late of Temple Lodge No. 9, A.F. & A.M. is and stands <u>EXPELLED</u> from all rights and privileges of a Master Mason as of this date.
- Mr. Michael L. Brittingham, late of Temple Lodge No. 9, A.F. & A.M. shall
 not be allowed membership in any Jurisdiction of Freemasonry until such time
 that this expulsion is rescinded by the Grand Master of Masons in Delaware and
 by unanimous vote of the Grand Lodge of Delaware.
- No Mason shall have Masonic Intercourse with Mr. Michael L. Brittingham for any reason whatsoever.

 The Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Delaware shall send a copy of this Edict No. 2 to Mr. Michael L. Brittingham, late of Temple Lodge No. 9, and all lodges in amity with the Grand Lodge of Delaware.



Correspondence

I do not have any letters under seal from the subordinate chapters.

Irregularities

Entering this year, I conveyed to the Grand Lecturer that I wanted to concentrate on setting a tone of encouragement as far as our ritualistic work is concerned. While I understand the need to identify errors and shortcomings in the presentation of our work, I also feel that feedback and reporting of said issues should be handled firmly, but tenderly. Having said that, the irregularities as observed by myself and the Grand Lecturer and so noted by the Grand Lecturer with recommendations are listed below:

- There is inconsistency in the usage of text from the Ritual and the signs and passes. It had been recommended that the signs and passes be practiced by all members. (See Ritual, Page 45).
- Incorrect wording was used when directing the members to extend grand honors, the word "Accord" was used. The Book of Instruction, Introductions Section 15 (J) reads: "Sisters and Brothers, you will join with me in

extending Grand Honors to our Worthy Grand Matron and/or Worthy Grand Patron."

While it is difficult to label the next issue an irregularity, unless there is a question or complaint from a member, it should be mentioned as a reminder to all Matrons when filling vacancies at meetings. Refer to Rules and Regulations for Subordinate Chapters, Art. X, Sec. 4, Vacancies preferences, Page 57, A) "preference MUST be given members of her or his Subordinate Chapter".

As noted above, various instances occurred where the ritual wording was not correct. It is understood that there are times when a specific word escapes us, and a similar term is used. However, we encourage all members who hold positions to review the ritual and strive for accuracy and beauty in your presentation. I know that sometimes it feels as though we are tired phonograph records simply repeating statements, we have heard hundreds of times. But what we need to remember is that there are still new or less experienced members who are not only memorizing the words from the ritual, but also watching and learning movement and delivery of those words from the more seasoned members. Be proud of your work and make your ritualistic performance such that others remember it well and strive to emulate it. An important example of the importance of the use of correct wording and meaningful delivery is the "Farewell" statement. I have always felt that statement to be a critical part of our meeting, show your sisters and brothers how truly important they are to you by saying this properly. Now more than ever, we need to hear these words in a reverent and sincere manner

Questions & Answers/Decisions

I received the following inquiries, my answers with reasoning follow:

- 10/22/2019 Question: Can the Altar be draped for a former member who is a Past Matron/Patron or Past Grand Matron/Patron?
 - Answer: I was unable to find any documentation to specify for whom the Altar may or may not be draped. The only

information I was able to find was for the procedures for *performing* the draping. Unfortunately, I had planned to write to the Most Worthy Grand Secretary to secure an answer, but for some reason, I did not complete the follow-up and the inquirer did not inquire again. Therefore, I will reach out at this time for a response, so I can reply and the issue can be closed.

- 4/10/2020 Question: The Grand Chapter of Virginia and their subordinate chapters are remaining in place until their next regular session date/installation date in 2021. Is this something that we here in Delaware could do as well? (A few people inquired as to this possibility, as several other jurisdictions were announcing this same plan).
 - Answer: The leadership of the Grand Chapter had met previous to this inquiry and had laid out a tentative plan for a session and changing of the grand officers and subordinate chapter officers. Therefore, I forwarded the written inquiry to the leadership team and inquired as to their thoughts. Everyone felt that since we had discussed our situation thoroughly and determined a tentative plan, that we should proceed with said plan unless circumstances changed further. I responded to the inquiries accordingly.

WORTHY GRAND MATRON'S SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT Sister Donna S. Hiddemen

Introduction

As you are all aware, in March of 2020, the world was thrown into a completely unexpected situation, the COVID-19 Pandemic. The severity of the Pandemic on the lives of those all across the world was just unfolding before us. As we watched the nightly, and sometimes all day, news in shock, each day was more unbelievable. At first, we expected that some known drug would be found to stop the virus and it would be isolated to one section of the world, then one section of the U.S., then it was at our doorstep. Quite quickly, we found that our meetings had to be stopped as the President, the Governors, the Masonic Grand Masters across our country and, of course our Most Worthy Grand Matron, took action to prevent gatherings that would spread the virus and imperil our members and others. I think we all knew immediately when major sporting events went dark that indeed this foe was a major opponent that was to be taken extremely seriously. It soon became evident what heroes really looked like: Doctors, Nurses, First Responders, Supermarket Workers, Pharmacy Workers, Truck Drivers, Engineers, Laborers and oh so sadly, Mortuary Workers. Everyday people were being pushed to their limits and beyond and were finally being recognized for the criticality of the work they do. So much

was happening in our world, and we were doing our part to help stem the tide, simply by not gathering face to face. While it sounds like such action was very easy, behind the scenes there was continual work: Monitoring government and CDC briefings, working in coordination with the Grand Master's office, the Most Worthy Grand Matron, our Jurisprudence Committee, our Grand Line Officers and Trustees. Your Leadership team worked very hard to do what was expected of us as an organization while still managing our work, home, family issues and health concerns. Unfortunately, it became evident early in this situation that our Grand Chapter Session in May, 2020 was not going to be able to proceed. Additionally, we heard from many jurisdictions who were in the same boat as our Grand Chapter. State after State and Canadian Provinces were making the difficult decision not only to cancel their sessions, but also to keep their 2019-2020 Grand and Subordinate officers in place until their next scheduled session and installation times. The Delaware Leadership team also reviewed our specific circumstances and came to the same conclusion. There would be no change of office until April and May of 2021. Circumstances continued to morph and as events evolved, we learned, by necessity, how to manage many every day functions, including work and our Eastern Star business virtually. For many of us, the term "Virtual" having never been a part of our vocabulary previously, was now used in daily conversation. While we did not meet at all for a portion of the year, September brought us the use of virtual business meetings, so many of us could at least handle necessary business and see each other's faces. Chapters and individual members worked to remain in contact with members who did not wish to or did not have the ability to participate in online meetings. As things progressed and more was learned from the CDC about the virus and the state began increasing options, chapters were given the option to continue virtual business meetings or begin in-person meetings.

I am thankful at this writing, that we seem to be coming out of our long global nightmare and moving toward a new form of normalcy with lowered risk for all.

Since my initial report, we have lost several more sisters and brothers, including the following past Grand Matron and Patrons: Brother Eddie Morris in October 2020; Sister Lee Anderson in March 2021 and Brother Bill Edwards in April 2021. Grand Chapter Committees

Appointments to fill Vacancies

Unfortunately, 2020 - 2021 required a couple of vacancies to be filled, those are as follows:

Standing Committees:

Grievances & Appeals: Ann L. Street, PGM appointed to fill the position of J. Edward Morris, PGP (12) due to his passing.

Julia M. Story Award: I did not appoint anyone to fill the position of Sister Lee Anderson, PGM (8) due to her passing, as the work of this committee was already completed for this term.

Special Committees:

OES License Plates: Rosemarie Vanderhoogt (16) appointed to fill the position of J. Edward Morris, PGP (12) due to his passing.

Special Committees

At the special meeting in September 2019, it was determined that I should appoint a special committee to investigate the possible options for moving the Grand Chapter year and holding the annual session in a different month. While I had several members interested in participating in the process by serving on the committee, I was not able to find someone willing to serve as chair. As a result, I held off and tried again later in the term. Ultimately, in November of 2020, I felt that I should attempt to chair the committee myself. However, with managing work fulltime, the ongoing business of Grand Chapter during the pandemic and hosting the subordinate chapter Zoom business meetings, I just didn't feel that I had the bandwidth to fulfill the duty. Therefore, the research to adequately present the information was not accomplished. I deeply regret not seeing this responsibility through to completion. I would like to recommend that when the Grand Chapter does consider a move such as this, that they examine other months and not just March as an option.

Meeting Status Progression and Instruction

In March 2020 as the pandemic come on, we had to cease all meetings completely. The Governor of the State of Delaware issued a stay-at-home order, the Grand Master closed the lodge

buildings, and our Most Worthy Grand Matron reinforced the need to follow the Federal, Local and Grand Lodge guidelines for our jurisdictions. Therefore, effective March 16, 2020, our chapters closed. No in-person meetings were held, and we waited....monitoring the Center for Disease Control (CDC), federal & state government, Grand Lodge and Most Worthy Grand Matron's directives.

The leadership of Delaware Grand Chapter, from this point forward referred to as "The Leadership Team", was comprised of the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Grand Line Officers, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Trustees, Jurisprudence Committee, and our Session Chair - Sister Ann Street, RN MBA CNOR, who also served as our medical advisor began Zoom meetings to discuss the status of our Grand Chapter Session. Extensive plans were put into place for a postponed "Delaware Members Only" one-day session to be held August 29, 2020. Money was refunded to those who had registered for the May session itself, as well as the meals. As time passed, we realized that the August Session was not going to be possibility either. The Leadership team then made the extremely difficult decision to have the Grand Chapter Officers, Committee Members and Subordinate Chapter Officers remain in place until the next scheduled change of office in April and May 2021.

As documented in the previous paragraph and through the numerous letters under seal (included in this report), we had to adjust our actions significantly to work through the pandemic. In August 2020 I received an email from the Most Worthy Grand Matron (MWGM) indicating that chapters would be able to conduct their business using virtual means, such as a tool called "Zoom". Very specific guidelines were also provided by the MWGM to accomplish the meetings and she clearly and emphatically stated that: No ritualistic work was to be performed during the virtual meetings, to do so would be illegal. Additionally, the following were not permitted to be conducted virtually: reading of petitions, reports of investigating committees, balloting or initiations. Quorum was still required to conduct a legal business meeting. The guidelines were disseminated and in September 2020, as our internet and human

capabilities ramped up, chapters began to move forward to meet and conduct their business.

Each chapter required an internet "host" to schedule the meetings, admit and assist members with the process and the Worthy Matrons conducted the meetings. I would like to thank Sisters Ann Street, PGM; Barbara Lott, PGM and Rosemarie Vanderhoogt, PM #16 for serving as hosts. The chapters were hosted as follows:

Ann Street: Adah #5:

Rosey Vanderhoogt: Sussex #7 & Unity #16:

Barbara Lott: Georgetown #9

Donna Hiddemen: Caesar Rodney #8, Frankford #12,

Victory #15, Ruth #19 & Naomi #20

As the state slowly began to open up, lodges opened and the vaccinations became a reality, the chapters were given the opportunity to decide whether they would meet in person or continue handling business via Zoom. Worthy Matrons were permitted to poll their members in advance of each meeting to see if there was enough interest to meet in person and if a quorum would be met. If not, then a Zoom meeting must be held. Over the course of the term, all chapters continued meeting virtually and continue to do so at this writing.

In the end of January 2021, it was determined that our April subordinate chapter installations would be held virtually. We were fortunate that all chapter elections had been completed before we were forced to cease meetings at the end of March 2020. The MWGM distributed guidelines for virtual installations and I created a template to be followed logistically for Delaware. The template was distributed to incoming Worthy Matrons, Installing Officers, the Grand Lecturer and Deputy Grand Lecturers. The Worthy Grand Patron, Associate Grand Matron, Associate Grand Patron and the Jurisprudence Committee were copied.

Also, in January 2021, the leadership team met to discuss the status of our annual session for May 2021. Various factors were considered, such as the status of the state and that the location was still undetermined due to the inability to secure public facilities that had also been thrown into flux due to the pandemic.

Another important factor that had to be considered was that the vaccination process was taking longer than anticipated. Given these facts, among others, it was decided that the session would be restricted to a one-day, in-person meeting to cover only required business, which is the Jurisprudence Committee Report with legislation to be addressed, budget review & vote, Election of Officers, and Installation of Officers. The business of the day would flow as outlined in the call and a box lunch would be offered. The Nur Shrine was willing to rent the facilities to us and proper social distancing guidelines could be followed.

A backup plan was also created in the event things turned for the worse and an in-person meeting could not be achieved. The one-day session would take place, only it would be virtual. In anticipation of the potential for a required virtual meeting, it was decided that nominations would be an advance process requiring letters of intent to be submitted to the Nomination Committee by either U.S. Postal mail or email by a specified date. Brother Tom Morganstern WGP, appointed the committee, informed the membership, and managed the process.

This information was intended to be a summary of the process during the past year and some things may have been omitted here. However, much is covered in the letters under seal and additional information can be garnered there.

Installations

I hosted the Zoom installations for the following chapters: Caesar Rodney, Victory, Ruth and Naomi. I was honored to serve as Installing Officer for Ruth Chapter #19 and Installing Marshal for Caesar Rodney Chapter #8. I attended all installations except Georgetown #9, since it occurred at the same time as Caesar Rodney.

As I call them eMeetings. This email is under seal. The guidelines from the MWGM and the additional guidelines specific to Delaware must be strictly adhered to. If you have any questions, please contact me so we can be sure that all are in sync.

Additionally, if you need a Zoom "host", the Grand Secretary or I will be happy to do that for you. Please be aware that Zoom meeting attendees may call in by phone, they do not need to own a computer or have computer knowledge to participate in the meeting.

As stated above, there are additional guidelines specific to Delaware that need to be followed. The guidelines outlined below apply only for the duration of eMeetings as permitted by the MWGM and as needed by our jurisdiction. The additional Delaware guidelines are as follows:

Quorum as specified by the MWGM is appropriate for electronic meetings. Clarifying for Delaware: According to the Rules and Regulations for the Subordinate Chapters of Grand Chapter of Delaware Article II, Section 3 C - Offices to be filled to meet quorum are specific. However, due to the fact that we are not physically in a meeting room, the Conductress, Chaplain, Warder & Sentinel are not required for quorum at an electronic meeting. The Secretary should be present, however, a substitute may be necessary.

Rules and Regulations for the Subordinate Chapters of Grand Chapter of Delaware Article II, Section 4 B, C & D are not required.

Rules and Regulations for the Subordinate Chapters of Grand Chapter of Delaware Article II, Section 4 E is not applicable since there is no ritualistic work being done.

In addition to the business items prohibited by the MWGM, there will also be no reading of Resolutions of Respect and since there

is no physical presence, all members who pass during this time will be honored with the draping of the Charter or Altar, as appropriate, when we resume in-person meetings. PLEASE NOTE: Knowledge of deaths should be shared for awareness and so proper sympathies may be extended to family. Resolutions should be prepared and sent after funeral or memorial services are held, but should not be read until the physical draping occurs in chapter.

I appreciate your cooperation and your eagerness to return to business. I know we are all missing our sisters and brothers and seeing everyone's smiling faces. Hopefully, meeting in this manner will help chapters complete necessary business and help them to work through alternate methods of fundraising to meet the needs of the ongoing chapter expenses.

Guidelines - Video Conferencing to Conduct Essential Chapter Business

The guidelines below are for the purpose of conducting a simple business meeting in order to complete Chapter business that must be addressed for the good of the Chapter, in particular to meet financial obligations, using Zoom or other video conferencing methods. These instructions do not apply to and are not to be used for in-person Chapter meetings.

Using Zoom or other video conferencing to conduct essential Chapter business:

- Establish that a quorum is present on the call for the transaction of business. Seven members of the Chapter, including one of the first four Officers, constitutes a quorum, unless the Bylaws of the Chapter states a larger number.
- Record the names of the members present on the call that constitute the quorum, as well as other members in attendance on the call.
- > Confirm minutes of the meeting are being taken.
- Do not open the meeting ritualistically. The Officer in charge (WM or pro tem) will call the meeting to order, i.e., "I hereby call this virtual meeting of ______ Chapter to order."
- Request the reading of the minutes of the last stated and special meeting, if any.
- Ask for corrections, if any.
- Ask for approval of the minutes.
- Request the reading of communications.
- Ask for Unfinished Business (see paragraph below).
- Ask for New Business (see paragraph below).
- Request Treasurer's report.
- Request reading of the bills.
- Conduct discussion, as necessary, and ask for verbal approval to pay the bills.
- Record the verbal "yes" or "no" by the individual's name when asking for approval to pay bills and/or spend the Chapter's money.
- Ask for any sickness and distress.
- Close the meeting. Do not close the meeting ritualistically. The Officer in charge will say, "There being no further business to be conducted virtually, I hereby declare this virtual meeting of _____Chapter closed."

There will be no petitions read, no reports of investigating committees, no balloting and no initiations taking place during virtual business meetings of a Chapter. These portions of our closed meetings are not authorized to be conducted using Zoom or other video conferencing methods because to do so is illegal.

If your Unfinished Business and/or New Business involves petitions, investigating committee reports, balloting or initiation, it will be necessary to postpone this business until it is safe for your Chapter to meet in person.

Please adhere to all government and local authority health and safety guidelines specific to your area regarding Covid for your protection and the well-being of your members.

A very special thank you to the leadership team, especially the Jurisprudence Committee for their guidance and support in making these difficult decisions.

As we re-open, I called for your continued caution by encouraging your chapters to pursue activities and fundraisers that do not require in-person participation. Please also be considerate and supportive of your sister chapters by sharing ideas for new and progressive activities and fundraisers to meet our changing needs during this time.

Please feel free to reach out to me if you have any questions or if further assistance is needed.

COVID-19 Restrictions

Most Worthy Grand Matron Guidelines and Supplementary Guidelines for Chapter Meetings under the Grand Chapter of Delaware Beginning November 1, 2020

The guidelines outlined below represent a compilation of those provided by the Most Worthy Grand Matron (MWGM) (May 2020) and those designated by Delaware's Worthy Grand Matron and Jurisprudence Committee.

The following guidelines are not permanent. They shall be in effect until local and/or national health officials and governments lift the CDC restrictions relating to the coronavirus pandemic. Additionally, it would be desirable that members would express their confidence and comfort regarding their health and safety to attend a meeting before the decision is made to hold in-person meetings.

- It is strongly recommended each member wash their hands immediately
 after coming into the building to help stop the potential spread of the
 virus
- It is required that members wear face masks, maintain social distancing and utilize proper hand sanitizing/washing.
- · Members are not to shake hands, give hugs or kiss.
- Members who are feeling ill must not attend meetings.
- Members who feel uncomfortable or have concerns for their health and wellbeing should not attend meetings.
- Members who have traveled outside of the state <u>Deyond</u> the surrounding states of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland or Virginia, should not attend in-person meetings for 14 days after returning to Delaware.
- Those who are in the high-risk group should not attend meetings until it is considered safe by health experts to do so. Those at high-risk for severe illness from COVID-19 are: people aged 65 years and older; people who live in a nursing home or long-term care facility; people of all ages with underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled including chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma; serious heart conditions; diabetes; chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis; liver disease; and people who are immunocompromised which includes cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications (source: cdc.gov/coronavirus).
- Members are required to have their temperature taken by an individual designated by the Worthy Matron with a non-contact thermometer upon arrival at the meeting place. This data is to be recorded on the COVID-19 Release Form.

- Members will be required to sign and date the aforementioned COVID-19
 Release Form in order to attend the meeting. The chapter secretaries
 are required to maintain copies of the forms as part of chapter records.
 For those chapters meeting in Delaware lodges, said completed forms
 must be provided to the lodge for their records and secretaries may
 keep photos of the forms for their records.
- Hand sanitizer should be available at the check in station and other points within the chapter room.
- It is strongly recommended that only members of the chapter attend the chapter's meeting, unless substituting for the chapter having the meeting.
 This recommendation includes chapter birthday meetings.
- Chapters are not to have refreshments.
- Worthy Matrons will coordinate with the lodge or facility representative to secure sanitization requirements and see that the required cleaning is completed after each meeting by a team of two designated individuals and any logs completed.
- Nitrile gloves may be worn by officers required to touch chapter paraphemalia, such as the Bible and drapes.

Chapter Room Setup. The following are required for Chapter Room setup:

- · Altar in the center of the Chapter Room
- Bible on the Altar
- Pedestals at the Star Point stations with emblems Delaware Note: Photos may be used in place of the actual emblems for ease of cleaning.
- Signet Delaware Note: Photos may be used in place of the signet for ease of cleaning.
- American Flag Delaware Note: The lodge or facility American flags should be used if they
 are already in the room, please do not pull the chapter's American flag out if one is already
 present.

Please assign one or two people to set up the Chapter Room. If possible, it would be helpful to have the room set up in advance. The Flag should be placed in the East when setting up the Chapter to eliminate the exchange between Officers to post it.

Opening Chapter. During this time of unusual circumstances, it shall be acceptable for the Officers to enter the Chapter Room informally and take their stations. In a small Chapter Room, it may be necessary for the Officers to be seated on the sidelines six feet apart, with the exception of the WM and those Officers whose stations are typically six feet from other members in the Chapter. **Delaware Note**: Please ensure the six-foot distance is maintained. In small chapter rooms, this may mean being creative with your stations, for example Chaptain & Marshal on the sidelines, Adah & Electa at usual

spots, Ruth & Martha on the sidelines and Esther at usual spot. Use common sense to secure distancing, that takes precedence over the chapter room layout.

Singing. Masks must be worn while singing.

Seating in the East. The WM and WP chairs shall be six feet apart. In a small Chapter Room, it may be necessary for only the WM to be in the East and the WP to be seated at her left on the sidelines six feet from others.

Seating in the West. The AM and AP chairs shall be six feet apart. In a small Chapter Room, it may be necessary for only the AM to be in the West and the AP to be seated at her left on the sidelines six feet from others.

Chapter Officers. The Chaptain and the Treasurer shall be seated six feet apart. The Marshal shall be seated six feet from the Secretary. The Warder shall be seated six feet from the West, next to the door and not next to the AM or AP. In a small Chapter Room, it may be necessary for these Officers to sit on the sidelines six feet apart, except the Warder who shall be seated by the door six feet from others. **Delaware Note**: The Organist shall be six feet apart from any other officer.

Speaking parts of Officers. If it is necessary for the Officers to be seated in their stations on the sidelines to maintain social distancing, they may stand and give their speaking parts from the sidelines. **Delaware Note**: All members must keep their masks on throughout the meeting. Both the Worthy Matron (while conducting the meeting) and Secretary (while reading the minutes) may remove their masks ONLY if no microphone is available. If using a microphone, these officers should remain masked to prevent the microphone from being contaminated.

Balloting. It is recommended the ballot box be placed on the Altar for balloting. Please ensure members use a hand sanitizer before approaching the Altar to cast their ballot. If the ballot box is passed to each member, please ensure each member uses a hand sanitizer before casting their ballot. During these uncommon times, the AC should present the ballot box by extending it toward the voting member as far as comfortably possible to maintain social distancing. Those handling the balloting box and those casting their ballot should protect the safety of all members by using hand sanitizer.

Delaware Note: To avoid delays and to ensure that all members follow the guideline, the Associate Conductress should carry a small hand sanitizer and squirt each member's hands prior to their voting.

Initiation. The ceremony of Initiation is essential to our Order, followed by being kind and loving to each other, and making our presence known in our communities by our charitable giving. The ceremony of Initiation is a portion of our Ritual where it is not possible to practice physical distancing. It is critical that every possible effort be made to protect the health and safety of our members and the candidate(s). All people involved shall wear face masks, observe proper hand cleanliness and observe all other common-sense precautions to safeguard the heath of all. Members shall not become lax in observing social distancing when and where it is possible during the ceremony of Initiation. The Chapter must Inform the candidate(s) that their initiation is a ceremony where physical distancing is not possible. It is necessary, as well as right and proper, to explain this to them so they can be given the option of not being initiated at this time. It is recommended the candidate be directly asked if they feel comfortable being initiated knowing social distancing is not possible. Remember, they should be reassured that they are still to be initiated and will be welcomed when they feel comfortable or as soon as possible after restrictions are lifted, whichever comes first. Delaware Note: By special dispensation, chapters may perform an initiation together during the COVID-19 Restrictions. The charter for each chapter must be present and each chapter must have a quorum.

Escorting and Introductions. It is not possible to have extensive introductions and escorting and observe proper social distancing. These activities are not an essential activity of our Order because our existence does not depend on introductions and escorting. Reducing the ways people come in close contact with each other should be the goal for Chapter meetings at this time. Escorting does not meet this criteria. It is acceptable to introduce members from their places in the Chapter Room. It is acceptable to give Grand Honors to those entitled to receive them when they are introduced from their seats in the Chapter Room. At this time, it is not recommended to escort members for introduction.

<u>Coin March</u>: If your chapter regularly has a coin march, please place a disposable cup or bowl on the secretary's desk and members may place funds in there either before or after the meeting for the secretary to count and record. Once the funds are recorded, they may be placed in a plastic baggie for delivery to the bank and the plate/bowl can be disposed of.

Additional Requirements for Delaware:

 To avoid setting up the meeting room and then find that quorum won't be reached, the Worthy Matron should call the officers and members (who regularly attend meetings) in advance and confirm that enough members plan to attend to reach quorum for the upcoming meeting.

- In the event that a quorum will not be reached for an in-person meeting, then
 preparations need to be made to conduct a Zoom meeting. Chapter meetings
 must be held either in-person or Zoom.
- If a Zoom meeting is necessary and the Worthy Matron is unable to preside via Zoom video, the host will begin the meeting and the Worthy Matron will attend and preside via phone. The Associate Matron will assist and, along with the Secretary, will be her eyes for voting results.
- In the event that quorum will not be reached for either meeting form, the Worthy Matron will inform the Worthy Grand Matron.

DIRECTIVE No. 20-21-1 (Update For Masonic Activities Effective October 29, 2020)

Brethren: As we are all too aware, this Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation continues, and our state continues phased-in reopening procedures, Governor Camey continues to extend his Phase II requirements for the "Reopening Delaware". Please keep in mind, and I again remind you, that these reopening procedures and allowances are not a "Carte Blanche" allowance to just continue our masonic meetings and masonic activities as we have in the past, and we must always keep the health and welfare of our members, their families, and our communities at large as our primary responsibility.

As we have now embarked on a new masonic year and we are entering our usual heavy schedule with Grand Master Visitations, I want to take a few moments to remind everyone that we are still following Governor Carney's Phase II restrictions and that the State of Delaware has <u>formally</u> considered us as falling under the <u>Food & Drink Restrictions</u> (in addition to the General Restrictions).

The following are highlights of the Phase II restrictions, and other restrictions that I have placed on all of our lodges:

- The 60% of the Fire Code Occupancy maximum allowable capacity must be followed.
 Ensure that allowable seating is identified for social distancing.
- · Social Distancing must be maintained and managed.
- Face Masks shall be worn at all times (except while eating); including while "Social Distancine".
- There can be no self-serve food service. All food must be served by dedicated servers as
 per the Phase II Directives and restrictions of the Governor's Office. No person, other
 than the server, shall touch any serving spoons, and serving staff members should be
 dedicated to a particular serving spoon(s). Social Distancing in any buffet line must be
 maintained (lodge responsibility).
- If you are moving your venue to a place other that your lodge hall, it is the responsibility
 of the lodge to ensure that the chosen venue is following the proper protocol and is
 adhering to the Governor's Directives & Restrictions.
- For any lodge meeting/lodge social activity, etc., it is highly recommended (from a Liability perspective), that the following steps be taken:
 - Assign someone the responsibility of making documented temperature checks on all members and guests as they enter the lodge/lodge building/or alternate venue of your function.
 - Require all members and guests entering the lodge/lodge building/or alternate venue, to answer a COVID-19 questionnaire and sign (see attached example).

- Require all members and guests entering the lodge/lodge building/or alternate venue to sign a COVID-19 Liability Waiver (to be maintained by the lodge). See attached example.
- Degree work can proceed as long as all guidelines/directives are followed. There are several steps that some lodge's have taken to ensure a safer degree conferral. Contact the Office of the Grand Secretary for suggested steps to be taken in a degree conferral.

As we enter into our new masonic year, we must remember that we have an obligation to ensure that our members, our guests, and our members' families remain as safe as we can possibly allow. To that end, and because we have a liability for their safety, I am directing that the following additional procedure continue as directed by Past Grand Master Evan R. Moody in his Directive No. 4:

All sanitization steps, as directed by the CDC, the Governor's Directives, and any Edicts
or Directives issued by the Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of Delaware, shall continue.
These sanitization steps shall be documented in a log book or spread sheet, that clearly
shows what was sanitized, who sanitized it, and the date and time of sanitization. This
documentation shall be maintained throughout this pandemic situation.

I realize that we are taking a lot of extra effort, but we must continue to be aware of our responsibility to do everything we can to ensure the safety of our members, our guests, and our families. This is a pretty heavy liability and we must be able to demonstrate that we are doing everything we can to follow all of the directives of our federal, state, and local leaders, and the Edicts and Directives of this Grand Lodge.

Again, as our lodges and our other Appendant & Concordant Bodies begin to open limited masonic activities, there are several options to consider, and each lodge and/or Appendant/Concordant Body must weigh all options and decide what is best for them. The opening of "Limited Masonic Activities" will remain in effect until further directed. As our lodges or Appendant/Concordant Bodies choose to open masonic activities, all of the Governor's Phase II restrictions for the Reopening of Delaware must be strictly followed, and all masonic related activities must adhere to these same restrictions. Please keep in mind that our Worshipfal Masters and the various leaders of our Appendant & Concordant Bodies have the last say when contemplating the opening of "Limited Masonic Activities"; if you do not feel safe in holding a limited masonic activity and you feel that you need to cancel, our leadership has every right and obligation to do just that. Note: All Brethren and Membership (and the Grand Secretary's Office) must be notified with Due and Timely Notification.

If and when we enter into Phase III or any other Phase during this Coronavirus pandemic, our situation in relation to masonic activities here in Delaware will be re-evaluated, and our lodges, Appendant, and Concordant Bodies notified accordingly.

Again, please be reminded that this is a time for us to pay particular attention to our brethren who may be in need and who may require assistance. If you are worried about a fellow member or his family, please keep in contact with them via telephone, text, or email. Let us remember Directive No. 20-21-1 October 29, 2020 Page Three

our masonic obligations to relieve the distressed, and to aid with the health and welfare of our fellow brothers. Please keep an eye on each other and be ready to exercise our masonic benevolence where and when we are able.

In Conclusion, I hereby Order that this Directive is to be distributed to all of our members as expeditiously as possible, including the membership of our Appendant & Concordant Bodies. Additionally, this Directive shall be entered in full upon the Minutes of the Lodge, Appendant or Concordant Body thereof, during the next allowable Stated Communication of the Lodge, Appendant or Concordant Body.

DIRECTIVE No. 20-21-3 (Update For Masonic Activities Effective December 14, 2020)

Brethren: This Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic appears to be getting worse, and it is sometimes very difficult to keep up with the every-changing restrictions, recommendations and procedures that we are all to follow. On Thursday, December 3, 2020, Governor Carney announced an additional advisory as shown below, that will again affect our already limited Masonic Activities and our personal lives. In short, the following are the new restrictions announced by Governor Carey, that are effective on December 14, 2020 and will continue thru January 11, 2021:

"WILMINGTON, Del. – Governor John Carney and the Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH) on Thursday announced a new Stay-at-Home advisory, strongly advising all Delawareans to avoid gathering indoors with anyone outside your household from December 14 through January 11 to interrupt the dangerous winter surge of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations in Delaware. The advisory does not apply to Delawareans in workplaces, and traveling to and from their places of work.

In addition to the Stay-at-Home advisory, Governor Carney and DPH will institute a universal mask mandate statewide, requiring Delawareans to wear a cloth face covering anytime they are indoors with anyone outside their immediate household. Delaware has had a public mask mandate <u>since April 28</u>, requiring Delawareans and visitors to wear a cloth face covering in public settings where social distancing is not possible. Any child 2-years-old or younger MUST NOT wear a face covering, due to the risk of suffocation."

In keeping with Governor Carney's announced new advisory, and with our members, our members families, and our community's safety foremost in our actions, our fraternity here in Delaware will adopt this added advisory during this same period.

All Delaware Masons shall abide by the Stay-at-Home Advisory as related to any
masonic related indoor function or gathering. This includes all meetings, social
functions, and any masonic function that is planned for indoors; no meetings during this
time period.

- Any outdoor masonic gathering or function shall follow all current restrictions and guidelines as established by the Governor.
- Masonic Funeral Services may be attempted as long as the Governor's guidelines and

- Worshipful Masters will continue to have authority to approve routine bills for payment to keep things moving forward during any Stated Communication cancellations.
- This shut down Directive for all indoor masonic gatherings/functions will remain in
 effect from December 14, 2020 until January 11, 2021 unless otherwise notified. If
 there are any updates/changes to the Governor's directives that will affect our masonic
 activities, you will be notified accordingly.

DIRECTIVE No. 20-21-4 (Update For Masonic Activities Effective January 12, 2020)

Brethren: Unfortunately, this Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic continues to be problematic in 2021 and has caused all of us to after the way we do things with our families, our businesses, and our many masonic activities. As you are all too aware, Governor Carney has issued new expanded restrictions for the State of Delaware, that were in effect from December 14, 2020 through January 11, 2021, and caused us to shut down masonry in Delaware during that time period. As of this writing, and as best we can tell, the Governor's restrictions will revert back to what they were prior to December 14, 2020 (November 23, 2020 restrictions). The following is basically a recap of the restrictions that will resume on January 12, 2021:

Gatherings capped at 10 people; restaurant dining indoors limited to 30 percent of fire capacity

WILMINGTON, Det. — Governor John Carney on Tuesday amounced additional restrictions statewide to slow community spread of COVID-19 as Deliaware and the country experience surge of cases, hospitalizations and deaths heading into the winter months. The restrictions will be formally issued in a revision to the Governor's omnibus emergency order later this week. Governor Carney's order will include the following restrictions, which take effect at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, November 23:

Indoor gatherings in homes must be capped at no more than 10 people.

***Indoor gatherings outside of homes must be limited to 30 percent of the venue's stated fire capacity, up to a cap of 50 people. This includes all events, such as weddings, funerals, services in houses of worship, performances, political gatherings, and events in public spaces including fire halls.

Outdoor public gatherings are limited to 50 people. Up to 250 may be allowed with a plan approved by the Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH).

Restourants must operate at no more than 30 percent of fire capacity indoors, with allowances for additional outdoor seating.

Governor Carney's order will also prohibit Delaware youth sports organizations, teams and venues from hosting or participating in tournaments with out-of-state teams, effective at 8:00

Attached is the MW Grand Master's Directive No. 20-21-4 that will go into effect on Tuesday, January 12, 2021. As you can well imagine, it is very difficult trying to keep up with the ever-changing restrictions with this whole COVID-19 problem.

At this time, it appears that the Governor will return to his previous restrictions from November 23, 2020, and that if you are comfortable opening back up with Limited Masonic Activities once again, you may do so. However; please remember that the Governor continues his "Stay-at-Home" Advisory, and if any of our leaders do not feel safe in reopening "Limited Masonic Activities", Grand Master Haass has given you full authority to cancel or reschedule as you find necessary; this includes Stated Communications, Special Communications, and any special lodge activities.

Please remember . . . If Governor Carney issues any additional restrictions or relaxes any restrictions as we move forward, you will be notified as soon as possible. Believe me when I say that I understand your frustration with this ever-changing and moving target, but we will do our best to get information out to you as soon as we can confirm the Governor's announcements and restrictions.

In keeping with Governor Carney's announced restrictions, our fratemity here in Delaware will follow these same restrictions until further notified, and are strongly reminded of the following:

- The 30% of the Fire Code Occupancy maximum allowable capacity must be followed.
 Ensure that allowable senting is identified for social distancing.
- Social Distancing must be maintained and managed.
- Face Masks shall be worn at all times (except while eating); including while "Social Distancing".
- There can be no self-serve food service. All food must be served by dedicated servers as
 per the Phase II Directives and restrictions of the Governor's Office. No person, other
 than the server, shall touch any serving spoons, and serving staff members should be
 dedicated to a particular serving spoon(s). Social Distancing in any buffet line must be
 maintained (lodge responsibility).
- If you are moving your venue to a place other that your lodge hall, it is the responsibility
 of the lodge to ensure that the chosen venue is following the proper protocol and is
 adhering to the Governor's Directives & Restrictions.
- For any lodge meeting/lodge social activity, etc., it is highly recommended (from a Liability perspective), that the following steps be taken:
 - Assign someone the responsibility of making documented temperature checks on all members and guests as they enter the lodge/lodge building/or alternate venue of your function.
 - Require all members and guests entering the lodge/lodge building/or alternate venue, to answer a COVID-19 questionnaire and sign.
 - Require all members and guests entering the lodge/lodge building/or alternate venue to sign a COVID-19 Liability Waiver (to be maintained by the lodge).
- Degree work can proceed as long as all guidelines/directives are <u>strictly</u> followed. There
 are several steps that some lodges have taken to ensure a safer degree conferral. Contact
 the Office of the Grand Secretary for suggested steps to be taken in a degree conferral.
- ALL VULNERABLE INDIVIDUALS should continue to avoid gatherings; and as you
 are aware, a large number of our membership falls into this category.

All sanitization steps, as directed by the CDC, the Governor's Directives, and any Edicts or Directives issued by the Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of Delaware, shall continue. These sanitization steps shall be documented in a log book or spread sheet, that clearly shows what was sanitized, who sanitized it, and the date and time of sanitization. This documentation shall be

maintained throughout this pandemic situation. All surfaces that are typically touched must be sanitized (ie: door knobs, chair arms, desks, gavels, columns, surfaces of doors where people may normally push on the door, tables, chairs, rest rooms, etc). Signs must be posted on how to stop the spread of COVID-19.

SPECIAL NOTE: Governor Carney's "Stay-at-Home" Advisory is still in effect, and you are again reminded that our Worshipful Masters and the various leaders of our Appendant & Concordant Bodies have the last say when deciding on any "Limited Masonic Activities", including Stated Communications; if you do not feel safe in holding a limited masonic activity due to this COVID-19 situation, and you feel that you need to cancel/postpone, our leadership has every right and obligation to do just that. Note: All Brethren and Membership (and the Grand Secretary's Office) must be notified with Due and Timely Notification.

Whatever path the lodge or any other masonic body chooses to follow, please be mindfal of your members who are in the "Vulnerable Individuals" category, and remember that we should be mindful of the safety of our members and their families, as our first concern.

<u>Private Functions</u> booked/scheduled to be held in any Masonic Hall are to be handled by the individual Hall Company. - All Delaware Masonic Bodies in this Jurisdiction shall remove his name from their membership rolls.
- All Masonic rights, privileges, and titles of Mr. John Charles Rayias are hereby revoked, and he is to refrain from masonic intercourse with any of its members.
- 4. Mr. John Charles Rayias is not to attend any function of any masonic, appendant body, concordant body, or collateral body.
- 5. Mr. John Charles Rayias shall have fourteen (14) days from the date of receipt of this Edict, to return all records which may have been placed in his care, to the various Masonic organizations which he may serve (or has served).
- 6. The Grand Secretary shall send a copy of this Edict No. 3 to Mr. John Charles Rayias, and to the area Grand Jurisdictions in amity with the Grand Lodge of Delaware.
- 7. No mason shall have masonic intercourse with Mr. John Charles Raylas, for any reason whatsoever.

In Conclusion, I Order and Direct That This Edict shall be entered in full upon the Minutes of each Lodge during the next allowable Stated Communication of the Lodge.

Dear Sussex Chapter Members,

On your January 21st Zoom meeting, Sister Vickie Nicklas read a letter to the chapter in which she stated that due to her current health condition, she would not be able to fulfill the office of secretary as elected in March of last year. Vickie then addressed me and asked if there was anything that could be done to re-elect. Additionally, Dawn Hoesten, your Associate Conductress-elect, then stated that she would be willing to accept the office of Conductress if another election was held because she had since passed her Conductress test. It should be noted here that no Conductress was elected last March. I indicated that at the very

least a special dispensation would be needed to conduct a special election for the purpose of electing a Secretary and Conductress.

However, I would do some research and speak with Jurisprudence to be sure I was not giving incorrect information.

I have completed my research and confirmed my findings with the Jurisprudence committee. According to Pg. 57 of the Rules and Regulations for Subordinate Chapters of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Article X, Section 5 (A): "If an elective officer refuses to be installed, the Worthy Grand Matron may grant a special dispensation to hold an election to fill the office." Additionally, according to the Book of Instruction, Page 78, Section 11 B (12-k): A special election to fill a vacancy requires a special dispensation and a notification to members, ten days before the election.

I have since been informed that due to the current circumstances your Associate Matron-elect may be willing to fill a different position if needed, as well.

This being the case, a dispensation should be requested to hold a special election for the purpose of electing the offices of Associate Matron, Secretary, Conductress and Associate Conductress. The request for special dispensation should include the usual \$10.00 fee.

In this time of virtual business meetings, we still adhere to the guidelines set forth in the Book of Instruction, Pages 77 & 78, Section 11 PROCEDURE FOR ELECTION OF SUBORDINATE CHAPTER OFFICERS Item B. Including those noted below, some slightly modified due to meeting virtually:

- (3) Any individual wishing to be elected to a specific office will submit written notification, including their name and the office desired, to the Chapter Secretary via US Mail, hand delivery or email in advance of the election meeting. (Slightly modified due to meeting virtually).
- (5) Officers may only hold the office of Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron or Associate Patron in one of the Plural chapters to which they belong.

Dear Naomi Chapter Members,

On February 3rd I received an email from your Worthy Matron indicating that Naomi Chapter had received a letter from your Worthy Matron-Elect, Sister Euretta L. Schultheiss, PGM, stating she will not be filling her position as Worthy Matron for the 2021 - 2022 term. Sister Linda stated she would be willing to assume the position of Worthy Matron and be elected, but was unsure on how to proceed.

According to Pg. 57 of the Rules and Regulations for Subordinate

Chapters of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, Article X, Section 5 (A): "If an elective officer refuses to be installed, the Worthy Grand Matron may grant a special dispensation to hold an election to fill the office."

Additionally, according to the Book of Instruction, Page 78, Section 11 B (12-k): A special election to fill a vacancy requires a special dispensation and a notification to members, ten days before the election.

I have since been informed that due to the current circumstances your Worthy Patron-Elect is also unable to serve.

This being the case, a dispensation should be requested to hold a special election for the purpose of electing the offices of Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron. The request for special dispensation should include the usual \$10.00 fee.

In this time of virtual business meetings, we still adhere to the guidelines set forth in the Book of Instruction, Pages 77 & 78, Section 11 PROCEDURE FOR ELECTION OF SUBORDINATE CHAPTER OFFICERS Item B. Including those noted below, some slightly modified due to meeting virtually:

- (3) Any individual wishing to be elected to a specific office will submit written notification, including their name and the office desired, to the Chapter Secretary via US Mail, hand delivery or email in advance of the election meeting. (Slightly modified due to meeting virtually).
- (5) Officers may only hold the office of Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron or Associate Patron in one of the Plural chapters to which they belong.
- (12-d) For uncontested offices, the Worthy Patron will say, "there being only one name presented or nominated, and if there are no objections, the Secretary will cast a unanimous vote of this chapter", except for the Secretary, which will be done by the Treasurer.
- (12-e) For contested offices, the Worthy Patron will say, "you will use your polling option on the screen for the office of [name of contested office]. [Pause long enough for all to complete their poll]. Any member participating via phone will be contacted by the meeting host for their vote. The Worthy

Guidelines for Virtual Installations for Subordinate Chapters in Delaware Created: 3/5/2021 Updated: 3/15/2021 Author: Donna Hiddemen, WGM

These instructions are based on the guidelines provided by the Mosf Worthy Grand Matron. The amended installation procedures are to be used any for the April, 2021 Installations due to the COVID-19 pandemic crisis.

Reconfirming that meetings to conduct regular chapter business using the Zoom tool are **not** to utilize any ritualistic work contained in the opening or closing of chapter. To do so would be illegal.

General Information

Installations are to be performed on the date of your first meeting in April and will follow your Zoom business meeting. Therefore, your business meeting will begin at your stated meeting time and once completed, the open installation will take place.

No one can be installed who is more than one year in arrears for Chapter dues.

The Chapter Secretary shall prepare the "Certificate of Newly Installed Officers" and make sure that it is in the hands of the Primary Installing Officer in advance of the meeting date. No officer signatures will be on the form at this time. The names of any officers not able to be installed via Zoom will be marked with an asterisk. The asterisk will be defined at the bottom of the form as "To be installed at a later date". In the event it is determined that a member is not able to be installed on the Zoom call after the form is in the hands of the Primary Installing Officer, she shall add an asterisk by the member's name and initial next to the asterisk to indicate her personal confirmation. Upon completion of the installation, the installing officer will sign the "Certificate of Newly Installed Officers" and return it to the Chapter Secretary to be sealed. The Secretary will then send the necessary copies to the required recipients.

Grand Honors may be given as they are not considered part of the Secret Work.

Procedure Open Installation on Zoom

After the close of the business meeting. The Worthy Matron turns control over to the Installing Officer, who in turn may give a short greeting followed by the introduction of the assisting installing officers, if any.

The Installing Officer (I.O.) calls the Installation Ceremony to Order with one rap of the Gavel.

I.O.: "You will join with me in repeating the Lord's Prayer."

The installation then proceeds with the speaking parts utilized in the ritual beginning with:

I.O.: "Sisters and Brothers, the selection....."

The verbiage for the portion of each officer's installation that refers to the *investing* of the badge should be omitted, as no badges are being presented at this time. However, the portion that refers to the *meaning* of the badge shall be spoken.

Similar to the above, the verbiage for the portion of installation that refers to the presentation of the Secret Work, Charter and Constitution and By-laws should be modified to state that these items will be presented at the first in-person meeting, as these things are not being exchanged at this point in time. In reality, the Associate Matron should diready possess a copy of the Constitution and By-laws and the Associate Patron, should already possess a copy of the Secret Work. These items must be presented at the first in-person meeting and recorded as being done by the secretary in the minutes.

NOTE: It has been confirmed by the Most Worthy Greed Metron that it is acceptable due to the COVID neutricians that the cherter is not present for the virtual installation.

After the proclamation has been completed, the installing Officer turns control of the meeting over to the newly installed Worthy Matron.

The Worthy Matron may make announcements, including committee appointments and closing

Worthy Matron shall then close the meeting by saying: "I now declare the installation of chapter name closed."

Change Article IX (New Article X) Section 3 and Section 4 by deleting the word "another" and replacing it with the word "a". The two sections would then read:

Section 3. Any Past Matron serving a term in this Chapter as Worthy Matron will be compensated the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) in lieu of a Jewel for service rendered.

Section 4. Any Past Patron serving a term in this Chapter as Worthy Patron will be compensated the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) in lieu of a Jewel for service rendered. Amend current ARTICLE VIII Committee on Relief (New ARTICLE IX Committees) Section 1 by replacing in line 5 "twenty-five (25)" with "one hundred (100)". Section 1 would then read:

Section 1. The Worthy Matron shall appoint three members of the Chapter as a Committee on Relief whose duty shall be to investigate all applications for relief made to the Chapter and report the circumstances of the case at the first meeting after receiving notice of the application. If the case is one of pressing necessity, the Worthy Matron may on the report of the committee draw an order upon the Treasurer for an amount not exceeding one hundred (100) dollars and the order so drawn shall be sufficient voucher to the Treasurer to pay the same.

11. Add new Section 2 to Article IX that reads

Section 2. The Worthy Matron in addition to appointing a Committee on Relief shall appoint members to the committees listed below. She may also appoint any other committee that she feels is necessary for the Chapter's year.

- 12. Delete current Section 2A of current Article VIII in its entirety.

Rationale: The Gift Committee has not existed or functioned for years.

 ARTICLE IX (new ARTICLE X), Section 2A add the following sentence to follow the first sentence:

A Worthy Matron (Patron) who has previously served as Worthy Matron (Patron) in another Chapter and has been awarded a Part Matron (Patron) jewel is not eligible to receive an additional Past Matron's (Patron's) jewel.

Section 2A would then read:

Section 2A. A Worthy Matron (Patron) who has served a majority of the scheduled stated meetings shall at the end of their term of office receive a Past Matron's (Patron's) jewel. The Trustees shall see that the jewel(s) is/are obtained in time for presentation at the Annual Installation of Officers. A Worthy Matron (Patron) who has previously served as Worthy Matron (Patron) in another Chapter and has been awarded a Past Matron (Patron) jewel is not eligible to receive an additional Past Matron's (Patron's) jewel.

 ARTICLE IV Membership Section 4 amend by adding "and certificate" prior to the period:

Section 4 would then read:

Section 4. Upon completion of twenty-five (25) years said member in good standing shall receive a twenty-five year membership pin and certificate.

ARTICLE V Fees and Dues - Section 1
 Action: Delete section in its entirety and replace with:

Section 1. The fee for conferring the degrees in this Chapter shall be twenty-five (25) dollars. The fee for affiliation or plural membership shall be twenty-five (25) dollars. All fees must accompany any of the petitions. In addition, each member shall pay five dollars at the time of their initiation to the International Temple Fund (as prescribed in Article IV, Fees, Section 2 of the Rules and Regulations for Subordinate Chapters of the Grand Chapter of Delaware).

Rationale: Grand Chapter in Article VI, Fees, Section 1 requires minimum fee for initiation or plural membership to be \$25. Since affiliation is comparable to plural membership, they should have the same petition fee. The Section number in the Rules and Regulations for Subordinate Chapters of the Grand Chapter of Delaware that refers to the International Temple Fund is Section 2.

- ARTICLE IV. Membership Section 3
 Action: Delete section in its entirety and replace with:

Section 3. Plural membership is permitted in this Chapter (as prescribed in Article III, Membership, Section 11 Plural Membership, of the Rules and Regulations for Subordinate Chapters of the Grand Chapter of Delaware).

Rationale: Grand Chapter is no longer using the term "Dual Membership", but "Plural Membership" only. The Article number in the Rules and Regulations for Subordinate Chapters of the Grand Chapter of Delaware that refers to plural membership is now "Ill" and the section number is only "11." Amend ARTICLE IX (new ARTICLE X) Section 4 by changing in the second line "Fifty Dollars (\$50)" to "One Hundred Dollars (\$100)".

Section 4 would then read:

Section 4. Any Past Patron serving another term in this Chapter as Worthy Patron will be compensated the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) in lieu of a Jewel for services rendered.

Amend ARTICLE X Vacancies (New Article XI) Section 2 by deleting the last sentence.

Section 2 would then read:

Section 2. In case an elective officer leaves the jurisdiction of the Chapter the Worthy Grand Matron can, if circumstances warrant declare the office vacant and grant a dispensation to elect a new officer, such election to take place ten days after written notice has been given to the members by the Secretary of the Chapter, except the office of Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron, which cannot be declared vacant.

Rationale: This requirement is already addressed in the Installation Charge to the Officer.

My Sisters and Brothers,

Tuesday night there was a Zoom meeting of the Grand Chapter line officers, Jurisprudence, Trustees and **Sister** Ann Street to provide guidance on the medical front. During our meeting we discussed the feasibility of returning to chapter meetings in September. After much discussion and review of the Governor's, Grand Master's and Most Worthy Grand Matron's most recent communications and directives, we determined that it would be in the best interest of our membership to delay the return to chapter. Our plan is to keep chapters closed through September and October and do the following:

Have the Worthy Matrons poll their officers and active chapter members with a set of questions around willingness/ability to return to chapter once we are open.

The responses will be consolidated by the Worthy Grand Matron and the Grand Secretary.

We will regroup mid-October to re-evaluate the status of the state and the virus and make a determination regarding resuming work in November.

During September & October and until we do resume meetings, all chapters will have Zoom social gatherings on the nights of their stated meetings. The Worthy Grand Matron and the Grand Secretary will work with each chapter to get them set up and host the gatherings for the chapters if that assistance is needed. No ritual work or chapter business is to be performed during these gatherings, they are purely social in nature.

All members are encouraged to reach out to their sister and brother chapter members via cards, calls and other socially distanced options to keep our communications open and any needs identified.

Letters under seal outlining the above will be sent to the secretaries of the chapters for record.

I know that we are all disappointed we will not be returning to chapter in September, but we must proceed with the best interest of our members in mind. I appreciate your support and willingness to do what is best for the members in Delaware as a whole.

Hello Sister Marianne,

Thank you for all of the updated information regarding Zoom meetings recently. We are currently not having in-person meetings, so this may be of help to us.

Our members are anxious, however, and I find myself, as you are, fielding many kinds of questions about gathering in-person. Therefore, I do have a couple of questions for you that were triggered by inquiries here as well as our Grand Lodge office information.

In compliance with CDC and state regulations, our Grand Lodge has issued very detailed and extensive sanitization requirements after each use. Part of that is the recommendation that one or two people be assigned to set-up and tear down and those same persons be required to complete the sanitization process before the premises are vacated. One of the concerns of our leadership team is, understandably, that this is a lot to expect of one or two members. Additionally, the sanitization of all paraphernalia and premises may be for naught if you end up not having a quorum. Has any thought been given to holding the meetings without pulling out all the badges and other paraphernalia and just using the charter, altar and bible? This would minimize the amount of things that would need sanitation.

Our Grand Lodge has issued waiver notices to be posted with the expectation that people can then decide if they wish to enter. Participation waivers for each member and/or guest to sign have also been issued. Will the GGC be issuing such documents for the chapters?

From: M.A. Shenefelt To: Donna Hiddemen Hi WGM Sister Donna, I am, indeed, finding myself answering many different kinds of questions. And like you, there are no guidelines or resources of former times like these so that makes for some interesting situations.

Thank you for your email. In light of these unprecedented Covid times and the need to keep our members safe and healthy, I understand the concern about handling the badges. I also think it's possible it might not be in the best interest of the badges to be sanitized, especially if they are antique. With these considerations in mind and if you decide to advise your **Chapters**, they do not have to use their badges, I would agree with your decision.

Your question about the paraphernalia and Chapter Room set up. I see your point about the work involved and the possibility of no quorum after the work has been done. My guidelines "Chapter Meetings - Covid Restrictions" issued May of 2020 are based on the clear instructions in both the Ritual and the GGC Red Book regarding the Chapter Room set up, (Ritual, Chapter Furniture, pg. 168; GGC Red Book Bylaws, Chapter VII., 4. Chapter Furniture, pgs. 73-74). I did my best to adhere to the bare, basic requirements of setting up Chapter Rooms and yet retain the essence of Eastern Star (see below). It is my opinion these guidelines will need to be followed. I hope having one or two people who are responsible for this minimal set up will helpful in reducing the need for sanitization.

Chapter Room Setup. The following are required for Chapter Room setup:

- · Altar in the center of the Chapter Room
- · Bible on the Altar
- · Pedestals at the Star Point stations with emblems
- Signet
- American Flag
- Your Country's Flag

The GGC will not be issuing participation waivers. If you, as WGM, feel this is necessary and/or it is something that would be beneficial to the Chapters of the Grand Jurisdiction of Delaware, I would encourage you to discuss this with your WGP and your supporting Committees (Jurisprudence, Trustees, etc.).

I hope I have been of some assistance. If you have further questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me.

APPROPRIATE FOR IN-PERSON OPEN INSTALLATION CEREMONY FOR SUBORDINATE CHAPTERS AND GRAND CHAPTERS

Guidelines – In-person OES Installations with COVID-19
Restrictions: Face Masks, Social Distancing, Limited Attendance
These instructions are a temporary deviation from normal
Eastern Star procedures due to the coronavirus pandemic

I hereby issue the following temporarily modified guidelines for the Ritualistic Ceremony for conducting in-person open Installations adhering to COVID-19 restrictions. All participants are to wear face masks, maintain social distancing and attendance is to be limited as required by national and/or local health authorities. These modified Guidelines may be used by Subordinate Chapters and/or Grand Chapters wherever in-person meetings are allowed by national and local authorities and the Worthy Grand Matron. The following instructions are not permanent.

Modified In-person Open Installation. The Installation Ceremony language printed in the Ritual shall be used, adjusting wording as necessary to fit the circumstances (pages 98-126 or 127-151). The floor work shall be modified as follows in order to maintain social distancing. All participants will please wear face masks/coverings.

All Installing Officers shall be in their Stations six feet apart. The Installing Marshal will remain at her/his Station and invite the incoming Officers to enter the Chapter Room. The Officers will enter the Chapter Room carrying their badges and proceed to the Stations where they will be installed. It is possible their Stations will be on the sidelines six feet apart. When the Officers reach their Stations, they will be seated. The Installation Prayer will be given at the Altar or from the Installing Chaptain's Station. The Installing Marshal will read the roll of Officers to be installed. As their name is called, the Officer will stand at their Station and remain standing. All Officers remain standing and face the Altar to repeat the Obligation of Office given by the Installing Officer. The Officers will then be seated at their Stations.

The Worthy Matron-elect and the Worthy Patron-elect shall be seated in the Chapter Room wherever necessary to maintain social distancing. The Installing Officer shall direct the WM-elect to approach the Altar to be installed. At the Altar, she shall put on her badge when directed and then as directed proceed to the East or near East, whichever position maintains social distancing, to receive Grand Honors and be seated. The same procedure shall be used for the WP-elect.

All other Officers shall remain at their Stations, stand when addressed by the Installing Officer to receive their charge, put on their badge when directed and be seated.

At the end of the Ceremony, the Installing Officer shall direct the Installing Marshal to proclaim from her/his Station the Officers regularly installed.

If members and/or visitors are allowed to be present, strict adherence to the COVID-19 restrictions in your area shall be observed.

MOVING FORWARD - 2021

It is of the upmost importance that Jurisdictions and Subordinate Chapters alike move forward with their essential business such as elections, installations, etc., for 2021. Due to the restrictions in the duties and powers of the MWGM, it is not possible for me to become closely involved in the actual governance of a Grand Chapter or their Subordinate Chapters. I encourage you to follow your Constitution, Code of Laws, Law Book or similar source for your Jurisdiction as faithfully as possible and to do the best you can with fairness and loving kindness to your membership. In these unprecedented times, it may be necessary to move forward with the understanding it's possible none of the usual rules can be applied. The following information DOES NOT change any of the requirements for joining our Order or any of the other fundamental and foundational rules in the Ritual or the GGC Red Book.

• To the Leadership: Please realize the pandemic continues to be serious and is in full force. It may be necessary to make some practical and necessary adjustments to your Grand Chapter and/or Subordinate Chapter protocol/business in order for you to move forward. All possible effort should be taken to follow your Jurisdiction's Constitution and still obey health regulations, understanding that the health regulations imposed by your national and local governments override your constitution. If there is a contradiction, lawful health regulations rule. Please be mindful of the fact that the unprecedented circumstances of the pandemic are not to be used as an excuse to ignore, disregard or abolish your Constitution.

GRAND CHAPTER SESSIONS - USING ZOOM OR OTHER VIDEO CONFERENCING METHODS

If your Grand Chapter Session is being held using Zoom or other means of video communication, you are directed NOT to perform any Ritualistic work whatsoever. No portion of any of our established Ritualistic ceremonies from the Ritual are to be performed during a meeting using Zoom or other video conferencing method, with the exception of the previously authorized https://docs.pythos.org/ and with the exception of the previously authorized https://docs.pythos.org/ and with the exception of the previously authorized https://docs.pythos.org/ and 4/8/20, which states: An "installation ceremony" must be performed that includes (at a minimum) the Installation Prayer, the Obligation of Officers and the Proclamation of the Officers being duly installed. These portions of the Installation Ceremony in the Ritual must be accomplished. It is okay to use a conference call or video conferencing to do this, but it cannot be accomplished in person in order to safeguard the health and safety of our members until the COVID-19 pandemic is over."

"At this time, I would like to adjust the last statement in the above information; "...cannot be accomplished in person...until the COVID-19 pandemic is over" because some Jurisdictions are conducting in-person meetings with appropriate COVID-19 restrictions in place so it may be possible to hold in-person open Installations. If your Jurisdiction's WGM and supporting leadership and government health regulations allow for in-person meetings, it is acceptable to conduct a Modified In-Person Open Installation Ceremony with Covid restrictions. Please see the attached Guidelines for a Modified In-Person Open Installation Ceremony with Covid Restrictions for Subordinate Chapters and Grand Chapters (updated January 2021).

It may be necessary to adjust the structure of your Grand Chapter Session if you are using Zoom (or other video methods) to hold your Session. It may basically become a business meeting with the essential portions of your business being taken care of in accordance with your Constitution as closely as reasonably possible with adherence to Covid health and safety restrictions in your area. Out of necessity due to the pandemic, it will not be possible to have the usual protocol, traditions, ceremonies or formalities we are accustom to for our Sessions.

ELECTIONS

- ELECTRONIC BALLOTING. If your Jurisdiction has the expertise and technical support available to your membership to conduct confidential and secret balloting using Zoom or other video conferencing programs, this manner of voting can be used if your leadership is in agreement to do so. Please keep in mind you have a duty to ensure all who are entitled to vote are given the chance to vote.
- MAIL-IN BALLOTS. If your Jurisdiction is not holding in-person meetings, it is suggested you consider using mail-in ballots. It is possible this may be a better choice for your members to ensure all who are entitled to vote are given the opportunity to vote (not just those who have access and understand how to use Zoom or other video conferencing methods). The process for mail-in ballots would require time to discuss and choose a specific way of accomplishing this task such as preparation of the ballots, the actual mailing, setting a deadline for the return of the ballots, etc. Please take into consideration how you will handle nominations from the floor if you allow this type of nomination from members during your elections.
- ABBREVIATED IN-PERSON VOTING. This suggestion is courtesy of a kind and sharing Jurisdiction (thank you!) and is an acceptable alternative to mail-in ballots if in-person activity is allowed and your leadership is in agreement to use this method. Description: select a specific date and on that day have your Chapter Rooms open for a set time so that eligible voting members can come to the Chapter during that time and cast their ballot. The slate of Officers to be voted on could be sent to the members beforehand if desired. The official ballot would be given to them as they enter the Chapter Room. Members would mark their ballot, deposit it in the ballot box and leave (an "in" and "out" process). If desired and felt to be necessary, precautions such as signing in could be used. The preparations for the Abbreviated In-Person Voting protocol would need to be arranged prior to the voting day and the instructions discussed and presented clearly to the members well in advance. If this suggestion is used, please stay safe by wearing face masks, observing social distancing and restricting the size of attendance as necessary.

RESOLUTIONS

The following information is my viewpoint regarding handling Resolutions and is an acceptable manner of handling them if the Jurisdiction leadership is in agreement to do so.

It is my opinion for Resolutions to be properly considered, discussed and voted on by the membership, it is necessary for this business to take place at an in-person Grand Chapter

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Session. I believe this is especially true for major revision-type Resolutions, as well as Resolutions that may possibly be contentious. Body language, tone and the attention of those in the Grand Chapter Room are a part of conducting this important business. These components are not necessarily present on Zoom or other video conferencing methods. Additionally, the need for amendments could be complicated, as well as the need for secure and confidential voting if there is a call for a written ballot vote. Therefore, it is my opinion the membership would be better served if Resolutions were held over until they can be addressed in person at a Grand Chapter Session. Of course, it is possible there will be circumstances where this is not acceptable. Each Jurisdiction will need to address Resolutions in a manner that best serves their membership. Resolutions are the business of Jurisdictions.

Guidance

In January 2021, I spoke with the Worthy Matrons of two chapters that had not had any Zoom meetings since we began that method of meeting. Both were struggling to make quorum due to the advanced ages of their members and their computer inability or unwillingness to call via phone in to the meetings. During the discussion I explained that if the chapter continued on their current path, I would have to take the charter once they had reached 6-months without a meeting. Both chapter's members worked together to ensure that quorum was met and that the business meetings could be held. Both chapters continue to have meetings at this point.

Questions & Answers/Decisions

I received the following inquiries, my answers and in some cases the MWGM's answers with reasoning follow:

- 10/22/2019 Question: Can the Altar be draped for a former member who is a Past Matron/Patron or Past Grand Matron/Patron?
 - Answer: I was unable to find any documentation to specify for whom the Altar may or may not be draped. The only information I was able to find was for the procedures for *performing* the draping. Unfortunately, I had planned to write to the Most Worthy Grand Secretary to secure an answer, but for some reason, I did not complete the follow-up and the inquirer did not inquire again. Therefore, I will reach out at this time for a response, so I can reply, and the issue can be closed.
 - In 2020, I posed this question this question to the MWGM as follows and received the indicated response: Question: Can the Altar or Charter be draped for a former member? There is a funeral service for former members, but no indication of whether draping may be

performed. I researched this and asked our jurisprudence, I could only find procedures for performing the draping, not who is entitled to a draping of either the Altar or Charter. Typically, the Altar is for Past Grands or sitting Elected Grand Officers. The Charter is for chapter members. MWGM Answer: It is my opinion your question about draping the Altar or Charter would be addressed by you as WGM, with guidance from Delaware's OES Code, Law or Constitution. I researched the GGC Red Book, as well as the Ritual. regarding draping the Altar or Charter and there are no specific instructions or guidelines for this ceremony. It has been my experience that each Jurisdiction handles this particular portion in a specific way for their Jurisdiction.

- 3/9/2020 Question: Has there been any talk on the Grand or General Grand Chapter level about the Coronavirus? [I did not share the rest of the information in this email as there was personal health issues included. Answer: I have emailed the Most Worthy Grand Matron and they are preparing information to disseminate. I will keep you updated.
- 4/29/2020 Questions:
 - Face Masks This one has two parts: With the directives from the Governor mandating the use of face masks in public, will face masks worn in chapter be required to be white? Will chapters be required to supply them if they must be white? My gut inclination on this one is that I hope we are not required to wear masks once we are opened up for having meetings, however, that may not be the case. In my personal opinion, any face mask should be acceptable as it would be a medical requirement, not a fashion prerogative. My second thought is that chapters should have a limited supply of disposable masks in the

event someone shows up uncovered. Again, just my personal opinion. MWGM Answer: It goes without saying that if your Governor's directives include requiring face masks to be worn, they will need to be worn (realizing there may be details I am unaware of). The color, style or other considerations for face masks would up to the Jurisdiction. I think it would be thoughtful and a kindness for a Chapter to have a limited supply of face masks so in case someone forgets theirs, they will not be without one.

- If members want to wear surgical gloves, will they be permitted since gloves are normally not permitted? MWGM Answer: I expect that wearing gloves will not be required, but this may be a personal preference for peace of mind, in which case I would permit it. Again, just my personal opinion. It is my opinion it would be permissible for a member to wear gloves if desired. The Ritual, pg. 50, Initiation Ceremony and the GGC Red Book, Section 88. Rules of Order, Rule 9., pg. 125, state: "...gloves are not worn..., except for medical or religious reasons...". In my opinion the coronavirus pandemic is a medical reason.
- 8/26/2020 Question: From Sussex Chapter:
 - First, since most of our members do not have computers will phone calls be adequate for contact instead of Zoom meetings? The Turkey Talk letter seemed to indicate that we had to have these Zoom meetings on Chapter nights. Answer: Zoom gatherings should be held for those who have access to join. Phone calls, cards, outside visits with masks and distancing can be used for those who have no computer access. News from the calls and visits could be shared at the Zoom gatherings.

- Secondly, since our chapter has its own building and can regulate who comes and goes, can we have a yard sale in the building following all the governor's guidelines? We must find a way to make some money to support the chapter. We haven't had any dinners or fund raisers since this whole Covid thing started. Answer: As far as the yard sale, my initial gut feeling is no because the liability is too high. Having something outside could be a possibility. Let me do some investigating and get back to you on that one. Some info that may help: Since you have your own building, do you have liability insurance and if so, you may want to ask your insurance agent about coverage for COVID during such an event. Let me know about that. Sorry to be such a pain, but we must err on the side of caution to protect not only our members, but our guests as well. I can sympathize with your situation as it is very unique. Have you investigated online methods of having your fundraisers? Or maybe a takeout dinner for reserved pick up? Your regulars just might be in the mood for that. Just a thought. I'll get back to you on the yard sale if you could let me know about the insurance.
- 9/3/2020 Question: Is there a list of questions I am supposed to ask the members about coming to meetings? When do you need them by? Answer: Sister Barbara Lott and I are preparing and will be sending out shortly. Very brief, if you could contact your active members via phone and ask the questions, then compile responses briefly. We'll called for you all to get them back to Barb, with a cc to me within a week from the date of my initial email request. Sound doable?
- 9/9/2020 Question: Franklin Lodge has requested that the members of Georgetown Chapter put on the dinner for the visit of the Grand Master of Delaware in October. The

event will be held in the Millsboro Fire Hall with the visitation meeting following in the same location. I have been studying the guidelines for COVID 19 for the restaurant industry plus other guidelines but before going any further felt that it was necessary to contact you and ask if you have a decision on Subordinate Chapter participation in events such as dinners. Answer: Thank you for inquiring about this request to serve. Knowing what we do about the spread of the COVID-19 virus and with current guidelines regarding food service, I have several concerns about honoring the lodge's request. I'm sure that the fire hall probably has adequate space to seat the diners. However, my concern is with being present in a room where several people will not have their masks on due to eating and will be conversing while they are eating. This scenario is also a little different than serving a family as all participants are coming from different households, which multiplies the risk. Additionally, we cannot be assured that the action of clearing the tables can occur after the men have left the area since the meeting is to take place in the same venue. Considering all these factors, I regretfully recommend that the chapter decline this request until we can be more confident in the safety of the situation. I appreciate you keeping the safety and welfare of your members as your top priority.

- 9/10/2020 Question: The lodge is open. On Tuesday they are having a meeting. I am planning to do a dinner for them as usual. However, there will be no mention or apparel eluding to OES. Just doing it on my own with a couple of friends according to the State of Delaware guidelines. Lodge is aware that OES has not opened up yet. However, the food was purchased for the Easter Dinner and put in the freezer. If its not used it will have to be thrown out. We will actually be helping DeMolay. They are open. Answer: Absolutely, no usage of OES anything, no monies from *or* to OES for this and this is a one-time permission.
- 9/25/2020 Question: Did you give permission for Victory Chapter to serve meals in our chapter? If so, why can't we have meetings in the room? I was told that some

members of the chapter served a dinner to the Union Lodge #7 members on 9/15 and plan to serve another dinner on 10/6, as well as serving a meal after a funeral on 9/20. Answer: Thank you so much for your inquiry. I did give permission as follows based on the information that was provided to me by Carolyn Van Heckle: The 9/15 dinner was presented to me as being served by the DeMolay with Carolyn and a couple other women helping the boys. No OES clothing or paraphernalia was being worn or used and this was not a Victory Chapter job. The food was described as having been in the freezer since a planned dinner in April and if not used would have to be discarded. The 10/6 dinner was a funeral dinner and was presented that the meal was pre-plated sandwiches with all condiments, utensils, etc. being pre-packaged. The expected attendance was to be less than 25. In both cases, Carolyn assured me that all CDC/DE serving guidelines were to be followed. In addition, I specified that the tables should not be cleared until the guests had left the dining area to minimize the amount of contact while their masks were still off due to eating. Carolyn assured me this would be done. Having said all that, I did not give permission for any future dinners to be served. As you're aware, I had emailed Jurisprudence and followed up by phone with Chairman Bob Bradish regarding these inquiries and those regarding other social gatherings. Bob's response was that the feeling was that Eastern Star in Delaware is closed at this time and that means everything across the board: No meetings, no other activities either. Therefore, I will email Carolyn and reiterate that message and let her know that any dinners occurring before we officially open cannot be catered or served by Eastern Star. I appreciate you bringing these concerns to me and thank you for your continued support especially during this unusual time.

 9/27/2020: Follow-Up Letter to mentioned in the above Question and Answer: Hi Carolyn; I have received an inquiry regarding Victory Chapter serving dinners while Delaware Eastern Star is closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, I believe that I need to clarify what

has occurred and our position going forward. I did give permission as follows based on the information that you provided to me: The 9/15 dinner was presented to me as being served by the DeMolay with you and a couple other women helping the boys. No OES clothing paraphernalia was being worn or used and this was not a Victory Chapter job. The food was described as having been in the freezer since a planned dinner in April and if not used would have to be discarded. The 10/6 dinner was a funeral dinner and was presented that the meal was preplated sandwiches with all condiments, utensils, etc. being pre-packaged. The expected attendance was to be less than 25. In both cases, you assured me that all CDC/DE serving guidelines were to be followed. addition, I specified that the tables should not be cleared until the guests had left the dining area to minimize the amount of contact while their masks were still off due to eating, you assured me this would be done. Having said all that, I did not give permission for any future dinners to be served. As a result of several questions from the chapters, I had emailed Jurisprudence regarding these inquiries. The feedback I received was that Eastern Star in Delaware is closed at this time and that means everything across the board: No meetings, no other activities either. Therefore, I must make the decision that any dinners occurring before we officially open cannot be catered or served by Eastern Star. I understand that this is a difficult time for all, especially with the other having already resumed organizations However, our primary responsibility is to our members and keeping them safe. I appreciate your understanding and cooperation. Sincerely, Donna Hiddemen, WGM

• 10/10/2020 Question: Please clarify for me whether it is permitted that we conduct a zoom meeting for the purpose of conducting essential chapter business following the guidelines established by the MWGM. I have everything established to proceed, but want to be certain that I am following the appropriate procedures. Answer: Yes, the Zoom guidelines from the MWGM are specifically for conducting business, thus the requirement for checking

- quorum. If you have any other questions or need someone to host so the meeting can run longer than 1 hour if needed, please let me know. Also, please advise your secretary that my correspondence under seal regarding the COVID restrictions do not need to be read, as long as they are spread upon the minutes, as they should be and paper copies supplied to those who request them. There were so many, reading all that would take much too long.
- 10/22/2020 Question: Do we need to have a quorum? Do we need to have our charter? Answer: Yes, chapter business is being conducted, therefore a quorum is required. We are unable to secure the charters from our buildings at this time, so no.
- November meeting must they again sign a release for our November meeting must they again sign a release if they attend the December and later meetings? Answer: Yes, the waiver must be signed and dated each time a person enters the lodge. It has been suggested that the same form be used with lines for each meeting at the bottom. The signature and date can be completed by the attendee and the temperature recorded by the assigned person on those lines. That has the benefit of trimming multiple pages for each person, yet still keeps a running log.
- 10/29/2020 Ouestion: I DO NOT AGREE with only Zoom meetings for the remainder of the year. The guidelines you sent states "To avoid setting up the meeting room and then find that quorum won't be reached, the Worthy Matron should call the officers and members (who regularly attend meetings) in advance and confirm that enough members plan to attend to reach quorum for the upcoming meeting. " After I sent the notice about the Zoom meeting, some of our regular members contacted me to say they could not attend a Zoom meeting, but could attend an in-person meeting. The members, who attended the Zoom meeting, had agreed to attend in-person meetings when surveyed. They seemed to be more inclined for socializing than having an Eastern Star meeting. If we do not have in- person meetings we will not be able to do the following: Ø Ballot on a petition that was received, which a

committee investigated. Ø Charter and Altar cannot be draped Ø Worthy Matron cannot sign minutes Ø Secretary cannot give funds received to the Treasurer Ø Demit granted by the Worthy Matron cannot be signed. I think we should follow the guidelines and have in-person meetings. Answer: I completely understand your feelings. I was surprised when I received such a lengthy list of dates for which Zoom meetings were requested. I acted based on the following:

- I agree that the guidelines should be followed. Having said that, I also understand that chapters, having made the initial contact with their members to determine attendance for the next meeting, may vote via their Zoom meeting to meet virtually until restrictions are lifted or relaxed.
- I set up the three meetings to the end of the year based on the expectation that this is what the chapter had decided on.
- I did not go beyond December because I felt that many things could change before that time.
- Even though I created the Zoom meetings, the invitations do not need to be sent until you get closer to each meeting date. The invitations are for your use, but I can cancel them at any time if things change.
- If you feel that the guidelines were not being properly followed, it would have been best to address that during the meeting. However, even now you may refer to the guidelines as issued and cause the chapter to revisit the discussion at your next meeting. I am sure that some members may have initially replied that they felt comfortable enough to attend in person when the survey was taken, yet at this time may no longer feel that level of comfort.
- To address the items, you mentioned that cannot be done if you do not meet in person:

- You are correct, balloting cannot occur until the chapter meets in person.
- You are correct, the charter and altar cannot be draped until you meet in person. All chapters will draped at their first in-person meetings for the specified 30 days.
- The Worthy Matron may signify her acknowledgement of the minutes as read or corrected via email and then apply her wet signature upon attending the in-person meeting when it occurs. Or, the secretary may deliver the pages to the Worthy Matron after each meeting and wait outside of her home for the signature. I would recommend the first option.
- The secretary should either mail the receipts or coordinate a meeting with the treasurer to exchange documents and cash. This is what is being done by the Grand Chapter. I have met with the Grand Secretary at the Wawa parking lot in Dover on a few occasions to sign warrants & checks and exchange other items that were not able to be mailed.
- The demit granted by the Worthy Matron, should be mailed to her for signature and return post to you. Or again, this could be accomplished via delivery to the Worthy Matron and wait outside of her home for the signature.
- Again, I completely understand your feelings and agree that the guidelines must be followed, and you should address that issue with the chapter. However, the Most Worthy Grand Matron has made it very clear that we are to find ways to complete the business needs of the chapter without endangering the welfare of our members. While I agree that our current situation is not ideal, most business of the chapter can be completed outside of inperson meetings. The issue of balloting certainly is a difficult one as it really should be time sensitive. The only

thing I can recommend is if your chapter does not choose to have an in-person meeting at this time, that someone be assigned to remain in touch with the potential candidate to keep the communication lines open, so they are aware they have not been forgotten or rejected. I hope this information is of assistance. If you have any problems or wish for me to sit in for your next meeting, please let me know.

- 11/23/2020 Question: did see that I had the latest edict from the Grand Lodge. I'm attaching it here so you can read it tonight. I reviewed the edict and also ran it past Bob as a general indicator of our current status and this is what came out of our conversation: At this point in time, the fundraiser may move ahead with the following caveats:
 - All State requirements and restrictions must be followed explicitly.
 - All Requirements and restrictions set forth in the Grand Master's edicts must be explicitly followed.
 - Specifically:
 - There must be less than 10 workers and proper social distancing must be maintained in the kitchen.
 - The meals are only for takeout and should be presented at the door of the lodge.
 - Masks and gloves must be worn at all times.
 - The kitchen must be sanitized before and after the event.
- As you are all aware, this situation is very fluid. If circumstances change before then, the event may have to be canceled and rescheduled for a later time. I appreciate your inquiry and hope that all can move forward as planned.
- 1/6/2021 Question: Several weeks ago, I inquired regarding what the Grand Chapter is doing regarding scholarships. Naturally, I was specifically asking about ESTARL. However, we had a call from Nancy Davis

about the Shustack Scholarship. As you can see from the message, I am forwarding I have received inquiry from Robin Hurley who was awarded the Scholarship last year and is looking to apply for another year. Although COVID has shut lots of things down schooling continues for people and they need the financial assistance as much if not more than in the past. I have responded to Robin that I do not have a definitive answer to her inquiry but hope to get back to her after hearing from you. Thank you for your consideration in this matter. Answer: Thank you for the inquiry. I have been intending to re-write to you (will explain), but have been behind. I originally answered you with the statement that I would have to research the wording on the number of scholarships available for award in a particular term. Unfortunately, your inquiry was "stacked" with other responses to my Christmas donation email and my answer went to Cheryl Mongillo in error. So, now having already researched the issue. I am addressing this response to both you and Betty Abrams with the answer as I see it. According to the By-Laws Appendix C: ESTARL Item 1 states: "Each award is in an amount determined each year not to exceed

\$1,000.00." Likewise: Shustack Scholarship Item 4 states: "There will be one award given annually in the amount of \$1,000.00." Therefore, given unprecedented situation and the fact that students have continued with their education and would naturally expect to be given the opportunity to apply for these awards in the sequence of their pre-determined length of study, I feel that even though our leadership has not changed on the usual annual basis, because the By-Laws are stated as "each year" and "annually", we can award scholarships in 2021. Please move forward with your communications to the chapters. As an FYI: The first chapter meeting of the year is Naomi, which is tonight. So, you can make your letters brief and refer the members to the web for forms or have them contact you if they do not have access to the web. I hope this helps, I apologize for the delay.

- 2/8/2021 Question: Is this email (1/31/2021 to the Secretaries) to be considered as correspondence under seal? Can we file the Certificate of Election without signatures of the officers and the installing officer, but just the list of officers with their addresses and the name of the installing officer? Answer: Yes, an actual sealed copy was sent to the secretaries on 2/8/2021. The Certificates of Election may be sent without the signatures of the officers and the installing officer. The list of officers should contain the officer names, addresses and the name of the installing officer. Of course, it must be noted as usual, if any officers were not installed at the time of the virtual installation. Signatures may be obtained when we are in-person and those updated copies submitted after your first in-person meeting.
- 3/9/2021 Question: After reading your printed guidelines, and perusing the Ritual, I find there are two parts in the presentation of the badges: The first is the physical presentation of the badge by the installing marshal. The second part is a description of the badge by the installing officer (or assistant installing officer). I agree that the portion where the Installing Marshal invests the badge of the office should be eliminated (due to the impossibility of performing this part virtually), but I do believe the I.O. or A.I.O. should give the description of the badge to the individual who has been installed to that station. Please clarify for me that not the entire reference to badges is removed but only the portion that refers to the physical investing of badges. Thanking you in advance for your clarification. Answer: I'm not ignoring you, I'm just waiting for any other questions 'til tomorrow and then I'll answer all together so everyone's covered in one reply. [The items questioned were covered in the final version of the Installation Procedures given to the chapters].
- 3/15/2021 Question: Several members have asked about attending the Installation of the 2021-2022 Grand Officers ONLY. They are wondering must they pay the registration fee if they are only attending that portion of the session in May. Answer: I'm so sorry for the delay, I thought I had already replied, but I find no copy. I have

spoken with Jurisprudence and the Trustees and the guidance is that members who wish to come only for installation, will not have to register. Once registration closes in the morning, it will be done. Having said that, however, inquirers should be reminded that the business of the day will flow according to the outline of the call without hesitation. Therefore, it will be hard to determine when exactly installation will begin. Only registered members will be admitted until the Grand Chapter recesses to prepare for installation.

3/28/2021 Question: I was asked if there was to be a ballot box at sessions. The question was posed with this as an example: What if someone wants to place a name for Trustee, Gr. Sec., etc. Even though letters of intent have been requested does that mean no one else can place a name for nomination/election on the day of sessions. Answer: I did receive your inquiry. The nomination process was outlined in the manner it was so that preparations and verifications could be completed in advance. Therefore, in the event that we would have to abandon the in-person meeting, a virtual meeting could be held and the elections managed suitably. Therefore, I believe that there will be no nominations that day. However, I would like to consult Jurisprudence and will follow-up with you further. Subsequent Answer: I have consulted with the Jurisprudence Committee, and they confirmed that there will be no ballot box at this year's Grand Chapter Session. At our last leadership meeting it was decided that no nominations would be from the floor. therefore no ballot box. That is because there is still a potential of having to cancel the in-person session and go with a ZOOM meeting. Also seeing that this is going to be only a one-day event, timing and logistics would also be an issue. If the Nomination Committee has only one candidate for a specific office, then a unanimous ballot will be cast by the Grand Secretary (or Treasurer if the position is Grand Secretary). If the Nomination Committee has more than one name for a specific office, there will be a vote as usual if we are meeting in person. Any offices for which there are no nominees, will be

appointed for the term by the incoming Worthy Grand Matron. In the event we are not able to meet in person and a virtual meeting must be held, the process would be the same as above with the exception of the situation where the Nomination Committee has multiple names for a specific office. Due to the difficulty of managing a vote of this nature on-line with numerous attendees, the incoming Worthy Grand Matron would call a special meeting at a later date for an in-person election to fill that specific office.

- 4/13/2021 Question: We have been asked to do Secretary's Association dinner the end of this month. It would be a plated dinner, everything disposable and would be limited number of Masons only. No outsiders. Small number of kitchen staff. Are we good for the? Answer: If there are a limited number of attendees, the lodge is following their protocol for admitting people to the building (and you follow those rules as well for you and the staff) and you all follow the required regulations for serving under these conditions, I think that would be ok. If your volunteers have had at least one shot, that's better yet. I'm sure you know all the required safety precautions, but in addition to those, if you can hold off on clearing the tables until the men are up and away from the tables, that would be best.
- 4/18/2021 Question: Was I right in reading the past grands memorials or was that wrong? Answer: Thanks Vickie. The memorials for the Past Grands and any notifications for chapter members should be read when received so everyone is informed. However, we cannot draped until we are in-person. Draping is supposed to be done at the first meeting back. If your altar and/or charter were already draped when we went into quarantine, then you or your Matron may just remind everyone of the names of all those lost and read an appropriate message/poem.

REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY Sister Barbara F. Lott, PGM (9)

During the installation of Grand Officers, the Grand Secretary is told that the office of Grand Secretary is one of the most important gifts within the Grand Chapter. My goal has been to be faithful in the performance of the various duties that lay before me; endeavored to support the leadership of this Grand Chapter; be obedient to the orders or directions I have received throughout the year; impartially and faithfully perform the duties of the office and make myself useful to the members of this Grand Chapter.

I had no illusions about the position of Grand Secretary. I wasn't sure that I really wanted to stand for election to the position this time, as there were some other positions in Grand Chapter that I was hoping I would be asked to fill. There might be a lull in the work now and then but that is the calm before the storm. Below is an accounting of the duties performed during 2019-2021:

Proceedings: The initial draft of the Proceedings began in August of 2019. The Junior Past Grand Matron and Junior Past Grand Patron were given the next draft to proof in late September 2019 and requested to return that proofing on or before October 31st, 2019. Since sometimes there needs to be more than three pair of eyes, I also requested Sister Henrietta R. McKelvev to also proof providing her with a copy of the proceedings in the middle of October. The Junior Past Grand Patron and Sister Henrietta returned their proofs to me by the 2nd week of November. The Junior Past Grand Matron returned her proof and a disc of pictures by the end of the 2nd full week of November. Bids were received from Copies Done Right, Lewes Printing, and Print Coast2Coast. Print Coast2Coast with a low bid of \$850 was given the job on January 22, 2020, and it was completed on January 31, 2020, picked up and distributed according to the Rules and Regulations Section 5 A 7).

Two copies of each of the years 2017, 2018, and 2019 were sent to E&L Bindery, 708 Vandalia Street, St. Paul, MN 55114-1303

for binding for three years in one volume per the Rules & Regulations Article II Section 5 A) 6).

The proceedings of the Special Session held September 21, 2019, will be incorporated into the Proceedings for the 99th Session May 2021.

Directories: In conjunction with the Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna S. Hiddemen the directories were prepared and distributed according to the Rules and Regulations of Grand Chapter Section 5 B by mid-August 2019. Three bids were requested from Print Coast 2 Coast of Lewes, Copies Done Right of Lewes. With the low bid of \$106.25, Print Coast 2 Coast was given the job on August 12th, and it was completed and ready for pick up on August 17th. Distribution either in person or by mail was in accordance with the Rules and Regulations Section 5 B) 1 was completed by September 15th.

Work on the 2021-2022 directories has begun.

Care of Property:

- 1) Received, duly filed and safety kept all papers, books, documents, paraphernalia, and other property of the Grand Chapter that were assigned to the Grand Secretary.
- 2) Kept a receipt from all Grand Officers for the jewel of their office and other properties and when those items were returned at the end of their term.

- 3) **Special Session** notification was prepared and distributed by the Worthy Grand Matron, although the Rules and Regulation of Grand Chapter Article II Duties of Grand Officers; Section 5 Grand Secretary; M) Call or Invitation to Grand Chapter Session 3) does state that this is the responsibility of the Grand Secretary.
- 4) Due to the COVID 19 situation the 99th Annual Session to be held May 9 11, 2020 was postponed. Due notice was given to all members and refunds were made to individuals who had paid for registration and meals.
- 5) The call/invitation to the rescheduled 99th Annual Session to be held May 10, 2021, along with forms for preregistration, luncheon reservation and directories and proceedings were distributed to all members via email and usps mail.

Jurisprudence

- 1) Current copy of the Constitution & Bylaws, Rules & Regulations and Book of Instruction with seal affixed were provided to each Elected Grand Officer and to each member of the Jurisprudence Committee.
- 2) Copies of the current Constitution & Bylaws, Rules & Regulations were available for resale as well as in the "Members Only" section of the Grand Chapter of Delaware website.

Log of Duties: This report is a condensation of the duties of the Grand Secretary. For anyone interested, a complete excel spreadsheet will be provided. Suffice it to say that from May until November I did not watch much TV as I was in "The Cave". Thanks to Bill for recording some of shows we both enjoy. There was that every now and then when I got hooked and "The Cave" was abandoned that night for TV or for a play or for an afternoon or morning sailing May to November. As the year went

on, I was not as diligent about keeping track of my activities but suffice it to say that all requirements of the office were met.

Grand Representative Commissions: Twenty-seven Grand Representatives of Sister Jurisdictions in Delaware expired on December 31, 2019. After consultation with the Worthy Grand Matron, I attached twenty-seven letters with recommended Sisters or Brothers to the Grand Secretaries of those Jurisdictions that had expired or were expiring on December 31, 2019. It was determined that three other commissions needed to be filled. All letters were sent via email attachment in November 2019.

Grand Representative Packets were prepared for Sisters or Brothers in other Jurisdictions to Delaware and forwarded to the Grand Secretary of the appropriate Grand Jurisdiction.

Among the things that happened during this pandemic was the request of several Sister Jurisdictions to extend the terms of the Grand Representative **to** Delaware. After consultation with the Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna S. Hiddemen, all requests were honored.

On December 31, 2020, the commissions of thirty Grand Representatives expired. The Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna S. Hiddemen requested that I recommend reappointment for 28 of Grand Representatives; one Grand Representative needed to be appointed as the commission expiring in 2020 had not be accepted and no replacement had been named; and one Sister Jurisdiction had not had a recommendation for the 2019 – 2020 term. Letters of recommendation for reappointment of these Sisters and Brothers was sent via email attachment to the Grand Secretary of Sister Jurisdictions.

Constitution, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations and Book of Instruction: While preparing the legislation enacted at the Special Session of September 2019, I also updated our 2017 Constitution, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations and Book of Instruction noting those section that were amended in 2018, 2019 and at the Special Session of 2019. The revised Constitution, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations and Book of Instruction with amendment can be found on the web. After consultation with the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, and

Jurisprudence Committee one printed copy was provided to all Subordinate Chapters and elected Grand Line Officers.

Membership database: During the year I found that the membership database needed some revising to help make it more robust and easier to work with. It was fortunate that several Subordinate Chapters have a membership address list that I was able to obtain, and double check information currently contained in the database. When Annual Reports were due a list of the membership was included for the Secretaries to update. This information was used to create a list of members by Subordinate Chapter for the Registration/Credentials Committee.

Social Media:

- 1) Forwarded to the web administrator in pdf format the updated Constitution, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations and Book of Instruction, General Grand Chapter Forms as well as revised forms for the Grand Chapter of Delaware
- 2) Took over responsibility for the calendar on the web page for the Grand Chapter of Delaware.
- 3) Took advantage of the calendar of the Grand Lodge and posted as many of our events as possible.
- 4) In conjunction with Sister Deena Yale mounted a Facebook page for the Grand Chapter of Delaware.

Insurance: When the bill from Selective Insurance was received this year, I carefully reviewed it and found several red flags that resulted in a conversation with the insurance representative, Kimberly Bailey, at Wilgus Associates, Inc. in Bethany Beach. After correcting information concerning location of the Grand Secretary's office, I questioned who the insurance was covering and for a user-friendly version of the policy. The General Commercial Liability policy carried by the Grand Chapter of Delaware is written for the members of the Grand Chapter, but the premium basis was stated as 11 members. I questioned if those 11 individuals were specified in the policy and Kimberly Bailey, our insurance agent indicated there was none. At this point, Kimberly requested copies of our Constitution and Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter and any

other information that could be provided so that she could assess if the policy were written correctly or if there were any problems.

Kimberly's conclusion was that the policy is written correctly but the number of members that were used as the premium basis were not only not correct according to the Article II of the Constitution but also not named.

I took the above action as I was concerned about the inaccurate information that I saw in the bill. Selective insurance was very accommodating and did not file a complaint of fraud against the Grand Chapter, which they were in their right to do. If no action had been taken, any claim filed against the Grand Chapter would have been paid but the policy would be dropped by Selective for falsely reporting the number of members of the Grand Chapter and a fraud complaint would also have been brought against the Grand Chapter of Delaware.

The policy is now corrected, and additional monies paid so that the policy covers all members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware while attending a Grand Chapter sponsored event.

Honorary Membership: While rummaging through some papers I found several piles of pre-registration forms for individuals who were dignitaries that would have been presented at the Altar during the Annual Grand Chapter Session. One individual who had been at a past session had contacted me several times asking about her honorary membership and I had no answer for her. While going through those papers I found the answer and it appeared that honorary membership had not been mailed to Sister and Brothers who for the first time had been presented at the Altar during the Annual Session of several sessions. Certificates been mailed to those individuals.

Report to the Right Worthy Grand Secretary: Reports was filed on June 16, 2019, and June 15, 2020. I was notified on June 17, 2019, and July 1, 2019, that the electronic copy had been accepted. A hardcopy of the reports with appropriate checks, updated list of Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons, report of charitable contributions and names, addresses and emails of Grand Officers installed at the 2019 Annual Session and the continuing Grand Officers for the year 2020-2021.

Form 990N: In November, a call from a Subordinate Chapter secretary in need of finding a 508 C, that was determined to be the IRS Determination Letter with the Subordinate Chapter's tax status rolled into a major issue. Upon checking the IRS gov site to see what Subordinate Chapters had filed their 990N e-postcards uncovered the following information concerning the last filed 990N e-postcards. The 990N e-postcards must be filed for the previous year in the first month of the next year. This is not an option. If the 990N e-postcard is not filed for four years, there are repercussions and to be reinstated into the 501 C 8 status is not only time consuming but brings financial penalties.

After downloading all information available on the IRS.gov website I was able to determine for each chapter that had not filed when the last 990N e-postcard was filed. Before notifying any of the Subordinate Chapter Secretaries, I alerted the Worthy Grand Matron to the issue. I then contacted all Subordinate Chapter Secretaries that were in arrears and provided them with as much information as possible.

A question was raised as to what contributions are tax deductible when given to a 501 (c) 8 organization. The IRS.gov website clearly states what is tax deductible so if you ever wondered...deductions to the Order of the Eastern Star for Benefit for Children with Special Needs, ESTARL, or any of our charities is tax deductible. For individuals who make donations to these charities a letter of acknowledgement has been issued for the donation. It should also be kept in mind that donations for fraternal purposes are not tax deductible.

History: A project was begun to bring the history of the Grand Chapter of Delaware to the web. The web administrator created a "History" tab. Under this will you find lists of the following: Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patron; In Memoriums for Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons; Past Grand Secretaries; Past Grand Treasurers; Past Grand Instructors/Lecturers; Proceedings; and Past Matrons and Past Patrons. As of this date 74 proceedings have been mounted on the web in pdf format.

Strange happenings: The 1st of November I received a call from Bruce Fine, PM of Hiram Lodge #8 and organist at Greenville Presbyterian Church, Kennett Pike, Wilmington to do a memorial service for a Christabel Murphy. The only Eastern Star information her family had provided was that she always talked about being a member of OES. At the time of her death, she was living in Pharr, TX. Checking the membership database turned up several Murphy's but no Christabel. A search of white pages premium found that she lived in New Castle, Bear and from 1973-1999 in Pottstown, PA. Hoping legacy.com would provide some answers, I searched for days for her obituary also checking the obituary notices of funeral homes in Pharr, TX. Still no answers as to where she was a member. I then contacted the

Grand Secretary of the Grand Chapter of Texas hoping she might give me an answer. She forwarded the information to the Texas membership chairman who had no record of Christabel. looking and not wanting to step on any toes, I thought that she might belong to St. Matthew's Grand Chapter PHA. A delicately written note to both St. Matthew's Grand Chapter and the Grand Lodge of Masons PHA was sent. Then, BINGO....her obituary appeared on legacy.com and I realized that there was no way she was a member of Eastern Star PHA. I then reached out to Sister Donna Runyan, Grand Secretary of Maryland thinking she might have had Maryland friends and joined in Maryland as I knew that she lived in Bear and New Castle. Still no success. I pondered for a few more days and realized that if she had lived in Pottstown, PA maybe that was where her membership was. By this time, I had contact Sister Debbie Good and asked if Caesar Rodney No. 8 would be willing to perform a memorial service. Although I had asked Sister Debbie about performing the service, I truly didn't want to have a service performed for someone who was no longer a member or had never been a member even though her family indicated that she was. EUREKA....Christabel was found, and I breathed a sigh of relief knowing that the service would be performed very legally as she was a member in good standing. A note to Sister Virginia Plyler, Grand Secretary of Pennsylvania gave the answer that Sister Christabel was a member in Good Standing in Schuylkill Chapter #338, Quakertown, PA whose members were very grateful to Caesar Rodney Chapter for performing the memorial service.

The takeaway from this strange happening is that as members of the Order of the Eastern Star when doing estate planning there is a need to provide the information to the preparer or your family that you are a member and who they should contact within the Order of the Eastern Star to inform them of your death.

I was also contacted via email by the Grand Marshal of Oklahoma, Sister Kellie Tillman requesting information on the early history of Delaware. Sister Kellie was planning to use this in Oklahoma's parade of flags. I provided here with a short history of Delaware.

Acknowledgments:

The members may not realize it, but this office is not just one person. Following this report is a recapitulation of the various accounts of our Grand Chapter held in the Dover Federal Credit Union for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 Grand Chapter years.

Please note that our Grand Chapter finances are based on the Grand Chapter's Fiscal Year which runs from April 16th of one year to April 15th of the following year. So, even though we have had a Grand Chapter year of 2019 – 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it encompasses two Grand Chapter Fiscal Years.

I want to highlight some things that you will see in the recapitulations for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 Grand Chapter years which may need a short explanation.

- 1. We had a CD (#102) mature on 11/07/2019. At the direction of the Grand Trustees, we retained \$5,000 of that CD in our Savings Account (#01) and started a new 36-month CD (#105) with the remaining proceeds.
- 2. In December 2019, with the concurrence of the Grand Trustees, we opened an additional Money Market Account and transferred the proceeds of the Service Dog Account and the Heart Account into what is now called the Benevolent Charities Account (#21).
- 3. We had a CD (#103) mature on 11/07/2020. Due to the COVID-19 situation and me being in quarantine due to having an upcoming operation, the CD rolled over to a new 24-month CD that will mature on 11/07/2022.

Sister Barbara, I want to thank you for your willingness to learn QuickBooks over the past two years. You did well and we made it through these two years with no loss of hair and our sanity mostly intact. Thanks for a great two years.

To the members of the Grand Chapter of Delaware, I thank you for the confidence you have placed in me, and it has been and continues to be a distinct pleasure for me to serve this Grand Chapter as your Grand Treasurer.

Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna, Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Tom, Grand Trustees, Sisters Cathy, Jane, and Kathi, I have enjoyed working with each of you and I hope that you have received all the financial information you needed in order to make your various jobs easier. REPORT OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES Sister Catherine Yaiser, PM (20) 1 year, Chairman Sister Jane Morris, PGM (12) 2 years Sister Kathi Anderson, PGM (8 & 15) 3 years

I personally thank all of you for attending the 99th Grand Sessions of the Grand Chapter of Delaware so that we can move forward after the many challenges faced in the last 14 months. The work of the Grand Trustees continued during the entire two years. This report covers actions taken during that time.

DOVER DOWNS HOTEL: Met with the Director of Sales and Lisa Skelley to review the 2018-2019 Sessions concerning the complaints of hotel staff and the Sessions Chairman. We were made aware of the new owners and the changes to our upcoming contracts since Grand Chapter was not meeting the hotel room usage requirement. There was an attempt to get credit for Gold Card rooms, but it seemed doubtful we were successful. Before our attempt at negotiations, we were informed that the ballroom

rental rates would cost us \$14,400 for the 100th Grand Sessions. Other rooms would cost \$6,000 (Diamond Room).

CONTRACTS: As per the Bylaws, we reviewed contracts for the 2019-20 Grand Banquet. We also reviewed the contract for the Beef 'n Beer to assure that liability for the liquor consumption was assumed by the Aetna Fire Company.

FINANCIAL REVIEW WITH LINE OFFICERS: We became aware that the line Officers had many questions and misconceptions about the finances, the workings of the budget, and how that relates to their responsibilities. We met for an indepth discussion in October 2019. We would recommend that such meetings be continued.

VENUES FOR FUTURE SESSIONS: As previously mentioned, Dover Downs Hotel informed us of the upcharges in our future contracts when we contacted them to discuss the 100th Grand Sessions. Inquiries were made into other venues:

Modern Maturity: not available on Sunday because of church service

Rehoboth Convention Center: not available on Sunday because of Prom Contracts

Atlantic Sands: in season beach rates for May

Christiana Sheraton: has become a county homeless shelter

Christiana Hilton: Sunday Mother's Day conflicts

Embassy Suites: ballroom too small for Chapter setup

Nur Shrine: available at Masonic family discount \$975 when booking was allowed. Housing would be about 4 miles away St. John's Lodge: not accepting reservations because of Grand Master's edict

When the Worthy Grand Matron decided to hold her Sessions on May 10, it was decided to rent the Nur Shrine because it would have the floor space, we need for proper 6' distancing. No contracts have been made for future sessions at this time because of currant uncertainties.

INSURANCE:

A. Liability: After questions were independently presented to Wilgus Insurance Company by the Grand Secretary, our liability insurance was increased from \$255 to \$1310.

(The Grand Secretary questioned the limitations of the original policy.) Liability is determined by the number of the organization's voting members not the attendance at an activity. When we gave voting rights to all members attending Grand Chapter Sessions, the number of voting members increased from 12 to 725.

- B. Marine: The Grand Trustees investigated insurance coverage for equipment held by the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer. The cost was greater than \$2000 per year and would include depreciation of the value of our equipment. No action was taken because it is not cost effective.
- C. Surety Bond remains the same.

FINANCIAL

- A. It was decided to not change the financial institution from Dover Federal Credit Union. This decision is reviewed annually.
- B. The CD maturing in Nov. 2019. The amount was reinvested: \$10,000 in a CD and \$5000 was placed in the Savings account. At that time the budget had a huge deficit, and we were uncertain of expenses.
- C. The CD maturing in Nov. 2020. Because of the covid-19 restrictions, it was decided to rollover the CD until such time as a better rate could be received.
- D. Credit Card: The Grand Trustees investigated establishing a credit card account for collection of Grand Chapter fees and for paying Grand Chapter expenses. To establish an account requires monthly fees by the financial company and a charge per item entered. No action was taken because there is no cost benefit to Grand Chapter.
- E. Electronic payments with the consent of the WGM was approved.
- F. Created a money market account for monies collected for General Grand Chapter projects. Presently the account holds monies for Service Dogs and Heart projects. These monies are not included in the budget.
- G. The Grand Treasurer requested to transfer \$1000 from Savings to be placed permanently in the Benefit for

Children Money Market account so that the interest received would be included in distributed funds. After consultation with the WGM, no action was taken. There has always been a challenge to leave the least amount of money for the incoming WGM. We feel that this recommendation should be decided by the Grand Chapter.

- H. Storage unit: inventory to follow
- I. Safe deposit box: Inventory was taken March 4, 2021:

PGM jewel and PGP jewel removed for cleaning and engraving for presentation JEWELS

The PGM jewel previously worn by Eliza Crossland, PGM and Nancy Edwards, PGM was cleaned and engraved by Heritage Jewelers, Seaford, Delaware for presentation at this Session. The PGP jewel worn previously by Robert Stineman, PGP was cleaned and engraved by Heritage Jewelers for presentation at this Session.

Unfortunately, as was predicted by Sara Quinby, PGM, AR Morris Jewelers, Wilmington, Delaware, as of this time, has not found the dyes for the PGM and PGP jewels. They were not returned when the jewels were made for Ginny Crocket, PGM and William Lott, PGP. I have been in touch with the owner recently, who was going to check at Philadelphia location.

AUDITS

- A. 2019-2020 Audit was done June 17, 2020, when the Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, and Grand Trustees felt sufficiently safe to meet. The Grand Chapter books and accounts were found to be in good order.
- B. The loan to the ESTARL Committee was returned to the Money Market fund in a timely manner.
- C. Payments should be made to vendors rather than individuals.

- D. Repayment made to the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer should be made in a timely manner so that expenses can be reviewed as they are occurring. The Grand Secretary prefers to combine all expenses for payment before the close of Grand Chapter books.
- E. 2020-2021 Audit was completed on April 30, 2021. Again, the Grand Chapter books were found to be in good order. Grand Secretary Barbara Lott, PGM and Grand Treasurer Steve Tolbert, PGP are to be congratulated on the professional in the performance of their duties.

BUDGETS

- A. 2020-2021: A budget was created even though the Grand Chapter remained closed through most of the year. The Grand Trustees felt it was important to give the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer guidelines for paying ongoing expenditures rather than having to delay payments while the WGM and Grand Trustees approved each expenditure. It was the intention to have that budget approved when the Grand Chapter held its Sessions in August. Since that never occurred, the Grand Trustees requested the Line Officers approve the budget. It is included with the 2021-2022 Proposed Budget showing the expenditures for 2020-2021. We would be remiss if we did not acknowledge the efforts of the Quarter Auction co-chairmen Susan Marge, Cheryl Mongillo and committee member, Steve Quillen plus Sue Peronti for their success. Also, Bronwyn Millman gave us the unique experience of the Beef 'n Beer. Thank you to these Sisters and Brother and to all who took part in these activities as workers and participants.
- B. 2021-2022: The proposed budget is included as an attachment to this report. It is impossible to present a zero-balanced budget as required. Normally our expenditures for Grand Sessions 2020 would show in the "actual" column. With the one-day Session and a cancelation of many activities, there are no expenditures. Fees for the 2022 Sessions will begin to be received prior to April 15, 2022. No requests for monies were received from Grand Chapter committees.

C. Centennial Fund: The amount set aside to celebrate our 100th Grand Sessions (\$4830) is not included in the budget because it was collected in the 3 previous years. The Grand Trustees believe that the use and/or distribution of these funds are the responsibility of 2021-2022 Worthy Grand Matron-Elect, Sr Kathy Trombley in consultation with her Special Committee. Contracts in excess of \$2000 will be entered into by the Grand Trustees.

This is my final report to this Grand Chapter, so I have a few acknowledgements to extend.

The success of your years ahead will help to maintain the Grand Chapter of Delaware. Your newly elected colleague will be enthusiastically awaiting to make his/her impact on this Board.

GRAND LECTURER Sister Joan L. Moore, PGM (16)

2019-2020 was a year to remember so far as national and international events that kept us from socializing and getting to know our Sisters and Brothers. As of the date of this report we are still confined to homes and not allowed to have meetings.

My year as Grand Lecturer started with a conference call from our Worthy Grand Matron on May 16 to go over details to be discussed at the School of Instruction on May 18, 2019, a summary of those details were given to each Deputy Grand Lecturer. The signs and passes were exemplified.

Legislation adopted at the 2019 Grand Session states within the duties of the Grand Lecturer, Rules and Regulations of the Grand Chapter, Art. II, Sec. 8, F. Page 24. Instruct the Deputy Grand Lecturers in "The Book of Protocol" and Eastern Star etiquette as provided by the General Grand Chapter to be used by Grand

It is my observation that there is inconsistency in the usage of text from the Ritual and the signs and passes. It had been recommended that the signs and passes be practiced by all members. (See Ritual, Page 45). also refer to Rules and Regulations for Subordinate Chapters, Art. X, Sec. 4, Vacancies preferences, Page 57, A) "preference MUST be given members of her or his Subordinate Chapter". After each visit, an email was sent to the Deputy Grand Lecturer pointing out inconsistencies or answering questions using the Grand Chapter Book of Instruction as reference. We do strive for perfection.

2020-2021 started with a letter dated May 28, 2020, was mailed to all Deputy Grand Lecturers urging every officer and member to keep our ritualistic words foremost in our minds lest we forget what we have so patiently learned. This has been a long year without meeting and greeting each other and therefore may need some refreshing when the time comes that we are able to meet person-to-person.

Unfortunately, there is only 1 certification to report from our total membership and that is as follows:

All questions directed to me as Grand Lecturer have been referred to the Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna S. Hiddemen.

SESSION COMMITTEE Sister Ann L. Street, PGM, GGCCM Service Dogs (5) Sister Catherine "Scotty" Schultz, PGM (12)

Planning for the 99th Annual Session "Radiate Positivity" began in 2019 focusing on the various themes chosen by Sister Donna and Brother Tom to represent their planned year 2019 – 2020. With the pandemic emerging fast and furious in early March 2020, Grand Chapter sessions were put on hold and eventually cancelled along with our hopes of making this session exceptional for a very deserving Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron. From that point forward, Sister Donna felt decorations were not necessary and requested the committee not spend money on decorations for an abbreviated session that, hopefully, would be planned for May 2021. The sessions committee regrouped via "Zoom" for committee meetings.

"The Enchanted Forest" Tea Party celebrated Sister Donna and Brother Tom's fun themes. Sister Jennifer Grassett (09) was very accommodating and loaned us the scenery from that venue. Thus, we were able to surprise Sister Donna and Brother Tom with a new twist to some familiar décor.

Committee members added green trees and Sister Linda Morganstern (20) provided artificial crabs, crab netting and turkeys to embellish the North, South, East, and West. Crab netting with a blue crab hanging mat, provided by Sister Donna, hung on Brother Tom's podium.

The background for the East was a scenic draped of a fairy forest. Brown tree trunks that surrounded the forest were enhanced with lighted vines. A tall life size Smokey the Bear standing on one side was guarding the forest. Red caped mushrooms, and various animals from the Worthy Grand Matron's personal collection laid across the front of the scene. Butterflies and owls dressed the

Lunches were provided by Haass' Family Butcher Shop catering service in Dover, Delaware. Members had a choice of a roast beef wrap with arugula and caramelized onions topped with horseradish sauce, white meat chicken salad wrap with grapes, celery and mayonnaise or a pesto chicken caprese on a ciabatta roll. Each lunch box included a fruit cup, bag of chips, cookies, and a bottle of water. Thank you to Pat Martin (16) for managing reservations. Pat, Virginia Robertson (19), and January Wright (19) organized and distributed the lunches to members. Eighty lunches were purchased. We would like to thank the Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Delaware, Jeffrey Haass (15), and his catering coordinator Chrissy, who worked with us on the menus. Amid the pandemic he provided the services and was willing to allow us to cancel, if needed, without penalty. Starpoint colored drapes adorned the lunch tables. Sister Linda Morganstern provided decorations throughout.

The services of session nurses, Keri Bradford (16) and Kathy Kee (08), were much appreciated for being in attendance to scan members' temperatures upon entrance into the chapter room and provide medical assistance. ESTARL COMMITTEE REPORT

Doris Laurer, PGM, Chairman (16), 1 year Susan C. Tolbert, PM, Acting Chairman (16), 2 years David A. Holley, PGP (5), 3 years

On behalf of Sister Doris Lauer, PGM and Brother David Holley, PGP and myself I am pleased to announce the ESTARL Committee awarded three scholarships in 2020. As the May 2020 Informal Opening was put on hold and the committee felt the recipients needed to know, letters with certificates were mailed to Robin Lynn Hurley (first time award recipient attending Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington DC), Jeffrey Paul Peters (also first-time award recipient attending Palmer Theological Seminary in St. David's, PA) and Tyler Anderson Farmer (third time award recipient attending Liberty University, Lynchburg, VA)

Due to Governor Carney's emergency directive, I had the time to go through the Committee Chair's box that had been given to me. According to Article XI, Section A 10), Disposal of Materials paragraph a), "the Chairperson of Eastern Star Training Awards for Religious Leadership (ESTARL) Committee should keep all the applications, correspondence (except late application requests) and supporting data until the next selection process is completed (one year)" and, paragraph b), "After the next selection process is completed, all scholarship materials from the previous year should be destroyed." That directive had not been followed for many years. There were materials still in the box that dated back to 1999! It certainly made for interesting reading, such as the directive from one of the Most Worthy Grand Matrons that there would be church services to benefit ESTARL during her term, previous committee decisions to award scholarships of \$1,500 rather than \$1,000 and, unlike what we see now for contributions to ESTARL from the chapters, there were years when the total was \$10.000!

I also found a discrepancy in the Rules and Regulations that I feel should be clarified. Under Article XI, Section A, 3) Restrictions, paragraph c) reads, "No more than four (4) awards will be given to an ESTARL recipient." However, Article XI, Section A, 8) Renewal, paragraph b), says, "the maximum number of renewals will be four (4)" which would make it possible for a recipient to

receive a total of five (5) ESTARL awards! Interestingly, I found a document that provided Guidelines for ESTARL Scholarship Award for Second and Third Awards making one think there was a maximum of three awards. According to those guidelines all that was required for renewal was "a letter requesting a grant with a copy of your transcripts to the chairperson no later than April 1." However, under Article XI, Section A, 8) Renewal, paragraph a), "the same procedure for original application will be followed for scholarship renewal including the submission of grades from the previous semester", implying the applicant needs to write the essay "Why I Wish an ESTARL Award" and submit three letters of reference as indicated in Article XI, Section A, 4) Applications, paragraph b). I contacted Jurisprudence for clarification as to what I should do as there was a possibility one of the recipients would apply again in 2021. I was told to permit the recipient to apply again. As the Grand Officers and the Worthy Grand Matron's Committees were extended until May 2021, I have submitted proposed legislation for the above recommendations.

As the term of office was extended, I contacted Sister Donna, Worthy Grand Matron as to whether scholarships would be awarded in 2021. She responded by saying scholarships should be awarded annually and not by term. Therefore, the committee chose to award scholarships to Robin Lynn Hurley (second award recipient attending Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington DC), Jeffrey Paul Peters (also second award recipient attending Palmer Theological Seminary in St. David's, PA) and Tyler Anderson Farmer (fourth award recipient attending Liberty University, Lynchburg, VA). Once again as there will be no ESTARL service at Grand Session letters and certificates were mailed to them.

Both 2020 and 2021 I sent correspondence to each chapter reminding them of the available scholarship and requesting each chapter send me their ESTARL report. Neither year did I receive reports from any chapters other than Unity #16, so I contacted the Grand Treasurer for the figures needed to give my financial report.

ESTARL donations received for the two Grand Chapter years (April 16, 2019 - April 15, 2021) are included in the financial report.

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron we thank you for giving us the honor of serving on this committee and pray that your session will "Radiate Positivity" once it happens!

The 2019 – 2020 to 2021 Grand Chapter year for this Jurisprudence Committee was at times very quiet and at other times extremely hectic. A leap year along with the unprecedented world-wide epidemic converted a 366-day Grand Chapter year to a 731-day year. Much of the first 300 days could

be considered a standard year. However, the last part became extremely challenging. The suspension of meetings, the use of online computer meetings, the ability to meet challenged both Grand Chapter Constitution and Bylaws not to mention General Grand Chapter. Never were these circumstances imagined nor were rules and regulations written to handle them.

In summary we thoroughly reviewed the Bylaws of Sussex Chapter No. 7, Caesar Rodney Chapter No. 8 and Georgetown Chapter No. 9. While each Chapter by-laws were approved, we also had the opportunity to recommend some needed changes other than the ones submitted for approval. We need to remind the Subordinate Chapter secretaries once the bylaws have been approved by the Worthy Grand Matron and reprinted, a new copy needs to be sent to the WGM, Grand Secretary and the Chairman of Jurisprudence.

Items that came to the Jurisprudence Committee from the membership for a formal ruling were:

- Special meeting to continue Grand Chapter bylaw voting
- ❖ Handling of funds for Grand Chapter fundraiser.
- ❖ Subordinate Chapter not electing a Worthy Patron
- Requirement of having to send out hard copy of Session Announcement to all members vs electronic.
- Can one member be Secretary of more than one Chapter at the same time.
- Non appointment of special committee to review moving the date of Grand Chapter sessions.
- Postponement of Grand Chapter Sessions.
- Can more than one Shustack Scholarship be awarded in a single year.
- ❖ What happens when all top four offices in a single Subordinate Chapter are unfilled by elections?
- ♦ How to list a Subordinate Chapter in the White Book when all top 4 officer positions vacant.
- ♦ How to handle ESTARL award when recipient school closed due to the pandemic.
- * Request to extend Grand Commissions.
- Multiple meetings and questions on the state of Grand Chapter and Subordinate Chapters due to COVID and the shutdown, return of in person meetings and the use of

online (ZOOM and other electronic meeting software) for meetings as well as elections and installations.

The Jurisprudence committee were active participants on the Executive Committee over this last year as they dealt with all of the COVID issues. Initially looking at how to handle our meeting needs then the closure of all Lodges in the State by the Grand Master. Some of the first major issues were the postponement of Installations for Subordinate Chapters followed closely by the 2020 Grand Chapter Sessions. The roll of names of all the notified deaths we received in the periods of 2019,2020, and 2021 were laid at the Altar during the opening of the session and will be printed in the proceedings. The fact that the service will not be the same as usual does not lessen our remembrance of our Sisters and Brothers. Our Eastern STARS are now the STARS in heaven guiding our actions.

PRINTING COMMITTEE REPORT

After the Grand Chapter Session, the Grand Secretary produced the 2019-2020 "Radiate Positivity" directory. Bids were received from Lewes Printing, Copies Done Right, and Print Coast2Coast Graphics. The job was given to Print Coast2Coast with a low bid of \$106.25. Copies were distributed to those entitled to a copy and sold to members wanting additional or personal copies for \$2.00

The Grand Secretary typed the 2019 proceedings and gave a copy to the Junior Past Grand Matron and attached to an email sent to the Junior Past Grand Patron on October 24, 2019. It was requested that proofing be done by November 15, 2019. The proofing of the Junior Past Grand Patron was received by November 1, 2019. The proofing of the Junior Past Grand Matron was received November 30, 2019. It is always wise to have another pair of eyes when proofing and we thank Sister Henrietta McKelvey for her assistance with this project. The final draft of the proceedings was ready and sent to the printer on January 13, 2020, and completed on January 27, 2020.

The Grand Secretary produced in house all *In Memoriums* for our Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons who died during the 2019-2020 term.

During the 2020-2021 time period no printing outside printing was required. Preparations for the 2021-2022 term have been initiated for the directory.

SERVICE DOG COMMITTEE

Thank you for the privilege of working with the Service Dog Program Committee. It has certainly been my pleasure to help with this particular program.

This has been a difficult year. I was appointed for a three-year term but found myself, the newly appointed member, chair of the committee. During the year, because of health issues, the other two committee members resigned. Therefore, for a good part of the year, it has been a committee of one.

Each Subordinate Chapter Worthy Matron was asked to appoint a Chapter member to be the contact person for the Service Dog Program. I am aware of only three appointments for the program. Each Subordinate Chapter was asked to inform me of all events which were happening in their area so that contact could be made with the event coordinator and the OES Service Dog Program could participate. We did participate in one event, the Seaford Riverfest. A table was set up with Dog Bone pins for sale and donations were gratefully accepted. A second event could not be attended due to it conflicting with OES Special Sessions. No other events were suggested.

Funds were requested from the Grand Chapter to purchase items to sell to the general public with all funds being returned to the Grand Chapter. No funds were available to get this project off the ground. I, personally, purchased: paw bling can covers, dog design socks, paw print gloves, key chains, paw print car magnets, Love paw plaques, paw lapel pins, and OES shooting star pins to be sold to members and the general public.

Each Subordinate Chapter was visited along with a mascot "Service Dog in Training." Members were asked to donate a dollar to name the mascot. "D" Dollars were collected to support the Service Dog program.

All funds received were forwarded to Ann Street, GGCC member. She, in turn, forwarded the funds to Grand Chapter. As each individual Subordinate Chapter submitted funds directly to Grand Chapter, it is impossible for me to include an accurate

financial report (other than monies I spent for items to sell). The Grand Chapter Secretary has provided me with a report on the Service Dog program that indicates \$3,519.80 was donated to Service Dogs this year.

Tentative plans for the future include the following: 1) A motorcycle ride of the Southern Masonic Riders to raise funds with a BBQ at a stop during the ride, 2) Dinner and a show by Dame Edna and/or Elvis impersonators, 3) A presence at festivals, parades, events, etc. with items to sell and information about the Service Dog Program and the Order of the Eastern Star, 4) A chicken BBQ held on a route where beach traffic would be passing, 5) Visitation to Masonic Lodges to explain the Order of the Eastern Star and the Service Dog Program, and 6) Establish contact with service dog owners who would be willing to explain their need for a service dog and how their dog helps them.

On Saturday, November 2, 2019, we held our annual Quarter Auction for the Grand Chapter of Delaware. The event took place at the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd at 7:00 p.m. (doors opened at 6:00 p.m.). We collected donations from each of the chapters and many of the individual members. Donations and gift certificates were solicited from local vendors throughout the state with many members helping to procure items from businesses in their area. The 2020-2021 year has been a plus minus situation. On the minus side, due to the Covid 19 Pandemic the 'Hookers' were unable to meet in person. We enjoy our monthly lunches. It's fun to get together and share patterns and ideas for new stitches. However, on the plus side, being confined to our homes during the quarantine we kept our hands busy knitting and crocheting.

I am very happy to report that even though our Chapters were dark this past year we were still able to reach out to the community in the name of Eastern Star.

Early in March when some of the hospital restrictions we delivered to Christina Hospital NIC Unit 150 baby caps and 50 incubator covers. We took 75 baby caps, and 25 incubator covers to St. Francis Hospital NIC Unit. My thanks and appreciation to Sister Rose Vanderhoogt who delivered 75 caps and 25 covers to Beebe NIC Unit for us. Our total for the year 2020-2021 was 300 caps and 100 covers. We have caps and covers on hand, ready to begin the new year.

Then COVID-19 hit!! First, I received a message that productions were cancelled up to March 26. With our date being March 28, we were safe! The only date that would have been available for a group the size of ours was December 26. I felt our members would be with family over the holidays and it would not be a good date. So, I requested a refund which was graciously and generously honored. I must mention here that I later received a message indicating Sight and Sound was closed, and all refunds would be given when it reopened. I had already been in contact with Jor-Lin and knew we would receive as a refund of \$1,179.00 less the \$250.00 deposit. I also was given a call that Shady Maple Smorgasbord was closed. Of course, we had nothing outstanding with them.

Full refunds were given to all those who had paid for the trip. The \$250 bus deposit that was non-refundable has been generously donated by the WGM, Sister Donna. Thank you! The remaining bus payment and the tickets have been refunded to us as well.

It was an honor to be asked to arrange the trip and I am terribly disappointed, as I know many others are, that we were not able to do it. Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron may you have a session that "Radiates Positivity" once it happens!

Veterans Hospital (Elsmere) Hobby Cart Brother Mercer A. Quinby, PP (20), Chairman Brother Walter Evans, PP (20) Brother E. Watson Day, PGP (19) Sister Janet Day, PGM (19)

Thank you for the privilege of working with the Veterans at the VA Hospital in Elsmere, DE. I consider it my honor to represent the members of our Order in Delaware.

During 2019-202 five members who volunteer at the hospital gave almost 400 hours at the hospital. The five members who alternate weekly turns in pairs are: Brothers Wally Evans, and Chuck Porter, Sisters Bernadette Porter, my wife Sara, and myself. Every week we visit with 39 residents in the CLC (Community Living Center) and the patients on the surgical and in-patient floors. All our volunteers are members of Naomi Chapter #20. We desperately need volunteers to help us if we are to continue the 'Hobby Cart'. I sent letters to the subordinate chapters in the northern section of our state and received no responses (which was the same as last year).

This past year we participated in the 'Angel Tree' project. This was the first year the VA took part. We received a list from the administrator with suggestions of Christmas presents for a

designated family. Although, we didn't know who our family was, we were given the following information. Our family consisted of a single father with 4 children, 2 boys and 2 girls, ages 6 to 12 years. The father, who is a patient at the VA Hospital was unable to work. Christmas looked bleak. We sent out letters to our chapters with suggestions and sizes for gifts. I thanked the individual members and Naomi Chapter #20, who responded and donated to this project. Our goal was accomplished, and Santa delivered the presents.

This year due to the addition of two more veteran facilities in our state we were limited on our accomplishments. We were not supported by the chapters and individual members who have supported us financially in past years. We did not receive the donations we have come to rely on in the past.

I would like to acknowledge Ruth Chapter #19, for their gift of clothing to the cart. Sister Deena Yale, PM of Sussex Chapter #7, gave us a very generous donation of a whole carton of pocket tee shirts. Ionic Lodge, #31, F&AM donated five very large bags of men's clothing. The clothing was used, but in good condition. We thanked the widow who made this donation. Whatever we couldn't use we gave to The Purple Heart.

We thank our Worthy Grand Matron for designating the charity collections taken at her 'official visits' to the veterans. The money that was received was divided 3 ways half to the VA in Elsmere, one quarter to Home of the Brave and one quarter to the VA facility in Milford. Nothing was given to Victory Village in Middletown, which is also a half-way house very similar to Home of the Brave.

In the past 47 years, OES in Delaware has served the men and women veterans here in our state. The VA Hospital treats patients from the entire state of Delaware. This year due to the lack of funds and interest, I would like to make the following suggestion:

The Hobby Cart visits be cut from weekly to twice a month. In recent years our membership has declined, and chapters have closed. At the present time we only have nine chapters. The addition of another facility influenced the amount of money and clothing donations we received. Last year I presented this

in my report and received no response. Grand Chapter recently added another facility, so now there are three.

During 2020-2021 due to the Covid 19 Pandemic, the Veterans Hospital has been 'shut down' to all outside visitors since March of 2020. The four members who faithfully visit the residents in the 'Community Care Center' each week have been unable to distribute our usual weekly toiletries and clothing. Needless to say, this has been a disappointment. However, looking on the bright side, there has not been one single case of covid reported among the residents.

The 'Hobby Cart' at the Veterans Hospital in Elsmere, DE had it's beginning in 1946, soon after World War II. Since then, our members have faithfully supported our veterans for 75 years. In all these years, there never was one like 2020!

I would like to acknowledge Ruth Chapter #19, for their generous donation of one dozen beautiful plush throws. I know our gentlemen are going to enjoy these when we're able to distribute them. We appreciate the monetary donations from the chapters in our state. Although, no money was needed this year, we will certainly need it soon (we hope) to replenish our cart.

Never let it be said that Delaware Eastern Star ever shirked any responsibility. When we weren't able to push our hobby around the hospital we began serving as 'hospital escorts'. We take the patients in wheelchairs and stretchers from department to department for tests and treatments. We have enjoyed doing this and plan to continue with this service even after the quarantine is lifted.

I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank Brother Charles Porter and Sisters Bernadette Porter and Sara Quinby for their service. This year even though we weren't able to distribute our usual items on the 'Hobby Cart' we were still able to let our light shine at the hospital. These four members altogether gave 196 hours of escort service at the hospital.

Early in January we received a telephone call from the Director of Volunteers to come to the hospital to be vaccinated! The four members each received two doses of the Moderna vaccine, thanks to the VA.

Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, I thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve this Grand Chapter. I have enjoyed working with the members of my committee. It is my honor to give service in the name of our grand chapter to the men and woman who have given their service to our country.

As no money was requested by the committee this year, there is no financial report.

The 2019-2020 Grand Chapter year began with a new Web Administrator, Sister Joan Siler of Victory Chapter 15. At a meeting in June at Smyrna Diner, passwords to the site were transferred to Sister Joan. She then transferred control of the site to herself and billing for the domain to her credit card. After having problems working with GoDaddy and the Linux structure of our website, Sister Joan decided to resign as Web Administrator early in the fall. Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Donna, asked me to resume the role of Web Administrator.

After resuming the role of Web Administrator and given that the key FTP password to the site has not been changed by Sister Joan, I was able to update all web pages on our website. Actual control of the site was not regained until late in March. As of today, I am listed as the Administrator of our website and all billing for the site is attached to my credit card.

As I do not as of this date know who the 2020-2021 Communication Committee has selected as Web Administrator, I am still performing the duties. When the new Web Administrator is named, I will work with them to transfer control of our GoDaddy account to them and their credit card.

A page has been added to the Members' Only section with all the forms from our Grand Secretary that our Subordinate Chapter Secretaries need in both Word and PDF format. The legislation to be considered at this session was also mounted on the Members' Only page. A page with the information for this session was created with access from the Grand Chapter tab on the home page.

After several attempts to hijack our page, I have purchased at no expense to the Grand Chapter upgraded security service for our site from GoDaddy. All other charges for the web site are billed

Article III, Committees of the Grand Chapter, Section 4; Add (D). Delete (O)

Article III Committee Duties and Composition Section 6 Add: (D) Communication Committee Delete (O) Web Page

- (D) Communications Committee
 - 1) It shall be the duty of the members of the Communications Committee to utilize or see that appropriate digital and print media are provided by the Grand Chapter to communicate to the membership information concerning activities of the Grand Chapter and Subordinate Chapters in Delaware.
 - 2) Will consist of three (3) members, one of which shall be appointed each year for a three (3) year term.
 - 3) The Chairman will be the member whose term next expires.
 - 4) This committee in conjunction with the Worthy Grand Matron will select annually those tools of information dispersal that will best keep the membership informed concerning activities and actions of the Grand Chapter and Subordinate Chapter. These tools may include but are not limited to:
 - a. Website
 - b. Newsletter
 - c. Social media
 - d. Email list
 - e. Other tools as are deemed appropriate
 - 5) This committee in conjunction with the Worthy Grand Matron shall select individuals to serve for one year as administrator or editor or moderator or coordinator to administer the means of communication as needed.
 - 6) If there are costs associated with providing of these mediums of communication, they shall be budgeted for in the annual budget of the Grand Chapter of

Delaware, Order of the Eastern Star and if recoverable (such as print media) via subscription from the users, the committee shall establish a price for the service and establish a method to see that these funds are deposited to the appropriate Grand Chapter account.

D) Subordinate Chapter: See Rules and Regulations of the Subordinate Chapters in Delaware Article

- 1) Election of Subordinate Chapter Officers shall be held at the 1st stated meeting in March.
- 2) No recess will be declared during election.
- Any individual wishing to be elected to a specific office will place their name and the office desired in a sealed envelope on the Secretary's desk prior to the start of the chapter meeting at which elections are to be held.
- 4) A member or spouse of a member cannot hold the offices of Secretary or Treasurer and Trustee at the same time.
- 5) Officers may only hold the office of Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, Associate Matron or Associate Patron in one of the plural Chapters to which they belong.
- 6) Before each position to be balloted upon begins, the Secretary will read the names of those interested in holding an office; in turn each member will rise and introduce themselves.
- 7) If an office has no submissions, the presiding officer may issue a call for nominations from the floor.
- 8) Those seeking elected office must have the appropriate proficiency for the office they are seeking as specified in the Rules and Regulations

- of the Subordinate Chapters of Delaware Article VIII.
- 9) The first eight officers and one Trustee will be elected by a majority vote (one vote more than half of the ballots cast) no blank ballots shall be counted.
- 10) The remaining officers will be appointed by the Worthy Matron-elect.
- 11) The election shall be by a majority vote on a separate, written ballot, and if there are more than three candidates for the same office, the name of the one receiving the lowest number of votes cast shall be dropped after the third ballot is announced.

12) Election Procedure

- a) At the first meeting in March, Under New Business, the Worthy _____ will announce those to be appointed tellers and distributors preferably sideline members, according to the needs of the Chapter.
